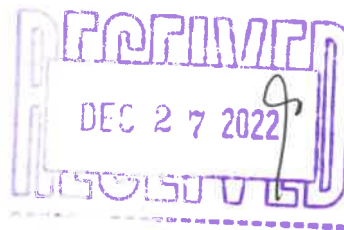

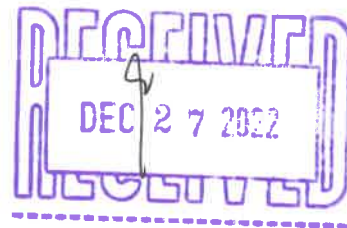

ORDINANCE NO. 2022 – 08

AN ORDINANCE INSTITUTIONALIZING THE MOBILE HEALTH CARE SERVICE FOR THE ELDERLY PROGRAM IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF TANAUAN, LEYTE; PROVIDING GUIDELINES IN THE IMPLEMENTATION THEREOF AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR.

SPONSORED BY HON. JASMIN U. BORJA

WHEREAS, Article XIII, Section 11 of the Constitution of the Republic of the Philippines provides that the state shall adopt an integrated and comprehensive approach to health development which shall endeavor to make essential goods, health and other social services available to all the people at affordable cost, giving priority for the needs of the underprivileged, sick, elderly, disabled, woman and children;

WHEREAS, Rule II, Section 2, d) of the implementing Rules and Regulations of Republic Act 9994 states that, consonant with the constitutional policies, this rule shall serve the objective of providing a comprehensive health care and rehabilitation system for senior citizens with disabilities to foster their capacity to attain a more meaningful and productive ageing;

WHEREAS, there are a number of senior citizens in the different barangays of the Municipality of Tanauan who are persons with disability (PWD's), bed-ridden and have not undergone any medication due to such limitations as distance of their homes to the Health Center in the town, physical problems and financial incapacity; and

WHEREAS, there is a stern necessity to establish a Mobile Health Care Service for the Elderly Program in the Municipality in order to bring health care closer and accessible to the older people who are devoid of the chance to regularly visit the Rural Health Unit on account primarily of their physical conditions,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE 16th SANGGUNIANG BAYAN OF TANAUAN, LEYTE IN A REGULAR SESSION DULY ASSEMBLED THAT:

ARTICLE I: GENERAL PROVISIONS

Section 1. Short Title - This ordinance shall be known as the "Mobile Health Care Service for the Elderly (MHCSE) Program of Tanauan, Leyte."

Section 2. Coverage - This ordinance shall involve the health services for the senior citizens of the Municipality of Tanauan under the responsibility of the Municipal Health Office.

Section 3. Definition of Terms - As used in this ordinance, the following are hereby defined:

- a. Bed-ridden - confined to bed because of sickness or weakness
- b. Elderly- senior citizens whose age is sixty (60) years old and above.
- c. Mobile -capable of moving or being moved from place to place

- f. Protective outfit -- a set of equipment for protection purposes
- g. Underprivileged - lacking or deprived of advantages or opportunities enjoyed by other members of society

ARTICLE II: IMPLEMENTING PROVISIONS

Section 4. Organization - In conformity with the provisions of Article XIII, Section 11 of the Philippine Constitution, a Mobile Health Care Service for the Elderly (MHCSE) Team in the Municipality of Tanauan shall be organized and be under the control and supervision of the Municipal Health Office.

4.1. This Mobile Health Care Service for the Elderly Team shall be composed of at least two (2) registered nurses who are regular employees of the MHO and a licensed vehicle driver who may be hired on a job order basis. The MHCS Team shall exclusively perform functions catering the medical and health care needs of the senior citizens of Tanauan, particularly those who are PWDs and bed-ridden due to sickness, ill-health and old age.

4.2. A motor vehicle shall be provided for the exclusive use of the MHCSE Team for their transport, for the transportation of senior citizens and as ambulance, when necessary. The vehicle shall be equipped with at least the basic life support requirement and medical equipment on board such as, but not limited to oxygen tanks, a stretcher, sphygmomanometer, stethoscope, etc. The MHCSE Team shall be provided with the basic protective outfit such as, but not limited to, the Personal Protective Equipment (PPEs), face masks, face shields, medical gloves, rain boots, flashlights, etc., which shall always be onboard and ready for use. ,

Section 5. Special Functions of the MHCSE Team – The MHCSE Team shall have the following functions:

5.1. The nurses comprising the Mobile Health Care Service Team shall:

5.1.1. Closely coordinate with the Office of Senior Citizens Affairs (OSCA) for the schedule of activities and visit to the different barangays in the municipality of Tanauan to provide medical service to the senior citizens.

