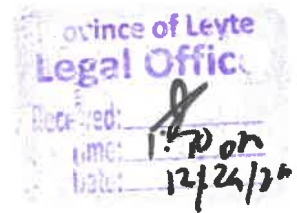
¹ **Section 16. General Welfare.** - Every local government unit shall exercise the powers expressly granted, those necessarily implied therefrom, as well as powers necessary, appropriate, or incidental for its efficient and effective governance, and those which are essential to the promotion of the general welfare. Within their respective territorial jurisdictions, local government units shall ensure and support, among other things, the preservation and enrichment of culture, promote health and safety, enhance the right of the people to a balanced ecology, encourage and support the development of appropriate and self-reliant scientific and technological capabilities,

improve public morals, enhance economic prosperity and social justice, promote full employment among their residents, maintain peace and order, and preserve the comfort and convenience of their inhabitants.

Section 17. Basic Services and Facilities. -

(a) Local government units shall endeavor to be self-reliant and shall continue exercising the powers and discharging the duties and functions currently vested upon them. They shall also discharge the functions and responsibilities of national agencies and offices devolved to them pursuant to this Code.

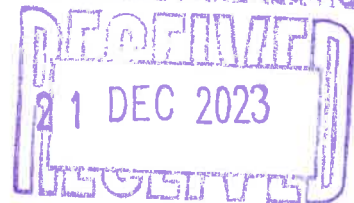

SECTION 1. TITLE. This ordinance shall be known as "An Ordinance Establishing The 2023 Municipal Traffic Code of Macarthur, Province of Leyte and Providing Penalties for Violators Thereof, and for Other Purposes" which hereafter be referred to as the code.

SECTION 2. DECLARATION OF POLICY. It is the policy of this Municipality, particularly the Sangguniang Bayan as the legislative body of the Municipality to enact an ordinance that redound to the benefit and general welfare of its inhabitants. The traffic code is promulgated to prescribed all motorized and non-motorized vehicles for hire and for private use to include the drivers and operators. A comprehensive traffic code rules and regulations, that would ensure the safety of its constituents.

SECTION 3. SCOPE. This code covers all general ordinances and special ordinances of this Municipality pertaining to traffic management and other related matters. This code is likewise applicable to all kinds of vehicles motorized or not operating within the territorial jurisdiction of this Municipality.

ARTICLE II RULES OF CONSTRUCTION

SECTION 1. WORD AND PHRASES. Words and phrases embodied in this code by not herein specifically defined shall have the same meaning as found in dictionaries as well as in existing law.

SECTION 2. CONSTRUCTION OF CODAL PROVISIONS. In construing the provisions of this code, the following rules of construction shall be observed, unless otherwise inconsistent with the manifest intent of the provision or when applied they would lead to absorb a highly improbable result.

a.) General Rules. All words and phrases shall be construed and understood according to the common and approved usage of the language, but technical words and phrases and such other words in this code which may have acquired a peculiar or appropriate meaning shall be construed and understood according to such technical, peculiar or appropriate meaning.

b.) Gender and number. Every word in this code importing the masculine gender shall extend to both male and female. Every word importing the singular number shall extend and apply to several persons or things as well; and every word importing the plural number shall extend, and applied, also to one person or things.

c.) Computation of Time. The time within which an act is to be done as provided in this code, or in any rule or regulation issued pursuant to the provision thereof, when expressed in days shall be computed by excluding

the first day and including the last day, except when the last day falls on Sunday and Holiday. In which case the same shall be excluded from the computation and the next business day shall be considered and the next business day shall be considered the last days.

d.)Tenses. The use of any verb in the present tense shall include the future wherever applicable. The words "shall have been" shall include past and future cases. The use of the word "shall" in this code means the act being required to be done in mandatory, whereas when the word "may" be used, it means permissive.

e.)References. All references to the "Chapters", "Articles" or "Sections" are to chapter, articles or sections in this code unless otherwise specified.

f.)Conflicting Provisions of Chapters. If the provisions of different Chapters conflict with or contra verse each other, the provisions of each chapter shall prevail as to all specific matter and questions involved therein.

g.)Conflicting Provisions of Sections. If the provisions of different section in the same Chapter conflict with each other, the provisions of the section which is the last in point of sequence shall prevail.

SECTION 3. AMEDEMMENTS AND INTEGRATION OF ADDITIONAL PROVISIONS. Any amendment of this code may be introduced to the Chapter, Article or section concerned. All ordinances or provisions thereof enacted subsequent to the date of effectivity of this code shall be complied in such a way as to bear the corresponding chapter, article or section to which such ordinance or provisions pertains. Such new provisions shall be integrated into the corresponding chapter, articles or sections whenever a new printing or reproduction of this code is undertaken upon authorization of the Sangguiang Bayan.

SECTION 4. EXISTING RIGHTS. No right accrued, action or proceeding commence before the effectivity of this code shall be adversely affected by any provision hereof. Thereafter, all procedure or action to be taken shall conform to the provision of this code whenever possible.

SECTION 5. REFERENCE TO CODE. Whenever reference is made to any portion of this code, such reference shall apply to all amendments, and addition now or may hereafter be introduced.

SECTION 6. EFFECT OF HEADING. The Chapter, Articles and Section headings to do not in any manner affect the scope, meaning or intent of the provisions contained in this code.

SECTION 7. RELATION TO PRIOR ORDINANCE. The provision of the Code which are substantially the same as that of provisions or existing ordinances particularly when dealing with the same subject matter shall be construed as "restatement" and not as a new enactment.

ARTICLE III
DEFINITION OF TERMS

SECTION 1. MEANING OF TECHNICAL TERMS AS USED IN THIS CODE:

1. AIR POLLUTANT – Any harmful or undesirable matter emitted in the atmosphere, including smoke, soot, solid particles of any kind, undesirable gases, fumes and obnoxious odor.

2. BICYCLE – any vehicle which has at least two wheels and is propelled by muscular energy by the person operating its motion, or persons on that vehicle by means of pedal or hand cranks.

3. BUS TERMINAL – The new terminal located at Poblacion District 2 in this Municipality. Shall mean a terminal not only for buses but to include multicabs, tricycle for hire and any other means of transportation for hire. A place or area where incoming public utility conveyance could discharge or disembark their passengers and could likewise solicit passengers for their respective destinations.

4. CAPACITY – refers to the space and fitness a vehicle can accommodate passengers and freight.

5. CITATION TICKET – issued by a traffic officer for violation of the traffic code to erring drivers or operators, may it be local citation ticket or that coming from the Land Transportation Office (LTO)

6. DIRECTION OF TRAFFIC – this refers to a particular practice such as a right-hand side drive. Wherein the driver of a vehicle must allow other vehicle to overtake on his left, or that the driver drives his vehicle on the right lane or lanes of the road.

7. DISPATCHER – means any person employed by the Association or operator of any public utility conveyance to solicit passengers for given public conveyance.

8. DOUBLE PARKING – refers to vehicles parks parallel to each other on opposite sides of the road or street from its center.

9. DRIVER – shall mean every or any licensed operator of a vehicle. This term is synonymous to that term "chauffer".

10. FRANCHISE – is a privilege and right granted to a person, natural or juridical, to operate a vehicle for hire serving the public for a fee within the territorial jurisdiction of MacArthur, Leyte subject to the provisions of the franchise of the municipality of MacArthur, Leyte and other related laws.



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11. GARAGE – means a building or compartment of a building used for housing an automotive vehicle; a repair shop for automotive vehicles.

12. GIVE WAY OR YIELD – this means that the driver must not continue his advance or maneuver of his vehicle if by so doing, he might compel the drivers of the other vehicles coming from opposite or other direction to change direction or speed of their vehicles abruptly.

13. HIGHWAY/STREETS – shall mean public thoroughfares, public boulevards, driveways, alleys, and callejones.

14. INTERSECTION – any level, crossroad, junction or fork, including the open area of such crossroad, junction or fork.

15. JAYWALKING – refers to the act of crossing the street, thoroughfares or highways outside the designated cross-walk or marked pedestrian lane or walking inside the designated crosswalk or marked pedestrian lane but in disregard of traffic rules and regulations including hand signal of the traffic enforcer or traffic signal from electronic devices. It also includes walking along or outside the sidewalks of streets, thoroughfares or highways which hinders or obstruct the free flow of traffic causing inconvenience to the motorist or the other pedestrians.

16. LANE – one the longitudinal strips into which the road is divisible which is wide enough for moving line of vehicles.

17. LOADING/ UNLOADING ZONES – are place designated in accordance with this ordinance where vehicles may stop to load and unload cargoes and passengers.

18. MAJOR REPAIR – means those repairs, which require a period of not less than three (3) hours' time for their accomplishment.

19. MOPED – any two-wheels or three-wheels vehicles which is fitted with an internal combustion engine having a cylinder displacement not exceeding 50 cc and maximum speed not exceeding 50 kms. per hour.

20. MOTOR VEHICLE – shall mean any vehicle propelled by any power other than muscular power using public highway and streets. Vehicles that run only rails or trucks, tractors, trailers, and traction engines of all kinds used exclusive for agricultural purpose. Trailers having any number of wheels propelled or it's ended to be propelled by attachment to a motor vehicle shall be classified as separate motor vehicle with no power rating.

21. MOTORCYCLE – a two – wheeled vehicle without a sidecar which is equipped with a propelling engine whose load does not exceed 400 kgs.

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

22. MUNICIPAL TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT OFFICE – an office created under the code headed by the PNP Chief Traffic Division who will manage and supervise the implementation of this code.

23. MOTORIZED TRICYCLE FOR HIRE OR MOTORCAB FOR HIRE (MCH) – is a motor vehicle composed of a motorcycle fitted with a single wheel sidecar, (or a motorcycle with a two-wheel cab) operated to render transport service to the general public a fee.

24. MOTORIZED TRICYCLE OPERATIONS PERMIT OF MTOP – is the documents granting permit to operate issue by the Municipal Mayor to a person natural or juridical, allowing him to render transportation service to the public for fee with the use of a motorized tricycle or other vehicle operating within the territorial jurisdiction of MacArthur, Leyte in accordance with the recommendation of the Municipal Tricycle & Franchise Regulatory Board.,

25. ONE WAY STREET – are streets designated and sign posted for purpose of expediting the smooth flow of traffic.

26. OVERNIGHT PARKING – Shall mean to be the parking of vehicle in the premise of the terminal, or sidewalks authorized as such for parking by the traffic management office from early hours of the evening until and up to anytime past twelve o'clock (12:00) midnight.

