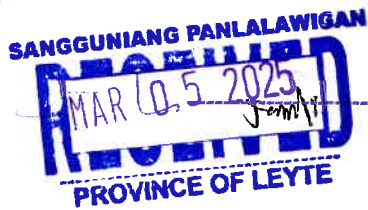

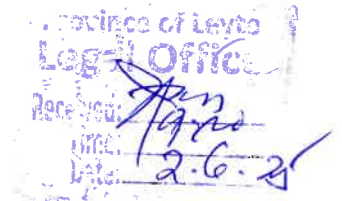
(1) Approve ordinances and pass resolutions necessary for an efficient and effective municipal government, and in this connection shall:

PREFATORY STATEMENT

WHEREAS, Section 16 of the Local Government Code of 1991 or Republic Act No. 7160, also known as the General Welfare Clause, provides in pan that every local government unit shall exercise powers necessary for its efficient and effective governance and those which are essential to the promotion of general welfare;

WHEREAS, Sections 447 and 458 of the of said Republic Act 7160 provide in pan, that the Sangguniang Bayan shall enact ordinances for the general welfare of the municipality and its inhabitants pursuant to the abovementioned Section 16 of said law, and in this regard, enact and approve ordinances relative to the: (i) maintenance of peace and order in the municipality/city, (ii) suppression of lawlessness therein, and (iii) authorization of the issuance of permits or licenses upon conditions and for such purposes intended to promote the general welfare of the inhabitants of the municipality/city, regulating thereby any business which does not require government examination within the municipality/city and the conditions under which the license for said business may be issued or revoked;

WHEREAS, law enforcement agencies in the country have already proven that Closed Circuit Televisions (CCTV) are among the most effective tools in crime deterrence, prevention, detection and solution since there is a video recording which can be used in addition to the testimonies of witnesses;

WHEREAS, in order to intensify the Municipality of Kananga’s drive to deter, prevent, detect, and solve criminality, and to preserve video recording as evidence, this August Body deems it proper to require the use of CCTV systems in business establishments within;

WHEREAS, the Department of the Interior and Local Government, through the Philippine National Police Anti-Cybercrime Group, has conducted a study as to the minimum technical specifications to be required of CCTVs to be installed pursuant to this Ordinance.

NOW THEREFORE, the Sangguniang Bayan of Kananga, in its regular session duly assembled, hereby ordains the following:

SECTION 1. TITLE. – This Ordinance for brevity shall be known and cited as “*The CCTV Ordinance of Kananga*”

SECTION 2. DECLARATION OF POLICY. – It is hereby declared the policy of the Municipal Government of Kananga, Leyte:

- To protect the security and well-being of its constituents from criminalities and lawlessness by enacting measures for the maintenance of peace and order within its jurisdiction.
- To ensure that the fundamental rights of an individual to privacy is not and will not be unreasonably hampered or curtailed other than what is necessary for the protection of the welfare of the public in general.
- To reiterate and affirm its adherence and full respect for every individual’s fundamental right to privacy by regulating the installation and use of video surveillance camera or CCTV, ensuring that feed locations are limited to public spaces only and by the provision of proper safeguards against unauthorized viewing and/or disclosure of video recording made in accordance therewith.

SECTION 3. DEFINITION OF TERMS. For purposes of this Ordinance, the following terms shall mean:

- a) *Business Establishments* – refers to all establishments registered with the municipal permits and licensing office whose capital is at least five hundred thousand pesos (Php 500,000.00) including but not limited to banks and their satellite offices, branches and automated teller machines (ATMs), money changers, pawnshops, credit facilities, and other similar lending and financial institutions, as well as gasoline stations and service shops, hotels, inns, lodging houses, homestays, restaurants, specialty stores and facilities, hospitals, computer shops, internet shops, bus terminals, dormitories, resorts, and other high risk places, spaces or establishments as may be identified.
- b) *Capital* – shall refer to the total project costs such cash outlay and cost of building, excluding the land upon which the business is established.
- c) *Closed-Circuit Television (CCTV)* – refers to video surveillance cameras used to transmit visual information to a monitor/s. Feed - are visual information or images transmitted by video surveillance cameras to the monitors.
- d) *Feed Locations* – areas that are covered or viewed by video surveillance camera.
- e) *High Risk Areas* – refers to commercial/business establishments and other places and spaces with common business areas where there is greater degree of susceptibility to occurrence of accidents or criminalities because of the numerous financial, social or business interactions, or places and spaces where critical properties of the Municipality are situated.
- f) *Monitors* – the screens or other devices on which feeds are viewed.
- g) *New Establishments* – refers to newly created trading or commercial concerns undergoing application for business permit or the license to operate prior to the effectivity of this ordinance.
- h) *Old Business Establishments* – refers to existing business establishments that have duly secured current business permit or license to operate and are already operating at the time of the effectivity of this ordinance.