5.1.2. Go to the houses in the fifty-four (54) barangays in the municipality where older people live to conduct health assessment of the PWDs and bed-ridden senior citizens who had been pre identified by the officers of the senior citizens association of every barangay concerned:

5.1.3. Make a report on their assessment of the PWDs and bed-ridden senior citizens to the MHO Head of Office for immediate interventions to the primary health needs of the subject older persons;

5.1.4. Administer upon their return to the assessed PWDs and bed-ridden senior citizens the right medicines prescribed by the physician based on their assessment, giving priority to the most advanced cases and give instruction to the members of the family, or whoever is assigned to attend to the (PWD or bed-ridden) senior citizen, on the proper care of the patient and in the administration of the medicines while these health workers are doing their duties in other areas.

5.1.5. Set a regular follow-up of these patients as they proceed with their visitation activity to every barangay in order to determine the progress/condition of said patients.

5.1.6. Properly observe the schedule prepared in the MHO Office for the assessment of prospective patients and travel to the barangays with regularity, except during inclement weather condition; and

5.1.7. Submit a monthly report/brief narrative on the outcome of their special mission.

5.1.8. Maintain a database or list of PWDs and bed-ridden senior citizens including their personal details, medical status, date of visits and interventions that were conducted.

5.2. The driver shall:

5.2.1 Ensure the operational readiness of the motor vehicle at all times by conducting regular inspection before and after its usage, observe the scheduled maintenance and make the necessary reports and requests to the RHU on any observed deficiency or derangement of the vehicle that will need repair or replacement.

5.2.2 Ensure the cleanliness of the vehicle and ready availability of the medical equipment on board.

5.2.3 Assist the MHCSE nurses when requested, and

5.2.4 Perform other tasks, as necessary.

Section 6. Safe-keeping of the Transport Vehicle and Protective Outfit. The motor vehicle, including the protective outfit, shall be under the custody of the Municipal Health Office and shall only be used in the job performance of the MHCSE Team and never for other purposes.

ARTICLE III: PURCHASE OF EQUIPMENT AND SOURCE OF FUND

Section 7. Purchase of Equipment -The motor vehicle, the basic life support and medical equipment. Including the protective outfit shall be available for use before the MHCSE starts its operation. In this regard, the MHO shall submit the list of equipment which are not yet available that will be needed to implement this ordinance, including the required budget that will be needed for its purchase.

Section 8. Source of Fund – This kind of health care service for the underprivileged PWD's and bed-ridden elderly is a legitimate extension program of the Municipal Health Office and shall be funded by the local government unit of Tanauan. The fund for the purchase of the abovementioned equipment and outfit shall be taken from the budget allocation for the programs, projects and activities of the senior citizens to be included in the municipality's general appropriation or Supplement appropriation thereafter.

ARTICLE IV: FINAL PROVISIONS

Section 9. Repealing Clause - All existing municipal ordinances, resolutions, executive orders, rules and regulations, or part thereof, which are inconsistent with this ordinance are hereby amended, repealed or modified accordingly.


Section 10. Separability Clause - Should any part or provision of this ordinance be found unconstitutional or invalid by a court of law, such part or provision shall be severed from this ordinance and such action shall not affect the enforceability of the remaining parts or provisions.

Section 11. Effectivity Clause - This ordinance shall take effect upon its approval.



MINUTES OF THE PUBLIC HEARING

**Tanauan Presidencia Lobby
Tanauan Town Hall
November 24, 2022 (2PM)**

I. OPENING PRAYER. (Overture)

II. PRELIMINARIES.

The proponent of the proposed Ordinances, Hon. Borja, acknowledged the presence of the Chairman of the Committee on Rules, Hon. Isagani S. Espada; the Chairman of the Committee on Barangay Affairs, Hon. Ma. Martina L. Gimenez; the Chairman of the Committee Youth, Hon. Gil Mark L. Fiel; SB Member Hon. Mark Efren Merilo; the Chairpersons and representatives from the 54 barangays of the municipality and all other stakeholders and attendees of the said Public Hearing.

III. PRESENTATION OF THE FIRST PROPOSED ORDINANCE.

A PROPOSED ORDINANCE INSTITUTIONALIZING THE "FREE ACCESS TO MEDICINE (FAMed)" PROGRAM IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF TANAUAN, LEYTE; PROVIDING GUIDELINES IN THE IMPLEMENTATION THEREOF AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR.

IV. DISCUSSION/OPEN FORUM.

PB dela Cruz of Brgy. Cahumayhumayan asked the proponent when will the said Ordinance will take effect and Hon. Borja answered that once the same is approved it will be deemed in force. Hon. Espada also added that the said Ordinance will also be published and thus will be effective after the required publication.

PB Omega of Brgy. San Victor also asked if the budget allocation of the LGU for the said program will be sufficient and the proponent answered that though they have initially indicated a budget appropriation of 2.5 Million for the said program for CY 2023, the same may be insufficient. Hon. Espada added that at present there is only an allocation of 350 thousand for the said program but by the following year, if the initial amount of 2.5 Million will be insufficient then it may be subject for Supplemental Budget.

