

CITY ORDINANCE NO. 16, S-2024 42nd Regular Session



AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE ESTABLISHMENT, OPERATION, AND MAINTENANCE OF JUNK SHOPS AND/OR JUNKYARDS WITHIN THE CITY OF BAYBAY AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

WHEREAS, the continuous growth of the City of Baybay demands that businesses and activities relative to the use of lands and buildings are to be regulated to prevent criminal elements from taking advantage thereof;

WHEREAS, Section 458(a)(4) of the Local Government Code empowers the City Government, through the Sanggunian, to regulate activities relative to the use of land, buildings and structures within the city in order to promote the general welfare;

WHEREAS, the operation of junk shops or junkyards utilizes lands and buildings for its activities which therefore requires regulation to ensure compliance with existing laws and thereby prevent lawless elements from taking advantage of the effects of the crime by selling stolen properties to ready buyers through junk shops and junkyards;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, as it is hereby ordained by the 6th Sangguniang Panlungsod of the City of Baybay, Province of Leyte, in its 42nd Regular Session duly assembled that:

Section 1. Objective. It is the objective of this ordinance to adopt a uniform system of establishing, operating and maintaining a junk shop or a junkyard in the City of Baybay in accordance with Presidential Decree No. 1612 and other laws relative thereto.

Section 2. Definition of Terms. The following terms as used in this ordinance shall have the following meanings and interpretations;

 Junk - any waste material, discarded material, or old iron or other metal or substance glass plastics, paper cordage, machine parts accessories discard machinery or discarded machines in whole or in part, and any material commonly and generally known as junk" in the ordinary meaning of the word, acquired and/or collected.



- Junkyard any lot or land within the City of Baybay on which junk is placed, collected, stored or kept
- Junk Shop any building or structure within the City of Baybay on which junk is stored and sold
- Junk merchant any person engaged in the business of buying, selling, exchanging, or dealing in junk materials.

Section 3. Permit. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, association, partnership, or corporation to operate or maintain a junk shop and/or a junkyard at any place without the required permit. The owner of such junk shop or junkyard must secure a Mayor's Permit prior to its operation. For existing junk shop or junkyard without a permit, the owner is required to secure a Mayor's Permit within thirty (30) days from the effectivity of this Ordinance.

Section 4. Required Clearances. The following requirements shall be submitted together with the application for a Mayor's Permit, to wit:

- a. A sketch plan of the location of the junk shop or junkyard.
- b. A Zoning Clearance from the City Planning and Development Office (CPDO) stating that the location of the junk shop or junkyard is within the zone established for such purpose or there is an approved variance or exemption from the zoning ordinance.
- c. An Environmental Sanitation Certificate from the City Health Office stating that the business is in compliance with the Sanitation Code of the Philippines and such other laws or ordinances relative to sanitation.
- d. A Certification from the City Environment and Natural Resources Office (City ENRO) stating that the location of the junk shop or junkyard is not hazardous to the environment and that the system of waste disposal is in accordance with existing environmental laws and ordinances.

The above-mentioned requirements shall be submitted to the City ENRO which shall then issue a clearance of the applicant's compliance. The said-clearance shall be a condition for the issuance of the Mayor's Permit.

Section 5. Prohibition. Existing junk shops or junkyards located on areas not classified for its purpose in accordance with the City's zoning ordinance shall be required to transfer or relocate to areas classified for its purpose. The said junk shop or junkyard is affected by this prohibition shall be given a period of one (1) year from notice by the City ENRO to transfer or relocate to the proper site or area intended for such purpose.

Section 6. Required Records. Every junk shop or junkyard, whether already existing at the time of the passage of this ordinance or establish thereafter according to law or this ordinance, shall keep a book which shall be legibly written in the English language or "Cebuano", at the time of every purchase, a general description of every article subject of the purchase, the price paid for the article, the name of the owner/seller, residence and other description sufficient to identify the person from whom the purchase was made and the place where the junk item was taken.

In addition to the record of purchase required above, whenever the junk shop purchase any broken water meter, brass, copper (peeled and cut copper wire pieces), or any other metal alloy containing these materials, the junk merchant shall keep a record of the transaction and the general description of the material when the same was purchased.

All junk shop and junkyard merchants or operators are required to report with confidentiality to the local authorities or PNP persons who are selling broken water meters, brass, copper (peeled and cut copper wire pieces), tower parts (angular bars), tower clamps, aluminum conductor wires, or any other metal alloy containing these materials, which the merchant or operator believes to be stolen.

Section 7. Prohibited Acts.

- a. No junk shop or junkyard shall purchase any peeled or cut copper pieces and broken brass water meters from any minor.
- b. No junk shop or junkyard keep or store junks items or materials in excess of the volume authorized by the City ENRO, if one has been established.
- c. No Junk shop or junkyard shall purchase any item or junk without requiring the seller to disclose his source, his personal identity, his parents/guardian if he is a minor, and his permanent address and contact numbers.
- **d.** All junk shop or junkyard operator is not allowed to use city roads or public highways as their loading, unloading, and storage area for their junk articles and materials.
- e. All junk shop or junkyard operators are mandated to take active precautionary measures in handling flammable materials or items. These materials are to be segregated properly from other junk or materials.
- f. All junk shop or junkyard operators are required to maintain the cleanliness and orderliness of its premises at all times.
- **g.** No junk shop or junkyard shall operate without complying with any of the requirements set forth in this ordinance.

Section 8. The City ENRO is authorized to promulgate Rules and Regulations for the effective implementation of this Ordinance. The IRR shall include the area or size of the junkshop or junkyard depending on the nature or class of the business.

Section 9. Inspection of premises. The City ENRO is tasked to monitor the operation of all junk shops or junkyards in the City and ensure its compliance to this Ordinance and such other laws and ordinances. The City ENRO may conduct inspection of the junk shops or junkyards, evaluate its compliance, and provide recommendations for corrective or remedial measures.

Section 10. Penalty. A person who violates any provision of this ordinance shall be subject to a fine of One Thousand (P1,000.00) Pesos for the first offense; Five Thousand (P5,000.00) Pesos for the second offense; and closure of the establishment for the third offense.

Section 11. Separability Clause. If any provision of this Ordinance is held invalid or unconstitutional, the same shall not affect the validity and effectivity of the other provisions hereof.

Section 12. Repealing Clause. Pertinent provisions of all other laws, decrees, executive orders, and rules and regulations contrary to or inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

Section 13. Effectivity Clause. This Ordinance shall take effect after due compliance with all the requirements provided under RA 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991.


