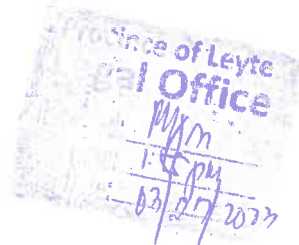

WHEREAS, Piso WiFi Machine/Pisonet Vendo Machine is one of the municipality's fastest-growing business sector, making additional income to enterprising individual even in far-flung barangays;

WHEREAS, there is a need to amend Ordinance No. 10-06, Series of 2010 in order to include the regulation of Piso WiFi Machine/Pisonet Vendo Machine;

NOW, THEREFORE, on motion of Honorable Diosdado P. Siao, duly seconded by Honorable Zenaida G. de los Santos, be it

RESOLVED, as it is hereby RESOLVED, to enact the following:

**ORDINANCE NO. 23-05**

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 10-06, SERIES OF 2010, ENTITLED, "AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE ESTABLISHMENT AND OPERATION OF INTERNET CAFES AND COMPUTER RENTAL SHOPS/COMPUTER GAMING SHOPS OR CENTERS IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF INOPACAN, PROVINCE OF LEYTE, AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION THEREOF"**

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the Sangguniang Bayan of Inopacan, Leyte that;

**SECTION 1.** The title of Ordinance No. 10-06, Series of 2010 is hereby amended to include Piso WiFi Machine/Pisonet Vendo Machine and shall be read as:

**"An Ordinance Regulating the Establishment and Operation of Piso Wifi Machine/Pisonet Vendo Machine, Internet Cafes or Computer Rental Shops/Computer Gaming Shops or Centers in the Municipality of Inopacan, Province of Leyte and Providing Penalties for Violation Thereof".**

**SECTION 2. Definition of terms** is hereby amended by including the definition of Piso Wifi Machine/Pisonet Vendo Machine which shall be placed after paragraph "j" and shall be read as:

- a. xxx
- k. Piso WiFi Machine/Pisonet Vendo Machine – is an arcade-style computer unit which allow the mobile device user to have access to the internet by dropping coins into the machine coin acceptor. This kind of business is mostly put up inside or in front of residential houses and commercial establishments.

**SECTION 3.** Section 1, Section 3 Coverage, Section 5 Requirements, Section 6 Building Specifications, Section 7 Prohibited Activities, Section 8 Duties and Responsibilities, Section 9 Regular Inspection/Visit and Section 10 Penalties, are hereby amended by adding "piso wifi machine/pisonet vendo machine" before "internet cafes or computer rental shops/computer gaming shops or centers".

**SECTION 4. Separability Clause.** Should any section or provision of this ordinance be declared as unconstitutional or invalid, other provisions which are not be affected thereby shall continue to be in full force and effect.

**SECTION 5. Repealing Clause.** All other existing resolutions, ordinances or rules which are inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

**SECTION 6. Effectivity Clause.** This ordinance shall take effect upon its approval.

MINUTES OF THE PUBLIC HEARING OF THE PROPOSED MUNICIPAL ORDINANCE OF THE 15<sup>TH</sup> SANGGUNIANG BAYAN OF INOPACAN, LEYTE HELD ON MARCH 15, 2023 AT THE SB SESSION HALL, NEW TOWN HALL, INOPACAN, LEYTE

1 **PRESENT: (Please see attached Attendance Sheet, also attached are the lists**  
2 **of personalities invited)**  
3

4 The proposed Ordinances submitted for public hearing are the following:  
5

- 6 1) **“An Ordinance Prohibiting the Entry of Vehicles such as Motorcycle,**  
7 **Bicycle, Trisikad, Eco-trike, and the Likes Inside the Premises of the**  
8 **New Public Market, Providing Penalties Thereof and for Other**  
9 **Purposes”**  
10  
11 2) **“An Ordinance Amending Ordinance No. 10-06, Series of 2010, entitled**  
12 **“An Ordinance Regulating the Establishment and Operation of Internet**  
13 **Cafes and Computer Rental Shops/Computer Gaming Shops or Centers**  
14 **in the Municipality of Inopacan, Province of Leyte, and Providing**  
15 **Penalties for Violation Thereof”**  
16  
17 3) **“An Ordinance Amending Ordinance No.17-05 entitled, “An Ordinance**  
18 **Regulating the Operation of Tourist Motorboat” in the Municipality of**  
19 **Inopacan, Province of Leyte”**  
20  
21 4) **“An Ordinance Imposing Regulatory Fee for Visiting Tourist Bound for**  
22 **Apid, Mahaba, and Digyo Islets of the Municipality of Inopacan, Province**  
23 **of Leyte”**  
24

