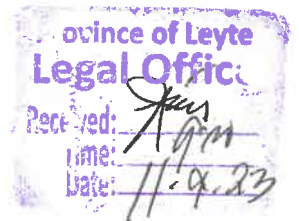

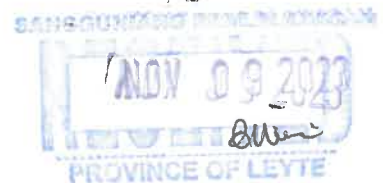

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A RESOLUTION ADOPTED TO CREATE ORDINANCE NO. 48, S-2023-2025

WHEREAS, Section 3, (2) of the 1987 Constitution of the Philippines declares that the State shall defend the right of children to assistance, including proper care and nutrition, and special protection from all forms of neglect, abuse, cruelty, exploitation and other conditions prejudicial to their development;

WHEREAS, Section 17, (b), (2), (IV) of the Local Government code of 1991 (R.A 7160) provides that the local government units shall likewise exercise such other powers and discharge such other functions and responsibilities as social welfare services which include programs and projects on child and youth welfare, family and community welfare, women's welfare, welfare of the elderly and disabled persons, et cetera; and

WHEREAS, Section 447, (a), (I) of the same Code states that, in the exercise of the corporate powers of the municipality, the sangguniang bayan shall approve ordinances and pass resolutions necessary for an efficient and effective municipal government;

THEREFORE, on motion by the Hon. Rogelio J. Baay, chairman, SB Committee on Social Welfare, duly seconded en masse, Be it











RESOLVED, as the Sangguniang Bayan hereby resolved, that Ordinance No. 48, S-2023-2025 be created, *to wit*:

MUNICIPAL ORDINANCE NO. 48, S. 2023-2025

AN ORDINANCE RECOGNIZING THE AGE FROM ZERO (0) TO EIGHT (8) YEARS AS THE FIRST CRUCIAL STAGE OF EDUCATIONAL DEVELOPMENT AND STRENGTHENING THE EARLY CHILDHOOD CARE AND DEVELOPMENT SYSTEM IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF VILLABA, LEYTE. APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

BE IT ORDAINED by the Sangguniang Bayan of Villaba, Leyte in regular session assembled, that:

SECTION 1. Title. – This ordinance shall be known as “AN ORDINANCE RECOGNIZING THE AGE FROM ZERO (0) TO EIGHT (8) YEARS AS THE FIRST CRUCIAL STAGE OF EDUCATIONAL DEVELOPMENT AND STRENGTHENING THE EARLY CHILDHOOD

CARE AND DEVELOPMENT SYSTEM IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF VILLABA, LEYTE, APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFORE AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.”

SECTION 2. Declaration of Policy. – It is hereby declared the policy of the municipality of Villaba, Leyte to promote the rights of children to survival, development and special protection with full recognition of the nature of childhood and as well as the need to provide developmentally appropriate experiences to address their need; and to support parents in their roles as primary caregivers and as their children’s first teachers in accordance with R.A. 10410. Further, the municipality hereby recognizes the age from zero (0) to eight (8) years as the first crucial stage of educational development of which the age from zero (0) to four (4) years shall be the responsibility of the Early Childhood Care and Development (ECCD) Council.

The municipality of Villaba, Leyte shall institutionalize a Municipal System for Early Childhood Care and of Development (ECCD) that is comprehensive, integrative and sustainable, that involves multi-sectoral and interagency collaboration in the barangays of the municipality; among service providers, families and communities, and among the public and private sectors, nongovernment organizations; professional associations and academic institutions in consonance with R.A. 10410, otherwise known as the **“AN ACT RECOGNIZING THE AGE FROM ZERO (0) TO EIGHT (8) YEARS AS THE FIRST CRUCIAL STAGE OF EDUCATIONAL DEVELOPMENT AND STRENGTHENING THE EARLY CHILDHOOD CARE AND DEVELOPMENT SYSTEM APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.”**

The system shall promote the inclusion of children with special needs for reasonable accommodation and accessible environments for children with disabilities and advocate respect for cultural and linguistic diversity, including the use of Filipino Sign language as the visual language of the deaf community. It shall be anchored on complementary strategies for ECCD that include service delivery for children from age zero (0) to four (4) years, educating parents and caregivers, encouraging the active involvement of parents and communities in ECCD programs, raising awareness about the important efforts that improve the quality of life for young children and families.

Section 62. of Ord. No. 30, S. 2023-2025 also known as the Gender and Development (GAD) Code of the Municipality of Villaba, Leyte provides xxx Early Childhood, Care and Development Program & Services, appropriate support services for women and their children shall include creche and day care services for infants and toddlers as prescribed in R.A. 6977 and the municipality of Villaba’s Children Welfare & Development Code.