27. OWNER/OPERATOR – shall mean the actual legal owner of a vehicle in whose name such vehicle is duly registered at the land transportation office, or at the Office of the Municipal Licensing Officer in the case of none motorize vehicle. He is a holder of a certificate of public convenience to conduct the business of transporting passengers within a given line or route.

28. PARKED – a vehicle is said to be parked if it is stationary for the period during which the vehicle is not limited to the time to pick up persons or goods, means that a motor vehicle has been brought to a stop on the shoulder or proper edge of the highway and remain enactive in that place of close thereto for an appreciable period of time. A motor vehicle which properly stops merely to discharge a passenger or to take in waiting passenger, or to load or unload a small quantity of freight with reasonable dispatch shall not be considered as "parked" if the motor vehicles again move away without delay.

29. PARKING PLACES – are places designated and signposted to vehicles to park unattended for a fee or with the necessary permit for the use of the space provided that the vehicle parked shall be parallel to the curb and the same shall not impeded the smooth flow of traffic or cause to congest the roadway. It can also be any place designated by this traffic code.

30. PEDESTRIAN LANES – areas in the street duly marked with line where vehicles may stop in order that two parallel streets where

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pedestrians may cross in safety, however, in pedestrian lanes manned by a traffic officer or a traffic man, persons may cross it only upon proper signal of said traffic officer/man. And vehicles must stop to allow pedestrians to cross.

31. PEDESTRIANS – all persons commuting on foot on the street or its sidewalks.

32. PERMISSIBLE MAXIMUM WEIGHT – maximum weight of a loaded vehicle declared permissible by a competent authority in which the vehicle is registered.

33. PROFESSIONAL DRIVER – shall mean any driver hired or paid for driving operating a vehicle whether for private use or for hire, who possess a license to drive issued by the LTO or by the Municipality with regards to drivers permit for pedicab drivers.

34. PUBLIC ROADS – includes National, Provincial, Municipal or Barangay roads.

35. RIDERS – refers to person or persons riding, on a motorcycle for a legitimate purpose.

36. RIGHT OF WAY – for the purpose of this traffic code it means priority or preference passage.

37. ROAD – mean the entire surface of any path way or street open to public traffic.

38. SERVICE – shall mean duties, work done for other or business performed, by means of the facilities of the terminal that would in turn ensure the safety and benefit of the riding public.

39. SIGN – is either given by symbols or written words.

40. SIGNAL – is either hand or any device given in contemplation of the law.

41. STALLED VEHICLES – shall mean stationary vehicles which are attended or unattended.

42. STANDING – a vehicle is said to be standing if it is stationary for the time needed to pick persons or to load or unload goods.

43. STOP STREETS – are streets intersection where vehicles must stop upon reaching such intersections before proceeding on and must be duly posted with the sign "STOP"

44. THRU STREETS – are streets where vehicle traveling the thoroughfare have the priority of passage. All vehicle intending to cross said thru streets must bring his vehicles to a full stop before proceeding on, and when no

hazard exist and the operation of the crossing vehicles can be done with safely.

45. TRAFFIC MAN – every police officer or any person duly authorized to direct the flow of the traffic including Boys Scouts or Barangay Tanods who may be assigned with the permission of the Chief of Police or the head of the Traffic Management Office.

46. TRAILERS – any or all trailers designed to be coupled to a motor vehicle in such a way that a part of it rests on the motor vehicle and that a substantial part of the weight of its load is borne by the motor vehicle.

47. TWO-WAY STREETS – are streets where traffic is allowed on both side of the road, or vehicles can travel in opposite directions.

48. VEHICLE – shall mean a conveyance propelled any service whether or not used in transporting people from one place to another. This includes among others bicycle, moped, motorcab, motorcycle, potpot, pedicab and the likes.

49. ZONES – is a contiguous land area or block say a subdivision or a barangay, where tricycle for hire may operate without a fixed origin or destination.

CHAPTER II
TRAFFIC RULES AND REGULATION

ARTICLE I
DRIVING RULES AND REGULATIONS

SECTION 1. NO HELMET, NO TRAVEL POLICY- Driving of motorcycle without the required helmet or head gear as prescribed under RA No. 10054, otherwise known as "Mandatory Helmet Act of 2009", is strictly prohibited within the jurisdiction of the Municipality of MacArthur, Leyte.

SECTION 2. NO CHILDREN AS PASSENGERS OR BACK RIDERS IN MOTORCYCLE- Pursuant to Section 4 of RA 10666 be known as "Children's Safety on Motorcycles Act of 2015" It shall be unlawful for any person to drive a two (2)- wheeled motorcycle with a child on board on public roads where there is heavy volume of vehicles, there is a high density of fast-moving vehicles, there is a high density of fast-moving vehicles or where a speed limit or more than 60/ kph is imposed, unless:
a. The child passenger can comfortably reach his/her feet on the standard foot peg of the motorcycle;
b. The child's arms can reach around and grasp the waist of the motorcycle rider; and

c. The child is wearing a standard protective helmet referred to under Republic Act No. 10054, otherwise known as the "Motorcycle Helmet Act of 2009".

SECTION 3. RIGHT-SIDE-DRIVING. Unless a different course of action is required in the interest of safety and the security of life person or property, or because of unreasonable difficulty or operation in compliance wherewith, every person operating a motor vehicle or an animal-drawn vehicle on a highway shall pass to the right when meeting persons or vehicle coming toward him, and to the left when overtaking persons or vehicles going the same direction, and when turning to the left is going from one highway to another, every vehicle shall be conducted to the right of the center of the intersection of the highway.

ARTICLE II OVERTAKING AND PASSING A VEHICLES

SECTION 1. OVERTAKING A VEHICLE. The driver of any motor vehicle proceeding in the same direction shall pass at a safe distance to the left and shall not again drive to the right side of the highway. Road until safety clear of such overtaken vehicle. The driver of a vehicle about to be overtaken and passed by another vehicle with audible signal being given by the driver of the overtaking vehicle, shall not increase the speed of his vehicle until completely passed by the overtaking vehicle.

SECTION 2. RESTRICTION OF OVERTAKING ANS PASSING: - The following are the restriction in overtaking and passing vehicles:

1. The driver of a vehicle shall not drive to the left side of the center line of a highway in overtaking or passing another vehicle, proceeding in the same direction, unless such left side is clearly visible and free from incoming traffic for a sufficient distance ahead to permit such overtaking or passing vehicles to pass safety.

2. The driver of a vehicle shall not overtake or pass or attempt to pass another vehicle proceeding in the same direction between any points indicated by an official temporary warning or caution signs indication that men are working ahead.

3. The driver of a vehicle shall not overtake or pass another vehicle proceeding in the same direction, when approaching the crest of a grade, nor upon a curve in the highway, where the driver's view along the highway is obstructed within a distance of five hundred (500) feet ahead.

4. The driver of a vehicle shall not overtake or pass any other vehicle proceeding in the same direction, at any intersection of highways, unless such intersection is controlled by traffic signal, or unless permitted to do so by a peace office or traffic enforcer.

5. The driver of vehicle shall not overtake or pass, or attempt to overtake or pass, any other vehicle proceeding in the same direction in any "no-passing or over-taking zone"

6. No driver or a motor vehicle shall overtake another motor vehicle:

- a.) On the right side of the vehicle to be overtaken.
- b.) While driving over a bridge or approaching a bridge
- c.) On or approaching an intersection,
- d.) On or approaching a curve
- e.) Or on approaching a school zone.
- f.) In places where there is a yellow solid line in the centers of the road
- g.) In other where there is a traffic sign marked "NO overtaking"

ARTICLE III TURNING VEHICLES

SECTION 1. TURNING AT INTERSECTIONS. The following rules shall be observed when turning at intersections:

1. The driver of a vehicle intending to turn to the right at an intersection shall approach such intersection in the lane for traffic nearest to the right-hand side of the highway and, in tuning shall keep as close as possible to the right-hand curb or edge of the highway.

2. The driver of a vehicle intending to turn to the left shall approach such intersection in the lane for the traffic to the right of and nearest to the center of line of the highway, and in turning, shall pass to the left of the center for traffic and upon one-way streets, a left turn shall be made from the left lane of traffic in the direction in which the vehicle is proceeding.

3. For the purpose of this section, the center of the intersection shall mean the meeting of the medial lines of the highways intersecting one another, except when it is occupied by a monument, grass plot or any permanent structure, other than a traffic control device.

SECTION 2. U-TURN. Allowed only on U-turn signs or allowed by traffic enforcers:

1. No driver of a vehicle shall make U-turn in places where there is a traffic sign marked as "No U-turn"

2. No vehicles shall make a "U-Turn" in any street unless ordered by any Police Officer performing his official duties

3. No vehicles shall take a "U-Turn" or tags or apparels of any bridge.

SECTION 3. LEFT TURN. No drivers of vehicle shall turn left in intersection or any other place where there is traffic sign marked "NO LEFT TURN".

ARTICLE IV
RIGHT OF WAY AND SIGNALS

SECTION 1. RIGHT OF WAY. The following rules shall be observed in yielding the right of way:

a.) When two vehicles approach or enter an intersection at the same time, the driver of the vehicle on the left shall yield the right of way to the vehicle on the right, except as otherwise provided herein. The driver of any vehicle traveling at an unlawful speed shall forfeit any right of way which he might otherwise have under the provisions hereof.

b.) The driver of a vehicle approaching but not having entered an intersection, shall yield the right of way to a vehicle within such intersection of turning therein to the left across the line of travel of such first mentioned vehicle, provided the driver of the vehicle turning left has given a plainly visible signal of intention to turn as required herein.

c.) The driver of any vehicle upon a highway within a business or residential district shall yield the right of way to a pedestrian crossing such highway within a crosswalk, except in an intersection where the movement of traffic is being regulated by a traffic officer or by traffic signal. Every pedestrian crossing a highway within a business or residential district, at any point other than a cross walk, shall yield the right of way to vehicles upon the highway.

d.) The driver of a vehicle upon a highway shall bring to full stop such vehicle before traversing any "through street". Provided, that when it is apparent that no hazard exists, the vehicle may be slowed down to ten (10) kilometers per hour instead of bringing it to a full stop.

e.) Fire Department's cars, ambulance or any other vehicle authorized to use horns when the same is sounded for emergency has the right-of-way over other vehicles.

f.) Drivers of the above-mentioned vehicles shall sound their sirens only when answering emergency calls of special occasions if so required.

g.) Upon the approach, of an ambulance giving audible signal, the driver of every other vehicle shall immediately drive the same to a position as near as possible and parallel to the right-hand side or curb of the highway, and shall stop and remain in such position unless otherwise directed by a peace officer or until such vehicle shall have passed.