25 The public hearing started at 1:45 in the afternoon with an opening prayer and  
26 the singing of the national anthem synchronized with the computer audio.  
27

28 The Master of Ceremony (MC), Mr. Narcis Lean N. Montajes gave an  
29 overview to the participants that four (4) draft Municipal Ordinances will be  
30 deliberated. He informed that joining a little later is the Municipal Mayor, Honorable  
31 Rogelio D. Pua, Jr. He acknowledged as well the SB Members present, namely:  
32 Honorable Joel D. Bernales, Honorable Andrew B. Dedal, Zenaida G. de los Santos,  
33 Honorable Alfie Jian B. Yamson, Honorable Daria D. Malanguis, Honorable Rowena  
34 K. Madrazo, Honorable Diosdado P. Siao, and Honorable Marianne B. Boldios.  
35

36 Honorable Joel D. Bernales, SB Member, delivered an Introductory Message,  
37 for and on behalf of the Municipal Vice Mayor/Presiding Officer, who has an equally  
38 important matter to attend to. He thanked all the participants for responding to  
39 Sanggunian's invitation, to finalize the four (4) draft Ordinances, to be introduced  
40 and discussed by the Authors, most especially the Ordinance imposing fees for the  
41 Islets. He elaborates that no Ordinance imposing penalties shall be finalized for Final  
42 Reading nor be approved, in the absence of a public hearing. Hence, all  
43 concerned/involved in these Ordinances were invited to this public hearing and  
44 furnished with copies of the same. He encourages all participants to open up their  
45 thoughts, suggestions, and queries after the discussion of each Ordinance by the SB  
46 Member-Author. Then he gave the floor to Honorable Dedal, the Author of the first  
47 Ordinance.

48 **“An Ordinance Prohibiting the Entry of Vehicles such as Motorcycle, Bicycle,**  
49 **Trisikad, Eco-trike, and the Likes Inside the Premises of the New Public**  
50 **Market, Providing Penalties Thereof and for Other Purposes”**  
51

52 Honorable Dedal reiterates that all Ordinances that involve penalties, should  
53 undergo a public hearing, to address complaints relative to fees being imposed.  
54 After thanking all the participants for their presence, he then discussed the  
55 provisions of the above-captioned draft Ordinance, starting off by relaying on the  
56 observations at the New Public Market, where parking of vehicles had caused  
57 obstructions to customers/buyers. And as to the title alone, he emphasized that entry  
58 of vehicles enumerated therein is prohibited *within the premises* of the new public  
59 market. He asked those representatives of each group as to their designated parking  
60 areas and the latter responded affirmatively. Honorable Dedal cited that most  
61 scenarios being observed are those buyers whose bicycles are being parked inside  
62 the public market. Then he discussed in detail, the entirety of the draft Measure,  
63 emphasizing on the penalties. After which, was the open forum, and the MC  
64 reminded the participants to introduce themselves first before throwing any  
65 questions.  
66

67 Mr. Jimar Manabat, President of the Inopacan Tricycle Operators and Drivers  
68 Association (ITODA), suggested having signages both for the designated parking  
69 area/space and areas where parking is not allowed, for easy identification.  
70 Honorable Dedal agreed to the suggestion and explained further that once the  
71 Ordinance is being enacted, then duly approved by the Municipal Mayor, it will be  
72 the Mayor to accordingly execute and strategize the implementation.  
73

