Be it enacted by the Sangguniang Bayan of Tolosa, Leyte, in session assembled:

#### **Section 1. Title**

This ordinance shall be known as the "Green Development Ordinance of Tolosa,

#### Section 2. Objectives

The objectives of this ordinance are:

- a. To promote sustainable and environmentally-friendly development practices within the municipality;
- b. To protect and conserve natural resources while supporting economic growth;
- To reduce the environmental impact of development activities through green technologies and practices;
- d. To foster awareness and responsibility in the community regarding environmental conservation and sustainability.

#### **Section 3. Green Development Principles**

The Municipality of Tolosa shall promote the following principles of green development:

- Sustainable Land Use Ensuring that land development projects prioritize sustainability, including the preservation of open spaces, green areas, and the reduction of urban sprawl.
- b. **Energy Efficiency and Renewable Energy** Encouraging the use of energy-efficient technologies and renewable energy sources, such as solar, wind, and hydropower, in both residential and commercial developments.
- c. **Waste Management** Implementing waste reduction, recycling, and composting programs to minimize waste generation and promote resource conservation.
- d. **Water Conservation** Promoting the efficient use of water resources and the use of rainwater harvesting systems in new developments.
- e. Green Transportation Encouraging the use of public transportation, cycling, walking, and electric vehicles to reduce emissions and traffic congestion.

## Section 4. Establishment of a Green Development Task Force

A Green Development Task Force (GDTF) shall be established to oversee the molementation of this ordinance. The Task Force shall be responsible for:

- Formulating and implementing strategies for green development projects and initiatives;
- b. Monitoring the progress of green development programs;
- Providing guidance and technical assistance to developers, businesses, and community groups to incorporate green practices;
- d. Organizing public awareness campaigns on green development practices and environmental stewardship.

### Section 5. Green Building and Infrastructure Standards

All new construction projects, both public and private, shall adhere to the following green building standards:

- a. Incorporating energy-efficient designs and materials;
- b. Using sustainable building materials with minimal environmental impact;
- Implementing water-saving technologies and practices, including the installation of low-flow fixtures;
- d. Encouraging the installation of green roofs, rain gardens, and other sustainable landscape practices.

Existing buildings shall be encouraged to adopt energy-saving and eco-friendly technologies through government incentives.

## Section 6. Environmental Education and Public Participation

The Municipality shall promote environmental education programs aimed at increasing community awareness about sustainable practices. Public participation shall be encouraged through:

a. **Workshops and Training** — Conducting educational workshops and training for residents, businesses, and government employees on sustainable development practices.

#### Section 7. Green Fund

The Municipality shall establish a **Green Development Fund** to support the implementation of green initiatives. This fund may be sourced from the following:

- a. Annual budget allocations;
- b. Local government partnerships with private sector entities;
- c. Grants from government agencies or international environmental organizations.

#### **Section 8. Monitoring and Evaluation**

The Green Development Task Force shall be responsible for monitoring and evaluating the progress of green development programs. The Task Force will prepare annual reports assessing the effectiveness of the green initiatives, which will be presented to the Sangguniang Bayan and made available to the public.

#### Section 9. Repealing Clause

All ordinances, resolutions, and executive orders or parts thereof that are inconsistent with this ordinance are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

#### Section 10. Effectivity

This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its approval.

## Section 4. Strengthening Youth Involvement

The youth of Tolosa shall be encouraged to participate in local governance through:

- a. Establishing a Youth Engagement Council, aimed at involving young people in discussions about policies affecting their generation;
- b. Organizing regular youth forums and workshops that focus on local government processes, civic duties, and community development.

AN ORDINANCE FORMULATING THE POLICIES AND GUIDELINES ON PREEMPTIVE OR FORCED EVACUATION IN RESPONSE TO MAN-MADE AND NATURAL DISASTER OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF TOLOSA

Be it ordained by this Honorable Sangguniang Bayan in its regular session assembled that:

Section 1. TITLE - This ordinance shall be known as AN ORDINANCE FORMULATING THE POLICIES AND GUIDELINES ON PRE-EMPTIVE OR FORCED EVACUATION IN RESPONSE TO MAN-MADE AND NATURAL DISASTER OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF TOLOSA

Section 2. OBJECTIVE - This ordinance aims to provide policies and guidelines for the just and safe eviction in dangerous areas before a disastrous scenario is encountered in support of the Local Government of Tolosa obligation to its constituents to preserve their lives from imminent danger through decisive, although strictly limited, steps to remove them from hard.