SECTION 2. EXEMPTION OF THE RIGHT OF WAY RULES.

a.) The driver of a vehicle entering a highway from a private road or driveway shall yield the right of way to all vehicles approaching on such highway.

b.)The driver of a vehicle upon a highway shall yield the right of way to police or fire department vehicle or ambulance when such vehicle is being operated on official business and the driver thereof sound audible signal of his approach.

c.)The driver of a vehicle entering a "through street" or "stop intersection" shall yield the right of way to all vehicles approaching in either direction on such "through street". Provided, that nothing in this Section shall be construed as relieving the driver of any vehicle being operated on a "through street or highway" from the duty of driving with due regard to safety of vehicles entering such highway or street nor as protecting the said driver from the consequences of an arbitrary exercise of such right of way.

SECTION 3. SIGNALS. The following rules shall be observed before starting, stopping or turning a vehicle.

a.)Every motor vehicle shall be provided with a stop light which shall be use for slowing down or stopping and it shall be the duty of the driver or operator thereof to keep such device in good working condition, and such light must be installed in a visible place at the rear of the vehicle.

b.)In turning while in motion or in stand still leaving from the parking place, a signal shall be given by raising the left hand horizontally if turning to the left and raising left hand up indicating to the right, if turning the right direction.

c.)Before backing, ample warning shall be given and unceasing vigilance shall be exercised so as to prevent accident.

d.)Three or more blasts of a police whistle is a signal of alarm and indicate the approach of a fire engine or some other danger.

e.)Serene of the fire truck, police cars or other cars authorized to carry the same when sounded in an emergency signal and all vehicle should pull close to the curb and stop immediately.

f.)Every motor vehicle shall be provided with tail lights to be placed at the rear and shall illuminate the license Plate no. of the vehicle.

g.)Police Officer or traffic enforcer could give signals either by hand, whistle or signs or other devices for the purpose.

h.)Drivers and pedestrian occupying the street must at all times comply with all traffic signals, signs, or mark established, thereon.

i.)Every motor vehicle should have two (2) headlights and should be dimmed at night on crossing any street or upon approached of another vehicle.

j.) Every motorcab should have one (1) headlight and one tail light to be used at night, the letter placed on the rear and a device for signaling.

k.) Every animal-drawn vehicle should be provided with two (2) lamps which shall be installed one on each side of the vehicle, such lamps shall have a red colored glass and shall be visible also at the rear. A device should also be provided for signaling purpose during night time.

l.) All bicycle Pedicab/ potpot should be provided with ahead light and a tail light and or reflector to be used during the night and a device for signaling.

m.) All vehicles must be provided with horns for signaling.

n.) All vehicles must use their headlights when in motion during heavy downpour although it may be day time or night time. During clear and good weather all vehicles must use dim lights within the municipality limits during night time.

o.) All motor, vehicles, except privately owned automobile, motorcycles and other such types of vehicles shall bear capacity marking for passengers or freight or both according to that authorized by the Land Transportation Office (LTO) and the MacArthur Traffic Enforcement and Management Board (Mac-TEAMB) and shall be visible on either side by the vehicle.

p.) Any vehicle which has a load extending from the rear should display a red flag one foot by six 1 x 6 inches place at the rear of the vehicle during the day and white flag of the same dimension during the night.

q.) All vehicles which may serve as a storage for gasoline using the public streets shall display a red flag 2 x 1 feet, to be placed on the left side of the vehicle, and the body of such vehicle must be marked the word "GASOLINE" and "DANGER", and all such vehicles with combustible or inflammable cargo shall be shipped with lighting arrestors.

ARTICLE V
RESTRICTIONS ON THE MANNER OF DRIVING
AND SPEED OF MOTOR VEHICLES

SECTION 1. Any person driving a motor vehicle on the highway shall drive the same at a careful and prudent speed not greater nor less than what is reasonable and proper, having the regard for traffic, the width of the highway and for any other condition then and there existing; and no person shall drive any motor vehicle upon highway at such speed as would endanger the life, limb and property of any person, not at a speed that will permit him to bring the vehicle to stop within the secured lean distance ahead.

No person shall operate a motor vehicle on any highway recklessly or without reasonable caution, considering the width, length, traffic, grades, crossing and curvatures, conditions of the atmosphere and weather, so as to endanger the property or right of any person or as to cause excessive or unreasonable damage to the highway, otherwise he will be charge or reckless driving.

SECTION 2. Subject to the provisions of the succeeding paragraph, the rate of speed of any motor vehicle shall not exceed the following:

SECTION 3. EXEMPTION. The speed herein above prescribed shall not apply to the following:

- ◊ Temporary closure of a road or bridge
- ◊ Other justifiable occasions;

ARTICLE VII OBSTRUCTION OF TRAFFIC FLOW

SECTION 1. REGULATED ACTS. No driver of a motor vehicle shall perform any act of obstructing the smooth flow of traffic, including but not limited to, the following:

1. Loading or unloading of passengers or cargoes in places not allowed for that purpose; or in such a manner that the vehicle following behind cannot pass through;
2. Parking a vehicle diagonally on the side of roadway;
3. Driving so slowly in the wrong lane, in cases where the road has two or more lanes; blocking the movement of the motor vehicle following behind;
4. Making repair or changing a flat tire in the middle of a roadway; or a top of approaches of any bridge, blocking the path of the passing or incoming vehicle.
5. Leaving a motor vehicle unattended in the middle of the road or any portion thereof which causes obstruction to the smooth flow of traffic, the same must be posted or towed to the right side of the road nearest the curb.
6. Other unnecessary acts may cause obstruction to the flow of traffic.
7. Double parking which obstruct the smooth flow of traffic.

SECTION 2. LOADING AND UNLOADING PASSENGERS of incoming and outgoing vehicles shall be done at the Bus Terminal or at designated waiting station.

SECTION 3. LOADING AND UNLOADING OF CARGOES of incoming and outgoing vehicles shall be done at the Bus Terminal or at designated area by MacArthur Traffic Enforcement and Management Board (Mac-TEAMB)

SECTION 4. Any street properly designated and signed posted as loading and unloading zone may be used, which may vary from time to time.

SECTION 5. TEMPORARY USE OF SIDEWALK AND ALLEYS. No person shall use and/or occupy any sidewalk or alley portion thereof, which is owned by this municipality, in connection with any



construction works or other allowable purposes, without securing a permit therefore from the Mayor and paying the corresponding permit fee imposed, 2023 revenue code. The period of use and/or occupancy or sidewalk or alley or portion thereof shall commence from the time the permit is issued and shall terminate upon the completion of the construction work and other allowed activities or upon cancellation of the permit hereof.

SECTION 6. The Police Officers, through the Station Commander, the head traffic management office shall be empowered to remove, dismantle and conduct to headquarters any illegally constructed/ displayed goods or edifices that obstruct traffic.

SECTION 7. All vehicles are prohibited to unload sand/ gravel for storing purposes on the roadways.

SECTION 8. Vehicle owners or operators shall not use the public streets as garage for their vehicles unless authorized and upon payment of the necessary parking fee provided for in the 2023 Revenue Code.

SECTION 9. No person shall obstruct or maintain a stall nor shall the owner or lessee of the building thereof allow any other person to obstruct or maintain a stall on a public street or its sidewalk as to impede or obstruct the free passage or flow of pedestrians and/ or passers-by thereon.

SECTION 10. There shall be provided to the Police Station/ the traffic Manager Office either by procurement or chartered by the Municipal Government a tow vehicle to remove illegally parked and other physical obstructions present on the roadway or sidewalk subject to the availability of funds.

SECTION 11. no person shall jay-walk or commit any jay-walking act in any thoroughfares or portions of any roads or streets in this Municipality.

SECTION 12. No person shall use any portion of any public roads for the drying of whatever kind of cereals, buri palms or other agricultural products of for other similar purposes.

SECTION 13. No person, natural or juridical, shall construct or cause the construction of any kind of humps, or place any kind of protuberance, on any public road, without first securing a permit therefore from the Mayor thru the Municipal Engineer and after paying the necessary fees imposed in the 2023 Revenue Code.

SECTION 14. It is hereby declared unlawful for any person to install, or cause the installation of any kind of basketball board, or place any kind of gaming tables or nets and similar kinds of gaming equipment or device

on any public road; or use the public road as a playing field for any kind of games, except during the occasion of town fiesta, barangay fiesta or wake for a deceased person where a temporary permit to use a portion of a municipal or barangay road has been secured from the Mayor, provided that in the case of gaming tables; gaming equipment or contrivance, it shall only be used for games of skill and subject to the provisions of existing laws, ordinances, or rules and regulations on that matter.

SECTION 15. No person shall hawk or peddle any goods. Wares of any article of commerce in any public road or alley, or portion thereof, without securing a permit therefore from the Mayor. Except during the Yuletide Season, town fiesta, or on the occasion of a trade fair, the Mayor may grant a permit for the temporary use of public roads, alleys, and lanes for hawkers and peddles provided that such permit shall not exceed fifteen (15) days and with the concurrence of the Sangguniang Bayan. Provided that the hawking of peddling activity shall not impair or damage any private or public structures cause injury to or adversely affect the right of other persons, the hawking or peddling activity shall not obstruct or cause obstruction to the ordinary flow of traffic;


ARTICLE VIII PARKING

SECTION 1. PARKING PLACE. The following shall be the parking place of all passenger vehicles excluding potpot or none motorized vehicles, and motorpot.

1. Waiting station at Poblacion District II covered court building. If covered court is unavailable due to permitted activities waiting station will take place at the side of the waiting station.
2. All PUJs, Multicab plying the route of MacArthur- Abuyog and shall park at the Bus Terminal and or at designated parking area.
3. All other motorized vehicle for hire plying the route that goes beyond the poblacion shall park also at the Bus Terminal.
4. Places which may be designated by the Police Station. Traffic Management Office and sign-posted, which may vary from time to time
5. All private vehicle may park at their own private parking place or any places not prohibited by this code.
6. All vehicle when parked must be kept as close to the curb on the right side of the center of the road towards the direction of travel.

SECTION 2. PROHIBITED PLACES FOR PARKING. No drivers shall park a vehicle or permit it to stand, whether attended or unattended, upon a highway or any of the following places.