74 Mr. Celso E. Macuto, Chief, Traffic Enforcer, responded that two (2) Traffic  
75 Enforcers lead the concerned vehicle owners to where the designated parking areas  
76 are located. Honorable Dedal is not worried about the transport/passenger vehicles,  
77 he is more concerned with the private vehicle owners who might not easily be  
78 noticed. Mr. Macuto also informed everyone that they are also guiding those private  
79 cars and the like. Honorable Dedal agreed to it, for the meantime this Ordinance is  
80 still in the legislative process, to facilitate a smooth flow of all vehicles.  
81

82 Honorable Bernales is grateful for the suggestions and he emphasized that  
83 the Ordinance is not about parking, instead, prohibiting the entry of vehicles.  
84 However, he assured that all the suggestions will be taken into consideration.  
85

86 Mr. Pamfilo Piamonte, President of the Inopacan Mara-o Transport Group  
87 Inc., raised the following concerns: 1) he informed the Body that they have received  
88 a Notice for the transfer of tricycles' terminal to the New Public Market Terminal. He  
89 suggested having particular streets for a one-way entrance and one-way exit of  
90 vehicles since the road nearby the Town Hall Building is not as wide as a two-way  
91 street. Honorable Bernales, mentioned the existing Ordinance, however, due to the  
92 developments in the baywalk, he assured Mr. Piamonte that his suggestions will be  
93 noted and referred to the Local Chief Executive, for further study so that his  
94 concerns will be addressed. Honorable Siao responded to Mr. Piamonte's concern  
95 by assuring him that they will study the same with the Traffic Enforcers Team and 2)  
96 that loading and unloading within the town are not allowed and a penalty is imposed  
97 on violators. It caused some issues for them especially when their passengers  
98 wanted to be dropped off at stores within the town, hence they don't need to drop  
99 their passengers at the terminal. Honorable Siao told Mr. Piamonte to refer the  
100 concern to the Mayor, who sent the Notice, and the Body could not answer the  
101 concern because they have no idea about it, hence, defer the same at the moment.

102 Honorable Bernales assured Mr. Piamonte that all his concerns will be  
103 forwarded to the Mayor since the Body has no information about it.  
104

105 With the presence of Mayor Pua, Jr., Honorable Alma P. Bisnar, Brgy.  
106 Kagawad of Can-angay, asked the question of Mr. Piamonte, earlier, regarding the  
107 unloading of tricycle/habal-habal passengers at the highway. The Mayor replied in  
108 affirmative. Those vehicles from the upland Brgys. can drop their  
109 passengers/cargoes in the town proper, however, when passengers will be going  
110 home, they have to be at the terminal, and they can pick up their cargo as well at the  
111 stores.  
112

113 The Mayor added that he already instructed the Municipal Treasurer to  
114 prepare stickers for the *private* habal-habal, indicating that they are not for hire. To  
115 this, Honorable Bernales told Hon. Bisnar to relay the Mayor's response to Mr.  
116 Piamonte and the latter agreed.  
117

118 **“An Ordinance Amending Ordinance No. 10-06, Series of 2010, entitled**  
119 **“An Ordinance Regulating the Establishment and Operation of Internet**  
120 **Cafes and Computer Rental Shops/Computer Gaming Shops or Centers**  
121 **in the Municipality of Inopacan, Province of Leyte, and Providing**  
122 **Penalties for Violation Thereof”**  
123

124 Honorable Siao, thanked all the groups of participants as well as the Punong  
125 Barangays present. As the author, he presented the draft Ordinance entitled **“An**  
126 **Ordinance Amending Ordinance No. 10-06, Series of 2010, entitled “An**  
127 **Ordinance Regulating the Establishment and Operation of Internet Cafes and**  
128 **Computer Rental Shops/Computer Gaming Shops or Centers in the**  
129 **Municipality of Inopacan, Province of Leyte, and Providing Penalties for**  
130 **Violation Thereof”**. He clearly explained that said Ordinance is an amendment of  
131 Ordinance No. 10-06 enacted in 2010 and he sponsored the same when there was  
132 no PISO WiFi vendo/machines yet. And for years, the LGU has collected fees for the  
133 business permits of PISO WiFi, in fact, one of those paying for the permit is  
134 Honorable Madrazo. Honorable Siao discussed the entirety of the draft Ordinance  
135 and let the BPLO, Mr. Gilbert Miranda, discuss about permits for the PISO WiFi  
136 operators/owners. Mr. Miranda informed all participants and the Honorable Body that  
137 currently, fees the Treasurer's Office is collecting for PISO WiFi machines is more  
138 than a Thousand, especially for new ones. Then the floor has been opened for  
139 questions from the participants.  
140