Section 17. (a) of R.A. 7160 otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991 provides that xxx Local government units shall likewise exercise such other powers and discharge such other functions and responsibilities as necessary, appropriate, or incidental to efficient and effective provision of the basic services and facilities enumerated herein. Xxx (b) Such basic services and facilities include, but are not limited to the following: (2) For a municipality: xxx (iv) Social Welfare services which include programs and projects on child and youth welfare, family and community welfare, women’s welfare, welfare of the elderly and disabled persons:

- a) ECCD Curriculum - The curriculum shall focus on children's total development (and take development) and take into account age, individual and socio-cultural appropriateness. It shall promote the delivery of complementary integrative services for health, nutrition, early childhood education, sanitation and cultural activities. It shall use the child's first language as the medium of instruction;
- b) Parent Education and Involvement, Advocacy and Mobilization of Communities – This component shall harness and develop parent's strengths as providers of ECCD programs at home, as active partners of other stakeholders, as advocates for community organization efforts;
- c) ECCD Management – This component shall consist of a continuing process of planning, implementation, supervision, financial management, monitoring, evaluation and reporting to persons concerned and shall encourage the active involvement of and build the capabilities of service providers, parents and local government official to sustain the program;
- d) ECCD Workers – The existing Day Care Workers assigned to the 36 barangay centers of the municipality of Villaba, Leyte shall now be called as Early Childhood Care and Development (ECCD) Workers.

SECTION 3. Objectives. – The Municipal ECCD System shall pursue the following objectives:

- (a) To achieve improved infant and child survival rates by ensuring that adequate health and nutrition programs are accessible to young children and their parents, from the prenatal period throughout the early childhood years;
- (b) To enhance the physical-motor, socio-emotional, cognitive, language, psychological and spiritual development of young children;
- (c) To facilitate a smooth transition from care and education provided at home to community or school-based setting and to kindergarten;
- (d) To ensure that young children are adequately prepared for the formal learning system that begins at kindergarten;
- (e) To establish an efficient system for early identification, prevention. Referral and intervention for the wide range of children with special needs from age zero (0) to four (4) years;
- (f) To reinforce the role of parents and other caregivers as the primary caregivers and educators of their children especially from age zero (0) to four (4) years;

- (g) To enhance and sustain the efforts of communities to promote ECCD programs and ensure that special support is provided for poor, disadvantaged and linguistic minority communities;
- (h) To ensure that the education of persons, and in particular children, who are blind, deaf blind, are conducted in the most appropriate languages, modes and means of communication for the individual, and in environments which maximize academic and social development; and
- (i) To employ ECCD Worker, including teachers with disabilities, who are qualified in sign language and/or braille, and to train professionals and staff who work at all levels of education.

SECTION 4. Definitions. – The following terms are defined as follows:

- (a) Early Childhood Care and Development (ECCD) System shall refer to the full range of health, nutrition, early education and social services development programs that provide for the basic holistic needs of young children from age zero (0) to four (4) years; and to promote their optimum growth and development.

These programs shall include:

- (1) Center-based programs, such as the day care service established under Republic Act No. 6972, otherwise known as the “Barangay-Level Total Development and Protection of Children Act”, and hereinafter referred to as the child development service, community or church-based early childhood education programs initiated by nongovernment organizations or people’s organizations, workplace-related child care and education programs, child-minding centers, health centers and stations. These Day Care Services shall now be called ECCD Centers of the barangay; and
 - (2) Home-based programs, such as the neighborhood-based play groups, family child care programs, parent education and home visiting programs.
- (b) ECCD Curriculum shall refer to the developmentally-appropriate educational objectives and practices, programs of activities, organized learning experiences, recommended learning materials and appropriate assessment for children from age (0) to four (4) years that are implemented by service providers through center and home-based programs. It shall consist of national program goals and guidelines, instructional objectives, and content outlines that are age-appropriate, individually appropriate and culturally relevant.

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- (c) Parent Education shall refer to the various formal and alternative means of providing parents with information, skills, and support systems to assist them in their roles as their children's primary caregivers and educators. These include public and private parent education programs linked to center, home and media-based child care and education programs.

