

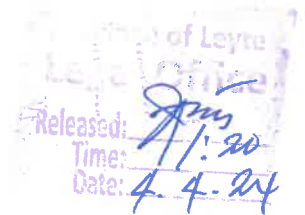

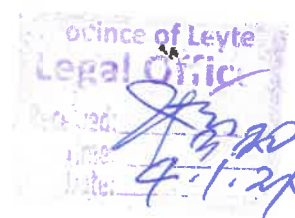

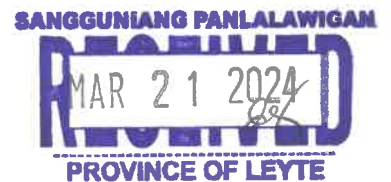

AN ORDINANCE LEVYING TOURISM ECOLOGICAL FEE IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF VILLABA PROVINCE OF LEYTE AND IMPOSING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION THEREOF

Prefatory Statement












The Municipality of Villaba is a place rich in history and culture, a place gifted with extraordinary wonders of nature, and a town having several tourism-related entities and establishments that are competitive and among some of the best in the region.

Villaba has always been known by the locals and other neighboring municipalities as a place of leisure, family bonding, stress relieving, and recreation due to its unique characteristics, abundance, locations, cultures, mangroves and rock filing and formations, marine life, and beaches in coastal areas.

Based on the gathered monthly tourism statistics report of tourists, domestic or from other places, and international emphasized that many people come to visit tourism-related entities and establishments of the town, specifically in beach areas and other leisure places within the Municipality of Villaba.

Regular visits from people to these places bring pride to the town, and revenue to tourism-related businesses, but at the same time it also brings waste materials that will potentially destroy the ecosystem and eventually create a negative effect on tourism-related establishments and the Local Government of Villaba in general.

The importance of such an ordinance implies two positive effects on the Municipality of Villaba and its tourism-related entities. It will generate revenues for the Local Government Unit and at the same time it will ensure intensive waste management in tourism-related

entities and establishments with the support from the Solid Waste Management Section of the Municipal Environment and Natural Resources Office (MENRO).

Section 16 of the Local Government Code states that the local government units shall exercise powers expressly granted, those necessarily implied therefrom, as well as the powers necessary, appropriate, or incidental of its efficient and effective governance, and those which are essential to the promotion of the general welfare. The local government unit shall ensure and support the preservation and enrichment of culture, promote health and safety, and enhance the rights of the people for a balanced ecology.

The Municipal Government of Villaba is committed to taking appropriate measures that are necessary to prevent, reduce, and control pollution of the marine environment within the coastal waters and tourist destinations of the Municipality by imposing penalties on the owner/s, operator/s or charterers who condoned the prohibited act of dumping pollutants to our waters and land areas and further requiring them an Environmental Preservation Fee for the proper disposal of their garbage by the Municipal Government.

The implementation of waste management and collection of this ordinance shall be facilitated by the Solid Waste Management Section of the Municipal Environment and Natural Resources Office. The Municipal Tourism Office and Information Center on the other hand shall be in charge of the promotional aspects to invite more tourists to visit the tourism-related entities and establishments of Villaba, Leyte.

ARTICLE I

TITLE AND COVERAGE

Section 1. Title – this ordinance shall be entitled AN ORDINANCE LEVYING TOURISM ECOLOGICAL FEE IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF VILLABA PROVINCE OF LEYTE AND IMPOSING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION THEREOF. It is otherwise known and cited as the Imposition of Ecological Fee Ordinance on Tourists Utilizing Tourism Entities and Establishments of the Municipality of Villaba;

Section 2. Coverage – This ordinance shall apply primarily to domestic tourists, tourists coming from other Municipalities, and international tourists who will visit tourism-related

entities and establishments like hotels, lodging houses, resorts, ecotourism spots, and beaches in the Municipality of Villaba.