141 Mr. Romel Austria, Jr., raised his thoughts concerning the inconsistent  
142 income/proceeds of PISO WiFi entrepreneurs, hence he suggested implementing  
143 uniform (same) rates for all PISO WiFi vendos so that the growing number of  
144 internet operators would not matter. Honorable Siao replied that the suggestion is  
145 well taken and referred them to the Municipal Treasurer for the concern. Meanwhile,  
146 he reminds the owners of the Ordinance that restricts porn sites, not allowing  
147 students in the internet cafes/WiFis from 7:30 AM to 5:00 PM (class hours), and  
148 minors as well from 10:00 PM to 4:00 AM in connection to the curfew.  
149

150 Honorable Yamson asked the PISO WiFi owners if they have such  
151 control/limit from the access of porn sites and the latter answered in affirmative.  
152 Honorable Siao added that online cockfighting which is illegal should be filtered as  
153 well. Views and opinions were aired.

154 Ms. Jenny Degracia of Brgy. Tao-taon asked the Honorable Body as to the  
155 effectivity of the Ordinance. Honorable Bernales explained in detail that the process  
156 would undergo Third Reading, approval, then posting. He said they will be informed  
157 because the Treasurer's Office will roam around purposely for the business permit.  
158 Ms. Degracia asked about the breakdown of the computation concerning the annual  
159 fee of Php 1,000.00 or more. The BPLO replied that everything is being reflected in  
160 the Official Receipt (OR).

161  
162 Mr. Arnel Degracia solicits appropriate action for those entrepreneurs from  
163 the other towns (Hilongos, Ormoc) who installed fiber connections in Inopacan, for  
164 he/they are affected by it since they also are installing PISO WiFi vendo machines.  
165 Honorable Siao replied, they also have to secure and pay for a business permit from  
166 this LGU, and it is the task of the BPLO to check it out. To this, he suggested  
167 providing the list to BPLO and report those without the business permits. Honorable  
168 Dedal added that the LGU has no control over those entrepreneurs for as long as  
169 they are operating legal transactions and paying for their business permits. As to the  
170 question of Mr. Degracia on the payment basis, the BPLO responded that referring  
171 to the existing Ordinance, it is per unit but per bracket. Views and opinions were  
172 aired.

173  
174 As the discussion developed, Honorable Bernales clearly informed all  
175 concerned that the LGU could not assure imposing the "uniform rates" since offering  
176 a lower rate than competitors is what we called, a strategy. Aside from the fact that  
177 some might invest much more than others. He recommends to all internet operators  
178 to organize themselves into an association so that they can agree as to the "rates".  
179 As Honorable Fernando B. Rulete, Jr., Punong Barangay of Maljo, having the same  
180 rate eliminates the sense of competition. Honorable Madrazo explained that given  
181 the same rate of PISO WiFi, the number of hours connected to the internet  
182 differs/matters the most (e.g. some offer Php 10.00 for 3 hours, while others offer the  
183 same rate for 5 hours). As Honorable Siao mentioned the trade secret of Honorable  
184 Madrazo and the latter explained, in connection to the modular scheme during the  
185 pandemic. Honorable Dedal emphasized underpricing benefits against overpricing.

186  
187 **"An Ordinance Amending Ordinance No.17-05 entitled, "An Ordinance**  
188 **Regulating the Operation of Tourist Motorboat" in the Municipality of**  
189 **Inopacan, Province of Leyte"**  
190

191 Honorable Siao, the Author, discussed in detail the entirety of the above-  
192 captioned draft Ordinance, which is an amendment to Ordinance No. 17-05. Mr.  
193 Cordova raised his concern if the 30 minutes waiting time is over and he/they only  
194 have 3 passengers. The case is considerable for Honorable Siao, however, if it  
195 reached 20 passengers, then must leave for the island. Since more tourists are  
196 coming during summer, particularly. More views and opinions on motorboat capacity  
197 and *pakyawan system* were discussed.