- a. Within an intersection
- b. On a crosswalk
- c. Within six (6) meters of the intersection of curb lines.
- d. Within six (6) meters from the edge of a roadway and nearest to a public entrance to a hotel, theater or public hall while open to the public.
- e. Within four (4) meters of the driveway entrance to any fire station.
- f. Within four (4) meters of a fire hydrant.
- g. In front of a private driveway.
- h. On the roadway side of any vehicle stopped or parked at the curb or edge of the highway.
- i. At any place where official signs have been erected or installed prohibiting parking
- j. Within four (4) meters of the driveway to any hospital.
- k. Opposite a parked vehicle (double parking)
- l. On the bridge or within fifty (50) meters from the foot of a bridge, over or under or across the highway;
- m. On a highway in such a manner as to obstruct, or cause the obstruction of, the smooth flow of traffic;
- n. On other places which are officially designated by the Sanggunian thru the recommendation of the PNP and the traffic management office as a "No Parking" area. Which may vary from time to time.
- o. All vehicles are prohibited to park on the left side of any street towards the direction of the vehicles travel.
- p. No vehicles shall park on the main entrance of stadium, banks, during banking hours, during classes in schools, services in churches, and at all times on the entrance of the hospitals and other government offices.
- q. There shall be no double parking on any street within the municipality.
- r. No vehicle shall park within the vicinity of any ship or motor launch at all times on the wharf.
- s. All vehicles are not allowed to park on any street or place not allowed by this code for parking, or when it is prohibited by the police or the



t. No vehicles shall park on any other street not designated as parking area.

u. Pedicab or potpot and motorpot are not allowed to park inside the Bus Terminal.

SECTION 3. ALLOWABLE TEMPORARY PARKING. Stopping a motor vehicle temporarily shall not be considered as parking which is prohibited in this Article under the following circumstances:

1. If the driver merely stops his vehicle temporarily in order to buy something from a nearby store, provided, that its shall not last for more than ten (10) minutes;
2. If the driver is merely loading or unloading a passenger or cargo in places where it is allowed;
3. When the motor vehicle suffered an engine breakdown;
4. When the driver is making a minor repair or changing a flat tire.

SECTION 4. STALLED OR ILLEGALLY PARKED MOTOR VEHICLE shall be towed by the operator thereof within one (1) hour from the time said vehicle stalled due to mechanical breakdown or parked. Otherwise, it shall be towed and impounded by the MacArthur Traffic Enforcement and Management Board (Mac-TEAMB) or PNP MacArthur at the expense of the operator of such vehicle in the amount prescribed in the revenue Code of 2023.

In the event of non-availability of government operated towing vehicle, the law-enforcement personnel concerned may call upon the operator of the nearest privately-owned tow vehicle, preferably a duly accredited one, to tow the stalled or illegally parked motor vehicle to impounding area and the cost of which shall be paid by the operator of such vehicle.

ARTICLE IX

RULES AND REGULATIONS ON MOTOR VEHICLE ACCESSORIES

SECTION 1. TIRES OF MOTOR VEHICLE. No motor vehicle with metallic tires shall be operated upon any public highway, and solid tires whenever used to be of sufficient thickness to prevent the metal rims thereof from coming in direct contact with the road.

SECTION 2. BRAKES. Every motor vehicle with four or more wheels shall be provided with dual hydraulic brake system so that in case of hydraulic line failure affecting the braking efficiency of any of the four wheels at least either the front or rear wheels shall retain normal braking capabilities. In the absence of such dual braking system, every motor vehicle with four or more wheels shall be provided with safety valve


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





devices of such design and make so that failure of the hydraulic braking system of the vehicle because of leakage in the line or other parts of the system will not affect all wheels but rather render at all times effective the braking power of either the two front wheels or the two rear wheels when brakes not apply to motor vehicles equipped with pneumatic braking system, pedicab or potpot likewise should provide an effective braking system.

SECTION 3. HORNS. Every motor vehicle shall be provided with a horn or signaling device in good working order. Provided, however, that no horn or signaling device emitting an exceptionally loud, startling, or disagreeable sound shall be installed or used on any motor vehicle.

All authorized emergency vehicles, such as ambulance and police cars and fire wagons used for emergency calls shall be equipped with a bell, siren, or exhaust whistle or a type approved by the Land Transportation Office (LTO) and no such device shall be installed or used in any other vehicle.

No vehicle not classified as a "motor vehicle" shall be equipped with a horn or signaling device similar to the horn customarily used on motor vehicle.

Pedicab must have their own horn device not similar to that of a motor vehicle.

SECTION 4. HEADLIGHTS. Every motor vehicle of more than one (1) meter of projected width, while in use on any public highway, shall bear two (2) headlights, one on each side, with white or yellowish light visible from the front, which, not later than one hour after sunset and until at least one-half hour before sunrise and whenever weather conditions so require, shall both be lighted.

Additional lamps and light may be carried but no red light shall be visible forward or ahead of the vehicle. Trucks, buses, trailers, and other similar vehicles must carry, while in use on any public highway during night-time colored riding lights on each of the four corners not more than ten (10) centimeters from the top.

All motor vehicles shall be equipped with devices for carrying the intensity of light, and the driver must dim the headlights or tilt the beams downward whenever the vehicle is being operated on well-lighted streets or whenever such vehicle meets another vehicle on any public highway.

SECTION 5. TAIL-LIGHTS. Every motor vehicle and trailer shall, during the above-mentioned hours, also bear on each side in the rear a lamp showing a red light visible at least one hundred (100) meters from the rear of the vehicle and a lamp throwing a white light upon the number plate issued for such vehicle.

SECTION 6. STOP LIGHTS. Every motor vehicle shall be equipped at the rear with at least one lamp which shall throw a sustained bright red light

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visible under all conditions, even under bright sunlight, when the brakes are applied. Each bus, truck, trailer, or similar vehicle shall be equipped, as its stop light at or near its rear center, with a lamp at least twelve centimeters.

SECTION 7. PEDICAB OR POTPOT – if use between 6:00 p.m. to 5:00 a.m must be provided with headlights and other warning signals such as reflectors.

SECTION 8. LIGHTS WHEN PARKED OR DISABLED – appropriate parking lights or flares visible one hundred (100) meters away shall be displayed at a corner of the vehicle whenever such vehicle is parked on highways or in places that are not well-lighted, or is placed in such a manner as to endanger passing traffic. Furthermore, every vehicle shall be provided at all times with built-in reflectors or other similar warning devices either pasted, painted or attached at its front and back which shall likewise be visible at night at least one hundred (100) meters away. All vehicles should provide an early warning device.

SECTION 9. WINDSHIELD WIPER FOR 4 WHEELS VEHICLES – Every motor vehicle shall be equipped with a mechanically or electrically operated device for wiping of raindrops or other moisture from its windshield which come within the driver's view.

SECTION 10. USE OF RED FLAG – Whenever the load of any vehicle extends more than one meter beyond the bed or body thereof, there shall be displayed every projecting and of such load a red flag not less than 30 centimeters in length and in width. Such red flag shall be visible at least 50 meters away.

SECTION 11. EQUIPMENT AND CONDITIONS – Every vehicle for hire shall be strongly built, well balanced and neatly painted, upholstered seats, side and back rest, provided with headlights, stop light, and signal lights, horns, with waterproof top, side curtains and rain aprons.

SECTION 12. All vehicles shall be equipped with a silencer and speedometer.

SECTION 13. MUFFLERS – Every motor vehicle propelled by an internal combustion engine shall be equipped with a muffler and whenever said vehicle passes through a street of the municipality any thickly populated district or barrio, the muffler shall not be cut out or disconnected.

SECTION 14. TRASH CAN/BOX. All vehicle should provide a trash can/box inside their respective vehicles.

SECTION 15. All requirements stated above are addressed to the owner thereof, they are all designated to give safety to the driver of the vehicle, as well as the other vehicles and to the public in general.



SECTION 1. RECKLESS DRIVING. No person shall operate a motor vehicle on any highway recklessly or without reasonable caution considering the width, traffic, grades, crossing, curvatures, visibility and other conditions of the highway and the conditions of the atmosphere and weather, or so as to endanger the property or the safety or rights of any person or so as to cause excessive or unreasonable damage to the highway.

No driver of a motor vehicle shall commit any reckless driving acts including, but not limited to the following:

1. Cutting in and out of the traffic lanes;
2. Cutting corner or blind curve;
3. Cutting in front of another moving vehicle;
4. Making "U" turn on the approach or on top of a bridge or elsewhere
5. Passing or overtaking on curves, at intersections and approached of bridges, hills and the like;
6. Racing on the roads or streets;
7. Sudden stopping without justifiable reasons;
8. Coming out of side streets or driveways without precautions;
9. Failure to stop on entering a "through street"
10. Failure to consider proper clearance when overtaking;
11. Failure to observe right hand rule to yield the "right of way" at highway intersection;
12. Driving on the wrong side of the street or road;
13. Backing against the flow of traffic;
14. Over-speeding or driving beyond the prescribed speed limits;
15. Running down a legitimately established barricade;
16. Turning from wrong lane;
17. Improper start from parked position;
18. Driving without lights during the hours prescribed by law;
19. Driving against "one way" streets
20. Disregarding automatic signaling devices or lights or any traffic signs; beating the red light of a traffic signaling device;

SECTION 2. HITCHING TO A VEHICLE. No person shall hang on to, or ride on, the outside rear of any vehicle, and no person on a bicycle, roller skate or other similar device, shall hold fast to or hitch on to any moving vehicle, and no driver shall knowingly permit any person to hang on, to ride on, the outside or rear end of his vehicle or allow any person on a bicycle, roller skate or other similar device to hold fast or hitch to his vehicle.

SECTION 3. DRIVING OR PARKING ON SIDEWALK. No person shall drive or park a motor vehicle upon or along any sidewalk, path or alley not intended for vehicular traffic or parking.

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SECTION 4. DRIVING WHILE UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF LIQUOR OR NARCOTIC DRUGS. No person shall drive a motor vehicle while under the influence of liquor or narcotic drug.

SECTION 5. DUTY OF DRIVER IN CASE OF ACCIDENT. In the event that any accident should occur as a result of the operation of a motor vehicle upon a highway, the driver of that vehicle shall stop immediately, and, if requested by any person present, shall show his driver's license, give his true name and address and also the true name and address of the owner of the motor vehicle.

No driver of a motor vehicle concerned in a vehicular accident shall leave the scene of the accident without aiding the victim, except under any of the following circumstances:

- 1.If he is in imminent danger of being seriously harmed by any person or persons by reason of the accident;
- 2.If he reports the accident to the nearest officer of the law; or 3. If he has to summon a physician or nurse to aid the victim.


