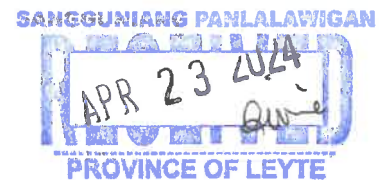

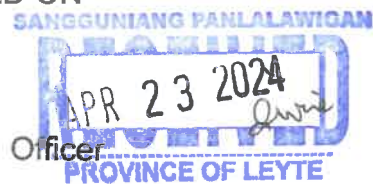

WHEREAS, Executive Order No. 297 Series of 2000 entitled regulating the manufacture, sale, distribution and use of PNP Uniforms, insignias and other accoutrements was signed on 04 October 2000 to control and manage the unauthorized manufacture, sale and distribution of PNP Uniforms, insignias and other accoutrements;

WHEREAS, the unauthorized manufacture, sale and distribution of PNP Uniforms, insignias and other accoutrements affect serious concerns that misleads constituents instead of providing security, it could be used by lawless elements in committing crimes within our territorial jurisdiction;

WHEREAS, in order to prevent the manufacture, sale and distribution of PNP Uniforms, insignias and other accoutrements, the Local Government Unit of Inopacan is in dire need to enact ordinance to mitigate, eradicate the proliferation of an authorized uniforms, insignias and the accoutrements in order to prevent commission of illegal activities;

NOW, THEREFORE, premises considered, the Sangguniang Bayan in session assembled hereby enact the following:

ORDINANCE NO. 24-02

“AN ORDINANCE MANDATING BUSINESS ESTABLISHMENTS THAT ENGAGED IN MANUFACTURING, SELLING OR DISTRIBUTION OF PNP UNIFORMS, INSIGNIAS AND OTHER ACCOUTREMENTS WITHIN THE MUNICIPALITY OF INOPACAN, PROVINCE OF LEYTE, TO SECURE PNP CERTIFICATE OF CONFORMITY, PROVIDING PENALTIES THEREOF AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES”

BE IT ORDAINED by the Sangguniang Bayan of Inopacan, Leyte that;

SECTION 1. This ordinance shall be known as “The PNP Certificate of Conformity Ordinance”.

SECTION 2. Definition of terms for purpose of implementation of this ordinance, the following terms shall have the following meaning:

2.1 PNP uniforms, insignias and accoutrements shall mean authorize clothing, garments with distinguished mark, emblem or decorations worn by officially acknowledgement members of the Philippine National Police;

2.2 PNP Certificate of conformity (COC) shall mean a Certification issued by the PNP through the Directorate for Research and Development (DRD) that signifies authority to manufacture, sell or distribute PNP uniforms, insignias and accoutrements;

2.3 Distributor shall mean an authorized dealer to supply and deliver PNP uniforms, insignias and accoutrement with a valid certificate of conformity;

2.4 Manufacture shall mean an act of making or producing fit to use, ready to wear PNP uniforms, insignias and other accoutrements;

2.5 BPLO shall mean business permit license office.

SECTION 3. Scope and Coverage. All business operating within the Municipality of Inopacan in the form of physical, online or in digital platforms that engage selling, manufacture of distribution of PNP uniforms, insignias and accoutrements.

SECTION 4. Requirements for PNP Certificate of Conformity. Business owners or representatives must secure the PNP Certificate of Conformity from Inopacan Police Station prior for the application of business permit.

SECTION 5. For effective implementation of this ordinance, procedures must be followed:

5.1 PNP personnel shall submit to the BPLO under the Municipal Treasurers office the lists of business establishments engaged in manufacturer, sale and distribution of PNP uniforms, insignias and accoutrements;

5.2 The BPLO shall recommend the business owner or his/her representative to secure first the PNP Certificate of Conformity during assessment of business permit.

5.3 PNP personnel shall inspect the business establishments and set a quality standards of produced clothing uniforms, insignias and accoutrement prior for the issuance of PNP Certificate of Conformity;

5.4 If the Certificate of Conformity has been issued, the proprietor or his/her representative shall proceed to the BPLO by presenting the PNP Certificate of Conformity and continue the process on business permit application and issuance.

SECTION 6. Implementing Office. The business permit licensing officer under the Municipal Treasurers Office is mandated to execute the provision of this ordinance in coordination with the assistance with the Inopacan Police personnel.