- i) *Recycling* – refers to the process by which records or tapes of feeds or visual information may be erased through the overrun by another or new visual information.
- j) *Satellite Branches/Officers* – refers to small extension officers of business concerns such that of banks or any financial institutions.
- k) *Homestays* – a house/building for housing a number of persons for local and foreign tourist.
- l) *Designated Security Personnel* – police or civilian personnel authorized to operate or use CCTV camera(s).

SECTION 4. SCOPE OF APPLICATION OF VIDEO SURVEILLANCE CAMERAS.

- a) All business establishments whether new or old with five hundred thousand pesos (Php 500,000.00) or more in capital like specialty stores, facilities, restaurants, gasoline stations, airline offices, hospital, hardware, grocery and dry goods stores, computer and cellphone shops, internet shops, homestays, resorts and other high-risk areas including industrial and manufacturing establishments.
- b) All educational establishments in the Municipality of Kananga whether private or public irrespective of their locations;
- c) All local government facilities, buildings and high-risk areas shall likewise install closed-circuit television (CCTV) in public buildings or places where the public frequently converge like markets, terminals, plazas, or parks, main thoroughfares or in entrance and exit points of the Municipality as may be recommended by the PNP.
- d) A written notice declaring the presence of a CCTV Camera or cameras in any business or commercial establishment/s so covered by this Ordinance must be posted by the owner/s in conspicuous place or places within the vicinity of the establishment.

SECTION 5. MINIMUM TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS. The CCTV system to be installed must meet the following minimum specifications:

CAMERA

- High-Definition Analog or at least 2 Megapixel Digital Camera
- 0.1 Lux Minimum Illumination
- 2.8mm to 3.6mm Focal Length
- Auto-Iris Focus Lens (fixed/vari-focal)
- /30s to 1/50,000s Shutter Speed
- 50-meter Infrared Range
- 120dB Wide Dynamic Range
- Pan and Tilt adjustment of 0 degrees to 180 degrees and Rotate adjustment of 0 degrees to 360 degrees
- Outdoor cameras must be vandal-proof with IP 66 Weatherproof Casing

VIDEO/AUDIO INPUT

- Hybrid Type (accepts Digital and Analog signal), Minimum of four (4) camera input
- Video and Audio Stream Input
- H.264 (Advanced Video Coding) Video Compression and G.711u Audio Compression
- 30 frames-per-second (FPS) recording capability per camera
- Analog High-Definition Input (1080p@25FPS, 1080p@30FPS, 720p@25FPS, 720p@30FPS)

- Hard Disk Drive storage system with enough capacity to accommodate the prescribed retention period below. (4TB Capacity is approximately sufficient for 40 days of recording for DVR with 4 cameras at 1080p)
- Time stamping feature

VIDEO/AUDIO OUTPUT

- 720p or 1080p resolution
- 30 FPS
- At least 10 Megabits per second (Mbps) Video Bitrate and at least 64 Kilobits (Kbps) Audio Bitrate

OTHER SPECIFICATIONS

- At least four (4) cameras covering the areas of transaction and risks. When possible, one camera must be facing the street/entrance, with the actual number of cameras to depend on the size of the establishment and nature of business, as determined by the LGU
- Centralized power supply for the Video Recorder and Cameras
- Uninterruptible Power Supply (UPS) to provide standard and reasonable back-up power to the Video Recorder and Cameras

SECTION 6. GUIDELINES FOR THE INSTALLATION OF CCTV. All facilities required to install CCTV's pursuant to the provisions of this Ordinance shall install and operate closed-circuit television camera which shall be always maintained in proper working order and based on the recommendation of the public officers who shall conduct the ocular inspection of the premises of the establishments. The following Installation Guide is recommended to be followed:

INSTALLATION:

- Cameras must be installed at a secure location with maximum area of coverage of entrances/exits and areas of transaction or risk. Make sure that there will be no blind spots;
- Video recorders must be mounted at secure/concealed locations to protect them from deliberate tampering;
- Should not be installed in an area which is not well-lit at night and must be in an area with consistent lighting to pick-up identifying details, such as facial features;
- Consider the angle of the cameras to avoid lens flare and backlighting;
- Determine the following objectives and recording distance when installing CCTV Cameras: General Surveillance = 10 feet or greater, Facial Recognition = 5 to 7 feet, Plate Recognition (for Parking Lots) = 3 to 4 feet;
- When possible, a back-up system should be installed alongside the CCTV system to ensure that data is kept secure in the event of physical harm to the storage devices such as fires, earthquakes, any form of deliberate tampering, and other similar situations;
- When possible, dummy CCTV cameras should also be placed in a conspicuous area to deter possible criminal acts and protect the cameras;
- Signages indicating that the establishment/area is being monitored by a CCTV System must also be installed in areas that visible and obvious to the public and must use clear, plain, and concise language;
- At least one staff or employee should be trained to operate the CCTV System.

SECTION. 7. REQUIREMENT FOR BUSINESS REGISTRATION. A Certificate of Compliance (COC) must be secured by new business establishments specified in Section 4 (a) as a requirement of the Municipal Government of Kananga for the approval of their business permit

applications. Likewise, the same COC shall be required of old business establishments, those in Section 4 (a), as a requisite upon every renewal of their business permits. The COC shall be issued by the BPLO and PNP duly signed by their respective heads of office after inspection thereof.

SECTION 8. IMPLEMENTING OFFICE. The Business Permit and Licensing Office (BPLO) and the Kananga Police Station are hereby tasked to assist each other in the implementation of this Ordinance.

- a) The BPLO and local PNP shall send duly authorized employees to inspect the premises of all business establishments covered by this Ordinance by order of the Municipal Mayor. A specially designed sticker shall be posted by the inspection team on the establishments that have complied therewith.
- b) An establishment found to be in violation hereof should be inspected again thirty (30) days after the date of the first inspection to determine if it has already complied herewith. An establishment that fails to comply during the second inspection shall be deemed to have already violated this Ordinance.
- c) Establishments that have already complied with this Ordinance shall be inspected twice every year without prior notice to ensure the CCTV system is operational and well maintained.
- d) Establishments or facilities covered by this Ordinance shall post signage on conspicuous places that this establishment is installed with CCTV.

SECTION 9. LIMITATION ON ITS USAGE. CCTV cameras and all its feed shall be solely used in specified instances set forth in this Ordinance, and use of CCTV cameras by such persons other than the owners and designated security personnel authorized to operate the same in any manner or location, or for any other purposes, is expressly prohibited.

- a) Law Enforcement and Crime Prevention – CCTV cameras and any all Feeds, shall be used for the purpose of providing surveillance in the service of law enforcement and crime prevention within the Municipality where there is documented criminal activity.
- b) Traffic Monitoring – CCTV cameras and any all Feeds shall be used for the purpose of monitoring but are not intended to include enforcement of traffic violations. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Feeds from the CCTV cameras used for traffic monitoring may be used for the lawful purpose in the event that such CCTV cameras, while being used for their primary function, incidentally, view behavior that has caused or is likely to cause danger to person or property.

SECTION 10. PROHIBITIONS. THE FEEDS SHALL NOT BE USED FOR THE FOLLOWING:

- a) Broadcasting – broadcast by any of the authorized persons prescribed herein of any of the Feeds or any of its parts or records on or through any medium other than the monitors;
- b) Viewing – Feeds shall be viewed by any person/s other than those expressly authorized herein to view the records of the feeds;
- c) Transfer – Feeds shall not be transferred to any third party, whether for profit or not;
- d) Reproduction – No person shall be allowed to copy any or all parts of record of the feeds.

SECTION 11. PRESERVATION OF FEEDS. Feeds shall be recorded or otherwise stored by owner or owners of institutions or establishments for future use for a period of not more than fifteen (15) days. After fifteen (15) days, the records or tapes of the Feeds may be recycled or destroyed unless otherwise a proper request for specific log of any given feed shall have been made as provided for in the proceeding section. In such case the properly requested specific record/s of Feeds must be turned over, in its original and unadulterated form and substance, to the proper requesting authority.

SECTION 12. PROPER REQUEST FOR FEEDS. Stored or preserved feeds shall be used at any time to satisfy the following:

- a) Any authorized subpoena or any written order of any court of competent jurisdiction, the local PNP, the NBI, Criminal Investigation and Detection Group (CIDG), the Philippine Drug Enforcement Agency (PDEA) or the Municipal Mayor;

- b) Any written request from the Chief Officer of the investigating body or authority calculating the advent of a criminality for proper disposition of crime investigation and report;
- c) Any written request from the duly constituted legislative body or assembly for purposes in aid of legislation.

