Furthermore, the opinions rendered herein are without prejudice to opinions rendered by higher authorities.

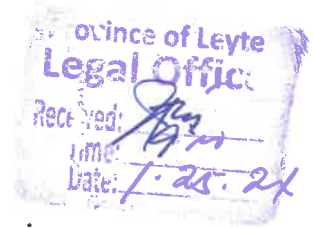

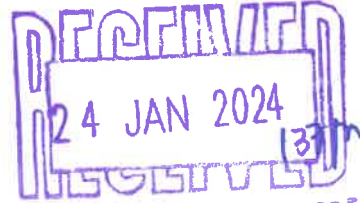

WHEREAS, the economy of the Philippines depends heavily on the agricultural sector, thus challenges encountered, especially by farmers, have negative effects on the food security in the country. Given its geographic location, the Philippines experienced numerous threats to food security brought about by strings of natural calamities that have rendered farm products unusable or increased food prices due to food shortage;

WHEREAS, COVID19 pandemic has further worsened the country's food security, disrupting availability and access to free and nutritious foods at affordable process;

WHEREAS, to address the problem of hunger and food insecurity in the Philippines, the national government enacted several laws and implemented various initiatives and strategies to ensure sustainable and resilient production and food availability throughout the country. However, food insecurity remains a challenge in the country due to food shortage and rising food prices of brought by natural calamities and disasters, health crisis such as COVID-19 pandemic, among others, hindering economic growth and national development;

WHEREAS, the Department of Interior and Local Government thru its Memorandum Circular 2023-001 shows its support in cognizant of the role of barangay as essential partners of the national government in contributing to address hunger and ensuring food security in the country thru Halina't Magtanim ng Prutas at Gulay (HAPAG) sa Barangay Project;

WHEREAS, HAPAG project aims to strengthen the capacities of barangay towards sustainable agriculture initiatives. One of which is the intensification and fostering of agricultural activities and communities will be encourage to produce fresh, healthy and affordable fruits and vegetables from their backyard spaces, through the establishment of community gardens in the barangays with vacant areas;

WHEREAS, after a Public Hearing and thorough study and discussion on the subject ordinance by the August Body, the herein ordinance is hereby enacted;

NOW THEREFORE, on motion by Hon. Mervin M. Lobrigo and unanimously seconded;

BE IT RESOLVE, as it is hereby resolved to enact/approve Municipal Ordinance No. 17 Series of 2023 entitled "AN ORDINANCE INSTITUTIONALIZING THE HALINA'T MAGTANIM NG PRUTAS AT GULAY (HAPAG) SA BARANGAY PROJECT OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF TABONTABON";

BE IT ORDAINED by the Honorable Sangguniang Bayan, in its Regular Session assembled, that:

MUNICIPAL ORDINANCE NO. 17
Series of 2023

AN ORDINANCE INSTITUTIONALIZING THE HALINA'T MAGTANIM NG PRUTAS AT GULAY (HAPAG) SA BARANGAY PROJECT OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF TABONTABON..

SECTION 1. TITLE. This Ordinance shall be known as "HAPAG ORDINANCE OF TABONTABON, LEYTE.

SECTION 2. DEFINITION OF TERMS. The following terms as used in this Ordinance shall mean as follows:

- a) **Aeroponics** - an integration of aquaculture (Fish Farming) with hydroponics. Creates symbolic relationships between the plants and the fish. It uses the nutrients waste from fish tanks to integrate hydroponic production beds, and hydroponic bed cleans water for fish habitats.
- b) **Aquaponics** - refers to a bio-system that incorporates recirculated aquaculture (fish farming) with hydroponic vegetable and herbs production to create a symbolic relationship between the plants and the fish.
- c) **Barangay Community Garden** - refers to a piece of land or several patches of land operated and cultivated by the barangay for the purpose of planting and growing vegetables and fruit-bearing trees.
- d) **Container Gardening** – refers to micro model farming where a family unit or household is producing fruits and vegetables in containers for personal consumption.
- e) **Fruit Bearing Tree Planting** – refers to the planting of fruit-bearing trees for food production purposes such as papaya, bananas, mango, avocado, jackfruit, guyabano, coconut, guava, lemon, mulberry, etc.
- f) **Hydroponics** – method of growing food using mineral nutrient solutions in water without soil. (soilless-based).
- g) **Square Foot Gardening** – is a simple method of creating small, orderly, and highly productive kitchen gardens.
- h) **Vertical Gardening** – refers to a special kind of urban gardening suitable for small spaces, particularly for decorating the walls and roofs in various styles. It is an alternative method for gardening by expanding the scope of growing plants in a vertical space.