SECTION 7. Penalty for violating the provision of this ordinance. Failure to secure a PNP Certificate of Conformity shall be penalized as follows:

7.1 First Offense. A fine of One Thousand Pesos (1,000) or an imprisonment of one (1) day but not more than Three (3) days, or both at the discretion of the court;

7.2 Second Offense. A fine of One Thousand Five Hundred Pesos (1,500.00) or an imprisonment or not less than Five (5) days but not more than Seven (7) days, or both, at the discretion of the court;

7.3 Third Offense. A fine of Two Thousand Five Hundred Pesos (2,500.00) or an imprisonment of not less than Ten (10) days but not more than Fifteen (15) days, or both, at the discretion of the court plus cancellation of business permit.

SECTION 8. Compromise Penalty- The Municipal Treasurer is hereby authorized to enter into a compromise settlement fee as maybe mutually agreed upon by both parties.

SECTION 9. Repealing Clause. All Ordinances, Resolutions, orders and/or Rules and Regulations inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed and modified accordingly.

SECTION 10. Separately Clause. If any Section or Provision of this ordinance is decreased void or unconstitutional. The remaining Section or Provision there of shall not be attached by such declaration.

SECTION 11. Effectively Clause. This Ordinance shall take effect after its approval.

MINUTES OF THE PUBLIC HEARING OF THE PROPOSED MUNICIPAL ORDINANCE OF THE 15TH SANGGUNIANG BAYAN OF INOPACAN, LEYTE HELD ON FEBRUARY 12, 2024 AT THE SB SESSION HALL, NEW TOWN HALL, INOPACAN, LEYTE

1 **PRESENT: (Please see attached Attendance Sheet, also attached are the lists of**
2 **personalities invited)**
3

4 The proposed Ordinances submitted for public hearing is entitled, **“An Ordinance**
5 **Mandating Business Establishments that Engaged in Manufacturing, Selling, or**
6 **Distribution of PNP Uniforms, Insignias, and Other Accoutrements Within the**
7 **Municipality of Inopacan, Province of Leyte, to Secure PNP Certificate of Conformity,**
8 **Providing Penalties Thereof and for Other Purposes”**
9

10 The public hearing started at 2:30 in the afternoon with an opening prayer through
11 computer audio and was immediately followed by the singing of the national anthem
12 synchronized with the computer audio.
13

14 Mr. Narcis Lean N. Montajes, SB Staff thanked everyone for attending the Public
15 Hearing. He acknowledged the presence of the Municipal Mayor, Honorable Rogelio D. Pua,
16 Jr. and the SB Members present, namely: Honorable Fernando B. Rulete and Honorable
17 Andrew B. Dedal, the Authors; the co-Authors namely: Honorable Alfie Jian B. Yamson and
18 Honorable Joel D. Bernales (coming); Honorable Zenaida G. de los Santos, and Honorable
19 Nathaniel Dave M. Katigbe. He also introduced to the participants the PNP Chief, Police
20 Major Ian Salvador Po; the BPLO, Mr. Gilbert Miranda and the Municipal Administrator,
21 Engr. Francis Jonathan B. Phua.
22

23 For the Introductory Message, he gave the floor to Honorable Rulete. The latter,
24 thanked all the participants for their presence. He then read the title of the Ordinance,
25 subject for today’s public hearing. He then gave the floor to Honorable Dedal, also an
26 author, for the discussion of the said Ordinance.
27

28 Honorable Dedal gave due respect to the Mayor, Honorable Jojo Pua, the PNP
29 Chief, and to his colleague - Members of the Honorable Body and the participants. He then
30 explained that the Public Hearing is being pushed through because the above-captioned
31 Ordinance entails penalties for the violators. So, the queries will then be addressed. He
32 expounds further the title of the Ordinance, citing examples of insignias such as patches
33 which are considered as not the primary parts of the PNP uniforms, and the accoutrements
34 like gloves, cap, and bags. Honorable Dedal put emphasis that an individual must secure
35 the Certificate of Conformity, once involve in manufacturing, selling or distribution of the
36 aforementioned, for the purpose of counter-checking with the PNP. Honorable Dedal
37 discussed in detail, the entirety of the Ordinance.
38

39 The floor has been opened for the forum and the SB Staff explained to the
40 participants to introduce first their names and designation prior to stating their queries for the
41 record purposes.
42

43 Rolando Aporador had a query, presenting his camouflage bag if the same is okay or
44 not. Honorable Dedal let the PNP Chief identify the design of the bag and the latter
45 confirmed the same as okay since the design does not belong to the PNP insignias and
46 accoutrements. However, Police Major Po said that the same kind of sling bags caught up
47 their attention and sometimes they conducted basic interview of the people using the same
48 due to some records that same sling bags are used as the accessories in some criminal
49 incidents. He explained it further.