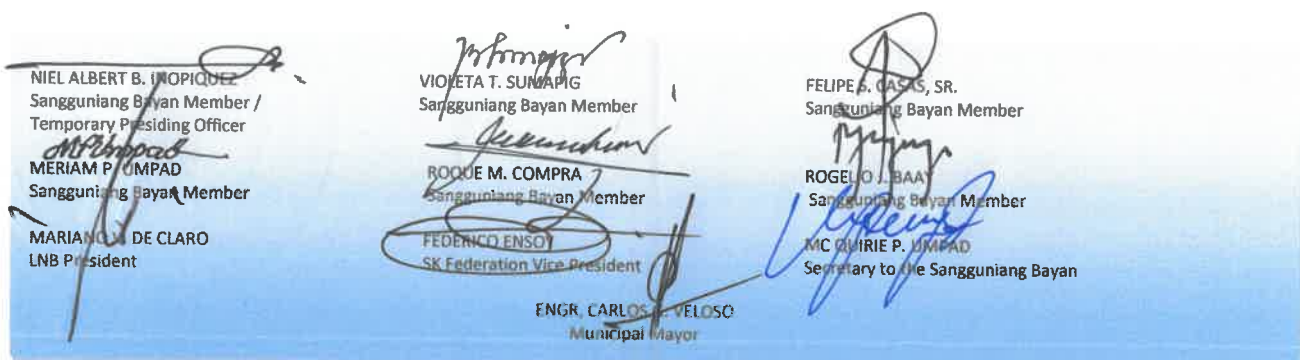
SECTION 5. System Framework and Components. – The ECCD System shall ensure that the Municipal ECCD Program is implemented in accordance with quality standards for accreditation and for this purpose there shall be established Municipal ECCD Monitoring and Evaluation Framework. The ECCD System shall include the following components.

- (a) Honorarium of ECCD workers – All the ECCD Worker assigned to the 35 barangay shall be entitled to receive an honorarium from the Municipal Government of Villaba, Leyte of One Thousand Eight Hundred pesos (P 1,800.00) per month. The Barangay Government where each ECCD Worker is assigned, shall provide also its counterpart honorarium per month the amount of which is not less that 5,000.00 pesos/month or shall depend on the capacity of the concerned barangay.
- (b) Other Forms of Support for Mun. ECCD Programs. – Additional funds may be generated from generous inter-governmental donors, and government financial institutions or provident institutions to support the program.

SECTION 6. Coverage of ECCD System – The Municipal ECCD System shall henceforth apply to all barangays of the municipality of Villaba, Leyte to achieve universal ECCD coverage for all children from age zero (0) to four (4) years old.

SECTION 7. Implementing Arrangements and Operational Structures – The implementation of the Municipal ECCD System in Villaba, Leyte shall be the responsibility of the Mun. ECCD Council and the Municipal Social Welfare & Development Office.

- a) Responsibilities of the ECCD Council – The ECCD Council shall be responsible for establishing standards, developing policies and programs ensuring compliance thereof, providing technical assistance and support to the ECCD service providers/workers in consultation with coordinating committees of the barangay level.
- b) The DepED shall recognize the Municipal ECCD Program as the foundation of the learning continuum and shall promote it for all children from age zero (0) to four (4) years; and
- c) The DepED, the DSWD, the DOH and the National Nutrition Council shall provide continuing professional development program support, supplementary learning materials, reference materials, supplemental nutrition and health care service.













- d) Responsibilities of Local Government Unit – The municipal Government of Villaba, Leyte shall include allocations from their Special Education Fund (SEF) and Gender and Development (GAD) Fund in addition to other local funds to be utilized for the following purposes.
- (1) Support the implementation of the ECCD Program;
 - (2) Organize and support parent cooperatives to establish community-based ECCD programs;
 - (3) Provide counterpart funds for the continuing professional development of the ECCD public service providers; and
 - (4) Provide the facilities for the conduct of the ECCD Program.
- e) Responsibilities of Families and Communities. - Families and communities shall support the local ECCD programs by participating in various community-based projects such as, but not limited to, health, nutrition, social development and early childhood education projects for the overall development of their children from age zero (0) to four (4) years.

SECTION 8. Strengthening the ECCD Council – The ECCD Council shall be strengthened to ensure the municipality’s focus on building a strong foundation for the development and learning of children during the early years from age zero (0) to four (4) years, to support the full range of health, nutrition, early education and social development programs for the child’s holistic development and ensure sustained interagency and multi-sectoral collaboration.

SECTION 9. Organization of the Mun. - ECCD Council – The Mun. ECCD Council shall be composed of the following.

(a) Mun. ECCD Council shall be composed of:

- (1) Municipal Mayor as Chairperson
- (2) Municipal Social Welfare and Development Officer as Vice Chairperson, the following as members:
- (3) District Supervisor of DepEd
- (4) Municipal Planning and Development Coordinator
- (5) Municipal Budget Officer
- (6) Municipal Health Officer
- (7) Municipal Local Government Operation Officer
- (8) Municipal Treasurer
- (9) Municipal Nutrition Officer
- (10) Liga President of the Liga ng mga Barangay

- (11) President of the Parent Teachers Community Federation in the Municipality
- (12) One (1) private individual who is an ECCD Partitioner and expert shall be appointed by the Chairperson upon the recommendation of the Board-Member.