#### Section 3. DEFINITION -

- a. Disaster means a result of a natural or man-made event which causes loss of life, injury, and property damage, including but not limited to natural disasters such as typhoon, tornado, floods, high winds, storm surge, and other weather events, and man-made events, including but not limited to power plant incidents, hazardous materials incidents, oil spill, explosions, civil disturbances, public calamity, acts of terrorism, hostile military actions, and other events in relation thereto:
- Calamity a disastrous event marked by a great loss and lasting distress and suffering.
- c. Evacuation means an operation whereby all or part of a particular population is temporarily relocated, whether individually or in an organized manner, from an area in which a disaster or emergency has been declared and is considered for health or safety of the public.
- d. Evacuation Center/Place a place where evacuees are brought before, during and after calamities/disasters such as but not limited to typhoon, flood, landslides, earthquakes or fire for care, safety and protection
- Evacuees people who are withdrawn from a dangerous place or circumstance and brought to a center/place for care, safety, and protection.
- Forced Evacuation means an evacuation ordered as a resort when a disaster or emergency has been declared and danger of loss of life is imminent, and conditions exist that critically imperil or endangered for health or safety of the public.
- Hazard a dangerous phenomenon, substance, human activity or condition that may cause loss of life, injury or other health impacts, property damage. loss of livelihood and services, social and economic disruption, or environmental damage.
- h. Public Official is any person who, by direct provisions of law, popular election or appointment of competent authority, takes part in the performance of public functions in the government, duties as an employee, agent or subordinate official or any rank or class who is charged with the implementation of this ordinance.

Section 5. TRAININGS AND ORIENTATIONS - The Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (MDRRMO) shall organize and conduct trainings and orientations on the possible natural hazards, vulnerabilities and climate change risks as well as knowledge management activities on disaster risk reduction and management within the locality at least once during summer as declared by the Philippine Atmospheric Geophysical and Astronomical Services Administration (PAG-ASA).

The foregoing trainings, orientations, activities, and information dissemination shall be intensified and made once a year or at the discretion of the MDRRMC.

During the aforesaid trainings and orientations, the MDRRMO shall also discuss and highlight in local dialect RA 10121, otherwise known as the Philippine Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Act of 2010; DILG MC No. 2012-35 dated February 21, 2012 regarding the Guidelines in Ensuring Public Safety During Man-Made and Natural Disasters; this Ordinance and other laws, rules and regulations and disaster risk reduction and management.

The MDRRMO shall conceptualize posters, newsletters, brochures and pamphlets regarding disaster risk reduction and management and cause the same to be posted at the conspicuous places of the Municipality and/or, if possible, disseminate through radio and TV advertisements.

**Section 6. EVACUATION PLAN** - It shall be incumbent upon the Barangay Risk Reduction and Management Committee (BDRRMC) to prepare an Evacuation Plan in their respective localities or areas of jurisdiction prior to hazard.

Every Barangay shall work out a Permanent Evacuation Center to be utilized in case of emergency/disaster.

In extreme cases, the LGU shall have the authority to negotiate with owners of buildings with strong/safe structures to be made as temporary evacuation center.

Section 7. ENLISTMENT OF ASSISTANCE OF OTHER GOVERNMENT AGENCIES - In declaring the implementation/enforcement of pre-emptive and forced evacuation, the Municipal Mayor may also enlist the assistance of the members of the PNP. AFP, BFP, and PCG assigned within the municipality; as well as accredited volunteers, civil society organizations and private sector groups with the capability and training in such emergency situation.

Every barangay may implement temporary evacuation plan. Public school classrooms maybe used as temporary evacuation center and duplicate key of rooms may be availed of by the Punong Barangay for accessibility.

All emergency measures adopted shall be a coordinative and collaborative effort between the municipal government and the assisting agencies.

Section 8. IMPLEMENTATION OF FORCED OR PRE-EMPTIVE EVACUATION - Upon the recommendation of the Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council, the Municipal Mayor may, in coordination with the Barangay Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council, direct the implementation of the pre-emptive or forced evacuation in case of disaster or calamity.

The Municipal Mayor, upon the recommendation of the Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction Management Council, may determine the period when the affected residents may be allowed to return or go back to their homes, if this is possible.

