- Ordinance No. 2024-06 entitled: **An Ordinance Mandating Business Operating within the Territorial Jurisdiction of the Municipality of Tanauan, Leyte, to Secure a Philippine National Police (PNP) Certificate and/or Certificate of Distributorship before Manufacturing, Selling, Using, or Distributing PNP Uniform, Insignias, and other Accoutrements and Prescribing Penalties for Violations thereof.**

REVIEW/RECOMMENDATION/LEGAL OPINION:

This office is of the opinion that the subject Ordinance is within the power covered under the Local Government Code of 1991 (R.A 7160), particularly under Section 447 (1) (ii)¹, (x)². This likewise conforms to E.O 297 regulating the manufacture, sale, distribution and use of PNP uniforms, to ensure that items are produced and sold only by PNP authorized manufacturer. 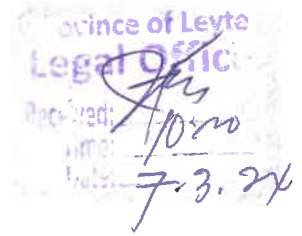

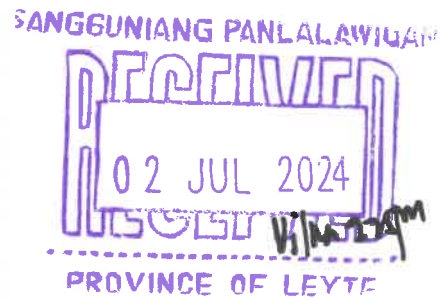

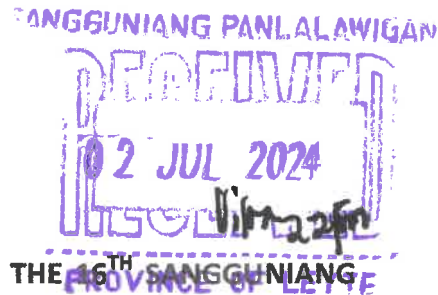

ORDINANCE NO. 2024 – 06

AN ORDINANCE MANDATING BUSINESSES OPERATING WITHIN THE TERRITORIAL JURISDICTION OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF TANAUAN, LEYTE, TO SECURE A PHILIPPINE NATIONAL POLICE (PNP) CERTIFICATE OF CONFORMITY AND/OR CERTIFICATE OF DISTRIBUTORSHIP BEFORE MANUFACTURING, SELLING, USING, OR DISTRIBUTING PNP UNIFORM, INSIGNIAS, AND OTHER ACCOUTREMENTS AND PRESCRIBING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS THEREOF.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE SANGGUNIANG BAYAN OF TANAUAN, LEYTE IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED THAT:

WHEREAS, Section 16 of the Local Government Code or Republic Act No. 7160, also known as the General Welfare Clause provides in part that every local government unit shall ensure and support the maintenance of peace and order within their respective territorial jurisdiction;

WHEREAS, Executive Order No. 297 entitled Regulating the Manufacture, Sale, Distribution and Use of PNP Uniforms, Insignias and Other Accoutrements was signed on October 4, 2000 to control and manage unauthorized manufacture, sale and distribution of PNP uniforms, insignias and other accoutrements;

WHEREAS, E.O. No. 297 imposes as penalties the immediate closure of establishment; cancellation of business license or permit condemnation, seizure and forfeiture of unauthorized items and imposition of reasonable fines for violators of the said order, all of which could be undertaken by the local government units concerned;

WHEREAS, the unauthorized manufacture, sale, use and distribution of PNP uniforms, insignias and other accoutrements impose serious concerns since such symbolic PNP identifiers,

instead of providing a comforting sense of security, could be used by lawless elements in the commission of crimes within the municipality.

WHEREAS, considering that the PNP National Headquarters sits within the territorial jurisdiction of the Municipality of Tanauan, Leyte and there are a number of business establishments that engage in the manufacture, sale and distribution of PNP uniforms, insignias and other accoutrements, there is a dire need to enact a corresponding municipal ordinance to mitigate or even eradicate the proliferation of the unauthorized PNP uniforms and commission of illegal activities within the Municipal of Tanauan, Leyte.