50 PMAJ Po made mention relative the penal code which prohibits the unauthorized
 51 personnel on the use of the PNP and AFP uniforms, insignias and accoutrements. He also
 52 made a manifestation that the PNP insignias and accoutrements are manufactured with a
 53 duly purposes, hence, the same should be authentic and within the PNP standard. He also
 54 emphasized that manufacturers/sewers shall also check and or help to verify the identity of
 55 those making the orders and or requesting their sewing services if they really are PNP or
 56 AFP and or if they are in doubt of the person's identity, then they could inform the PNP so
 57 that the PNP will take charge in the identification/verification procedures, especially when
 58 somebody requested to manufacture more items, so it could possibly be something... The
 59 PNP will do the background check, to avoid conflict also between the manufacturer and the
 60 requesting party. It could help the PNP as well, as Police Major Po said, to live a peaceful,
 61 better and safer place. According to Police Major Po, he will refer the approved Ordinance to
 62 the higher office of the PNP. He is amenable that they are not that expert to identify as to its
 63 standard as well. The Regional Office also has the accredited partner relative to the
 64 manufacture of the PNP uniforms, insignias and accoutrements. As to the confirmatory
 65 query of Honorable Dedal, Police Major Po replied that to him, it is below standard.
 66

67 Honorable Yamson asked the PNP, for and on behalf of the participants at his back,
 68 as during the career guidance programs of the schools, students are deemed to wear
 69 uniforms that represents their future professions, and police uniform always gets involve,
 70 some even opted to have it manufactured for the purpose. Police Major Po replied that there
 71 is that certain Republic Act which took effect 4 years ago, and there are some universities
 72 being authorized in the wearing of PNP uniforms but for the interns, the color is different
 73 from the standard one. However, as to senior high schools, for career guidance purposes, it
 74 is okay since they are identified as students, while some also borrow uniforms from the PNP
 75 personnel. Honorable Dedal added that students are identified, while on the other hand,
 76 others than students, seemed suspicious also and might create a proliferation scenario.
 77 Police Major Po relayed also to all that PNP personnel are prohibited to even upload tiktok
 78 wearing PNP uniform, and commenting even is not allowed, hair colors are also prohibited.
 79 The law prohibits the exploitation of the PNP uniforms.
 80

81 Mr. Buenaventura Labad, a sewer-manufacturer, asked about the CAFGU who often
 82 needs his service as to their uniforms. Police Major Po replied that he could not answer the
 83 query since they are PNP personnel and the Ordinance also involves PNP only, excluding
 84 the AFP, as the AFP had also their own laws, rules and regulations. However, according to
 85 Police Major Po, Mr. Buenaventura already knows the CAFGUs already.
 86

87 Meanwhile, PMAJ manifested that since, now the August Body is in the virtue of
 88 approving the Ordinance, if the Certificate of Conformity serves the purpose if manufacturers
 89 or sellers focus to only one accoutrement like cap alone, patches only, shoes only and the
 90 like. Honorable Dedal replied in affirmative. Otherwise, selling, manufacturing, or distribution
 91 of the aforementioned, without the Certificate of Conformity, means, its illegal. Views and
 92 opinions were aired.
 93

94 As Honorable Dedal asked the PNP if the Certificate of Conformity entails no fee/s,
 95 Police Major replied that it depends upon the Ordinance of the LGU since the PNP is not
 96 allowed to collect dues and taxes. Honorable Dedal said that, per the subject Ordinance in
 97 today's public hearing, there being no fees involved. Views and opinions were aired.
 98

99 As the discussions developed, Honorable Dedal informed all the participants that he
 100 will going to add another Section for compromise penalty. He explained it in detail.
 101

102 Towards the end of the discussions, Mr. Gilbert Miranda, the BPLO, posed an advice
 103 to all participants that upon securing their business permit, they must bring with them
 104 already the Certificate of Conformity to fasten the process and avoid delays.
 105

106 Since there being no more other questions, the public hearing ended at 3:05 o'clock
 107 in the afternoon.