198  
199 Mr. Noel Resuena, an operator of a 24 passengers-capacity motorboat,  
200 brought up that per their Certificate of Public Convenience (CTC) issued by the  
201 MARINA, it was specified thereof the "*pakyawan system*" and he is worried it would  
202 cause conflict in case of unforeseen accidents. Honorable Bernales assured that the  
203 concern is well taken and decided to consult the MARINA for this matter. *Pakyawan*  
204 fees by bracket were discussed.

205 Rev. Fr. Eufemio "Femmie" Gohetia shared his experience in Siargao, which  
206 booms because of its island hopping. He said he is not so sure if the amendments to  
207 "per head" has been studied and for his part, do not apply to Cuatro Islas. He cited  
208 that some groups don't want to be joined by other groups. He understood the  
209 purpose of the public hearing and he is into LGU's vision on economic development,  
210 however, he did not agree to collect fees to increase LGU's revenue, recalling the  
211 unpleasant incident years ago, relative to anomalies on the collection of fees done  
212 by LGU employees, as he said. He then exits the hall because he has another  
213 appointment.

214  
215 Hon. Jun Rosenas, Brgy. Kagawad of Apid and a motorboat operator of the  
216 18 passengers-capacity motorboat, expressed his sentiments and he is not into per-  
217 head fare rates, taking into consideration the expenses incurred such as permits,  
218 maintenance/repair, food, and the like, aside from they are carrying passengers  
219 which is so risky for them (operators), especially when sailing against big waves.  
220 Honorable Bernales presented a computation of having 18 passengers at Php  
221 200.00 per head, Hon. Rosenas is worried about having children and Sr. Citizen  
222 passengers which means a lesser fee. Views and opinions were aired, as Honorable  
223 Bernales explained that passengers may opt to pay the capacity of motorboats  
224 which is similar also to "pakyawan system". As the discussion developed, Honorable  
225 Bernales elaborates further that the per-head scheme has gone through the  
226 Technical Working Group (TWG) and everyone must be grateful enough that  
227 operation is back. The *One Island, One Destination* set up, refrains Hindang from  
228 asking for a share of the LGU income. Honorable Rosenas suggested setting a  
229 minimum number of passengers then beyond the minimum, will be charged on a  
230 per-head basis. The scheme in Canigao has been deliberated, in relation to  
231 motorboat capacities. Pakyawan system brackets were presented as follows:

- 232 A) Ten (10) passengers and below: Php 3,500.00  
233 B) Eleven (11) to twenty (15) passengers: Php 4,000.00  
234 C) Sixteen (16) to twenty (20) passengers: Php 4,500.00  
235 D) Twenty-one (21) passengers and above: Php 5,000.00  
236

237 The Body found out that currently, motorboat operators are collecting fares  
238 beyond the provisions of the existing Ordinance. Hon. Jun Rosenas explained that  
239 with the tariff rates stipulated in the existing Ordinance, they were not required for a  
240 license and insurance at that time, only the Mayor's Permit. As Honorable Bernales  
241 told them that their rate set up violates the Ordinance, Hon. Rosenas mentioned that  
242 it has been approved by the PAMB. It was then realized that it was when there has  
243 been conflicts between the LGU and the PAMB, and Honorable Bernales  
244 emphasized that was also the time when the LGU has not been receiving any share  
245 from the income and motorboats were obliged to go to Himokilan. He also made  
246 them understand that currently, the LGU, thru SB, and the DENR-PAMB is in close  
247 coordination, pushed by the motorboat operators' request to bring back the usual  
248 operation for the islands. The computation of Php 200.00 per head is duly  
249 formulated and approved by the PAMB. As to the operator's sentiments having a  
250 lower income with an individual collection scheme, Honorable Bernales then  
251 encouraged them to present a computation, proving that they're going to have a  
252 deficit given the Php 200.00 per head collection. Cited as an example, given the 18  
253 passengers-capacity motorboat (ANDY I / engine 4D30) at Php 200.00 per head will  
254 earn a total of Php 3,600.00 per trip, with the following expenses: 16 liters of diesel  
255 will cost Php 1,120.00; round trip maintenance of Php 300.00; and the cost for food  
256 is Php 250.00 having a total expense of Php 1,670.00. Then half of the net proceeds  
257 (Php 1,930.00) in the amount of Php 965.00 will go to the owner and the other half  
258 (same amount) will equally be divided among the crews.

