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RESOLUTION NO. 2024-311

**A RESOLUTION APPROVING ON THIRD AND FINAL READING, PROVINCIAL ORDINANCE NO. 2024-09, ENTITLED: "AN ORDINANCE INSTITUTIONALIZING A FUNCTIONAL DISASTER RISK REDUCTION AND MANAGEMENT IN HEALTH (DRRM-H) SYSTEM IN THE PROVINCE-WIDE HEALTH SYSTEMS (PWHS) OF THE PROVINCE OF LEYTE AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES."**

**WHEREAS**, Section 2 (d) of Republic Act No. 10121 also known as the "Philippine Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Act of 2010" provides that the state shall adopt a disaster risk reduction and management approach and promote the involvement of all sectors and all stakeholders concerned;

**WHEREAS**, Section 2 (a) of R.A. No. 11223 also known as the "Universal Health Care Act" provides that the state shall adopt an integrated and comprehensive approach to ensure that all Filipinos are health-literate, provided with healthy living conditions, and protected from hazards and risks that could affect their health;

**WHEREAS**, Chapter 3, Service Delivery on the Challenges and Implications of the National Objectives for Health 2017-2022 issued by the Department of Health elaborated on the country's vulnerability to disaster risks and inadequate local support to disaster preparedness, response and management aimed to intensify strategies to reduce public health threats by working towards institutionalizing resilient health systems, among others;

**WHEREAS**, DOH Administrative Order No. 2019-0046 or the National Policy on Disaster Risk Reduction and Management in Health (DRRM-H) required the institutionalization of DRRM-H to enhance the capacities of the health system to manage health risks, and attain resilience in the communities;

**WHEREAS**, Section 17.2 Rule IV. Health Service Delivery of the Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR) of RA No. 11223 provides that the DOH shall endeavor to the network contracting of the province-wide and city-wide health systems for the delivery of population-based health services including those that impact on the social determinants of health.

**WHEREAS**, Section 17.3 (d) of the same Rule provides that a Province-wide and City-wide health systems shall have timely, effective and efficient preparedness and response to public health emergencies and disasters, and other means to ensure delivery of population-based health services;

**WHEREAS**, Section 19 of the Rule on the Integration of Local Health Systems into Province-wide and City-wide Health System elaborated the implementation of health service delivery and health systems management. Health service delivery function is defined as the management of the health service delivery operations of public health programs which includes disaster risk reduction and management among others within the province/city-wide health system;

**WHEREAS**, Section 41, Rule XI the IRR provides that at the minimum, managerial and technical integration shall be characterized by a functional disaster risk reduction and management in the health system among other requirements as its primary focus;

**WHEREAS**, Section 16 of the Local Government Code of 1991 mandates all local government units to exercise powers necessary, appropriate or incidental for its efficient and effective governance, and those which are essential for the promotion of health and safety, among other things;



403 **Section 2. Declaration of Principles and Policies.** It is the policy of the Province of Leyte to  
404 promote the health and safety of the Leyteños by ensuring support, among others, the  
405 promotion of health and safety. Towards this end, the Province of Leyte shall adopt:

406

407 a. Science and evidence-based, easily scalable means to institutionalize and organize a  
408 functional DRRM-H system which supports the province wide health system, that is  
409 resilient to shocks and stresses; and  
410

411 b. People-centered, equitable and accessible DRRM-H system able to initially operate  
412 and guarantee a timely, effective and efficient preparedness and response to public  
413 health emergencies and disasters, and other means to ensure delivery of population-  
414 based health services.  
415

416 **Section 3. General Objectives.** This Ordinance seeks to:

417

418 a. Institutionalize a functional DRRM-H system within the province-wide health system of the  
419 Province of Leyte to manage and mitigate the adverse effects, impacts and health  
420 consequences of emergencies and disasters including climate change;  
421

422 b. Organize and implement a functional DRRM-H System through procedures and  
423 technical specifications necessary for the operationalization and transition;  
424

425 c. Promote the involvement and participation of all sectors and all stakeholders  
426 concerned, at all levels, especially the local community; and  
427

428 d. Allocate resources for the operationalization of a functional DRRM-H system at the PWHS.  
429

430 **Section 4. Scope and Coverage.** This Ordinance shall include and cover:

431

432 The Province-Wide Health System (PWHS) of the Province of Leyte including its sub-provincial  
433 health systems, and all member public and private, local and international stakeholders and  
434 partners.