PB Badana of Brgy. Guingauan asked whether prescription receipts coming from private doctors will be honoured and Hon. Borja answered a qualified yes since under the proposed Ordinance, it will only be allowed in emergency cases. Hon. Borja added that the available medicines under the program will be those for common ailments only and should the said medicines are unavailable, the MHO will issue a note so that the client will be endorsed to cash assistance for medicines under the AICS.

The Municipal Accountant, Mr. Mar P. Villegas, verified if in the proposed Ordinance, there is an intent to amend the AICS ordinance so that those who can avail medicines under the FAMed are already barred from availing cash assistance under the AICS

program emphasizing that the AICS program has been abused by most clients. He added that it should also be emphasized in the Ordinance that for purposes of availing cash assistance under the AICS program, the prescription receipts should be issued by government doctors only.

Hon. Borja answered that there will be a system or database so that it would be easy to determine if the client has already availed of medicines under the FAMed Program and the said client cannot anymore avail under the AICS program within the quarter within which said client has just availed from FAMEd.

Mr. Villegas exclaimed that the said provision should be expressly provided under the FAMed Ordinance to avoid any room for confusion especially to the implementing body. Hon. Espada that claims for cash assistance under the AICS Program will be governed by the AICS Ordinance and that any amendment thereto will be made separately. Mr. Villegas however countered that it is better to incorporate the said amendment as it may be forgotten to amend the AICS Ordinance and further contended that the later Ordinance may just contain a repealing or amendatory clause so that the FAMEd will be implemented in correlation with the AICS ordinance.

Hon. Borja, the sponsor of the proposed measure agreed with Mr. Villegas and noted to add the provision on the Specific Guidelines under Section 5. D. that any person who has availed of the benefits under the FAMed Program shall be barred and shall no longer avail of the Cash Assistance for Medicines under the AICS program within the covered period or quarter.

PB Garcia of Brgy. Binongto-an inquired whether all the required number of medicines as prescribed will be given and Hon. Borja answered in the affirmative provided that supply is available. PB Omega on the other hand ask about those who have monthly maintenance whether they can also avail once every quarter only and Hon. Borja said yes and further explained that they may resort to other national agencies or NGOs who provide similar assistance. Hon. Espada seconded that it is provided under the proposed Ordinance on non-diminution clause.

Hon. Gem Fiel asked if the provision under Section 5 (a) (2), means that any patient on emergency cases can avail of the program regardless of his or her income or is not indigent and Hon. Borja answered in the affirmative. PB. Garcia again asked if prescription is not issued by a government doctor since no doctor at the RHU is available at all times and so most patients would resort to private doctors whether indigent or not and Hon. Espada answered that it will be considered even if issued by a private doctor when the same falls within the cases of emergencies.

Ms. Lala Cumpio asked whether the Certificate of Indigency required for availing the benefits under the FAMed should be under the name of the claimant representative just like in claiming the benefits under the AICS and Hon. Borja that for FAMed purposes, the said certificate should be under the name of the patient.

There having no further questions on the said proposed Ordinance, the Proponent proceeded with the presentation of the second proposed Ordinance.

V. PRESENTATION OF THE 2ND PROPOSED ORDINANCE.

A PROPOSED ORDINANCE INSTITUTIONALIZING THE "MOBILE HEALTH CARE SERVICE FOR THE ELDERLY" PROGRAM IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF TANAUAN, LEYTE; PROVIDING GUIDELINES IN THE IMPLEMENTATION THEREOF AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR.

VI. DISCUSSION/OPEN FORUM.

Hon. Espada emphasized that the Mobile Health Care Program has already been implemented during the previous administration and that the present administration has just continued the same.

Kap. Josephine Angelio of Brgy. Pasil raised her complaint about their farm labourer who was wounded by the land master blades in the morning of that day and was brought to the RHU of this municipality however, according to her the nurse on duty was hesitant to accommodate the patient in fact it was the patient who did the dressing on his own wounds.

Mrs. Coronado, the mobile nurse assigned for the COSE program raised her hand to answer the concern of PB Angelio and stated that *"it is a general rule, that we prioritize our safety first...kun nangingiw-iw an nurse, maybe there were no more gloves that is why."*

Hon. Espada asked if Dr. Santo was notified and if a representative was sent to attend the said Public Hearing and Hon. Borja stated that Dra. Santo was invited but texted that she was sick.

The HRMO, Ms. Baranda, after being recognized by the proponent explained that all of the Health Personnel are on a training except for the newly-hired nurse who is still processing her documents. Ms. Baranda expressed that she was disheartened to her of what Mrs. Coronado said and further exclaimed that if the reason was there were no more gloves, the personnel should have procured to replenish the supplies already even before all the supplies are depleted. Hon. Espada exclaimed that they will raise the said concern under their Committee for a legislative inquiry.


VII. ADJOURNMENT.

There having no further query, the Public Hearing as adjourned at 4:15 in the afternoon.