ARTICLE II DECLARATION OF POLICIES

Section 3. Declaration of State Policies

- a) To promote the protection and conservation of land and coastal areas under existing Philippine environmental laws and enhance the environment;
- b) To conserve the land and marine waters, safeguard and preserve the living marine resources for the succeeding generations;
- c) The solid waste generated within the area of jurisdiction shall be characterized for initial source reduction and recycling element of the local waste management plan;
- d) A separate container is required for each type of waste for on-site collection properly marked as “Biodegradable”, “Non-Biodegradable” and “Residual and or Special Waste”; waste segregation shall primarily be conducted at the source including household, commercial, industrial and agricultural sources;
- e) To share responsibility for environmental protection, remediation, restoration, and development by allocating costs to responsible agents and users;
- f) To establish an additional source of funding which shall be applied to finance conservation, protection, and management of Villaba land and coastal waters;
- g) To generate funds by identifying additional sources of revenues to finance the implementation of tourism and environmental projects.


ARTICLE III DEFINITION OF TERMS AND EXPLANATORY NOTE

Section 4. Definition of Terms. For this Ordinance, the following terms shall be defined as follows:


- a) Levying – the act of imposing/collecting tourism ecological fees on tourists.
- b) Tourism Enterprise – refers to the establishments that offer accommodations, food, transport services, leisure, and recreation e.g., Hotels, Lodging Houses, Beach Resorts, Restaurants etc.



- c) Environmental Fee – a fee being collected from a person/s or group of individual/s meant to provide ecological maintenance and protection;
- d) Ecotourism - the practice of traveling or going around exotic often threatened environments or habitats that emphasizes conservation, education, traveler's responsibility, and active participation.












**ARTICLE IV
GENERAL PROVISIONS**

Section 5. General Provisions. General and specific provisions governing the operations, regulations, and preservations of the tourism potential destinations as ecotourism areas. The following regulations shall apply to the operations, regulations, and preservations:

1. No person, group, visitors, or tourists shall be allowed to gather, pick, or take away with them souvenirs or collections of any article of natural growth from the area whether land, marine, or wildlife;
2. Necessary staff/guide shall be designated by the enterprise to man the area and educate visitors, enforce order, maintain proper upkeep, apprehend violators, and collect fees and fines;
3. To fully operationalize the area as a self-sustaining entity, an environmental fee shall be added and collected from every person, visitor, tourist, and member of groups visiting the place and issued a corresponding official receipt/ticket to evidence payment.

Domestic Tourists	-	P 3.00
Filipino tourists (From other towns)	-	P 5.00
International Tourists (Foreigners and balikbayans)	-	P 10.00

The said environmental fee shall be collected by the Municipal Treasury Collector who in turn shall issue the appropriate receipt for it. Sixty Percent (60%) of the pooled amount shall be for the account of the administering agency (Tourism Office and MENRO) to be used for the upkeep and maintenance and promotional projects of the areas. The remaining forty percent (40%) shall go to the Municipal Government.

4. The Revenue Collection agent from the Municipal Treasurer's Office shall take measures in the collection process and shall coordinate with the Municipal Tourism Office and the tourism entities and establishments covered by the ordinance.
5. The Municipal Tourism Office/Information Center shall provide an itemized logbook in hotels, lodging houses, ecotourism spots, resorts, beaches, and other tourism-related entities included in the scope of the ordinance. The record shall be the basis of the collecting agent in determining the total collectible amount from the tourism entities and establishments.
6. The Municipal Tourism Office shall likewise, initiate intensive promotion to invite more tourists to visit the town's tourism-related entities and establishments. Such promotional activities include social media promotion, handouts, tarpaulins, and establishing markers in ecotourism spots and tourism-related entities covered by the ordinance.
7. The Solid Waste Management Section of the Municipal Environment and Natural Resources Office shall provide garbage racks to tourism-related entities upon the availability of funds generated from the collection of ecological fee.
8. The Solid Waste Management Section of MENRO shall likewise conduct information dissemination on proper waste segregation, supervise proper waste management, and collect segregated waste materials from tourism-related entities and establishments.