SECTION 6. Every motor vehicles using the street of Municipality must be provided with the necessary license and registration as authorized by law. All persons operating any motor vehicles shall first secure the necessary driver's license from the land transportation office (LTO) or from the Municipal Treasurer Office (MTO) with regards to the pedicab or potpot drivers. Before they can apply a permit to operate within the municipality.

SECTION 7. Every motor vehicle, habal-habal and potpot/pedicab operating in the Municipality must be a member of duly Registered and Accredited association in the municipality such as Tricycle Operator Driver's Association (TODA), Habal-habal Association or Pedicab Drivers Association as a pre-requisite to apply for a permit or franchise.


SECTION 8. All public utility vehicles before being operated within the streets of the Municipality shall have a Police Number. For this purpose, every owner, operator or drive shall report to the Police Department through the Municipal Traffic Management Office in order that a number may be assigned to the vehicle according to specification herein to wit:

- 1.REAR – Right-side) – shall painted in dark color over a white square field, 9 inches long and 9 inches wide.
- 2.FRONT (left-side) – large enough to be easily read at a distance of not less than 30 meters away.
3. INSIDE (right-front) – large enough to be easily read by passengers.

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SECTION 9. All vehicles for hire must secure a business plate. Such plate number shall be kept clean and cared for and shall be firmly affixed by the owner or operator in a manner to be entirely visible and always legible, and not wholly or partly hidden or obscured by bumpers, or other parts of the vehicles or by articles of any description carried on such vehicle.

SECTION 10. Owners or operators of vehicles must know the names and address of the drivers, plate numbers of their vehicle and must furnish them to any Police Officer when demanded in the investigation of crimes or accidents. Drivers of any kind of vehicles for hire should secure from the Municipal Licensing Officer an Identification Card and must wear the same while driving.

SECTION 11. Owners or operators of a public utility vehicles shall have the registration of the vehicle carried whenever the vehicle is operated or a copy thereof duly signed and subscribed under oath by the owner or operator. Certified photocopy may be used in lieu of the original.

SECTION 12. Motor vehicles such as private passenger car, or private motorcycle or any kind of vehicle which is classified as private shall not be used for hire under any circumstance either for freight or passengers.

SECTION 13. It is unlawful to use an unauthorized license, plate number or engine of a motor vehicle. It is likewise prohibited to operate a police number of another vehicle not properly given such number in order that the latter shall be operated within the municipality. The owner or operator of such vehicle shall be held liable thereof.

SECTION 14. Operators or owners of any motor vehicle when in use for the purpose of collecting garbage refuse, trash, or the like, shall so construct the body of their vehicle in order that such matter shall not be scattered on the streets. In this connection, such work should be carried out during night time when there are less pedestrians and houses are closed.

SECTION 15. Operators or drivers of any vehicle carrying explosives, chemicals, materials and the like which are dangerous to the public shall, before it is operated, secure the necessary permit from the office of the Fire Station Commander and the Office of the Station Commander of the PNP. The Office concerned herein shall see to it that permission shall not be given in transporting of said materials if such will cause grave and immediate danger to human lives. It otherwise, its safe transportation should be granted only after necessary precaution has been adopted and the proper signals displayed in accordance with this code. The above paragraph shall also apply to vehicles used for the delivery of gasoline from depots to gasoline station. "And shall pay the necessary fee provided in the 2023 Revenue Code"

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SECTION 16. The motor of any vehicle shall be stopped whenever the vehicle is left parked or unattended on any street.

SECTION 17. No more vehicle shall be operated in such a manner as to cause it to emit or make any unnecessary odor smoke or noise. No unnecessary noise shall be given off or any smoke be emitted out that is obnoxious to persons.

SECTION 18. All vehicles moving on public streets shall, before traversing a Thru-Street, be brought to a full stop. Whenever it is sign-posted, it shall be unlawful for the driver of any vehicle to fail to stop within 20 meters, but not less than 2 1/2 meters from such thru=street even if it is apparent that no danger exists.

SECTION 19. All vehicles shall not take more than the allowed passengers or more freight or cargo in the vehicle than its registered carrying capacity.

1. For other vehicles, the capacity limit for passengers should be followed:

- a. Only one person is allowed on a bicycle.
- b. Pedicabs, two (2) passengers.
- c. Motorized Tricycle (MCH) – six (6) passengers only.
- d. Motorcycle 3 riders
- e. All four-wheel vehicle as prescribed by the LTO.
- f. Motorpot 2 passenger excluding the driver.

2. In connection with the above paragraph, the following are held liable for such offense:

- a. For public utility passenger buses or cars, the conductors shall be held liable.
- b. For auto calesas, motorcabs, pedicabs, and other slow-moving vehicles, the one conducting the conveyance shall be held liable. For TH trucks- TTrucks and passenger automobiles for private use, the driver thereof shall be held liable.

3. No drivers of a motorcycle shall allow any rider to set in front of the driver while negotiating within the territorial limit of the municipality.

SECTION 20. No person having control of any vehicle shall negligently allow it to run a foul on any person, vehicle or other things not shall such person fail to stop his vehicle in order to render assistance to a person injured or give his name and vehicle number when demanded by anybody therein.

SECTION 21. The license or its duplicate in case of its loss shall be carried by the driver at all times when operating a motor vehicle and shall be shown to any police officer/ traffic enforcer on request. Potpot driver shall at all time wear their ID's issued by the municipality.

SECTION 22. Every driver of any vehicle who shall discover any parcel left by any passenger shall immediately deliver the same to the owner or



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

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to any police officer and should be turned over to the Police Station. The same shall be properly receipted.

SECTION 23. Every driver of any vehicle where any of his passengers is unruly, disorderly in manners, or one who tries to interfere in the operation of the vehicle shall stop his vehicle upon the first Police Officer. Traffic enforcer in the nearest barangay and shall report the matters. Such disorderly, unruly or interfering person shall be held liable under his code.

SECTION 24. It is unlawful for any person to operate or drive a vehicle going against the direction of a one-way street.

SECTION 25. In connection with conduct of vehicles, no person under the age Eighteen (18) years shall drive or conduct any vehicle. Drivers while conducting the vehicles shall be neatly dressed, and in no case be in their underwear's. Drivers of a motor vehicles when conducting the same shall wear shoes and in no case be on their bare feet or slippers, while performing his work as Public Utility Drivers. He shall be familiar with the names and location of the streets and other places in the Municipality.

SECTION 26. No licensed driver shall permit any unlicensed person to conduct his vehicle under his control not permit another to interfere in the operation of the vehicles. He shall have in his possession his licensed to drive with the appropriate restriction code to drive a vehicle, schedule of rates and photocopy of the registration certificate of the said vehicle.

SECTION 27. No driver of any public passenger vehicle shall smoke while operating his vehicle.

SECTION 28. Any person driving a vehicle shall stop upon signal of any Police Officer, or other law enforcement officers and shall give their license to operate a vehicle when so demanded, asking proper receipt thereof, it is hereby made the duty of such officers to give the necessary receipt for the license when taken.

SECTION 29. No motor vehicle shall carry a load on its top without the necessary permit from the Land Transportation Office.

SECTION 30. No person is allowed as passenger on any pulled trailer intended for cargo nor such trailer shall be utilized for advertisement or other purpose other than for cargo.

SECTION 31. No person shall ride on the running board, stop board, mudguards of any vehicle for any purpose except for the necessary adjustment of the vehicle's motor, the conductor when making collection, an inspector when pursuing his duties. For this purpose, the conductor is liable in case of passenger vehicle and the driver is liable in case of other motor vehicles.

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SECTION 32. No racing of any kind of vehicles is permitted on any street. "Except with the permission of the Chief of Police, who is enjoined to provide adequate precautions to forestall accident"

SECTION 33. No person shall ride an untamed animal within the streets, and to wash any animal or vehicle on the streets.

SECTION 34. No person shall puncture or otherwise injure the tires or any part of a vehicle.

SECTION 35. It is prohibited absolutely to pass a vehicle over fire hoses laid by the Fire Department.

SECTION 36. No person shall cause to be thrown, dropped, placed on any street any truck, nail, sharp metal or other material injuring to the feet of passenger, or tires of other vehicles.

SECTION 37. No person shall spit or expectorate on the floor, sides, steps or place the feet upon the seat ahead of them on any public vehicle.

SECTION 38. The driver or a vehicle shall not refuse any passenger, except:

1. When the car is fully loaded;
2. When the passenger is drunk, except upon order of a Police Officer,
3. Person known to be affected with communicable diseases' or
4. When he is carrying anything obnoxious that nuisance or illing passengers that would endanger the health of the other passenger.

SECTION 39. No driver or conductor or any public vehicle shall take an amount higher than the allowed rate established by the Land Transportation Office (LTO), as approved by the Public Service Commission (PSC) respectively or thru an ordinance promulgate by the Sangguian as recommended by the Municipal Tricycle Franchising Regulatory Board.

SECTION 40. No person shall blow the horn of a vehicle unnecessarily except in case of emergency in any place with in the town, nor shall blow or play music or announcement with the use of a loud speaker or amplifier in court zones, Hospital Zones and School zones. The accouchement made or music played should be modulated in volume so as not to constitute a disturbance or annoyance to the public. It is unlawful to use air horns, within the town limits of MacArthur.

SECTION 41. No vehicle with transaction tire shall be allowed in the streets of MacArthur, Leyte unless permission is granted by the Municipal Mayor, with the favorable recommendation of the Municipal Engineer.


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

SECTION 42. No person shall disseminate any advertisement or anything by using a vehicle with a public address system without its permit from the Municipal Mayor, with the favorable recommendation of the Chief of Police and after paying the necessary amount prescribed in the 2023 Revenue Code,

SECTION 43. No vehicle after having been declared "UNSERVICEABLE" shall be operated in the Municipal Streets. The driver or the owner shall be held liable thereof.

SECTION 44. it is unlawful to drop or cause to be dropped leaflets, programs, advertisements or other propaganda of any industry, business, shows or in motion within the streets of the town. The person dropping or causing the same to be dropped or the manager of the enterprise shall be held liable.

SECTION 45. All persons and vehicles within the hearing distance of any announcement being made by the authorities shall immediately stop and the driver should stop the motor of their vehicle in order to maintain silence, so that the public can hear well.