435 **Section 5. Definition of Terms.** As used in this Ordinance, the following terms shall mean:

436

437 a. **Disaster Risk Reduction and Management in Health (DRRM-H)** – shall refer to an  
438 integrated, system-based, multi-sectoral process that utilizes policies, plans, programs,  
439 strategies to reduce health risks due to disasters and emergencies, improve  
440 preparedness for adverse effects and lessen adverse impacts of hazards to address  
441 needs of affected population with emphasis on the vulnerable groups.  
442

443 b. **DRRM-H Institutionalization** shall refer to the establishment of a functional DRRM-H  
444 System, which includes the following minimum key indicators: approved, updated,  
445 tested, disseminated DRRM-H Plan with budget allocation, organized and trained

446 Health Emergency Response Teams, available and accessible essential Health  
447 Emergency Commodities and Emergency Operations Center, with command and  
448 control, communication and coordination.  
449

450 c. **Functional DRRM-H System** shall refer to the operational system which is a contracting  
451 network that manages and mitigates the adverse effects and impacts, and health  
452 consequences of emergencies and disasters including climate change in the province-  
453 wide health systems and concretized by investment in and conduct of core processes  
454 namely (1) governance, (2) service delivery, (3) resources management and  
455 mobilization, and (4) information and knowledge management to guarantee timely,  
456 effective and efficient preparedness and response to public health emergencies and  
457 disasters, and other means to ensure uninterrupted delivery of population-based health  
458 services.  
459

460 **Section 6. ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES.** The following shall be the roles and responsibilities of  
461 implementers and other stakeholders of the DRRM-H system that would include, but not  
462 limited to, the Health Care Provider Network (HCPN):

463

464 a. **Provincial Health Board** shall exercise their administrative and technical supervision over  
465 health facilities and services, health personnel, and all other health resources within  
466 their territorial jurisdiction.  
467

468 b. **Provincial Health Office** as the principal implementer of this Ordinance, under the  
469 stewardship of the Provincial Health Board, shall be responsible for the integration and  
470 supervision to organize and manage the institutionalization of DRRM-H in the PWHS, at  
471 the same time also represent the health sector in relevant DRRM activities or delegate  
472 such function as necessary.  
473

474 c. **Component City/Municipal Health Office** in the PWHS, shall participate and cooperate  
475 in the contracting network established by the Province. They shall endeavor to attain  
476 integration requirement as resources permit, still comply with standards and ensure  
477 upgrading of facilities, and support in the submission of necessary reports. All non UHC  
478 integrated component city and municipality shall pursue transactions through existing  
479 mechanisms and processes.  
480

481 d. **Health Care Provider Network (Primary Care Provider Network including Secondary and  
482 Tertiary Hospitals)** shall ensure delivery of population-based essential health services  
483 and ensure an interoperable system to optimize coordination with patients for smooth  
484 transactions, two-way referral and remove barriers to health services especially in mass  
485 casualty incidents or in emergencies and disasters.  
486

487 e. **Public Health Unit in Hospitals** shall establish a platform where close coordination with  
488 local Operation Centers / Emergency Operation Centers is possible in receiving and  
489 managing populations within and outside the network.  
490

491 f. **Contracted Apex or end-referral Hospitals** shall receive consultations and referral of  
492 population for complicated services and/or specialized care in emergency and  
493 disaster whenever necessary especially in mass casualty incidents or in emergencies  
494 and disasters.



495 **Section 7. Institutionalizing DRRM-H System in PWHS and its Sub-Provincial Health System.** In  
496 consideration to the approved standards and guidelines by the Civil Service Commission  
497 and endeavored organizational structure and staffing pattern as stipulated in Rule 19.12 of  
498 the UHC IRR, the local health office, in their initiative to create Divisions for the following  
499 functions Health Service Delivery and Health System Support, shall study the feasibility and  
500 implementation of the following functions for the operation and staffing for DRRM-H in the  
501 PWHS.

502

503 **a. Organizational Structure of the DRRM-H Unit at the local level.** The Provincial Health  
504 Office, as approved by the Provincial Health Board, shall determine the establishment  
505 and composition of the DRRM-H Unit or the Program Management Team, in  
506 accordance with the organization of the respective PWHS of the said LGU.

507

508 Each DRRM-H Unit or Program Management Team in PHO and in LGU-managed  
509 hospitals shall have at least one (1) DRRM-H Manager and one (1) Assistant, duly trained  
510 on DRRM-H. Other staffing deemed appropriate and necessary shall also follow  
511 pending the formal creation or establishment of plantilla positions in the LGUs. The  
512 Provincial Health Board in the interim may temporarily designate personnel capable of  
513 performing tasks stated herein, and be provided with essential resources, to serve as  
514 members of the DRRM-H System.