SECTION 1. TITLE OF THE ORDINANCE – This Ordinance shall be known as: An Ordinance Mandating Businesses Operating within the Territorial Jurisdiction of the Municipality of Tanauan, Leyte to Secure a PNP Certificate of Conformity before Manufacturing, Selling, Using or Distributing PNP Uniforms, Insignias and Other Accoutrements and Prescribing Penalties for Violations Thereof.

SECTION 2. SCOPE AND APPLICATION – All businesses, whether in physical, online or in digital platforms, engaged in line manufacture, sale, use and distribution of Philippine National Police uniforms, insignias, and other accoutrements. It includes enterprises dealing with raw materials for the production of aforementioned items.

SECTION 3. DEFINITION OF TERMS – For purposes of implementation of this Ordinance, the following definitions shall be binding and controlling:


- a) **PNP Uniforms, Insignias and Accoutrements** – these are authorized clothing, garment, distinguishing mark emblem, merchandise, or decorations worn by bona fide members and officially acknowledged by the PNP.
- b) **PNP Certificate of Conformity** – a certification issued by the PNP through the Directorate for Research and Development (DRD) which signifies authority to manufacture, sell, or distribute PNP uniforms, insignias, and accoutrements.
- c) **Distributor** – an authorized agents or a supplier or manufacturer to supply or deliver PNP uniforms, insignias, and accoutrements wherein the latter has a valid PNP Certificate of Conformity.
- d) **Manufacture and Sale** – act of producing or trading of fit-to-use, ready-to-wear, or ready-to-use PNP uniforms, insignias, and other accoutrements.
- e) **Certificate of Distributorship** – a certificate issued by a holder of PNP Certificate of Conformity which warrants that the person/company is authorized to distribute, supply, or sell specific PNP uniforms, insignia, and other accoutrements.

SECTION 4. REQUIREMENTS FOR PNP CERTIFICATE OF CONFORMITY AND/OR CERIFICATE OF DISTRIBUTORSHIP – All businesses engaged and dealing with PNP uniforms, insignias and accoutrements must secure a PNP Certificate of Conformity and/or a Certificate of Distributorship before applying for a corresponding business license or permit. All existing businesses shall likewise secure the same certification prior to its application for business license/permit renewal.

SECTION 5. IMPLEMENTING OFFICES – The Business Permit and Licensing Office (BPLO) is the primary office mandated, with the assistance of the Tanauan Municipal Police Station.

SECTION 6. COORDINATION WITH THE PNP – The BPLO will regularly coordinate with the Tanauan PNP for the latest list of manufacturers, suppliers, sellers, distributors, etc. with valid and existing PNP Certificate of Conformity and/or Certificate of Distributorship. The update list will be the basis of verification by the Municipality of Tanauan, Leyte of the status of the applicant for business license/permit.

SECTION 7. AUTHORITY TO INSPECT ESTABLISHMENTS – The BPLO shall be authorized to conduct inspection of business establishments requiring the presentation of its respective PNP Certificate of Conformity and/or Certificate of Distributorship. Authorized distributors of PNP

uniforms, insignias, and other accoutrements shall likewise present acceptable proof of authority to supply, sell, or trade the aforementioned items.

SECTION 8. PENALTIES – Failure to present or submit a PNP Certificate of Conformity and/or PNP Certificate of Distributorship is a ground denial of application for issuance/renewal of business permit or license for the covered businesses.

For purposes of this Ordinance, after thirty (30) days from the initial findings of non-compliance, continued and subsequent failure to comply with the provisions of this Ordinance shall constitute grounds for suspension, revocation, or cancellation of establishment's business permit.

In case of violations found during the aforementioned inspections for failure to present competent proof of authority to deal PNP uniforms, insignias, and other accoutrements, the items found therein shall be seized or confiscated subject to proper disposal, without prejudice to the cancellation or revocation of business license/permit and the filing of appropriate administrative, civil, or criminal case.

Any violator of the aforementioned provisions shall be imposed of a penalty of fine not exceeding P2,500 but not less than P1,000 and/or imprisonment for 6 months at the discretion of the court.

SECTION 9. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE – If for any reason, any section of this Ordinance shall be held unconstitutional or invalid other sections which are not affected thereby shall continue to be in full force and effect.

SECTION 10. REPEALING CLAUSE – All ordinances, rules and regulations or part thereof in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed, provided that the rights that are vested upon the effectivity of this Ordinance shall not be impaired.