SECTION 46. it is unlawful for any person to operate or drive motor vehicles having a weight of more the TWO and ONE-HALF (2- 1/2) tons on any street in the town without the written permission of the Municipal Mayor with the favorable recommendation of the Municipal Engineer and after paying the necessary payment prescribed in the 2023 Revenue Code.

SECTION 47. No person shall operate any vehicle on the public highways, or any street or road without having procured a driver's license for the current year, nor while such license is delinquent, invalid, suspended or revoked.

SECTION 48. Every license or duplicate thereof issued to operate a vehicle shall bear a recent readily recognizable photograph of the license which shall be securely attached to the license.

SECTION 49. No person shall operate a motor vehicle with an expired Citation Ticket.

SECTION 50. No person shall use a siren in his vehicle for signaling or otherwise, except said sirens shall only be sounded in an emergency.

SECTION 51. All vehicles should stop intersections and remain immobile at the proper places during parades, motorcades and other public functions that requires the use of the entire roadway. Only after the last element of the unit shall have passed by the intersection will motorist be allowed to move towards their direction of travel.

SECTION 52. Pedestrians while crossing the roadway shall use the pedestrian/ lanes/ crosswalks designated for each purpose.

SECTION 53. All vehicles approaching pedestrian lanes and even if there are none using the same, they should slow down.

SECTION 54. No three passengers shall be allowed on the right-side front seat of the driver, likewise no passenger is allowed on the left side front seat of the driver of any vehicle for hire in the Municipality of MacArthur.

SECTION 55. All persons engaged in the dispatching of vehicle for hire, must, before engaging in the business, first secure a Mayor's Business Permit with a favorable endorsement from the MacArthur, Leyte Police Station. Such business permit be issued with corresponding ID to identify such person and should be wear always while dispatching vehicles.

Operators of passenger buses or any public utility conveyance may be allowed or permitted to employ dispatchers; provided, that dispatchers as employed shall have to be bonded in the amount of not less than one thousand pesos (P1,000.00) either in cash or property bond, the same being answerable to whatever loss/es that any passenger may suffer in the course of handling such cargo or cargoes and/or effects by the dispatcher concerned, properly identify by wearing their respective uniforms and nameplates and in no case shall any person be employed as such if he/she has been convicted of a crime involving moral turpitude, and for this purpose, police and court clearance shall have to be secured before his/her employment as dispatcher by any given bus or any public utility conveyance operator. The necessary permit, however, shall have to be secured from the Office of the Municipal Mayor before any dispatcher could exercise such privilege within the municipality.

To ensure an orderly, peaceful, and disciplined passenger dispatch in the bus terminal, all dispatcher as employed by the or respective bus or any public utility conveyance operator shall be under the control and supervision of the Municipal Market Administrator or the Municipal Supervising Dispatcher to be appointed and/or designated by, and who shall be directly responsible to the Municipal Mayor and emolument shall be provided for in the budget in case of appointment. The Municipal Supervising Dispatcher shall be responsible for the conduct, behavior and proper discipline of the different bus or any public utility conveyance dispatcher brought under his control and supervision.


Utmost courtesy and honesty shall be accorded to all and every passenger by the dispatcher and in no case shall roughness and discourteous conduct be made.

SECTION 56. Owners/operators of Gasoline Service Station shall not tolerate to utilize said service station as waiting station for passengers of all kinds of vehicles.



It shall be prohibited and shall be considered a violation of this code for a passenger bus or any public conveyance driver, conductor, dispatcher or any other person authorized or not by any operator or his respective representative to solicit or accept passengers and allow them to board their public utility conveyance in any place within the poblacion of the municipality other than the bus terminal area here for designated, except the picking up of passengers while on their way out of the poblacion or in the course of their route towards their respective destination.

All other excepts as herein provided, construction by a private person or entity for use as terminal for public conveyance are hereby declared illegal and prohibited subject for penal provision of this ordinance.

SECTION 57. All cargo and container trucks transporting sea vans and other heavy equipments and cargoes shall be equipped with steel harness and other locking device which would hold the cargo firmly and securely during the transport of said cargoes.

SECTION 58. No stool or any seating device, other than what is normally provided for seating of passengers shall be allowed on any "For Hire Vehicles: for the purpose of accommodating/seating passengers more than its allowed capacity.

SECTION 59. No unauthorized person shall sound the horn, handle the levers or set in motion or in any way tamper with or damage any motor vehicle.

CHAPTER III OTHER TRAFFIC RELATED MATTERS

ARTICLE I Violations of Licensing and Driving Rules & Regulations

Section 1. No driver of a motor vehicle shall commit any of the following acts, to wit:

1. Driving without a Driver's License duly issued by the Land transportation Office (LTO) in actual possession;
2. Driving with an invalid license or fake Driver's License
3. Driving with a suspended, revoked, or improper Driver's License;
4. Driving with a Student Driver's License but not accompanied by a duly licensed driver;
5. Driving in slippers or sleeveless shirt;
6. Operation of a motor vehicle without horns or with horns making starting sound;
7. Operation of a motor vehicle equipped with unauthorized siren;
8. Operation of a motor vehicle without proper headlights, tail lights, or windshield wiper;
9. Failure to stop when requested so as to calm a frightened animal;
10. Failure to display a red flag or light of rear end of the load which extends beyond the projected length of the vehicle;



ARTICLE II
VIOLATIONS OF REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS

SECTION 1. No operator or driver of a motor vehicle shall commit any of the following acts, to wit:

- a. Operating or causing to be operated, an unregistered or improperly registered motor vehicle;
- b. Operating or causing to be operated, a motor vehicle with unregistered, substituted or replaced engine, engine block or chassis, changed color, change body or configuration without a clearance from the authorities concerned;
- c. Failure to carry or post in the motor vehicle a photocopy of the Certificate of Registration (CR) and Official Receipt (OR) of payment thereon;
- d. Operating or allowing the operation of his motor vehicle with a revoked or cancelled certificate of registration;
- e. Improper displaying of MV plates, inconspicuously displayed MV plates; utilizing unreadable numbered plates;
- f. Without a sticker showing valid registration;
- g. Displaying an expired commemorative plate;
- h. Displaying a tampered plate or sticker;
- i. Transferring of plates or sticker from one vehicle to another except authorized security plates for certain government vehicle;
- j. Non-painting or improperly painted business or trade name on the vehicle;
- k. Using an unauthorized improvised plate or tampered plate number;
- l. Operating a vehicle-for-hire with defective foot or hand brakes; defective speedometer or tacheometer; defective or broken windshield or wiper; without rear view mirror; without interior lights; without spare tire;
- m. Utilizing unauthorized horn or siren;
- n. Operating a vehicle without a red flag or red light on protruding items or materials about one (1) meter from the end of the load and in the evening a red light which can be visible at least fifty (50) meters away;



ARTICLE I
COMPOSITION ITS AND POWERS & DUTIES

SECTION 1. There is hereby created a Macarthur Traffic Enforcement and Management Board to be composed of the following:

- c. Recommend to the sanggunian the amount of fares or adjusted fare increases, periodically to be imposed in a particular zones or fixed route;
- d. Recommend to the sanggunian other reasonable fees and related charges in the regulation of tricycle-for-hire, after conducting a public hearing for that purpose;
- e. Promulgate rules and regulations for the proper enforcement of this Article which shall continue to be in full force and effect until revoked or modified by the sanggunian;





SECTION 3. Quorum. Majority of the members of the MacArthur Traffic Enforcement and Management Board (Mac-TEAMB) shall constitute a "quorum" to transact business.

SECTION 4. Internal Rules of Procedure MacArthur Traffic Enforcement and Management Board (Mac-TEAMB) shall formulate and adopt its own internal rules of procedure including its regular meetings and necessary standing committees.

SECTION 5. Rules and Regulations in the issuance of "Motorized Tricycle Operators Franchise

1. Only Filipino citizens and partnership or corporation with sixty percent (60%) Filipino equity shall be granted the MTOF.

2. No MTOF shall be granted unless the applicant is in possession of units with valid registration papers from the Land Transportation Office (LTO).

3. The grantee of the MTOF shall carry a common carrier insurance sufficient to answer for any liability it may incur to passengers and third parties in case of accidents;

4. Operators of tricycle-for-hire shall employ only drivers duly licensed by the Land Transportation Office (LTO);

5. Operators who intend to stop service completely, or suspend device for more than one (1) month, shall report in writing such termination or suspension to the sanggunian

6. Each tricycle unit granted an MTOF shall be assigned and bear an identification number aside from its LTO license plate number;

7. In addition to the Driver's License issued by the LTO all tricycle-for-hire are hereby required to register and secure an identification number from the Office of the Chief, Traffic Division, Traffic Management Office in this municipality;

8. All drivers of tricycle-for-hire are hereby required to wear t-shirt, and long pants. No driver of motorized tricycle shall wear a "sando" while operating his tricycle;

9. Tricycle-for-hire shall have a passenger capacity, including the driver, as provided for in Section 18, Art X Chapter II of this Code;

10. Operators of tricycle-for-hire are hereby required to post in a conspicuous and appropriate part of the tricycle the schedule of fares. Operators of Tricycle for hire must follow the proper color code

11. Additional rules and regulations shall be issued by the MacArthur Traffic Enforcement and Management Board (Mac-TEAMB) for the proper enforcement of this Article. Such rules and regulations shall be subject to the approval of the Sangguniang Bayan through a resolution.

SECTION 6. RESERVATIONS. Nothing in this Article shall be construed to diminish the authority of the sanggunian to issue, amend, revised, renew, suspend, or cancel any MTOF and prescribed the appropriate terms and conditions therefore; determine, fix, prescribe or periodically adjust fares or rates for the service provided in a zone or fixed route after public hearing; prescribed and regulate zones of service in coordination with the Barangay; fix, impose and collect and periodically review and adjust but not oftener than once every three (3) years, reasonable fees and other related charges in the regulation of tricycle-for-hire; establish and prescribe the conditions and qualities of service to the public.

SECTION 7. A traffic management office/division is hereby created to manage and supervise the implementation of this code the office will be headed by the PNP, Chief Traffic, PNCO and be complemented by personnel appointed by the Local Chief Executive.

SECTION 8. Allocation or revenue/ fines – all processing fee's seminar fees impounding fees imposed by the 2023 Revenue Code and 20% of penalty fees for violation shall be allocated to the Traffic Management Office for the purpose of paying the cost in the maintenance of Traffic signs, pedestrian, lanes, traffic signals, uniform of traffic enforcers and for other purpose, which amount the Municipal Treasurer shall hold in trust.

