Gentlemen and Ladies:

Pursuant to the provisions of the Local Government Code of 1991 (Republic Act No. 7160), our preliminary review of the **General Fund Supplemental Budget No. 01 FY 2024** of the **Municipality of Tunga**, **Leyte** duly enacted by the Sangguniang Bayan through **Appropriation Ordinance No. 01**, **Series of 2024** with a total appropriation in the amount of **P8,220,030.52** reveals compliance with the same law and its implementing Rules and Regulations.

It is therefore recommended for approval subject to the following conditions:

- 1. That the reversion of appropriations is duly authorized by the concerned officials and is backed up by cash collections and are made available to support the expenditures under Supplemental Budget No. 01;
- 2. That the procurement of Supplies, Equipment, Civil Works, and related services shall be made in accordance with the provisions of RA 9184 and its Implementing Rules and Regulations;
- 3. That the LGU created (1) Agriculturist II, SG 15. Attention is hereby invited to Section 5 of the Civil Service Commission (CSC) Memorandum Circular (MC) No. 12, series of 2022 which provides that the creation and funding of optional positions may be allowed after the mandatory positions have been created.
 - In view thereof, the creation and funding of the said optional position (Agriculturist II, SG 15) is hereby deferred until such time that the mandatory positions have been created. The appropriation is therefore, disallowed.
- 4. That funds are actually available to pay these proposed expenditures and shall be disbursed for the specific purpose(s) for which they have been appropriated pursuant to Sections 335 & 336 of RA 7160.

Compliance with CSC rules, DBM issuances, and accounting and auditing rules and regulations and all other existing laws shall be the responsibility of the implementing Local Government Unit.

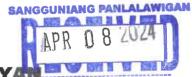

A RESOLUTION ENACTING THE GENERAL FUND SUPPLEMENTAL BUDGET NO. 1 OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF TUNGA, LEYTE FOR CALENDAR YEAR 2024 IN THE AMOUNT OF EIGHT MILLION TWO HUNDRED TWENTY THOUSAND THIRTY PESOS AND FIFTY-TWO CENTAVOS (PHP 8,220,030.52) PURSUANT TO SECTION 447(a)(2)(i) OF R.A. 7160.

WHEREAS, Section 447(a)(2)(i) of R.A. 7160 empowers the Sangguniang Bayan to approved annual and supplemental budgets of the municipal government and appropriate funds for specific programs, projects, services and activities of the municipality, or for other purposes not contrary to law, in order to promote the general welfare of the municipality and its inhabitants;

Be it enacted by the Sangguniang Bayan, Tunga, Leyte that:

SECTION 1. The Supplemental Budget No. 1 of the Municipality of Tunga, Leyte for Calendar Year 2024 in the amount of Eight Million Two Hundred Twenty Thousand Thirty Pesos and Fifty-Two Centavos (Php 8,220,030.52) is hereby approved.

- 6. Statement of Cash Flow, Statement of Financial Position, Statement of Financial Performance and Statement of Changes in Net Assets/Equity.
- 7. Supplemental Investment Program No. 01, CY 2024.

SECTION 2. SOURCES OF FUNDS. The source of funds for Supplemental Budget No. 1 in the amount of Eight Million Two Hundred Twenty Thousand Thirty Pesos and Fifty-Two Centavos (Php 8,220,030.52) shall be from Savings Unappropriated Balance/Surplus 2023 and Reversion of Funds, to wit:

the LGU Tunga CDRA team attended a training-workshop on CDRA formulation last August 21-26, 2023 at Hotel De Estrella, Tacloban City;

WHEREAS

a Climate and Disaster Risk Assessment (CDRA) is the product of a process that leverages the municipality's participative traditions consistent with the 2014 guidelines of the Housing and Land Use Regulatory Board (HLURB), presents the Climate and Disaster Risk Assessment (CDRA) for the Municipality of Tunga.

WHEREAS

a Climate and Disaster Risk Assessment (CDRA) is an imperative for the development of a local government unit as it determines the level of exposure, vulnerability, and risks of population, urban use areas, natural resources, lifeline utilities, and critical point facilities to disasters. The formulation of CDRA is based on the Housing and Land Use Regulatory Board (HLURB) Guidebook for mainstreaming climate change and disaster risk in Comprehensive Land Use Plan (CLUP). It provides necessary preparation and recommendation to help the municipality lessen its losses and damage in times of calamities.