The Council shall meet once in every quarter or upon the call of the Chairperson or four (4) members of the Council.

- (b) Council Secretariat – There shall be established an ECCD Council Secretariat to be headed by the Youth Development Officer. The Secretariat shall provide services for the coordination and monitoring of the implementation of policies and plans formulated by the Council.

SECTION 10. Functions of the ECCD Council. – The Mun. ECCD Council shall carry out the objectives of the Municipal ECCD System by performing the following functions.

- (a) Promulgate policies and implement guidelines for ECCD programs in consultation with stakeholders, including the barangay level when appropriate, consistent with national policy and programs frameworks as defined in R.A. 10410;
- (b) Establish ECCD programs standards that reflect developmentally appropriate practices for ECCD programs, which shall interface with the kindergarten curriculum of the DepEd;
- (c) Develop a municipal system for the recruitment, registration, accreditation, continuing education and equivalency, and credential system of ECCD service providers, supervisors and administrators to improve and professionalize the ECCD sector and upgrade quality standards of public and private ECCD programs;
- (d) Develop a municipal system of awards and recognition to deserving ECCD program implementer and service providers;
- (e) Promote, encourage and coordinate the various ECCD programs of the DepEd, the DSWD, the DOH and the NCC, and monitor the delivery of services to the ECCD program beneficiaries in the locality;
- (f) Evaluate and assess the impact and outcome of various ECCD programs municipal wide through an effective information system;
- (g) Develop a national system for early identification, screening and surveillance of young children from age zero (0) to four (4) years;
- (h) Develop various support mechanisms that maximize public and private resources for implementing ECCD programs, giving priority to the needy and high risk children from poor communities.

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- (i) Provide funds to poor and disadvantaged communities for the establishment and expansion of public ECCD programs, improvement of physical facilities and for hiring of ECCD service providers;
- (j) Promote and encourage private sector initiatives for the establishment of ECCD programs;
- (k) Provide guidelines for the conduct of solicitations from local and international civic organization, and request private foundations to supplement available resources needed; and
- (l) Perform such other functions as the ECCD Council may deem necessary.

SECTION 11. Appropriations. – The amount needed for the initial implementation of this Ordinance shall be charged against the current year’s appropriation of the Office of the

Mun. Social Welfare & Development Office under its MOOE Fund. Therefore, such sums as may be necessary for the continued implementation of this Ordinance shall be included in the annual Budget of the municipality.











SECTION 12. Financing ECCD Programs. – The Mun. ECCD programs shall be financed through a combination of public and private funds. All public ECCD program providers shall prioritize children from age zero (0) to four (4) years from families who are in greatest need and who can least afford private ECCD programs. Community-based rehabilitation programs for vagrants, beggars, street children, scavengers, juvenile delinquents, and victims of drug abuse; livelihood and other pro-poor projects; nutrition services; and family planning service; xxx.


SECTION 13. REPEALING CLAUSE. – All ordinances or resolutions, local issuances or rules inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

SECTION 14. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE. – If any provision of this Ordinance is declared invalid or unconstitutional, the remaining provision not affected thereby, shall continue to be in full force & Effect.

SECTION 15. EFFECTIVITY. – This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon approval from the Honorable Sangguniang Panlalawigan of Leyte.

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

ITEM NO. 1 – Persons Involved

The Committee, through its chairman, sat – in during the meeting of the Liga ng mga Barangay for its public hearing on the above-mentioned ordinances, courtesy of the LIGA President, Hon. Mariano V. de Claro, inasmuch as the Punong Barangays are likewise involved in these ordinances. Aside from the punong barangays, a number of day care workers were also present.

ITEM NO. 2 – Discussion on the ordinance

The proponent of these measures under consideration, Ms. Ma. Flor Pastor, MSWDO, spearheaded the disquisition.

There were multifarious points of importance to the beneficiaries of the programs in the ordinances that the speaker related. Among these were (1) the early childhood care and development, wherein the children from age zero to four years old are regarded as being in the decisive stage of growth, (2)

the welfare of the child development teachers/workers, and in this connection, (3) the monthly honorarium of not less than 5,000 pesos for these child development teachers/workers in the barangays.

ITEM NO. 3 – Concern of the Punong Barangays

The preeminent concern of the punong barangays was the 5,000 pesos honorarium for the child development teacher/worker in the barangay. According to them, most of the barangays can not afford to disburse such an amount.

ITEM NO. 4 – MSWD Response

The MSWD Officer explained that the inclusion of this quota in the annual budget of those who cannot immediately pay in full may be done in staggered way in two or three times.

Finally, the body arrived at an agreement and this issue ended up in good graces.

Having no other matters to deal with, the hearing adjourned at 10:20 A.M.