SECTION 9. All vehicles operating in this Municipality must secure copy of "The 2023 TRAFFIC CODE OF THE MUNICIPALITY" after paying Two Hundred Pesos (P200.00) for each copy, for them to have a complete knowledge regarding traffic rules in this municipality the amount collected by virtue hereof shall be allocated to the municipal Tricycle Franchising and Regulatory Board (MTRFB) for its maintenance and operating expenses and other related purposes, which amount the Municipal Treasurer shall hold in trust.

SECTION 10. Photo copy of necessary documents related to licensing and permitting including a certified photo copy of authorize fare shall be given only after paying sixty Pesos (60.00) at the Municipal Treasurer's Office, which amount be held in trust for MTRFB'S.

CHAPTER V
LICENSING AND PERMITTING

ARTICLE I

RULE AND REGULATIONS ON THE OPERATION OF VEHICLE FOR HIRE

SECTION 1. No person, natural or judicial shall operate any motorized tricycle-for-hire in this municipality without first securing a "franchise" therefore from the Sangguniang Bayan thru the Municipal Tricycle Franchising & Regulatory Board and paying the corresponding fees thereof.

SECTION 2. No person shall operate any motor vehicle and habal-habal without first procuring a license to drive from LTO, motor vehicle for the current year, nor while such license is delinquent, invalid, suspended or revoked.

The license shall be carried by the driver at all times when operating a motor vehicle, and shall be shown and/or surrendered for cause and upon demand to any person with authority under this code to confiscate the same.

Likewise, no person shall drive or operate a Pedicab (Potpot) without first securing a Driver's permit from the office of the Municipal Treasurer after paying the corresponding fees, for the purpose, as provided in the 2023 revenue code.

SECTION 3. It shall be unlawful for any duly licensed driver to transfer or otherwise allow any person to use his license for purpose of enabling such person to operate a motor vehicle.


No owner of a motor vehicle shall engage, employ, or hire any person to operate such motor vehicle, unless the person sought to be employed is a licensed driver. Likewise, owner of potpot shall not engage, employ or hire, any person to operate or drive such potpot unless such person is a holder of a Municipal Driver's Permit.

SECTION 4. All vehicles with franchise MacArthur to any place outside the municipality shall be required to secured business permit after paying the corresponding fees as provided in the 2023 Revenue Code.


SECTION 5. No owner or operator of a motor vehicle shall use his vehicle or cause or allow it to be used unless such motor vehicle meets the established emission standard.


SECTION 6. No person or drivers of all types of passenger vehicles shall be allowed to operate in the municipality of MacArthur unless the first secure a police clearance in addition to the Medical or Health Certificate issued by the Municipal Health Officer.



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

SECTION 1. The Municipal Mayor or his duly authorized representative shall upon the recommendation of the Municipal Tricycle Franchising and regulatory Board (MTFRB) as to Tricycle or upon written application as to application for the issuance of the license or permit provided that no application for the issuance of the license shall be approved unless the applicant shall have first presented a certificate of registration of his vehicle properly issued by the Land Transportation Office for motorized vehicle and the unit properly inspected and certified safe by the Chief Traffic Division –PNP or any of his authorized representative.

SECTION 2. LICENSE PLATE – License plate for motorcab and multicab for hire operating within the municipality for private use shall be serially arranged in numbers by the Municipal Treasurer or his duly authorized representative. Owners of these motorcabs and multicabs are required to have two licensed plate, with the same serial number, one shall be place at the back of the motorcab which must be visible and the other one at the front. The license plate must be kept clean at all time and under no circumstances shall the number and color be altered.

SECTION 3. It shall be the duty of the vehicle owner or persons having direct supervision of direct control or management of vehicles, to require such drivers to show their driver's license duly issued in accordance with this ordinance and passes the necessary qualification provided for in this ordinance, vehicle owners shall keep a record of their vehicle drivers showing the name, address and date when such drivers started their management. They shall also maintain a garage wherein they will keep a record of the number of vehicle therein and the time of departures of each vehicle. The records must be kept at all times in the garage where the vehicle are kept and maintain and shall be subject to periodic inspection by the Chief Traffic Division –PNP.

SECTION 4. The name of the owner and the operator and respective address of every vehicle for hire, licensed and authorized to operate within the municipality of MacArthur shall be painted on the side of the vehicle in bold letters so as to be visible to passengers all times.


SECTION 5. RECORDS – The Licensing Office of this municipality or his duly authorized representative should be notified within fifteen (15) days of any change of their addresses. The Licensing Office or his duly authorized representative, or the Chief Traffic Division shall likewise keep a record of the names and addresses of the owners or operators of the said vehicle stated above whether for private use for hire in this municipality, and the number of such kind of vehicle owned by each, together with their corresponding license number and Police Number.

SECTION 7. Police Number issued and assigned to vehicle stated above must be well painted. It should always be visible to the public as well to passenger. It shall be painted on the front portion, the side portion and or the rear portion. Owners or operator may repair the said Police Number if damage or obliterated after securing a permit from the Traffic Division and upon payment of the necessary fees and charges. In no case will the Police No. be altered, or obliterated for reason of repair. Such Police number is renewable or on before January 20 of every year failure to renew within the period prescribe such number will be assigned to other interested franchise applicant.

ARTICLE III FEES AND CHARGES

SECTION 1. There shall be paid to the Municipal Treasurer's Office as business license/permit license fees for every motorized vehicles for hire such as but not limited to, Bus, Jeepneys, Tricycle, Van, Multicabs and the likes, non-motorized vehicles for hire and for every vehicles for private use, such as but not limited to Tricycle, Potpot, Multicabs, Jeepneys, Vans and the likes, payable annually during the first twenty days (20) of the year. Upon failure to pay the fees herein required, a penalty of 10% shall be imposed, and in the case of a new registrant, he must register his vehicle within five (5) days from the acquisition thereof but before he operates the same, as provided for in the 2023 Revenue Code.

SECTION 2. Aside from the fees mentioned in the preceding section, payment for each license plate, and for Police Number to be secured at the Traffic Management Office as prescribe in the 2023 revenue code.

SECTION 3. Owner of a vehicles, before making any repair of a damage or obliterated police number shall secure a permit from the traffic division after paying the corresponding payment prescribe in the 2023 revenue code.

SECTION 4. Any vehicle towed and impounded by the traffic management group of the PNP, the owner or operator of such vehicles shall pay the amount as charged of towing or impounding as provided under the 2023 revenue code.

SECTION 5. Drivers of any kind of vehicles for hire should secure from the Municipal Licensing Officer license plate after paying the necessary fee prescribe in the 2023 revenue code.

SECTION 6. All vehicle mentioned in Article III Section 1 hereof after paying business permit fee a stickers or business plate be provided for

vehicles flying the route outside MacArthur and business plate to vehicle operating within.

SECTION 7. All person engaged in dispatching vehicle for hire must secure a business permit and Identification Card in accordance with Section 54, Article X, Chapter V of this code and upon paying, the necessary permit, prescribe in the 2023 Revenue Code

SECTION 8. Temporary permit maybe issued by the Municipal Mayor in accordance to Chapter II, Article VII, Section 14 & 15 of this code, after paying the necessary permit fee, prescribe in the 2023 Revenue code

SECTION 9. Photo copy of necessary documents related to licensing and permitting including the photo copy of authorize rate shall be given only after paying the necessary fees prescribe in the 2023 Revenue Code.

SECTION 10. An impounding fee prescribe by the 2023 revenue code for all vehicle pounded, payable to the Municipal Treasurer by the owner of the vehicle impounded plus incidental expenses for the removal of the vehicles or its transfer if any.

SECTION 11. Terminal Pass – Together with the cash ticket, the collecting officer shall issue a Terminal Pass Slip to the driver/operator for each trip. This pass slip will be collected by a collector assigned by the Municipal Treasurer as by the Traffic Management Office at the exit points of the municipality. Failure to present this pass slip a fine of Fifty Pesos (P50.00) be imposed to the driver.

CHAPTER VI PROVIDING RULES AND REGULATIONS IN THE OPERATION OF MOTORCYCLE SERVICES (HABAL-HABAL)

SECTION 1. Motorcycle service, locally known as "Habal-habal" is not legalized by the National Government as a public transportation vehicle however, the riding public to avail the service particularly in the far flung barangays or in the areas wherein there are no available transportation.

In this ordinance, the Local Government Unit of Macarthur recognizes the services of habal-habal as means of transport in helping our people in their travel especially to those living in the mountain barangays;

It is of the opinion that there is a need to regulate the operation of the motorcycle service locally known as "habal-habal" to protect the lives of the riding public;

SECTION 2. Rules and Regulations for a motorcycle service (habal-habal) drivers.

a. He must be a holder of a professional driver's license issued by the Land Transportation Office;

b. No person or driver is allowed to drive or operate a motorcycle under the influence of liquor or drunk driver during the time of driving its motorcycle.

c. Smoking is strictly be responsible to the backriders.

d. The driver shall be responsible to the backriders

e. Carrying cargoes must be determined by the driver based on the capacity and road worthiness of the motorcycle.

SECTION 3. Conduct and Duties of Motorcycle Service Drivers

a.) All motorcycle service drivers operating within the Municipality of MacArthur, Leyte are required to wear a decent long pant, shirt or T-shirt while driving a motorcycle service.

b.) Wearing of slippers and short pants are strictly prohibited while driving.

SECTION 4. Payments

All payments of motorcycle service (habal-habal) shall be paid at the Municipal Treasurers Office as prescribed in this ordinance or revenue code.

SECTION 4. Terminal Shed Buildings

All motorcycle service drivers shall park all their motorcycles at the terminal shed building designated for this purpose.

**CHAPTER VII
SCHEDULE OF FARES**

**ARTICLE 1
FOR ALL FOUR WHEELS VEHICLES FOR HIRE**

SECTION 1. No person operating a vehicle for hire and operating from the municipality and anywhere outside or inside shall charge a passenger more or less than what is allowed by the LTFRB and MTRFB thru an ordinance by the Sangguian for other vehicle for hire.

SECTION 2. The schedule of fare allowed by the LTFRB/ MTRFB shall be visibly displayed in the vehicles.

SECTION 3. A minimum fare of ten pesos for motorize vehicles operating within the poblacion.

Provided, however, that during school days students with valid ID's for the current year in uniform and senior citizens shall be entitled to a 20% less to the rate prescribed; Provided, further, that even during non-school days and even if the students are not in uniform is he/she can prove or establish that they are attending school activities, they shall likewise be entitled to the privilege of fare reduction above set forth.