515 A Functional DRRM-H System shall be headed by a DRRM-H Manager, who shall  
516 perform the following functions:

517

518 a. Prevention, Mitigation and Preparedness which primarily focuses on:  
519     ▪ Dissemination and monitoring of adopted policies/standards based on  
520         National Guidelines or developed local policies, plans, programs for health  
521         emergency and disaster risk prevention/mitigation and preparedness  
522     ▪ Facilitation and conduct of capability building activities for various  
523         stakeholders  
524     ▪ Facilitation of partnership and networking activities with stakeholders  
525     ▪ Provision of other technical/financial assistance (promotion, awareness raising,  
526         monitoring and research, etc.)  
527

528 b. Response, Recovery and Rehabilitation which primarily focuses on:  
529     ▪ Dissemination and monitoring of adopted policies/standards based on  
530         National Guidelines or developed local policies, plans, programs for health  
531         emergency and disaster response, recovery and rehabilitation  
532     ▪ Delivery of essential health services and products in all phases of  
533         emergency/disaster through mobilization of resources such as Technical  
534         Experts, HERTs and tangible logistics needed locally and internationally  
535     ▪ Management of health emergency and disaster information/knowledge and  
536         facilitate coordination activities between partner agencies/organizations  
537     ▪ Provision of support to recovery and rehabilitation through technical and  
538         financial assistance

539 c. Administration and Finance  
540     ▪ Performance monitoring of the DRRM-H system to facilitate the managerial,  
541         technical and financial integration  
542

543     ▪ Establishment of accountability mechanisms

- 544                   ▪ Management of budgetary allocation and support  
545                   ▪ Other support to DRRM-H System activities and operations  
546

547 **b. Concept of Operations.** The DRRM-H Framework pursuant to DOH AO NO. 2019-0046.  
548 The attainment of the societal goals and final outcomes on DRRM-H shall depend  
549 mainly on investments in promoting or advocating resilience of the health system and  
550 involvement of communities in the provinces, sustaining its development in all thematic  
551 areas. The output, that is the functional DRRM-H system, shall support the delivery of  
552 essential health cluster population-based services: Medical and Public Health; Nutrition  
553 in Emergencies; Water, Sanitation and Hygiene in Emergencies; and Mental Health and  
554 Psychosocial Support  
555

556 **c. Operationalization of DRRM-H System.** The DOH Administrative Order No. 2020-0036 on  
557 the Institutionalization of DRRM-H in Province-wide and City-wide Health Systems  
558 expounds the initiative needed from the Leyte Provincial Government in order to  
559 institutionalize a functional DRRM-H System. The following shall be operationalized  
560 pursuant to UHC IRR within the six-year transition period commitment for Provincial wide  
561 integration wherein managerial and technical integration is expected to be  
562 demonstrated in the first three years, and financial integration thereafter (year 2020-  
563 2025). The aim is to institute a workable system that can initiate and perform in  
564 coordination with the health system in place and communities at large. The following  
565 initiatives shall aid in resilience building and in guaranteeing a timely, effective and  
566 efficient preparedness and response to public health emergencies and disasters, and  
567 other means to ensure uninterrupted delivery of population-based health services.  
568

569 **c.1. Managerial Integration.**

570  
571 The Province of Leyte shall undergo managerial integration over its resources  
572 such as health facilities, human resources for health, health finances, health  
573 information system, health technologies, equipment and supplies to deliver the  
574 minimum requirements to establish a functional DRRM-H system for the PWHS.

575

576 **a. Development of the DRRM-H Plan**

577  
578 The DRRM-H Plan is a strategic and thematic plan of the PWHS referenced  
579 from the DRRM-H Planning Guide and finalized by Provincial Health Office in  
580 coordination with the DRRM-H Planning Committee and shall be approved  
581 by the Provincial Governor; updated annually or as necessary; tested  
582 through drills or other forms of exercises [e.g. semi-annually]; disseminated  
583 verbally and written to stakeholders of the network; and must be funded for  
584 operationalization.

585  
586 The DRRM-H Plan, shall be an integrated plan of the Provincial Health Office  
587 and all of its Hospitals, and other service delivery units within the Health Care  
588 Provider Network (HCPN) and shall be an input in the Leyte Provincial  
589 Government's investment, development and operational plan especially in



590 the Local Investment Plan for Health (LIPH), its Annual Operation Plan (AOP)  
591 and Disaster Risk Reduction and Management (DRRM) Plan.