WHEREAS

the planning team conducted a five-step process which involves, to wit: 1) collecting and organizing climate change and hazard information; 2) scoping of potential impacts of hazards and climate change; 3) developing exposure database; 4) conducting of risk analysis, and; 5) identifying decision areas and corresponding policy interventions. It provides necessary preparation and recommendation to help the municipality reduce its losses and damage in times of calamities.

WHEREAS

the formulated interventions are generally pre-disaster preparations. These includes the construction or expansion of mitigating measures (revetment, riprap, and flood control), elevation of structures (roads and buildings), conduction of Information Education Campaign (IEC), and strict implementation of national regulations and policies.

1. CSO's PLAN OF ACTION

- Mr. Dominador C. Davocol, Jr., President, Tungan-on Operators and Drivers Association and Member - Infrastructure Services & Local Roads Management Sector:
 - o Informed to the august body that the CSOs conducted a meeting last December 2023 - Local CSO Council, and elected Mr. Nestor A. Esquibel, President PASACA Irrigators Association, as their president who will represent the "voice and unity" of CSOs. The Local CSO plan of action will be prepared and submitted to the MDC for inclusion in the proposed development plans of the municipality.
- > The MDC Chairperson, Engr. Reinbert C. Costelo, stated that his administration is encouraging the submission of Project Proposals. These project proposals are necessary in requesting and release of funding amounting to One Million Pesos to be provided by DOLE. Submission of any proposals is at the mayor's office or at the PESO through Ms. Odinah C. Majam. He added that in CY2022 a CSO represented by Mrs. Flora Florendo was a recipient of a livelihood program provided worth ₱200,000.00.
- > Ms. Beauty A. Cinco, MLGOO, added information regarding the CSO's Plan of Action specifically for the Local Project Monitoring Committee (LPMC). She emphasized that the LGU shall allocate resources to undertake the monitoring and evaluation activities as part of the Local Project Monitoring Committee's (LPMC) regular functions (e.g., incentives, transportation allowance when attending seminars, and any financial support). These are indicators in the Subaybayan that would be verified if the LGU is compliant. She added that the allocation of resources to the CSO's shall require SB ordinance as legal basis for funding and its utilization
- Ms. Jinena R. Arintoc, President, Tunga Leyte Public Vendors & Entrepreneur Association (TLPVEA):

- Raised concern on the issues arising in the public market wherein the stall that is designated for <u>fish and marine products</u> is now utilized for <u>fruits and vegetable products</u>. According to her, the wet market section has designated <u>10 stalls each for meat and poultry products</u>, fruits and vegetable products, and fish and marine products. She added that the stall lessees at the wet market section are contemplating whether the category of stalls will no longer be followed thus they could sell any products regardless of the category of stalls that are intended to. In addition, since there was no meeting or gathering that was called upon by the implementing office, it would somehow create chaos among stall lessees specifically in the wet market section.
- The MDC Chairman, Engr. Reinbert C. Costelo, acknowledged the current scenario in the wet market section and he informed the august body about his plan of converting the existing terminal to an area for the fruits and vegetable section, and the stalls in the existing wet market area would be utilized for *fish and marine products* and *meat and poultry products* only. He added that Engr. Teodoro A. Quintana, Jr., Municipal Engineer, has already prepared a plan with a 2.5m x 2m dimension for each stall.

 - Added her concern on the increased number of stall lessees that would be offering the same products to sell. She emphasized that this could affect the sales considering the volume of products available versus the limited number of customers in the municipality.
- Ms. Evelyn A. Plaza, Acting Municipal Treasurer, shared her insights that her office cannot refuse prospective business applicants and it will now depend on the strategy of particular vendors to increase their sales.
- The MDC Chairperson, Engr. Reinbert C. Costelo, added that the LGU has no existing guidelines, policy or market code that prohibits and would limit the number of stalls provided for certain types of products, whether only ten (10) stalls each for fish and marine products, fruits and vegetable products and meat and poultry products.
- Ms. Evelyn A. Plaza, Acting Municipal Treasurer, informed the council that she consulted with the municipal mayor, decided, and agreed to utilize the vacant stalls for fish and marine products for fruits and vegetable products temporarily, for an additional income of the LGU, than keeping it unoccupied.
- The MDC Chairperson, Engr. Reinbert C. Costelo, added that the plan to return the occupancy right fee is his priority, but the absence of any available guidelines or policy by the LGU to restrict the number of vendors was also considered. There is no legislation issued by the Sangguniang Bayan to address the current issue. The LCE solicited the observation of the MPDC.