SECTION 11. EFFECTIVITY CLAUSE – This Ordinance shall take effect ten (10) days after its publication in a newspaper of general circulation.

MINUTES OF THE PUBLIC HEARING

MAY 16, 2024

TANAUAN PRESIDENCIA LOBBY

SUBJECTS:

1. A PROPOSED ORDINANCE MANDATING BUSINESSES OPERATING WITHIN THE TERRITORIAL JURISDICTION OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF TANAUAN, LEYTE TO SECURE A PHILIPPINE NATIONAL POLICE (PNP) CETTIFICATE OF CONFORMITY AND/OR CERTIFICATE OF DISTRIBUTORSHIP BEFORE MANUFACTURING, SELLING, USING OR DISTRIBUTING PNP UNIFORM, INSIGNIAS AND OTHER ACCOUTREMENTS AND PRESCRIBING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS THEREOF.

2. A PROPOSED ORDINANCE PROHIBITING ACTS OF DISCRIMINATION WITHIN THE MUNICIPALITY OF TANAUAN, LEYTE ON THE BASIS OF ETHNICITY, RACE, COLOR SEX, GENDER, SEX CHARACTERISTICS, LANGUAGE, RELIGION OR BELIEF, POLITICAL OR OTHER OPINION, SOCIAL ORIGIN, PROPERTY, BIRTH AND OTHER PROTECTED ATTRIBUTES AND PROVIDING PENALTIES THEREOF.

SPONSOR: HON. PAUL EMMANUEL R. CINCO

CO-SPONSOR: HON. CHERRY ANNE T. FIEL

PRELIMINARIES:

The public hearing was commenced with an opening prayer. In attendance were the sponsors of the proposed ordinance, the Chairman of the SB Committee on Laws, the Chairpersons of the different Barangays; and representatives from the different stakeholders of the municipality.

Afterwards, the salient provisions of afore-stated proposed Ordinances were presented.

DISCUSSION/OPEN FORUM:

The Tanauan III District Supervisor, Ms. Pamela Almanza raised the concern on instances were the sons or kids of PNP Officers are also wearing the uniforms or accessories and whether they shall be covered with the sanctions provided in the proposed Ordinance. She added whether the students who are performing Drama, parades and or role plays for academic purpose or for portraying different professions shall also be sanctioned.



Hon. Cinco answered that since the Ordinance include as prohibited act the "use" of such uniforms or accessories, thus the use by students of the said uniforms or accessories are deemed violation of the Ordinance unless there is a Certificate of Conformity. It is advised that the schools or students may resort to similar uniforms but which are not totally or exactly the uniforms and accessories used by the PNP Officers.

Hon. Espada added that if the Ordinance will be passed, the application thereof will include all persons or entity, including the kids or immediate family of PNP Officers who are not members of the organization.

The Representative from Tanauan MPS added that they are strongly advocating for the passage of the proposed Ordinance as there were instances when they flagged down a group of young men who were wearing complete set of PNP Uniform with insignias but were wearing rubber shoes and that at first glance the public could have mistaken them to be PNP Officers. Due to the rampant cases of unauthorized use of the Official Uniforms of the PNP Officers, the PNP was alarmed and thus it was coordinated with the DILG for the passage of the proposed Ordinance.

Hon. Fiel added that the proposed Ordinance also seek to protect the image of the PNP Officers and to deter the commission of future crimes by pretending to be police Officers.

There having no further salient concerns on the first proposed Ordinance, the second proposed Ordinance was then presented and the open forum followed. The sponsors of the proposed ordinance emphasized that the said proposal was endorsed by the Commission on Human Rights to institutionalize and heightened the protection of the rights of individual especially against any form of discrimination.

Hon. Cinco further stated that the only vulnerable group that are not specifically mentioned in the proposed ordinance are the ethnic groups, in which there is no particular ethnic group in the municipality except for the *badjaos* who are considered as nomads as they do not settle in a particular place or municipality. Nevertheless, the sponsors of the said proposed Ordinance stated that the Commission on Human Rights also manifested that they will come up with a separate template of proposed Ordinance addressing the rights of this similar tribes to be legislated in the concerned local government units.

CONCLUSION:

There having no further salient queries or comments to the above-stated proposed Ordinances, the Public Hearing was adjourned.
