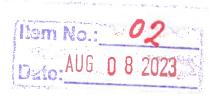

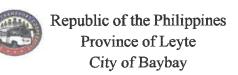

He added that for this years report there are minimal conflicts being reported which is a good signed of unity among the members. The report was been approved by the Chairman.

- The Chairman of the Education & Training Committee Leonardo Plaza reported to the General Assembly the training and webinars being attended by the members and employees of the Cooperative. He reported 10 training and webinars was been attended. The Mandatory Training provided by the CDA and one of the important training to be attended by its Cooperative members was been completed and attended. Certificates of attendance was been issued to the attendees. It was a job well done for all the members for this years improvements in attending training and seminars. The Chairman signed and approved the report.
- The Chairman Jack Noah Cueto presented to the General Assembly the Accomplishments Report for the year 2022. He reported it as follows:
 - 1. Released and launched 12 PUVMP units last April 21, 2022
 - 2. Approval of the application for the DOLE INTEGRATED LIVELIHOOD PROGRAM (DILP) a project of the DOTR under ENTSUPERNEURSHIP PROGRAM worth (Php 500,000.00) of Rice.
 - 3. Purchased a TRUCK (KIA BONGO) for business and multi purpose use.
 - 4. Purchased TOOLS & EQUIPMENT for bus maintenance use.
 - 5. Launched a SUPPLEMENTARY BUSINESS for additional income
 - 6. Extended JOB OPPORTUNITIES by hiring non coop members
 - 7. Constituted 17 Board Resolutions and 1 GA Resolution for new guidelines and policies in operation and management.

He added that for the year 2022 accomplishments the Cooperative is now on its way to improvement.

The General Manager discussed every detail regarding the annual developmental plan and budget with its importance and its purposes. The General Assembly queries was been answered by the Chairman and by the Board of Directors. The Plan and Budget was been approved upon the motion of Gerry Muñez and being seconded by Florencio Plaza.

C. FINANCIAL UPDATES

Before the treasurer Vanessa Senecio report on the financial status of the Cooperative. The Book keeper Lea Plaza notified the General Assembly that the Financial Report for the year 2022 has not yet been audited by an External Auditor and cannot be presented to the meeting. She apologized for the delayed and assures the General Assembly that it will be reported on a Special GA once done. The Chairman accepted and noted the explanation of the book keeper.

The Treasurer Vanessa Senecio reported the Bus Operation Income and Expenses for the month of January 2023. She read all the daily cash received and all the daily expenses incurred by the Bus. She reported the Summary of all the Income and Expenses of the Bus operation as follows:

D. AMENDMENT OF THE COOPERATIVE ARTICLES OF COOPERATION AND BY LAWS

The Chairman Jack Noah Cueto opened up to the members of the General Assembly the decision of the Board of Directors during their BOD meeting to amend the Cooperative Articles of Cooperation and By Laws. He stated that in this matter, in which in the Articles of Cooperation under Article VII- Area of Operation, the principal address of the office was San Vicente St. Brgy. Bitanhuan Baybay City, Leyte and that will be changed into Purok 6, Brgy. Plaridel Baybay City, Leyte, since it was the new location of the office. On the other hand, as he continued he also discussed to the members of the General Assembly the decision of the Board to expand its membership for some members has withdrawn their membership and capital. And to compensate, the Board has decided to amend the Article of Cooperation under Article VI-Common Bond and Field of Membership. In which it was stated that the common bond of membership of the Cooperative is Residential and the field of membership shall be open to all small Operators, Driver-Owner and Drivers who are natural persons, Filipino citizens, of legal age, with the capacity to contract and possess all the qualifications and none of the disqualifications provided for in the By-laws and this Article of Cooperation. And that it will be changed into that the common bond of membership of the Cooperative is Residential and the field of membership shall be open to all small Operators, Driver-Owner, Drivers and

Employees who are natural persons, Filipino citizens, of legal age, with the capacity to contract and possess all the qualifications and none of the disqualifications provided for in the By-laws and this Article of Cooperation. Then the Chairman also added the typographical error in the Article IX- Allocation and Distribution of Net Surplus of the By Laws in which it was stated in the Community Development Fund the 10% shall be used for projects and activities that will benefit the community where the cooperative operates to change it into 3 %. And the Optional fund , Land and Building and any other necessary fund of 6% shall be set aside for purpose to change into 7%. The Chairman Jack Noah Cueto furthermore discussed to the members the importance of this amendment. And upon the motion of Jeoly Mae Cozo and seconded on mass motion it was been approved that the Articles of Cooperation- Article VI and Article VII be amended as well as the Article IX of the By Laws.

E. HIRING OF EXTERNAL AUDITOR

The Chairman Jack Noah Cueto informed the members of the General Assembly for hiring an External Auditor for the audit of the Book of Accounts of the Cooperative. He explained that it is mandatory and necessary. It was been approved on mass motion by the members of the General Assembly.

F. GUIDELINES AND POLICIES

The Chairman Jack Noah Cueto reminded the member-employee and employee to always wear their proper uniform especially while on their duties to avoid penalties. On motion of BOD member Ricky Doguiles that Saturday and Sunday is no uniform day and they are allowed to wear any shirts. It was seconded on mass motion. He also reminded them to always ensure cleanliness of the buses because surprise ocular inspection is always expected.

While BOD member Mervin Dacalos motioned that cash advances of employees will be on scheduled day, and that will be once a week. He proposed that cash advances will only be done every Thursday, except on emergency cases. The proposal was been approved by the members of the General Assembly.

G. AWARDING OF THE CERTIFICATE OF SHARES FOR THE COMPLETION OF THE PAID UP SHARE CAPITAL

The Chairman Jack Noah Cueto announced to the members of the General Assembly and awarded the Certificate of Shares to the Treasurer Vanessa Senecio for the completion of her subscribed paid up share capital of twenty four thousand pesos (Php 24,000.00).

H. OTHER MATTERS

The Chairman Jack Noah Cueto opened up to the members of the General Assembly the problem regarding the Fuel Consumption of the buses. For some of the drivers complained to the shortage of the fuel provided to them. The Chairman proposed for buses with 2 round trips - 15 liters of diesel, buses with 3 round trips - 27 liters of diesel and for buses with 4 round trips - 30 liters. The drivers accepted and approved the proposal. The Chairman reminded them to still saved and not to waste fuel because half of the gross income of the buses goes to fuel consumption.

The Vice Chairman Leonardo Plaza notified the drivers about the renewal of their CTTMO ID and it was necessary to be registered in order to receive assistance from the LGU. He informed them that they must attend the seminars provided by the CTTMO office at the New City Hall every Friday and at the old CTTMO office at the Baybay Gym every Saturday.

The Chairman Jack Noah Cueto notified the Drivers about the LTFRB Drivers Academy. It was been decided that first to be dispatched and to be prioritized are the 12 Drivers with units then to be followed by the 13 reserved drivers. Scheduled of the Seminar will be announced.