- > Engr. Marlon B. Arintoc, MPDC, responded that before the construction of the wet market building there was a lay-out or floor plan with assigned number of stalls to be constructed specifically - 10 stalls for meat and poultry products,10 stalls for fruits and vegetable products, and 10 stalls for fish and marine products. And there was no legislation to prohibit if it should only be the number of stalls intended per category to be constructed in the years to come. In the absence of any legislation or market code and stall adjudication, the LGU should established first an interim market board who could provide policy interventions whenever any issue arises in the public market. The interim market board has a CSO representing the market vendors, and representatives from executive and legislative offices of the LGU, who would conceptualize the protocol in the market operation. The current situation in the public market was a result of the decision made by the BPLO in accepting, issuing official receipts (occupancy rights fee), and processing the business permit applications to three (3) prospective lessees even though there was only one available and vacant stall for the fruits and vegetable products. The decision was made without first consulting his superior who could decide for that matter. Luckily, there was one (1) stall lessee in the fruits and vegetables products category who surrendered her rights so the available vacant stalls for such category became two (2). Since there was no established market board yet, it is now the discretion of the municipal mayor to address the issue, but ideally, it would be better if there could be an interim market board who shall decide on this matter so the burden of making complicated decision will not only be made by the municipal mayor.
- Mr. Eriberto Astorga, Vice-President, Senior Citizens Association of Tunga (SECAT):
 - Contributed his opinion regarding the current issue. He verified the statement of Engr. Marlon B. Arintoc, MPDC, that before construction there was already a specific purpose for the stall categories. According to him, since there was no market board yet, it should be the responsibility of personnels assigned to the public market to disseminate information that the construction of building with the available stalls are solely for the purposes and categories identified and discouraging for "mix products" businesses. By doing so, even in the absence of market board, the public market could still operate and function as intended, and the lessees/vendors are well-guided. Currently, a problem was felt and it was a result of miscommunication.
- > Hon. Joselito L. Arintoc, SB Member, and Member Institutional Services & Management Sector:
 - Raised his concern about the terminal to be converted into a fruits and vegetable section. According to him, the nearby stalls, especially the wing section could be "boxed out" by the proposed plan, thus, he is asking for what at stake for those who could be affected. With regards to the transportation service, he mentioned that it was randomly located in various places, and he inquired if the transportation sector was considered for the proposed plan for the terminal. He recommended that the terminal should be utilized for its purpose, and the transfer of the random parking areas of motorist to the terminal could boost the economic activity in the public

market, since the concentration of transportation services will be in one location only, as intended.

- > The MDC Chairperson, Engr. Reinbert C. Costelo, solicited the opinion of Mr. Dominador C. Davocol, Jr., President, Tungan-on Operators and Drivers Association and Member -Infrastructure Services & Local Roads Management Sector.
- > Mr. Dominador C. Davocol, Jr., President, Tungan-on Operators and Drivers Association and Member - Infrastructure Services & Local Roads Management Sector:
 - o Responded that there was already a dry run of terminal operation in the previous administration. The problem they encountered was when the operators/drivers of motor vehicles bound to Carigara, Leyte did not cooperate. Accordingly, the dry run of terminal operation only lasted for two (2) weeks since they preferred the random parking in the street they were used to. At this moment, Mr. Davocol requested the strict implementation of available legislations intended for transportation sector and political will is much needed according to him.
- Mr. Eriberto Astorga, Vice-President, Senior Citizens Association of Tunga (SECAT):
 - Inquired the presiding officer if there is somebody who will prepare the minutes of the meeting for the purposes of follow-up for the unfinished business in the next scheduled meeting, considering there is only a limited time to tackle all issues.
- > The MDC Chairperson, Engr. Reinbert C. Costelo, presiding officer informed Mr. Eriberto Astorga, that Engr. Marlon B. Arintoc, is the MDC secretary who shall prepare the minutes of the meeting of the MDC.
- Ms. Beauty A. Cinco, MLGOO, added information regarding the raised issue on transportation sector. She emphasized that there is a continuing implementation of DILG-DATr JMC No.01, dated June 19, 2017, regarding guidelines in the Implementation of Public Transport Modernization Program. It was observed that in the province of Leyte, only 16 out of 43 LGUs have complied with the required with Local Public Transport Plan (LPTRP). Of the remaining 27 LGUs, the LGU of Tunga, which happens to be our LGU, is among them.
- > The MDC Chairperson, Engr. Reinbert C. Costelo, requested the present Sangguniang Bayan members, to prioritize formulation and legislation of the Market Code and Transportation Code, which could address the current issues in the public market and terminal operation. In the absence of these legislations/ordinance, the presiding officer, presented his plan to create an interim Market Board, to address issues whenever there could be another scenario that business applicants would be interested to apply for occupancy of vacant stalls and apply for business permit.