SECTION 13. PENALTY CLAUSE.

- a) Any violations on Section 4 of this Ordinance:
 - i. New business establishments (with capital of Php 500,000.00 and above) shall not be given a business permit if it has not complied with this Ordinance even after the lapse of the one (1) year transition period.
 - ii. Old business establishments (with capital of Php 500,000.00 and above) shall not be given a renewal of their business permits if they have not complied with this Ordinance.
 - iii. A fine amounting to Two Thousand Five Hundred Pesos (Php 2,500.00) shall be imposed on any business establishment in operation found to be in violation of this Ordinance.
- b) Any persons found to have committed any violation on the provisions set forth in this Ordinance shall be fined Two Thousand Five Hundred Pesos (Php 2,500.00) and/or imprisonment for a minimum of one (1) month but not more than six (6) months. Such fine or other penalty, or both, shall be imposed at the discretion of the Court. The said fine shall be paid to the Municipal Treasurer's Office within 72 hours from receipt thereof, failure to comply shall prompt the LGU to file the appropriate case at the proper court of jurisdiction.

SECTION 14. APPEAL PROCESS. Any establishment found to be in violation of this Ordinance by the BPLO and PNP may appeal the findings thereof to the Office of the Mayor within five (5) working days from being notified of its violation, furnishing a copy of the appeal to the BPLO and PNP prior to the filing thereof with the Office of the Mayor. Within five (5) working days from receipt of the copy of the appeal, the BPLO and PNP shall submit its answer to the Office of the Mayor, furnishing the business establishment a copy of the same on even date. Should the BPLO and PNP fail to file its answer to the appeal within the given period, it shall be deemed to have opposed the appeal on all its material points. The Office of the Mayor shall decide on the matter within five (5) working days from receipt of the answer of the BPLO and PNP or from the day the period of filing therefor has lapsed, giving due notice to the parties involved. The decision of the mayor shall be final, and no motion for reconsideration shall be entertained thereafter, subject to such remedial measures as may be then available under the law or Rules of Court.

SECTION 15. FUNDING. The Local Chief Executive shall appropriate an ideal amount every year the in the LGU's annual budget in order to fully implement the provisions of this Ordinance. The same shall also be included in the annual investment program of the Municipality.

SECTION 16. TRANSITION PERIOD. A one (1) year transition period shall be given to an establishment to comply with the provisions of this Ordinance and shall commence from June 1, 2025 until June 1, 2026.

SECTION 17. DISSEMINATION. The BPLO of LGU Kananga shall the cause the widest information dissemination of this Ordinance among all qualified establishments within the jurisdiction of the Municipality of Kananga after this Ordinance has been reviewed and approved by the Sanggunian Panlalawigan.

SECTION 18. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE. If any section or part of this Ordinance is held unconstitutional or invalid, the other sections or provisions not otherwise affected shall remain in full force or effect.

SECTION 19. REPEALING CLAUSE. All other ordinances, orders, issuances, rules, and regulations, which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed, amended, or modified accordingly.


SECTION 20. EFFECTIVITY. This Ordinance shall take effect 15 days upon its publication or after due compliance with all the requirements provided under R.A. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991.

MINUTES OF PUBLIC HEARING HELD BY THE SANGGUNIANG BAYAN ON DECEMBER 19, 2024 AT
THE ABC HALL BUILDING, BRGY. POBLACION, KANANGA, LEYTE FOR THE FOLLOWING
MUNICIPAL ORDINANCES:

1. **Ordinance No. 23L24-063-** An Ordinance prohibiting any person from consuming or drinking of alcoholic beverages in any public places in the Municipality of Kananga, Leyte.
2. **Ordinance No. 23L24-064** – An Ordinance requiring business establishments and other places and spaces considered as high-risk in the Municipality of Kananga, Leyte to install Video Surveillance Cameras or Closed-Circuit Television (CCTV) and providing penalties for violations thereof and for other purposes.
3. **Ordinance No. 23L24-065-** An Ordinance establishing guidelines on the Disposition and Allocation of Philhealth Konsultasyong Sulit at Tama Package Fund or the Philhealth Konsulta Package Fund of the Municipality of Kananga, Leyte.
4. **Ordinance No. 23L24-066-**An Ordinance prohibiting the sale, dispensing, distribution, reselling of any pharmaceutical products in Sari-sari Stores and other similar retail outlets within the territorial jurisdiction of the Municipality of Kananga, and providing penalties for violations thereof.
5. **Ordinance No. 23L24-067-** An Ordinance establishing the Municipal Epidemiology and Surveillance Unit (MESU) of Kananga, Leyte, providing its composition, duties and functions, appropriating funds therefor and for other purposes.