No person operating a vehicles such as motorcycles (habal-habal), tricycle, outside the poblacion but within the municipality shall charge a passenger more than what is allowed under this section again, schedule of fare under this Article must be visibly displayed in the vehicle. A five pesos minimum fare and an additional two pesos per kilometers maybe charge for routes that are not indicated or specified the schedule of rates.

CHAPTER VIII
 MISCELLANEOUS PROVISION

ARTICLE I
 INSPECTION OF VEHICLES FOR HIRES

SECTION 1. The Police Department, Traffic Management office in coordination with the Municipal Engineer's Office is hereby charged with the periodic check-up of all vehicles operating in the municipality of MacArthur for the fitness of traffic operation and for public safety. A certificate to this effect must be secured after paying the necessary fees provided for the 2013 revenue code.

SECTION 2. The Police Department, Traffic Management Office may avail of any assistance that may be provided by the Municipal Engineer's Office or other person who have the knowledge of the safety operation of vehicles.



SECTION 3. If, after checking or inspecting a vehicle is found to be unfit for traffic operation or endangers then the same must be declared "UNSERVICEABLE". However, the same may be provided with the lacing parts if any, to make the necessary replacement or repair, and is then qualified for a re-check-up. If found to be in good condition, the same shall be declared "SERVICEABLE" and could be operated again.

SECTION 4. For the purpose of the checking and inspection of the motor vehicle as provided for in the preceding paragraph, the station commander, traffic management office and the Municipal Engineer are hereby authorized to issue implementing rules and guidelines to implement the above-mentioned provisions.

ARTICLE II IMPOUNDING OF VEHICLE

SECTION 1. A vehicle may be impounded if found to be under any of the following conditions:

1. Any motor vehicle which, for any cause is unable to proceed under its own power and is left unattended by a responsible person for more than Two Hours in any street.
2. A vehicle which is not properly parked in such a manner as to block or interfere with free passage of persons or vehicles.
3. A vehicle on any prohibited place for parking when left unattended.
4. A vehicle using the public street as a garage.
5. Vehicles which are the instruments or proceeds of a crime.
6. Stolen vehicles may be release only upon order of the court without pay the impounding fee.
7. Any motor vehicle which cannot proceed under its own power to any point of destination designated by prospective passengers, thereby amounting to failure to convey passengers shall be considered re-capable to carry on its business and shall be impounded until such repair or correction is made, if however, upon inspection of the motor vehicle by the Police Officer it is discovered that the same was at the time fit but was made only as an excuse thereof, then, such circumstances shall be considered as "refusal to convey Passengers" and said driver shall therefore be subject to penal liability under this ordinance.
8. Vehicle use for any illegal activity traffic entered.
9. Vehicle driver or operator who violated traffic rules and failed to pay the necessary penalty imposed.

ARTICLE III POWERS OF THE POLICE AND THE TRAFFIC ENFORCER

SECTION 1. All members of the MacArthur, Leyte Police Department and the Traffic Management Office are hereby charged with the enforcement of this code.

SECTION 2. All persons are hereby required to obey the order of any Police Officer, Traffic Enforcer of the municipality of MacArthur in relation to the enforcement of this traffic code.

SECTION 3. All members of the Police Department, Traffic Management Office can order any driver operating any vehicle within the jurisdiction of the municipality of MacArthur to stop their vehicles anytime of the day or night either by signal, whistle or voice, by establishing check points, road blocks in order to investigate and inspect vehicles for any violation of this code or any laws, and to bring the offenders, or any person to Police Headquarters for further investigation as the case may warrant.

SECTION 4. The PNP Station/ Traffic Management Office may designate a street as one-way street or a no entry in case of special occasion or activities/emergency that may arise subject to the approval of the Sangguniang Bayan.

SECTION 5. All Police Officers, Traffic Enforcers are enjoined to issue a citation ticket to every driver whose license to drive is taken for any violation of this ordinance, such citation ticket shall act a temporary license to drive until the given date for the violator to report the office of the Chief Traffic Division

SECTION 6. Every member of the Traffic Division Police whole on duty manning the traffic when violation occurs, the driver of the vehicle should be advice to stop at a certain place upon the discretion of the apprehending or arresting officer, and tell the violation being committed and at the same time issue the citation ticket stating the kind of violation and the penalties amount thereof.

SECTION 7. Upon issuance of the citation ticket the same shall be advice to report to the Office of the Municipal Treasurer or to the Traffic Management Office within 24 hours for compliance of the said violation. Failure to appear and comply with or an answer the prescribed charges within 24 hours or upon the expiration of the said CT depending on the date specified by the apprehending or arresting officer and appropriate action shall be taken against the violator before the court for violation of this Municipal Ordinance.

SECTION 8. This Citation Ticket Receipt (CTR) shall be printed and deposited in the office of the traffic management who shall have the authority to control for the release. In case the Traffic Division Office have already consumed this ticket the Chief of the Traffic Division Office or his duly authorized representative shall request from the office of the Municipal Treasurer for this purpose, and will be signed "received" by the requesting officer.

SECTION 9. In the interest of peace and order and of public service and to remedy the existing conditions found to be hazardous to vehicular traffic and to prevent congestion of the traffic in any street or to facilitate the movement of the traffic in any street or to facilitate the movement of vehicular traffic, the Chief of Police or any of his authorized representative the chief traffic division or member shall have discretion to re-route traffic, to re-designate Thru-Streets, Two-way or One-way Streets and STOP Streets, parking places, loading and unloading zones. Any changes made under this provision, if to be implemented more than 2 days, should be subject for approval of the Sangguniang bayan through a resolution.

SECTION 10. It is hereby made the duty of the Chief Traffic Division cause to be made all proper signs, marks or places indicating or prohibiting loading, unloading, parking, pedestrians' lanes, one-way street and other signs or marks in order that the provisions of this code would be carries into effect.

Likewise, the Municipal Engineer has the duty to provide the necessary signs, symbols and marks that maybe needed by the Chief Traffic Management Office.

SECTION 11. Citation Tickets (CT) may be issued locally for violation of this ordinance or citation ticket issued by the Land Transportation Office (LTO) through the deputized Municipal Traffic Enforcer whose penalty will be paid at the LTO Regional Office.

SECTION 2. If the violation enumerated in this Article cause damage to life, property of another person's penalty corresponding to the violation under existing laws to that effect shall be expired, after notice with the proper court and after final judgment thereof.

SECTION 3. Imposition of Penalty. Any person who commits an offense which is punishable under the provisions of this code, but not punishable under R.A. 4136, as amended, shall be penalized only under the provisions, hereof. If the offense committee is punishable both under the provisions of this code and that R.A. 4136, as amended, it shall be prosecuted only under either but not in both, otherwise the offender will be twice put in jeopardy of punishment for the same offense.



SECTION 4. Penalty for other offenses. The conviction of any person for any offense under this code shall not bar his prosecution for any other offenses which may have been committed by such person concurrently with the commission of the offense for which he was convicted or in doing the act or series of acts which constituted the offense for which he was convicted.


SECTION 5. Separability Clause. If any section or portion of this ordinance shall be declared unconstitutional or ultra vires, such declaration shall not invalidate the whole of this ordinance.

SECTION 6. Repealing Clause. This code repeals, Ordinance No. 03, Series of 2017. All other rules, regulations and ordinances enacted and enforced by the Municipal Government of MacArthur that are inconsistent with this ordinance, by virtue hereof are hereby deemed repealed.

SECTION 7. Effectivity. This Ordinance shall take effect after the approval from the Sangguniang Panlalawigan and the requirement of posting prescribed in RA 7160 is complied with.

Afterwards, The Local Chief Executive, Honorable Rudin T. Babante, graced the event with his welcome address. He thanked everyone for their presence and stated the relevance of the public hearing. He shared that he received complaints from drivers/operators, and some are going to his residence to raise their complaints. He also stated that, to generate income, permit holders should pay their obligations. After he delivered his message, he excused himself to attend into his commitments.

do not have permits causes rivalry in the accommodation of passengers. Mr. Noya, President of TODA suggested to have the traffic enforcers to render duty the whole day. Honorable Lazar answered by citing Chapter 7 stating that the traffic management office is mandated to monitor the traffic. Meanwhile Honorable Milar, Punong Barangay raised his concern on those motorpots who has the maximum capacity of 6 passengers, who does not accommodate or denies transporting passengers with less than the number of 6 passengers. Honorable Lazar stated that drivers are not allowed to refuse. Mr. Noya there could only be two passengers based on the policy of TODA. A participant from Barangay Causwagan suggested that there should be waiting time. Mr. Noya added that in terms of emergency cases they immediately go. Honorable Canete, Punong Barangay stated to consider the drivers since they are also incurring fuel expenses. The Honorable Vice Mayor declared that it is case to case basis and in terms of emergency, it shall be accommodated. He also asked the number of colorum operators operating without permit. Mrs. Acala, BPLO, answered that there are approximately 20. Furthermore, Honorable Mundala said to identify what type of emergency is being catered to. Mr. Noya shared that their group are giving community services such as libheng sakay for students. Meanwhile, Honorable Pantin recommended that the habal-habal should reorganize and submit to the MTO the names of its members. Mr. Molero, habal-habal operator said that they are willing to pay but still waiting for the ordinance. He also aired his sentiments that habal-habal are considered private and only Angkas is the only single motorcycle transportation that is being recognized by the government to accommodate passengers.

Furthermore, Mr. Pille, a member of TODA answered to Mr. Paguipo that situation is on case to case basis like if there are members of TODA who are willing to transport passengers to upland barangays. Honorable Remanes Jr. suggested to have specific routes for habal-habal and motorpots. He also added that habal-habal must give the list of its members and have an organized association.

Ms. Acala, BPLO-Designate suggested that there will be a ticket to be issued in the amount of 10.00 per day of per operation. Honorable Pantin also manifested to have fare matrix schedule and the regulatory fees will be based on the Local Revenue Code.

After the open forum for the proposed Municipal Ordinance No. 10, Series of 2023, Honorable Leria Jr. presented the proposed Municipal Ordinance No. 14, Series of 2023. Immediately it was followed with the open forum. Mr. Pille asked if the pedicabs will still be allowed to pass through the bicycle lane. Honorable Leria Jr. answered that they will still be allowed given that they will give priority to bicycle riders.

Since there no much concerns raised with the proposed Municipal Ordinance No. 14, Series of 2023, it was followed with the presentation of the Municipal Ordinance NO. 05, Series of 2023. It was presented by Honorable Remanes Jr. After the presentations was made, Honorable
