Respectfully returned to the Sangguniang Panlalawigan of Leyte, through SP Secretary, the attached Ordinance No. 09, S-2024 of the Sangguniang Panlungsod of Baybay, Leyte.

Issues/concerns for review/recommendation/legal opinion is/are as follows:

Ordinance No. 09 S-2024 entitled: "An Ordinance Further Amending Sections 1 and 2 of City Ordinance No. 006, Series of 2015, Regulating the Use of Government Facilities of the City of Baybay for Public and Private Purposes, and Fixing its Rental.

REVIEW/RECOMMENDATION/LEGAL OPINION:

This office is of the opinion that the Subject Ordinance is within the power covered under Section 458(2)(vi)¹ and 458(3)(i)² of the Local Government Code of 1991 (R.A 7160).

Likewise as settled in the case of Constantino v. Desierto 288 SCRA 654, it is within the power of the local council to repeal or amend its prior acts either expressly, or by the passage of an essentially inconsistent resolutions. Hence, recommending for the declaration of its validity.

Please note that the opinion rendered by this Office are based on facts available and may vary or change when additional facts and documents are presented or changed. This opinion is likewise without prejudice to the opinions rendered by higher and competent authorities and/or the courts.

CITY ORDINANCE NO. 09, S-2024 26th Regular Session

AN ORDINANCE FURTHER AMENDING SECTIONS 1 and 2 OF CITY ORDINANCE NO. 006, SERIES OF 2015, REGULATING THE USE OF GOVERNMENT FACILITIES OF THE CITY OF BAYBAY FOR PUBLIC AND PRIVATE PURPOSES, AND FIXING ITS RENTAL

Sponsored by: Hon. Jose Rommel A. Peñaranda

WHEREAS, the continuous growth of the City of Baybay corresponds with the extension of services of its various facilities to address the concerns of the constituents;

WHEREAS, there is a need to amend the previous ordinance to specify additional facilities and the manner of their utilization;

WHEREAS, Section 458 (a)(2)(vi) of the Local Government Code empowers the City Government, through the Sanggunian, to prescribe reasonable limits and restraints on the use of property within the jurisdiction of the city;

WHEREAS, Section 458 (a)(3)(i) of the Local Government Code likewise empowers the City Government, through the Sanggunian, to fix and impose reasonable fees and charges for all services rendered by the city government to private persons or entities;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, as it is hereby ordained by the 6th Sangguniang Panlungsod of the City of Baybay, Province of Leyte, in its 26th Regular Session duly assembled that:

SECTION 1. Section 1 of City Ordinance No. 006 Series of 2015 is further amended as follows:

Section 1. The following are the city government facilities for purposes of this Ordinance.

XXXXXXX

- Z. Assembly Hall at the New City Hall
- aa. Training Room at the New City Hall
- Meeting Room at the New City Hall bb.
- Integrated Building at the new public plaza CC.
- dd. Baybay City Convention Center Hall "B"
- Convention Center Function Room "B-1" ee.
- ff. Women's Training Center
- Gazebo at the Boardwalk gg.
- Dormitory at the old Pasalubong Center hh.

SECTION 2. Section 2 of City Ordinance No. 006 Series of 2015 is further amended as follows:

SECTION 2. The fixed rentals of the above facilities if used for private purposes are hereunder provided except the City Plaza Stage and its premises and Legislative Session Hall.

XXXXXXX

- (ee) For the Assembly Hall at the New City Hall, the amount of Six Thousand Pesos (Php 6,000.00) for the first FOUR (4) hours of use and an additional One Thousand Pesos (Php 1,000.00) for every additional hour of use. The amount is inclusive of the use of the air conditioning system and electricity. The City Mayor may reduce the amount herein mentioned provided that the reduction shall not be more than 50% of the regular rent.
- (ff) For the Training Room at the New City Hall, the amount of Five Thousand Pesos (Php 5,000.00) for the first FOUR (4) hours of use and an additional One Thousand Pesos (Php 1,000.00) for every additional hour of use. The amount is inclusive of the use of the air conditioning system and electricity. The City Mayor may reduce the amount herein mentioned provided that the reduction shall not be more than 50% of the regular rent.
- (gg) For the Meeting Room at the New City Hall, the amount of Four Thousand Pesos (Php 4,000.00) for the first FOUR (4) hours of use and an additional One Thousand Pesos (Php 1,000.00) for every additional hour of use. The amount is inclusive of the use of the air conditioning system and electricity. The City Mayor may reduce the amount herein mentioned provided that the reduction shall not be more than 50% of the regular rent.
- (hh) For the Integrated Building at the new public plaza, the rates of the function rooms would be as follows:
 - 1. For the Small Room, the amount of One Thousand Pesos (Php 1,000.00) for the first FOUR (4) hours of use and an additional One Hundred Pesos (Php 100.00) for every additional hour of use. The amount is inclusive of the use of the air conditioning system and electricity. If no air conditioning will be used, the rate would be Five Hundred Pesos (Php 500.00) for every FOUR (4) hours of use. The City Mayor may reduce the amount herein mentioned provided that the reduction shall not be more than 50% of the regular rent.
 - 2. For the Big Room, the amount of Two Thousand Pesos (Php 2,000.00) for the first FOUR (4) hours of use and an additional Two Hundred Pesos (Php 200.00) for every additional hour of use. The amount is inclusive of the use of the air conditioning system and electricity. If no air conditioning will be used, the rate would be One Thousand Pesos (Php 1,000.00) for every FOUR (4) hours of use. The City Mayor may reduce the amount herein mentioned provided that the reduction shall not be more than 50% of the regular rent.

