BE IT ENACTED BY THE SANGGUNIANG BAYAN OF TANAUAN, LEYTE IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED THAT:

WHEREAS, Article 2, Section 11 of the 1987 Constitution of the Philippines, provides that the State values the dignity of every person and guarantees full respect for human rights;

WHEREAS, the Commission on Human Rights (CHR) is mandated to develop local policies and legislations that will address issues on human rights, rule of law and access to justice;

WHEREAS, in strengthening the Human Rights Action Center and Rule of Law strategy of the Commission on Human Rights (CHR) and the Department of Local Government (DILG), there is a need to ensure the accountability of local authorities in the promotion, protection and full realization of all human rights, and in instilling greater public awareness on human rights;

WHEREAS, with the continuing human rights violations transpiring everyday, it is high time to create a Human Rights Action Center in the Municipality of Tanauan that shall establish a continuing program of research, information and education to enhance respect for the primacy of human rights.

SECTION 1. TITLE. This Ordinance shall be known as the Tanauan Leyte Human Rights Action Center (TLHRAC).

SECTION 2. COMPOSITION. The Tanauan Leyte Human Rights Action Team shall be composed of the following local career personnel:

2.1 Municipal Mayor as chairperson;

2.2 SB Member Chairperson for Justice and Human Rights as Co-Chairperson;

2.3 Members:

1) Municipal Social Welfare and Development Officer;

2) Municipal Planning and Development Officer;

3) Municipal Health Officer;

4) Municipal Information Officer

5) Tanauan PNP Human Rights Affairs/VAWC Officer;

6) School District Supervisor of Tanauan


7) Barangay Human Rights Action Officer Association President;

8) At least 1 representative from the Civil Society Organization/ Non-Government Organizations/ People's Organizations;



SECTION 3. DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES. The Tanauan, Leyte Human Rights Action Team shall have the following duties and responsibilities:

3.1) Develop and implement the human rights plan of the Municipal Government of Tanauan

3.2) Propose to the Sanggunian the integration of human rights programs, projects and activities in the annual budget appropriation;



- 3.3) Recommend appropriate legislations to the Human Rights Committee of the Sanggunian;
- 3.4) Utilize available resources for human rights promotion activities;
- 3.5) Spearhead and coordinate the implementation of human rights programs, projects and activities;
- 3.6) Serve as hubs for Access to Justice Network;
- 3.7) Posting of human rights programs, projects and activities in the websites, bulletin boards and newsletters of the Municipal Government of Tanauan;
- 3.8) Provide legal and/or paralegal assistance to victims of human rights violations;
- 3.9) Encourage participation of Municipal Government of Tanauan Officials and Civil Society Organizations in human rights promotion activities;
- 3.10) Mobilize sectoral groups and locally-based people's organizations and civil society organizations in the community to participate in human rights activities;
- 3.11) Publish feature articles on various human rights concerns and issues in the websites, bulletin boards and newsletters within the Municipality of Tanauan, Leyte;
- 3.12) Reproduce and disseminate Human Rights Information, Education and Communication materials within the Municipality of Tanauan, Leyte;
- 3.13) Serve as information centers on Human Rights Programs and Services, including referral system within the municipality;
- 3.14) Maintain and update the Directory of Human Rights Programs and Services within the municipality;
- 3.15) Organize the association of Human Rights Action Officers (HRAOs) at the municipal level and support their operations;
- 3.16) Strengthen linkages with the regional/field officers of the Commission on Human Rights (CHR), Department of Interior and Local Government (DILG), other human rights service providers and Civil Society Organizations in the implementation of the human rights programs, projects and activities;
- 3.17) Organize capacity-building on human rights of all Municipal Government Officials in close coordination with regional/field offices of the Commission on Human Rights (CHR) and the Department of Interior and Local Government (DILG);
- 3.18) Establish and maintain a database of human rights situations including the monitoring of status of complaints of human rights violations referred to the Commission on Human Rights (CHR) Regional Offices and other appropriate agencies;
- 3.19) Provide technical inputs on human rights;
- 3.20) Consolidate Semestral Human Rights Situation Reports submitted by the Barangay Human Rights Action Officer and submit the same to the Provincial Human Rights Action Teams, the Commission on Human Rights (CHR) regional or field offices, and the Department of Interior and Local Government Regional Offices, and have them published in the municipal Government websites, newsletters and bulletin boards.
- 3.21) Assist the Barangay Human Rights Action Officers in referral of complaints of human rights violations to the Commission on Human Rights



(CHR) Regional Offices and other appropriate agencies and monitoring their status thereof; and

3.22) Assist the Barangay Human Rights Action Teams in the conduct of human rights advocacy, information and educational activities.