592

593 **b. Organization and Training of Health Emergency Response Team (HERT)**  
594

595 The HERTs are to be organized and mobilized whenever necessary based on  
596 the type of events, in emergencies, and disasters guided by the minimum  
597 requirements for implementation based on latest updates/guidelines and by  
598 the provisions stated in DOH Administrative Order No. 2018-0018 or the  
599 National Policy on the Mobilization of Health Emergency Response Teams  
600 and its amendments. Their safety, security, self-sufficiency shall be ensured.

601

602 Continuous Professional Education and participation to complete DRRM-H-  
603 related training shall be encouraged depending on the needed  
604 competency of HERTs based on roles and functions. Within six [6] months  
605 from the effectivity of this ordinance, a 6-year implementation plan on  
606 capability building shall be developed to attain the LHS ML functional level  
607 training requirements and conduct of learning and development needs  
608 analysis shall be facilitated [frequency e. g. each year] for routine  
609 assessment.

610

611 **c. Availability and accessibility of Health Emergency Commodities (HECs)**  
612

613 The HEC to be procured or strategically stockpiled are adopted based on  
614 guidelines or recommended logistics by the DOH to be procured by the  
615 local government and/or those that are deemed essential based on recent  
616 emergencies and disasters experienced in the area. These shall be made  
617 available and accessible to affected population in emergency or in disaster  
618 or upon the declaration of state of public health emergency or calamity by  
619 the local chief executives or by the President. The local government shall  
620 issue a separate issuance on the guidelines on the procurement and  
621 management of essential health emergency commodities for the PWHS.

622

623 **d. Establishment and activation of Operations Center (OC) and Emergency**  
624 **Operations Center (EOC) for Public Health**  
625

626

627 At the least, a functional Emergency Operations Center shall be established  
628 and activated, capable of 4Cs: Coordination; Communication; and  
629 Command and Control within the PHO. The EOC shall be interoperable with  
630 the Provincial Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office for  
631 synchronized operations and able to operate 24/7 in emergencies and  
632 disasters, whenever necessary. All duty personnel shall receive

633 orientation/training and shall receive adequate support to perform functions  
634 and deliver operations based on code alert level.

635

636 Within three [3] years from the effectivity of this ordinance, the Leyte  
637 Provincial Government through the PHO or its authorized representative, shall  
638 evaluate if there is a need to establish a Public Health Operations Center as  
639 the main hub for Public Health Emergency concerns. The recommendations  
640 shall be duly supported for implementation using this ordinance's  
641 appropriation or other relevant funds as available of the implementing office.

642

643 **c.2. DRRM-H System Management.**

644

645 The Leyte Provincial Government, through its PHO, shall perform the following for  
646 internal system capacitation and quality management. The following shall form  
647 part of the implementation review to be conducted.

648

649 a. Risk Analysis and Management. The PHO or authorized representative (e. g.  
650 DRRM-H Unit or Program Management Team) shall conduct routine  
651 monitoring of potential problem or threat and potential enhancement to  
652 improve the probability of success in establishing a functional DRRM-H  
653 System. Wherein potential actions shall be identified for development of  
654 action plans whenever necessary and appropriate.

655 b. Quality Assurance. The PHO or the authorized representative (e. g. DRRM-H  
656 Unit or Program Management Team) shall initiate the process of meeting the  
657 demands and expectations of the DRRM-H System's smooth operation and  
658 public feedback. The following initiative shall aid in this endeavor.

659

660 ▪ Standard Operating Procedures through a Citizen's Charter shall be  
661 developed for the office's commitment on standard, quality, and timely  
662 service delivery for transparency and accountability.

663

664 ▪ Training programs beneficial to strengthen competency shall be  
665 established or participated by all DRRM-H personnel.

666

667 ▪ Office and staff performance monitoring shall also be essential subject  
668 to the local office metrics and targeting and also in compliance to  
669 accomplishment and monitoring report requirements by the  
670 Department of Health.

671

672 ▪ The designated area or office to house its members shall be conducive  
673 and with adequate logistics/equipment to support operations.

674

675

676

677 **c.3. Technical Integration.**

678

679 The technical integration which focuses on health services provision from primary  
680 to tertiary care, shall be supported by the DRRM-H System in the PWHS through  
681 implementation of the following Core Processes:

682

683 a. Governance.