(ii) For the Baybay City Convention Center Hall "B", the amount of Six Thousand Pesos (Php 6,000.00) per hour of use. The amount is inclusive of the use of the air conditioning system and electricity. If the Light Emitting Diode or LED Wall will be used in this Convention Hall "B", the rent will be Twenty-five Pesos (Php 25,000.00) for the first four (4) hours of use and an additional of One Thousand Pesos (Php 1,000.00) for an additional hour of use for a maximum use of eight (8) hours. The same amount will be charged for the use of the Light Emitting Diode or LED Wall at the Convention Hall "A". On both instances, the City Mayor may reduce the amount herein mentioned provided that the reduction shall not be more than 50% of the regular rent.

(jj) For the Convention Center Function Room "B-1", the amount of Two Thousand Pesos (Php 2,000.00) per hour of use. The amount is inclusive of the use of the air conditioning system and electricity. However, if no air conditioning will be used, the amount of rent shall be One Thousand Pesos (Php 1,000.00) per hour of use. The City Mayor may reduce the amount herein mentioned provided that the reduction shall not be more than 50% of the regular rent.

(kk) For the Women's Training Center, the amount of Three Thousand Pesos (Php 3,000.00) for the first four (4) hours of use and an additional Two Hundred Pesos (Php 200.00) for every additional hour of use. The amount is inclusive of the use of the air conditioning system and electricity. If no air conditioning will be used, the rate would be One Thousand Five Hundred Pesos (Php 1,500.00) for the first four (4) hours of use and an additional One Hundred Pesos (Php 100.00) for every additional hour of use. The City Mayor may reduce the amount herein mentioned provided that the reduction shall not be more than 50% of the regular rent.

(II) For the Dormitory at the old Pasalubong Center, the amount shall be Two Thousand Pesos (Php 2,000.00) per day of use.

(mm) For the Gazebo at the boardwalk shall not be subject to lease and shall be reserve for public use only.

Section 3. Separability Clause. – If any provision of this Ordinance is held invalid or unconstitutional, the same shall not affect the validity and effectivity of the other provisions hereof.

Section 4. Repealing Clause. – Pertinent provisions of all other laws, decrees, executive orders, and rules and regulations contrary to or inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

Section 5. Effectivity Clause. – This Ordinance shall take effect after its publication in a newspaper of general circulation in the City.





SANGGUNIANG PANLUNGSOD BULLETIN BOARD








BAYBAY CITY TRICYCLE TERMINAL








BAYBAY CITY BUS TERMINAL

MINUTES OF THE 21st REGULAR SESSION OF THE SANGGUNIANG PANLUNGSOD OF BAYBAY CITY, LEYTE HELD AT THE SESSION HALL ON JUNE 22, 2015.

CITY ORDINANCE NO. 006

Series 2015

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CITY ORDINANCE NO. 004, 2008 OTHERWISE KNOWN AS "AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE USE OF THE CITY GOVERNMENT FACILITIES OF THE CITY OF BAYBAY FOR PUBLIC AND PRIVATE PURPOSES AND FIXING ITS RENTAL".

Sponsored & Introduced by: Hon. SP Member Cristelo S. Loreto & Hon. SP Member Arturo Elisa O. Astorga.

SECTION 1. The following are the city government facilities for purposes of this Ordinance.

- a. Baybay City Plaza Stage and Premises
- b. Gymnasium
- c. Legislative Function Rooms
- d. Legislative Auditorium
- e. Legislative Canteen
- f. Legislative Session Hall
- g. Stalls at the Public Plaza
- h. Athletic Grounds/Oval
- i. Swimming Pool & Cottages
- j. Badminton Courts

SECTION 2. The fixed rentals of the above facilities if used for private purposes are hereunder provided except the City Plaza Stage and its premises and Legislative Session Hall.