SECTION 4. IMPLEMENTING RULES AND GUIDELINES. In addition to the provisions enshrined under Article 2, Section 11 of the 1987 Constitution and Section 50 (b) (1) of the 1991 Local Government Code, which highlights “ the dignity of every human person and full respect for human rights”, along with the necessity of mainstreaming human rights through the rule of law and access to justice within the Local Government Units, matters not defined herein, particularly the implementing rules and guidelines, shall be governed by the provisions adopted in Joint Memorandum Circular No. 1. S.2014 that was issued by the Commission on Human Rights (CHR) and the Department of Interior and Local Government (DILG) dated December 16, 2014, and which form an integral part of this Ordinance.

SECTION 5. EFFECTIVITY. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its approval.

13 In attendance were the main author – Hon. Cherry Anne T. Fiel; and co-authors - Hon.
14 Paul Emmanuel R. Cinco, Hon. Engr. Jan Elmer V. Magdalaga, Jasmin U. Borja and Hon. Josie M.

17 Also in attendance were representatives from the different Offices of the local
18 government of this municipality, representatives from the Tanauan PNP, Barangay Chairpersons,
19 and the MLGOO.

39 **III. OPEN FORUM**

40 The MLGOO inquired as to the difference of the functions to be performed by the BHRAO
41 and the functions of the Lupon ng Tagapamayapa and whether the Barangay Secretary will
42 automatically be appointed as the concurrent BHRAO, considering that the previous practice was
43 that the BHRAO was either 1) elected through a Barangay Assembly; or 2) the Chairman of the
44 Committee on Human Rights, if the Barangay Council has the said Committee.

45 The main author explained that the provision on the manner of selection of the BHRAO
46 and the temporary appointment of the Brgy. Secretary as such was based on the Joint
47 Memorandum Circular presented by the CHR and the DILG. Hon. Fiel further explained that the
48 Secretary is designated only as the BHRAO in the event that the Barangay has no sufficient fund
49 yet to create the said position and provide for its corresponding salary.

50 As to the inquiry of the MLGOO on the differences in the functions of the BHRAO and the
Lupon ng Tagapamayapa, the main author emphasized that the BHRAO's function is exclusive to



1 concerns and complaints involving human rights, otherwise, the same will be handled by the
2 Lupon ng Tagapamayapa.

3 The Chairperson of Brgy. Sacme inquired as to where can they possibly get the fund for
4 the salary of the BHRAO and the main author answered that they will still coordinate with the
5 CHR for any suggestions so that the appropriation will still be within the guidelines of the COA.

6 The Chairman of Brgy. Solano also asked as to how much would be the salary of the
7 BRHAO and the Chairman of Brgy. Pasil asked if it is possible that their salary will be on a per
8 session basis, to which Hon. Magdalaga answered that since under the proposed ordinance, the
9 creation of the position and salary of the BHRAO is through a Barangay Ordinance, then it is up
10 to the Barangay Council to decide and stipulate the amount and the manner of giving the salaries
11 or wages of the BHRAO. Hon. Cinco added that the Council just have to make the necessary
12 considerations so that the salary will be commensurate to the work done and to the availability
13 of funds of the Barangay.

14 The Chairperson of Brgy. Pasil also inquired on what can the secretary do to handle the
15 human rights cases when the said secretary has no knowledge on human rights to which the main
16 author explained that the Secretary or the BHRAO will be capacitated through trainings and
17 seminars to be provided either by the LGU and DILG in coordination with the CHR. The
18 representative from the Tanauan PNP also added that they also extend and provide trainings and
19 information drive in the barangay in relation to human rights issues.

20 The Chairperson from Brgy. Sacme again asked if there can be a provision in the Ordinance
21 to provide financial assistance to indigent victims of human rights violations to which Hon. Creer
22 suggested to await the response or coordination with the CHR in order to raise the concern if
23 they can request for subsidy from their Office in relation to the implementation of the proposed
24 ordinance.

25 Having no further queries or comments, the Public Hearing was adjourned at 11:25 in the
26 morning.
