



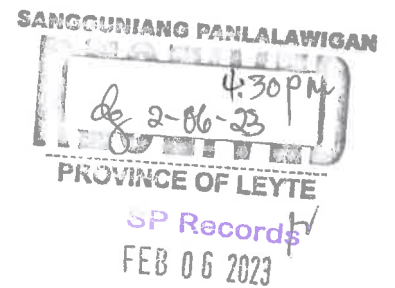



14 **PRELIMINARIES**

15 The Joint Provincial Peace and Order Council (PPOC) and Provincial Anti-Drug Abuse  
16 Council (PADAC) Meeting started at 10:30 o'clock in the morning. Some of the  
17 attendees were present at the venue while the others attended the meeting via Zoom.  
18

19 **DECLARATION OF QUORUM AND CALL TO ORDER**  
20

21 The Provincial Director of DILG-Leyte, Annabelle V. de Asis, Head of the PPOC  
22 Secretariat, stated that 31 participants were present in the hall and 19 were virtual  
23 attendees. As there were 50 members present out of 75, there was a quorum. The  
24 meeting was called to order.  
25

26 **OPENING MESSAGE**

27 In his opening message, SP Member Carlo P. Loreto expressed that he was grateful to  
28 the Governor and the Vice-Governor for the trust that was given him. He mentioned  
29 that he was also able to preside the joint meeting during his stint as Leyte Vice-  
30 Governor. He thanked all the participants for gracing the activity.  
31

32 **READING AND APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING**  
33

34 Mayor Edgardo Cordeño of Isabel, Leyte moved to dispense with the reading of the  
35 previous minutes as copies were furnished to the members before the meeting. This  
36 was seconded by Mayor Leonor Lugnasin of Babatngon, Leyte.  
37

38 As there was no business arising from the previous minutes and there were no  
39 corrections made, Mayor Cordeño moved for the approval of the minutes which was  
40 seconded by Mayor Lugnasin.  
41

42  
43 **AGENDA**  
44

1 **A. Anti-Criminality Update**

2  
3 PLt. Col. Margarito Salasño presented the audio-visual presentation of the Leyte  
4 Police Provincial Office (LPPO) which covered the annual report of accomplishments  
5 and the peace and order situation of the province for the year 2022.

6  
7 **B. Internal Security Matters/ ELCAC PTF Updates**

8  
9 Relative to the internal security updates and ELCAC efforts in the province, Lt. Col.  
10 Arnold Lozada, Operations Officer of the 93<sup>rd</sup> IB Battalion Commander, presented  
11 the status of the CTG affectation in the province with reference to the overall  
12 operations in the region. The audio-visual presentation highlighted the major  
13 accomplishments of the AFP in the province.

14  
15 In relation to the ELCAC accomplishments, DILG Leyte Provincial Director Annabelle  
16 V. de Asis presented the activities and innovations highlighting the Retooled  
17 Community Support Program (RCSP) and Support to Barangay Development  
18 Program (SBDP) thru an audio-visual presentation. Moreover, E-CLIP  
19 accomplishments were also given emphasis. PD de Asis explained that not all  
20 barangays of Leyte are recipients of the SBDP.

21  
22 Mayor Cordeño sought for clarification regarding the Local Government Support  
23 Fund (LGSF). He asked whether it would suffice if the funds have already been  
24 obligated considering that the projects have already been implemented. He also  
25 asked as to who would be accountable for the legal consequences that may arise  
26 after the funds have been returned to the national government. PD de Asis  
27 answered that what was required by the national government is disbursed, not  
28 obligated funds. Mayor Cordeño further asked if the national government will help  
29 the LGU if the contractors would litigate for non-payment of the LGSF projects. He  
30 added that there were instances when the time frame for the project  
31 implementation went beyond the period of fund validity prescribed by the national  
32 government. PD de Asis answered that in these instances, the LGU will have to  
33 execute an Affidavit of Undertaking.

34  
35 PD de Asis further explained that the LGSF validity is only until December 31.  
36 Beyond that, the funds will have to be returned to the national government.  
37 According to her, an inquiry has already been made to the Department of Budget  
38 and Management (DBM) if obligated funds would be alright but the answer was in  
39 the negative. Their reason was that it is beyond their authority because this is  
40 expressly provided in the General Appropriations Act.

41  
42 She assured the local government functionaries present that the DILG is exerting its  
43 best efforts to support, if needed, the LGUs by trying to help them find ways to fast  
44 track the implementation of the projects especially those that need to disburse the  
45 funds by December 31, 2022. It is just that the burden in coming up with the 100%  
46 completion/utilization is on the LGU.

49 **C. Anti-Illegal Drugs Campaign**

50  
51 PDEA representative Shiela Jervoso presented the current status of the anti-illegal  
52 drugs initiatives in the province.

1 **OTHER MATTERS**

2  
3 *Reorganization of the Provincial Peace and Order Council and Anti-Drug Abuse*  
4 *Council*

5  
6 Atty. Rhea Lina Enage, Provincial Focal Person, stated that with the change in  
7 leadership in the provincial government, there is a need to reorganize the Provincial  
8 Peace and Order Council (PPOC) and the Provincial Anti-Drug Abuse Council  
9 (PADAC) following the provisions under DILG Memorandum Circular 2022-118 and  
10 DILG and Dangerous Drugs Board (DDB) Joint Memorandum Circular (JMC) 2018-  
11 01, dated May 21, 2018, respectively.

12  
13 Thus, on motion of Mayor Edgardo Cordeño and duly seconded en masse, the PPOC  
14 and PADAC of the Province of Leyte was reorganized.

15  
16 *Approval of the Peace and Order and Public Safety Plan (POPS Plan) 2023-2025*

17  
18 The draft POPS Plan was previously presented to the body by Atty. Enage during the  
19 3<sup>rd</sup> Joint PPOC and PADAC meeting. As agreed, the draft was reviewed further. After  
20 plan has been finalized it was once again presented to the key functionaries of the  
21 council.

22  
23 *On motion of Mayor Edgardo Cordeño and duly seconded en masse, the POPS Plan*  
24 *2023-2025 of the Province of Leyte was approved.*

27 **ADJOURNMENT**

28  
29 On motion of Mayor Lugnasin and seconded unanimously, the joint meeting was  
30 adjourned at 12:37 PM.