On the basis of such recommendation, the Municipal Mayor shall immediately declare the implementation/enforcement of pre-emptive and forced evacuation which shall include but not limited to the following:

- 1. The designated area where vehicles provided by the Municipal Government are waiting to transport local residents to the identified evacuation centers:
- Evacuation centers or such places where the evacuated local residents will be temporarily taken will be at the municipal hall, public schools, barangay halls, or such other place at the MDDRMC may deem it fit;
- The necessity of the evacuated local residents to stay in the aforesaid evacuation centers until there be another issuance declaring that the imminent danger within the affected area is no longer there, if this is still possible; and
- Measures ensuring the safety of local residents in the evacuation areas. However, immediately after declaration of forced evacuation before Implementation/enforcement thereof, the municipal government shall see to it that the local residents are informed in local dialect of the need for them to be evacuated and that there is no other alternative way to ensure their safety.
- The members of the Philippine National Police, Armed Forces of the Philippines, Bureau of Fire Protection, and Philippine Coast Guard are enlisted to provide assistance to affected areas;
- The Barangay Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council in the coordination with the Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council and the Municipal Social Welfare and Development Office (MSWDO) shall attend of the basic necessities of the evacuees like food, water, electricity and other sustenance in the evacuation center.
- 7. The Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council in coordination with the Barangay Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council and Philippine National Police shall ensure strict enforcement of forced evacuation or the prohibition of fishing activities in areas declared by PAGASA under PSWS No. 1 or higher, such as when a resident/fisherman refused to leave the area, despite declaration by the local chief executive of forced evacuation, or when residents/fisherman go back to their homes/affected areas without an order issued to this effect;
- 8. Forced evacuation should be carried out in a manner that is humane, respectful of the dignity of persons, not using disproportionate force, without discrimination and with conscious attention to the needs of vulnerable sectors such as children, women, the elderly and persons with disabilities;
- The Municipal Social Welfare and Development Office (MSWDO) should ensure that shelter and relief especially for the sick and elderly is provided for the evacuees on the evacuation centers.
- 10. Members of the Barangay Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council should go house to house to ensure that all citizens are evacuated and to convince further those who refuse to evacuate impressing on them the gravity of the risk and that the Municipal might not be able to reach them in case of grave danger.
- 11. Personnel of the Municipal Health Office should be utilized in the course of evacuation to ensure that all health concerns and emergencies are provided. The same personnel should also be designated in the evacuation centers to prevent epidemics from occurring. Medical assistance shall also be provided for the sick, the elderly, and the disabled.
- 12. In cases that residents in disaster risk areas refuse to evacuate their residences, even after all efforts to inform them of the dangers are exhausted, the Municipal Government of Tolosa shall have the power to mandatorily evacuate the residents by any means but Which will not degrade or harm the residents.
- 13. Evacuated local fishermen or local residents shall not be allowed to return to their respective homes unless storm signal warnings were lowered by the PAGASA or the Mayor issues an order to this effect.

14. The Committee on Forced/Pre-Emptive Evacuation shall be responsible in determining the assistance needed for the recovery of the evacuees.

Section 9. MANNER/MANAGEMENT OF FORCED EVACUATION - In the event that local residents refuse to leave their homes even after notice/order or, after evacuating, go back to their homes/affected areas without an order issued to this effect, the Municipal Government as well as the members of the mobilized units of the PNP, AFP, BFP and PCG may use such physical force that commensurate under the circumstances, without discrimination and with conscious attention to the needs of vulnerable sectors such as children, women, the elderly and persons with disabilities, with the end view that lives are safely secured

Section 10. IMPLEMENTING RULES AND REGULATION - To further understand this ordinance, the MDRRMC shall formulate the necessary IRR.

Section 11. PENALTY CLAUSE - Any private individual/person or public official mandated who fails to implement this Ordinance shall be subjected to a fine not exceeding Two Thousand Five Hundred Pesos (Php2,500.00) or imprisonment not exceeding six (6) months or both at the discretion of the court, without prejudice to administrative sanctions as may be imposed under existing laws, rules, and regulations.

Section 12. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE - If, for any reason or reasons, any part or provision of this Ordinance shall be held to be unconstitutional or invalid, other parts or provisions hereof which are not affected thereby shall continue to be in full force and effect.

Section 13. REPEALING CLAUSE. - All ordinances, as well as pertinent rules and regulations thereof, which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed or amended accordingly

Section 14. EFFECTIVITY - This ordinance shall take effect immediately after its posting at conspicuous places in the Municipality for at least three (3) consecutive weeks.

#### **OTHER MATTERS:**

1. An Ordinance Promoting Transparency and Accountability in the Municipality of Tolosa, Leyte, and Prescribing Mechanism of Its Implementation.

Hon. Felicito D. Beltran III made a motion to take this out of the table, and the motion was approved. The ordinance will help ensure good governance and public trust in local policies.

ADJOURNMENT. - There being no further matters to discuss, the session was adjourned at 11:15 A.M., with the presiding officer thanking everyone for their participation and cooperation.