SECTION 3. DECLARATION OF POLICY. It is hereby declared a policy of the Municipality of Tabontabon, Leyte to enjoin all barangays in establishing their respective Barangay Community Gardens in accordance with the following guidelines:

- a) The community garden shall be established in an available site to be determined by the Sangguniang Barangay. It shall have at least a minimum of two hundred (200) square meters of land or its equivalent in several patches of land.
- b) In establishing the community garden, the barangay shall identify which vegetable plants (e.g. sweet potato, cassava, garlic, onion, etc.) they wish to grow.
- c) Barangays with suitable spaces are hereby encouraged to plant bamboos (kawayan).
- d) Barangays that do not have vacant areas, shall implement alternative gardening such as container gardening, hydroponic, aquaponics, and aeroponics.
- e) Barangays are encouraged to coordinate and request from the LGU for any vacant property owned by the local government or private individuals who own a certain vacant/idle lot that can be used to establish the barangay community garden.
- f) The barangay shall encourage their residents to set up their family vegetable garden and/or plant fruit bearing trees in any available open spaces.

SECTION 4. ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE LGU.

- a) Ensure the formulation, revision or updating of the local nutrition plan of action, to include and support the establishment of and maintenance of community gardens (this includes both barangay and household gardens).
- b) Implement, monitor, and evaluate the local nutrition plan which includes, but are not limited to the provision of technical assistance to barangays to promote basic agriculture through natural farming to serve as food baskets or main source of vegetables to sustain the dietary needs of the community as well as households, provision of agricultural services and facilities to the barangays.
- c) Include in the comprehensive development plan, as well as in the local development annual investment programs, applicable programs and activities to promote nutrition such as the establishment and maintenance of barangay community gardens, to ensure adequate funding for nutrition impact.
- d) Ensure the organization, reorganization, and strengthening of the Municipal Nutrition Committee with the local chief executive as chairperson through enactment of local ordinance or issuance of an Executive Order to that effect.
- e) The Local Chief Executive through an appropriate Order, shall designate a Municipal Nutrition Action Officer, preferably on a full-time basis with corresponding staff support to coordinate nutrition action and implementing one or more components of the local nutrition action plan, as may be needed.
- f) Provide technical assistance to barangays, particularly in the implementation of agricultural activities and provision of agricultural support services.
- g) Provide agricultural support services and facilities to the barangays such as, but not limited to vegetable seed farms, fruit-tree and other kinds of seedling, nurseries, improvement and development of local distribution channels, preferable through cooperatives; inter-barangay irrigation system, prevention and control of plant pests and diseases, assistance in the organizations of cooperatives, among others.
- h) Promote vegetable production and consumption of crops existing naturally in the area.
- i) Encourage the residents in the barangay to set up their family vegetable garden and/or plant fruit-bearing trees in available open spaces.
- j) The Local Chief Executive shall issue an Executive Order designating an inspection and monitoring team for the establishment of community gardens in the barangays and ensuring a quarterly inspection.
- k) Provision of incentives to barangays and community with best community garden including family garden and school gardens.

SECTION 5. FUNDING. The Municipal Government of Tabontabon shall appropriate the funds necessary for the efficient and effective implementation of this Ordinance, particularly programs, projects and activities that support the establishment, functionality and sustainability of Barangay Community Gardens.

SECTION 6. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE. If any part, section or provision of this Ordinance is declared valid or unconstitutional, the other parts thereof, not affected thereby shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 7. REPEALING CLAUSE. All ordinances, executive orders, resolutions and other local issuances or parts thereof, inconsistent with or contrary to the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby amended, modified or repealed accordingly.

SECTION 8. EFFECTIVITY. This Ordinance shall take affect fifteen (15) days following its posting in at least three (3) conspicuous places in the municipality.


