SUBJECT: CALL FOR LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNIT (LGU) PROPOSALS FOR

THE INDIAN GRANT ASSISTANCE FOR IMPLEMENTATION OF

QUICK IMPACT PROJECTS (I-QIP)

On 07 February 2023, the Government of the Republic of the Philippines (GPH), represented by the Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG), entered into a Bilateral Agreement with the Government of the Republic of India (GOI), represented by the Embassy of India (EOI), regarding the Indian Grant Assistance for Implementation of Quick Impact Projects (I-QIP).

1. Purpose of the Indian Grant Assistance

The Grant seeks to provide assistance in implementing short gestation projects at the sub-national levels to improve service delivery and achieve socio-economic development. This goal will be achieved through the creation or improvement of horizontal and vertical infrastructures that support transportation and mobility, education, health, sanitation, and access to energy, as well as non-infrastructure projects (i.e. implements, equipment, etc.) and innovative technologies that can aid in achieving disaster resilience, public safety, better livelihood outcomes, and overall community development.

2. Eligible LGUs

All Provinces, Cities, and Municipalities are enjoined to apply and submit their proposals for funding under the I-QIP.

3. Menu of Eligible Projects

LGUs can submit proposals for projects such as, but not limited to, those listed in

4. Project Cost

Projects proposed by applicant LGUs should preferably not exceed a total cost of FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (USD50,000.00) or its equivalent in Philippine Pesos.

5. Implementation Timeline

Initiatives put forth for the Grant should be completed WITHIN TWELVE (12) MONTHS.

6. Application Requirements

- 6.1. Letter of Intent addressed to the Secretary of the Interior and Local Government (SILG)
- 6.2. Simplified project proposal following the official template (Annex A)
- 6.3. Omnibus Sworn Statement signed by the Local Chief Executive (LCE) and the Local Planning and Development Coordinator (P/C/MPDC) (Annex B) attesting to the following conditions with corresponding attachments to verify the same:
 - a. The proposed initiative is the LGU's priority, as evidenced by a copy of page/s from the Local Development Investment Programme (LDIP);
 - b. The LGU espouses good governance in its operations, as implied through copies of the following: (i) certification of Good Financial Housekeeping (GFH); (ii) issuance creating the Local Project Monitoring Committee (LPMC); and, (iii) proof of partnership with accredited Civil Society Organisations (CSOs) in accordance with DILG Memorandum Circular 2022-005 or the "Guidelines on the Accreditation of Civil Society Organisations"; and,

SECTION 4. FUNCTION, DUTIES, AND RESPONSIBILITIES. The SIT shall have the following function, duties, and responsibilities:

1. Ensure that the project implementation abides by the Subproject implementation Guidelines and the provisions of the approved Agreements on I-QIP;

2. Develop a comprehensive Subproject implementation plan for the project, detailing timelines, resources, tasks, and activities;

3. Conduct regular meetings to review project status, identify challenges, and propose solutions;

4. Monitor the allocation and utilization of resources, ensuring efficient and judicious use of funds;

5. Ensure that the quality of the Subproject conforms with established standards;

6. Recommend adjustments or modifications to Subproject plans based on changing circumstances;

7. Prepare and submit regular reports to the Local Chief Executive, copy furnished the DILG, on Subproject progress and performance; and,

8. Perform such other functions related to the I-QIP implementation and management as may be prescribed by competent authorities.

SECTION 5. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE. Any provision of this Executive Order declared illegal shall not nullify the other provisions hereof provided that the remaining provisions can be given force and effect to accomplish the objectives of the Executive Order.

SECTION 6. This Executive Order shall take effect immediately.