259 As the majority appealed for help from the Sanggunian to retain the pakyawan  
260 system, Honorable Bernales assured having their computations be presented to the  
261 TWG, and he preferred the presence of the Mayor at that very moment to resolve  
262 the concerns raised, taking into consideration the complaints of most tourists, paying  
263 higher fees compared to other islands.  
264

265 Honorable Siao elaborates that the *One Island, One Destination* scheme was  
266 duly approved by the PAMB. However, he still asked the concerned operators about  
267 their options as to the *pakyawan system*. Mr. Ricky Cordova, and Mr. Aldimar  
268 Rosenas, expressed their sentiments.  
269

270 **With the presence of Honorable Rogelio D. Pua, Jr., LCE, this**  
271 **Municipality**  
272

273 Mayor Pua Jr. mainly discussed the *individual/per-head collection*. He  
274 presented its advantages, attracting tourists to visit the islets, even in a group of four  
275 (4) for instance, as well as the locals, making the tourism industry, boom. He cited  
276 examples with respective motorboat capacities. With the presentation on the  
277 computation of expenses per trip that has been discussed earlier, the Mayor opted  
278 to exclude food expenses amounting to Php 250.00/trip. The operators expressed  
279 their sentiments in times when tourists are just a few. On the contrary, the Mayor  
280 looks at the positive point when they could have 2-3 roundtrips during the summer  
281 season. He even cited that Canigao and Boracay implement per-head collection, so  
282 why not in Inopacan. The Mayor emphasized that there will be no more island  
283 hopping with the *One Island, One Destination* scheme. He further explained and  
284 hoped that the concerned operators will understand the purpose, to increase the  
285 number of tourists that visit the islands, for they are attracted to come back and visit  
286 another islet of Inopacan since island hopping is not anymore allowed.  
287

288 As Hon. Jun Rosenas reiterate once again the suggestion to set a minimum  
289 number of passengers and passengers beyond the minimum, will be charged on a  
290 per-head basis, because children (Php100.00) and Sr. Citizens (Php160.00) have  
291 lower fees. As Honorable Bernales asked the particular number of passengers that  
292 he (Hon. Rosenas) referred to as the minimum, the latter replied, 10 passengers at  
293 Php 3,000.00. To this, the Mayor wonders why they're into Php 3,000.00 *pakyaw*  
294 and not to Php 3,200.00 or Php 3,600.00 *per head* basis. The Mayor wanted  
295 everything to be clear and let the concerned motorboat operators understand the  
296 point of the LGU. That when 30 minutes waiting time is over and for instance, there  
297 will be 19 out of 20 passengers (capacity), then the tourists will have to pay the  
298 equivalent of 1 more passenger. He cited that they have the same plead as the  
299 tricycle operators. An operator asked about having 3 or 5 passengers only after 30  
300 minutes. The Mayor replied that the same question has been raised also by the  
301 Governor and he replied that the tourist may opt to pay as *pakyaw* if they wanted to.  
302 It depends upon the agreement between the tourists and the motorboat operators.  
303 More views and opinions regarding the setting capacity and diesel requirement were  
304 aired.  
305

306 Honorable Pua, Jr., convinced the operators not to worry about the limited  
307 number of tourists coming in because the LGU is trying its best to have more, by  
308 booking scheme in accordance with the carrying capacity of the islet, set by the  
309 DENR. With the high influx of tourists, travel tour agencies will be advised to book in  
310 advance at the LGU to monitor the number of tourists coming in for the day. He also  
311 expressed his sympathies as to the worries of the operators, however, when the  
312 plan takes off, the scheme would benefit them, since the LGU sees to it that their  
313 income won't be losing, and at the same time, affordable for the tourists.