- a. For the **Gymnasium**, the amount of Four Hundred Pesos (P400.00) per hour of use. Provided, that the maximum rental shall not exceed Two Thousand Five Pesos (P2,500.00) per day.
- b. For the **Legislative Function Room**, the amount of Five Hundred Pesos (P500.00) per room for the first four (4) hours of use and an additional amount of One Hundred Pesos (P100.00) for every additional hour.
- c. For the **Legislative Auditorium** the amount of Four Hundred Pesos (P400.00) per hour of use, that the maximum rental shall not exceed Two Thousand Pesos (P2,000.00) per day.

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- d. For the **Legislative Canteen**, the monthly rental shall be fixed at Three Thousand Pesos (**P3,000.00**). The electric, water and telephone bills shall be at the sole account of the lessee including the expenses for its installation. For this purpose, the City Mayor is authorized to enter into a lease contract with the present occupant of the canteen subject to some conditions a herein a set forth of the ordinance.
- e. In order to maintain the symbolic stature and a power of the **Legislative Session Hall**, it shall not be made available for lease or use to other persons/entities regardless of its purpose except for extreme necessity as determined by the presiding officer and the council.
- f. For the **Stalls at the Plaza**, a monthly rental of One Thousand Five Hundred Pesos (P1,500.00) per stall shall be the initial rent for the first year of the contract. Thereafter, the city mayor thru its representative may increase the rent by not more than 10%. However, should the City Mayor find it more beneficial to the city government to lease all stalls to a single individual or entity, he/she may do so provided a bidding among interested individual or entities shall be given the contract and the highest bidder shall be given the contract of lease but in no case that the winning bid be less than One Thousand Five Hundred Pesos (P1,500.00) per stall. The City Mayor or his/her authorized representative is further authorized to regulate the kind of business that the stall lessee may engage during the period of the contract of lease.
- g. For the **Athletic Grounds/Oval**, the amount of Four Hundred Pesos (P400.00) per hour, but not exceed Two Thousand Pesos (P2,000.00) per day.
- h. For the **Swimming Pool/Cottages**, the amount of Two Hundred Pesos (P200.00) per day of fraction thereof as rental for the cottages, while an entrance fee of Forty Pesos (P40.00) per head for adults and Ten Pesos (P10.00) for students be collected. However, during practice for athletic meets or tournaments, this will be free of charge provided, a letter request be made and duly approved by the City Mayor or his/her authorized representative.
- i. For the **Badminton Courts**, the amount of Three Thousand pesos (P3,000.00) per month). The electric, water and telephone bills shall be at the sole account of the lessee including the expenses for its installation. For this purpose, the City Mayor is authorized to enter into a lease contract with the present occupant of the Badminton Courts subject to some conditions a herein a set forth of the ordinance.

SECTION 3. Use for Public Purposes.

Whenever, the above facilities are used for public purposes by the City Government of the City of Baybay or any other agencies of the national government, they shall be free of charge.

Public purposes shall mean the activity is related to or in furtherance of the official function of the agency concerned.

SECTION 4. Availment of Discounted Rate.

- a. All regular employees and elective Government Officials of the City of Baybay shall likewise be entitled to a 30% discount for the use of any of the above facilities for private purposes.
- b. All NGOs and POs and Civic Organizations accredited by the Local Government shall likewise be entitled to the same discount for the use of the Legislative Function Room, Gymnasium, and Legislative Auditorium, provided, that said activity/ies is/are, for their common benefits, however, if the activity or purpose is to promote tourism industry of the city or in furtherance to or in relation with the programs of the city government as certified to be the City Mayor or the City Administrator, it is free of charge.

SECTION 5. Scheduling of Activities and Payment of Rates.

The Office of the City Mayor orin his/her absence, the next ranking employee shall receive, facilitate and plot the schedule of the application of first come-first serve basis for the use of the facilities above mentioned. The plotted schedule shall be posted in the Bulletin Board of the SP/CMO.

The payment shall be made directly at the City Treasurer's Office and the Official Receipt shall be made as the basis of the SP/CMO to confirm the schedule. For the activities of the NGOs, POs and Civic Organizations which are free of charge, the letter request which is duly approved by the City Mayor or City Administrator shall serve as confirmation slip/authority to book their activity.

Provided, that the City Government has the right to cancel any scheduled activities at any of the facilities mentioned should the exigency or public service requires in such case, the payment shall be returned.

SECTION 6. Effectivity.

This Ordinance shall take effect after 15 days from its publication in local newspaper.