- Ms. Beauty A. Cinco, MLGOO, also added her concern with regards to the establishment of KADIWA and addressed this matter to the municipal mayor and to the Municipal Agricultural Officer, Mrs. Nida A. Davocol for its implementation.
- > After thorough discussion regarding the establishment of KADIWA, Mrs. Nida A. Davocol, Municipal Agricultural Officer, proposed the schedule of KADIWA is every TUESDAY at the Tunga Public Market - Terminal Section. A signage (tarpaulin) and dissemination for the event and activity should be provided and initiated.
- > The MDC Chairperson, Engr. Reinbert C. Costelo, informed the august body that any other concern and issues relative to market operation should be properly discussed on their scheduled meeting in the coming afternoon.

2. BARANGAY REAL PROPERTY TAX (RPT) SHARE

> Engr. Marlon B. Arintoc, MPDC and MDC secretary, inquired from the present Punong Barangays if they have received already their RPT share for CY 2023, and the respond was a negative, thus he presented the provisions of SEC 271 (d) OF R.A. 7160:

"THE SHARE OF EACH BARANGAY SHALL BE RELEASED, WITHOUT NEED OF ANY FURTHER ACTION, DIRECTLY TO THE BARANGAY TREASURER ON A QUARTERLY BASIS WITHIN FIVE (5) DAYS AFTER THE END OF EACH QUARTER AND SHALL NOT BE SUBJECT TO ANY LIEN OR HOLDBACK FOR WHATEVER PURPOSE"

> Mrs. Evelyn A. Plaza, acting Municipal Treasurer, responded that she already coordinated last week with the LGU accountant for the preparation of vouchers and other documents. She explained that the delay of release of the RPT share was due to reconciliation of their records, and she gave assurance that it would be released as soon as possible. She added that the incoming RPT share will be released as scheduled since they are already implementing the iTax system.

3. TAX MAPPING

> Engr. Marlon B. Arintoc, MPDC and MDC secretary, informed to all present MDC members that one of his functions as Municipal Planning and Development Coordinator (MPDC) is to analyze the income and expenditures of the municipality. This brought his attention to include this matter of information regarding some misdeclaration of gross income/sales of business owners who applied for renewal of business permit for CY 2024. A comparative record of random businesses with their corresponding CY2022 and CY2023 gross sales or income was presented:

- Ms. Evelyn A. Plaza, Acting Municipal Treasurer, informed the council that she consulted the municipal mayor and recommended for tax mapping and salvation of books, since there were misdeclaration of gross sales that she is aware based on her comparative records. She told the august body that she instructed the BPLO when validating the declared gross sales to consider whichever is higher, since she could not always monitor all the business applications for a two-day duty in the municipality — Thursday and Friday. She also advised Mr. Salatan, that if the business owner insisted of lower gross sales compared to their previous year income, he should impose an equal or at least a 5% increase BUT NOT LOWER. With her findings and the current scenario of some misdeclaration of gross sales, she consulted the BPLO, if he would agree, according to her, the next step is to proceed with the examination of the books of accounts, whatever differences from the actual summation of the books, then she will send notice of differences to involved parties and required for its payment accordingly.
- > Engr. Marlon B. Arintoc, MPDC and MDC secretary, acknowledged the explanations of the acting Municipal Treasurer, and he told the council that the issue is alarming because the MTO has their own target of collections, this could affect their performance, and the LGU may not have an increase of collections this year. He added that, as was discussed earlier, the LGU has savings from last year's performance that could not be sustained with this scenario if this will not be addressed.
- > The MDC Chairperson, Engr. Reinbert C. Costelo, asked Ms. Evelyn A. Plaza, acting Municipal Treasurer, how the current scenario would affect the general income of the LGU and its impact.
- Ms. Evelyn A. Plaza, Acting Municipal Treasurer, replied that a lower collection is possible and it could have a significant impact. She added that her constant instruction to the BPLO is to assess whichever is higher, if not possible, impose at least a 5% increase.
- > The MDC Chairperson, Engr. Reinbert C. Costelo, requested the acting Municipal Treasurer that the BPLO should attend the next scheduled MDC meeting.
- > Engr. Marlon B. Arintoc, MPDC and MDC secretary, asked the acting Municipal Treasurer how alarming the scenario is. He added that whenever a business owner has a one million losses or even lower, that business owner should declare bankruptcy, but when that business is still operating, then there is something unusual.
- > The MDC Chairperson, Engr. Reinbert C. Costelo, advised the acting Municipal Treasurer to act on the current issue, and he informed the august body that by the start of CY2025
- there will be a new designated BPLO.

 Ms. Evelyn A. Plaza, Acting Municipal Treasurer, informed the body that the BPLO is not following her orders and instructions. She relayed a situation when the BPLO issued an analicant last February 19. As agreed, the deadline for payment

BPLO and insisted that she would not allow that to happen, thus Mr. Salatan obliged and issued another OR to cover the penalty of the involved business applicant since it was evident that time that she was already angry.

- ➤ The MDC Chairperson, Engr. Reinbert C. Costelo, acknowledged the presence of Sangguniang Bayan members and requested if they could give him an authority to impose the tax mapping by the treasurer's office.
- Ms. Evelyn A. Plaza, Acting Municipal Treasurer, informed the MDC council that they have already initiated tax mapping in some barangays. She requested the present punong barangays to extend efforts to advise their constituents in religious payment of their real property taxes for them to have an increase of the RPT share. She added that there are a large numbers of delinquent accounts in the municipality.
- Mr. Eriberto Astorga, Vice-President, Senior Citizens Association of Tunga (SECAT):
 - O Shared his experience of RPT payment in the LGU which he addressed the acting municipal treasurer if who shall correct the observed malpractice. He relayed that personnels in the treasurer's office and assessor's office are unaware of the current RPT computations. In November 2020, when he transacted for the RPT payment of land of Mr. Eloc Susaya, he paid a much higher RPT from the year 2019 computation. Whereas, in the succeeding years, when a certain person transacted payment for the same RPT of the same land, since that person bought a portion a land from the same owner, it was found out that the basis of RPT was still in year 2019 computation, and was allowed paying the RPT.
- Ms. Evelyn A. Plaza, Acting Municipal Treasurer, responded to Mr. Eriberto Astorga with the assurance that she would address the matter and that her staffs would be cautious this time. Ms. Plaza shared her insights and their current initiative in the municipal treasurer's office wherein they are now implementing the iTax system provided by the provincial government of Leyte. With regards to the transaction of payment of RPT's, she assumed that the revenue collectors of the municipality were aware of the requirements when paying RPT's, but with her findings, the revenue collectors are not aware of the protocol. According to her, they conducted a meeting that morning for retooling. She informed the council that during her watch, they will now implement the ideal protocol for transacting RPT payments with the following requirements:
 - o Proof of ownership (i.e., deed of sale, tax declaration, title, etc.)
 - If tax declaration/title is under the name of the parents, a client may provide a deed of partition
 - Authorization letter is allowed among the family members to those who are not able to transact personally
 - Valid ID

She added that when a person bought a portion of land but not yet subdivided, that person is obliged to pay the whole amount based on the computation of the entire land and not only portion she bought. Ms. Plaza assured the council that she will post in conspicuous places the guidelines relative to RPT payment.

> The MDC Chairperson, Engr. Reinbert C. Costelo, solicited any other issues and other matters of information to be discussed with the council, but none was raised so the 2nd MDC meeting for the first semester was concluded

With no more matters to be discuss and resolved, Ms. Marilyn A. Cubilla, Municipal Budget Officer, moved that the meeting be adjourned.