314 He encourages all operators to organize as an association so that they will agree on  
315 all matters. Views and opinions were aired.  
316

317 Hon. Jun Rosenas pleads to exclude the Php 100.00 per trip wharfage fee.  
318 The Mayor lowered the fee to Php50.00/trip. He also informed the participants that a  
319 pontoon pier (floating) will be installed on the island.  
320

321 Mr. Rosenas mentioned about strike action. Honorable Bernales let them  
322 understand that it is not good and the Mayor added that they should consider this  
323 business sector as their livelihood at the same helps the residents of the island earn  
324 an income too.  
325

326 Honorable Panfila I. Alonzo, Punong Brgy. of Tinago, shared her experience  
327 in comparison of the pakyawan system and per head basis, which she favors the per  
328 head scheme to encourage locals and small groups of tourists to visit the islands.  
329

330 The majority of the operators suggested not allowing those non-Inopacnon  
331 motorboat operators to operate. The Mayor is into their sentiments as well, to help  
332 Inopacnons for family living. The Mayor explained everything in detail about  
333 business permits which to his part, supposedly be issued only to Inopacnons hence,  
334 he encourages them to level up their motorboats to a higher capacity. Might as well  
335 organize into an association so that they will be entitled to a livelihood  
336 program/funding from government agencies, just like the jeepney group.  
337

338 Mr. Arnold Rosenas opened up that motorboats with higher capacity entail  
339 higher maintenance costs and are risky in bad weather conditions. And if they're not  
340 gaining, then they may opt to stop their operation. To this, the Mayor opened up that  
341 Tetrapods will be purchased, to protect their motorboats during stormy weather.  
342

343 Since all the operators voted not in favor of the individual collection (per head  
344 basis), and they pleaded to consider the *pakyawan system* the fact that they are still  
345 recovering from the pandemic. They also presented the advantages of *pakyawan*  
346 *system* particularly if the weather is not so good.  
347

348 As the discussion developed, Honorable Siao summed up the sentiments of  
349 the motorboat operators. The Mayor elaborates further on the purpose of the *One*  
350 *Island, One Destination* scheme, as discussed earlier, to avoid conflict with Hindang  
351 and so that the islets will not be abused, to retain their natural beauty. Hence, the  
352 LGU exerted its full efforts to take part once again in the Tres Islas Tourism  
353 activities.  
354

355 All operators deal and agree regarding the opinions of Mr. Resuena, with the  
356 *One Island, One Destination* scheme. Therefore, the Mayor opted to consider the  
357 *pakyawan system*, however, introducing and promoting as well the individual  
358 collection (per head basis). To this, Honorable Siao presented these two (2) options  
359 and it has been agreed by all, that the collection will have these two (2) options:  
360

**Option 1 - individual collection**

361 **Option 2 - pakyawan system** (minus Php 500.00 since there will be no island  
362 hopping), to wit:

- 363 A) Ten (10) passengers and below: Php 3,000.00  
364 B) Eleven (11) to twenty (15) passengers: Php 3,500.00  
365 C) Sixteen (16) to twenty (20) passengers: Php 4,000.00  
366 D) Twenty-one (21) passengers and above: Php 4,500.00  
367

368 As to overnight concerns, the Mayor informed everyone that it will be the  
369 private land/resort owners to take charge of the tourists and collect fees. LGU  
370 caretakers will take charge of the tourists during the daytime only. Hence, the  
371 motorboat operators' task is mainly to ferry the passengers. Views and opinions with  
372 *tamakay* or *sapaway* or *pasa* scheme were aired. As to motorboat Manifest  
373 concerns, the Mayor told the operators to have Manifest both on the mainland and  
374 the island.  
375

376 As to advance booking, the Mayor emphasized that travel tours (package)  
377 had to coordinate with the LGU to identify the numbers of tourists and the  
378 motorboats needed for a particular day. Moreover, the tourist must know the  
379 expenses they will incur in visiting the island/s. The Mayor discussed more on the  
380 advantages of per head collection, which seemed affordable to small peers/groups  
381 of friends. Views and opinions on island viewing were aired.  
382