684

685 i. A planning committee shall be organized with the following members: (a)  
686 Provincial Health Officer, (b) Provincial Health Office Cluster Heads, (c)  
687 Provincial Health Office Administration to create the PWHS DRRM-H Plan,  
688 Contingency Plan, Public Service Continuity Plan and Communication  
689 and Promotional Plan within [n] year from the effectivity of this ordinance.  
690

691 ii. An Incident Command System shall be established for the EOC/OC, with  
692 members identified and roles and responsibility defined and made  
693 available for public view in the designated area where the EOC/OC shall  
694 be established.  
695

696 iii. Local clusters on Public Health/Medical including MISP-SRH, Nutrition in  
697 Emergencies, Water, Sanitation and Hygiene in Emergencies, and Mental  
698 Health and Psychosocial Support shall be organized through an  
699 Executive Order. Its members/representatives shall be supported by an  
700 office order with roles and responsibilities identified, rules of engagements  
701 expounded and reporting mechanisms discussed.  
702

703 iv. DRRM-H System shall be promoted and advocated especially in each  
704 year's National Disaster Resilience Month every July through conduct of  
705 awards and recognition of best practices.  
706

707 v. Local leaders and health system managers shall strengthen their  
708 leadership and management capacities through promoting good  
709 governance and management practices, and engaging partners to  
710 provide technical assistance.  
711

712 b. Service Delivery. Within three [3] years from the effectivity of this ordinance,  
713 the PHO shall develop the local governments manual of operations on  
714 Health Care Provider Network (HCPN) arrangements, gate-keeping and  
715 referral system within and outside PWHS in emergency and disaster situations  
716 especially in the management of pre-hospital care, field hospital and  
717 evacuation center management and hospital surge for the effective and  
718 efficient coordination, management of resources and delivery of essential  
719 health service packages.  
720

721 c. Resource Management and Mobilization. Within one (1) year from the  
722 effectivity of this ordinance, process flowchart shall be developed and shall  
723 be attached as an annex to the manual of operations developed for  
724 Service Delivery.

725 d. Knowledge and Information Management. There shall be innovative  
726 initiatives to maintain and sustain the optimized access and/or monitoring of  
727 health emergency and disaster knowledge/information to analyze and  
728 forecast trends, bolster early warning systems, recognize and document best  
729 practices, among others, supporting DRRM-H System operations.  
730

731 **c.4. Financial Integration.**

732

733 The Provincial Health Board shall implement financial integration subject to  
734 National Guidelines and in accordance to the terms of partnership in effect for  
735 the Leyte Provincial Government. Recommendations to the Provincial Health  
736 Board on the needed support in planning and investments, allocation and  
737 utilization of Special Health Fund, financial grants, subsidies and donations, etc.  
738 for DRRM-H System operations and allocation for Contingency Fund shall be  
739 based on the latest assessment conducted by the authorized representative  
740 implementing the functional DRRM-H System.

741 **Section 8. Reporting and Monitoring.** The Provincial Health Office shall lead and oversee the  
742 regular monitoring and evaluation of the implementation of the functional DRRM-H System. It  
743 may designate other relevant office/s or authorized representatives to carry out monitoring  
744 activities provided that all data gathered shall be submitted to and consolidated by the  
745 Provincial Health Office for regular reporting to the Provincial Health Board. These data shall  
746 also be used to decide on the frequency of reporting by which can be periodically modified  
747 as necessary based on performance and recommendation. Results shall be made available  
748 to the Department of Health and to its regional counterparts and representatives as  
749 requested.

750

751 **Section 9. Appropriation.** The funding necessary to implement the provisions of this  
752 Ordinance and to implement the program may be sourced out from the following, in order  
753 of priority:

- 754 a. The LGU's annual National Tax Allotment (NTA);  
755
- 756 b. National Government Agency (NGA) subsidy to related programs, project, and  
757 activities through relevant agencies; and  
758
- 759 c. Supplemental funding request from relevant National Government Agencies (NGAs).  
760

761 Fund allotments shall be based on local investment review and latest menu of activities  
762 issued by the Department of Health through the Health Emergency Management Bureau  
763 (HEMB). All fund transfers, disbursements, utilization and accounting of resources shall strictly  
764 adhere to all government budgeting, accounting and auditing rules and regulations.

765

766 **Section 10. Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR).** The Provincial Governor may issue  
767 appropriate and relevant rules and regulation, as necessary for the proper implementation  
768 of any and all provisions of this Ordinance.

769

770 **Section 11. Repealing Clause.** All other orders and issuances, as well as pertinent rules and  
771 regulations thereof, which are inconsistent with any of the provisions in this Ordinance are  
772 hereby repealed or amended accordingly.

773

774 **Section 12. Separability Clause.** If any part or provision of this ordinance is held  
775 unconstitutional or invalid, other provisions not affected thereby shall remain in full force and  
776 effect.

777

778 **Section 13. Effectivity.** This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its approval.

779

780 **Approved unanimously.**