ARTICLE V PENALTIES

Section 6. Penalties. To assure adherence to the ordinance, the corresponding penalties for non-compliance from those who are covered by the ordinance shall apply;

1. Tourists who refuse to pay the tourism ecological fee shall not be allowed entry into the tourism-related entity or establishment.
2. For tourism-related entities and establishments that will not apply the principles of the ordinance the following penalties shall be implemented;

a) First Offense	-	P1,000.00 penalty
b) Second Offense	-	P2,000.00 penalty
c) Third Offense	-	Revocation of Business Permit

ARTICLE VI FINAL PROVISIONS

Section 7. Separability Clause. If any part of this ordinance is declared not valid, unconstitutional, or unlawful, such declaration shall not affect or impair the remaining



Section 8. Repealing Clause. All previous ordinances inconsistent with this Ordinance shall be deemed repealed or modified accordingly.


Section 9. Effectivity. This ordinance shall take effect upon approval and after the requisite posting and publication.



Minutes of the Public Hearing on Levying for Environmental Fee

The Public Hearing called upon by the Sangguniang Bayan Secretary was called to order at around 9:15 in the morning after most invitees were already present in the Sangguniang Bayan session hall.

Present during the hearing and serving as the panel was Hon. Julca Katrina Larrazabal – Con-uis, Committee Chairman on Tourism, Mr. Mark Anthony C. Luche, Tourism Officer, and Mr. Adolph Rae Barro, MENRO Solid Waste Management Section Head.

Mr. Mark Anthony C. Luche started the formalities and greeted everyone in the hearing. Mr. Luche then proceeded to emphasize the following points:

1. The proposed ordinance is not about your business/establishment having to pay additional money other than your paid taxes to the government. It is collecting environmental fees from the people coming to the town and Villaba residents having recreational activities in tourism-related entities.
2. The Municipal Tourism Office and Solid Waste Management of MENRO who are the proponents are just recommending bodies. This proposal is based on tourism concepts and Waste Management.
3. The proposed ordinance is focused on the improvement of waste management specifically in your business.
4. Once the proposed ordinance is accepted by the committee chair. The committee chairs now become the authors of the resolution.
5. The Sangguniang Bayan will initiate the process of the agenda and is the body that will approve or initiate any modifications to the presented proposal.
6. Having reached the stage of a public hearing means that the SB found substance in the proposal.
7. The MTO which is one of the implementing offices of the ordinance will initiate the process of the collection of environmental fees with their field collectors.
8. MTO collection agents are in charge of the collection and issuance of the tickets/receipts.
9. Failure to comply with the exact details in the record sheet will result in applied penalties stated in the proposed resolution. The record sheet is one of the SGLG requirements. We will not allow your entity will be the reason why Villaba fails with the DILGSGLG.
10. Peace and Order concerns are a major part of tourism but the coverage of this ordinance is only for the imposition of collecting environmental fees from people coming to our town regardless of purpose either recreation or business. The resolution also includes residents going to recreational/tourism-related businesses in the town.
11. The purpose of a public hearing is merely to inform the public or stakeholders about the concept of the resolution. After the public hearing, the SB can make modifications if they find substance in the comments in the hearing or apply the original concept.

The points raised by Mr. Luche are to further explain the concept of the proposed resolution and it is also a form of rebuttal to the argument brought about by the invitees during the previously conducted public hearing.

Mr. Joseph L. Vapor, one of the Invitees proposed that instead of having a 2.50 pesos entrance fee for locals why not have it at 3.00 pesos so that it would be easier since it would be difficult to find the fraction of a centavo as the change if ever. And the body unanimously agreed to Mr. Vapor.

Mr. Adolph Rae Barro seconded the raised points and further explained the importance of the said resolution specifically on the cost of waste management of the Local Government Unit of Villaba.

Mr. Barro however proposed the removal of the line that MENRO will provide the garbage racks since it is not part of the appropriation and there is no budget allocated to that. It was then agreed by the panel that the line should go as that once there is already a budget allocation, MENRO shall provide the garbage racks.

Hon. Con-ui then stated that after the public hearing, a meeting between the Tourism Office, MENRO Solid Waste Management Section, the Municipal Treasurer's Office, and her Office will convene on the planning out of the process of the collection of environmental fees.


The panel proceeded with his discussion and answered all the concerns of the invitees. Having all queries and concerns addressed Hon. Con-ui announced to adoption of the resolution for its approval.

Having no more arguments raised by the invitees, Hon. Con-ui moved that the meeting be adjourned and the proposed ordinance be approved.

At around 11:00 a.m., the public hearing was adjourned.