383 Furthermore, the Mayor informed everyone that LGU Inopacan ties up with  
384 LGU Baybay for tour packages. So from Baybay's well-known 16K Blossoms,  
385 included in the tour package is the Tres Islas. Hoping that this will attract more huge  
386 groups from other Regions, to conduct their trainings in Baybay City, which can cater  
387 big events, hence Baybay collaborates with LGU Inopacan for the Tres Islas,  
388 promoting eco-tourism in Leyte. With this set-up, the Mayor assures that the tourism  
389 industry in Inopacan will boom, hence, they (motorboat operators), will benefit from  
390 it. Thus, he is not worried about the per-head collection. He clearly said that while  
391 the set-up is on-process, he will allow the two (2) aforementioned options. Views and  
392 opinions were aired.  
393

394 With the high influx of tourists, travel tour agencies will be advised to book in  
395 advance at the LGU to monitor the number of tourists coming in for the day. He also  
396 expressed his sympathies as to the worries of the operators, however, when the  
397 plan takes off, the scheme would benefit them, since the LGU sees to it that their  
398 income won't be losing, and at the same time, affordable for the tourists. He  
399 encourages all operators to organize as an association so that they will agree on all  
400 matters. Views and opinions were aired.  
401

402 The Mayor presented the LGU target that by the year 2025-2027, residents in  
403 Digyo will be relocated either to Mahaba or Apid. So that Digyo will be solely for  
404 tourism, still with cottages and stores, but not as residential anymore. To preserve its  
405 cleanliness and natural beauty, as a whole. Views and opinions were aired.  
406

407 Toward the end, Honorable Siao summarized the agreement as follows: a)  
408 that there are two options for the collection of fees, individual and pakyawan (no  
409 island hopping); b) Php50.00 wharfage fee.  
410

411 **"An Ordinance Imposing Regulatory Fee for Visiting Tourist Bound for**  
412 **Apid, Mahaba, and Digyo Islets of the Municipality of Inopacan, Province**  
413 **of Leyte"**  
414

415 Mayor Pua, Jr. explained in detail starting off with presenting the previous set-  
416 up when the LGU do not have a share, came the temporary closure of Inopacan as  
417 entry points, until DENR-PAMB approves the LGU to have a share on the income,  
418 hence, this draft Ordinance. The Mayor presented that of the Php200.00 regulatory  
419 fee, Php120.00 is for the LGU while Php80.00 is for PAMB. Of the Php120.00 LGU

420 share, the Php100.00 will be deposited to the Trust Fund account of the LGU for  
421 relocation purposes of the affected residents, while the Php20.00 is for maintenance  
422 expenses (solar lights/posts installation, etc.) among others. Given the Php200.00  
423 regulatory fee plus Php200.00 individual fare, a tourist will spend a total of  
424 Php400.00 (for individual collection), and the LGU is promoting this. However,  
425 according to the Mayor, considering they are just recovering, he considered the two  
426 (2) collection options, individual and pakyawan. When the Mayor asked them if they  
427 understand the highlights of the draft Ordinances, all the participants affirmed, yes.  
428

429 Mr. Resuena brought up that all of them welcome new investors (motorboat  
430 operators) for as long as they are Inopacnon. The Mayor explained that it depends  
431 upon who the administration is. Once again, he reiterates that they will organize an  
432 association, to be able to discipline the Members (to have control over the renewal  
433 of clearance). Honorable Siao recalled that previously, the ISLA (association)  
434 requested 3 years moratorium (that no new investor is allowed to operate) which has  
435 been granted by the SB/LGU considering they represent and being recognized as an  
436 association. Mayor Pua Jr. is amenable to it and for his part, it is also a way to  
437 control the number of passenger motorboats. Because there is a possibility that  
438 when tourism fully booms, many motorboats are needed which entails also that they  
439 will be earning less. He advised them to positively vision a sustainable future (not  
440 just the current situation), as the LGU Council envisioned a boom in eco-tourism as  
441 well. Views and opinions about wood and fiberglass pump boats were aired. Since  
442 everybody agrees, the Mayor and the Sanggunian thanked all the participants.  
443

444 Since there were no more other questions, the public hearing ended at 4:00 in  
445 the afternoon.