(Attendance hereto attached)

The Public Hearing was conducted by the Office of the Sangguniang Bayan spearheaded by the Office of the Vice Mayor thru Facebook Page and Posting in the public places. The Public Hearing was attended by the Punong Barangay during the monthly meeting of Liga Ng Mga Barangay and it was open at 9:35 in the morning with opening prayer led by SB Secretary Atty. Allan R. Castro and he is also the master of the ceremony.

Atty. Castro introduced Hon. Capanas as the authored of the following draft ordinances.

Hon. Resurreccion C. Capanas(Chairman of the Committee on Rules and Laws) read and explained all the provision of the said ordinances specifically the prohibited acts provided therein. He said that the following municipal ordinances is pursuant to Section 16 of Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, provides that:

"SEC. 16. General Welfare. - Every local government unit shall exercise the powers expressly granted, those necessarily implied therefrom, as well as powers necessary, appropriate, or incidental for its efficient and effective governance, and those which are essential to the promotion of the general welfare. Within their respective territorial jurisdictions, local government units shall ensure and support, among other things, the preservation and enrichment of culture, promote health and safety, enhance the right of the people to a balanced ecology, encourage and support the development of appropriate and self-reliant scientific and technological capabilities, improve public morals, enhance economic prosperity and social justice, promote full employment among their residents, maintain peace and order, and preserve the comfort and convenience of their inhabitants." (Emphasis supplied).

Hon. Capanas explained the provision of Ordinance No. 23L24-063. He said that this proposed ordinance is necessary to implement because statistics shows that one of the main causes of road accidents, bar fights, and petty and serious quarrels is attributed to liquor drinking.

There is a need to regulate drinking of alcoholic beverages in public places in the Municipality of Kananga to prevent irresponsible consumption which is known to cause unruly and aggressive behavior – a perfect recipe for trouble and accident.

Hon. Juanillo Angus asked if the party to be conducted in Barangay Covered court is included.

Hon. Capanas said that PUBLIC in this context refers to OUTDOOR SPACES such as roads, walkways, parks, or in a moving vehicle, drinking in bars, restaurants, stadiums, and other such establishments. The consumption of alcoholic drinks/beverages, liquors is allowed provided that it is done inside the house or any enclosed private property. He added that there is an exemption for drinking in barangay covered court only during fiesta celebration of the barangay including "vesperas", provided that there is a presence of police personnel, barangay tanods, and other peace and order officers of the barangay in the said area celebrating "vesperas" or "fiesta".

2. **Ordinance No. 23L24-064** – An Ordinance requiring business establishments and other places and spaces considered as high-risk in the Municipality of Kananga, Leyte to install Video Surveillance Cameras or Closed-Circuit Television (CCTV) and providing penalties for violations thereof and for other purposes.

Hon. Capanas said that in order to intensify the Municipality of Kananga's drive to deter, prevent, detect, and solve criminality, and to preserve video recording as evidence, this August Body deems it proper to require the use of CCTV systems in business establishments within. Under the law "requirement to install CCTV" means that a business establishment is legally obligated to set up and maintain a closed-circuit television (CCTV) system on their premises, typically used for security purposes to monitor activities and deter criminal behavior; this is often enforced through local ordinances that may specify the number of cameras needed depending on the type of business and its size. he added that local government shall enact ordinances requiring businesses to install CCTV systems, often as a condition for obtaining a business permit.

3. **Ordinance No. 23L24-065**- An Ordinance establishing guidelines on the Disposition and Allocation of Philhealth Konsultasyong Sulit at Tama Package Fund or the Philhealth Konsulta Package Fund of the Municipality of Kananga, Leyte.

Hon. Capanas said that for the implementation of this ordinance is pursuant to Philhealth Circular No. 2023-0013 entitled, "Implementing Guidelines for the Philhealth Konsultasyong Sulit at Tama (Philhealth Konsulta Package), the current Philhealth Konsulta package shall expand its benefit coverage to encompass other primary care services in preparation for Konsulta+. Philhealth Konsulta Package Providers (KPPs) shall also act as the chief facility among its affiliated facilities at the primary care level, responsible for patient navigation to ensure first-contact, continuing and comprehensive care for all persons who are either diagnosed or undiagnosed, presenting with any health concern. He added that this law is to help alleviate with the financial burden of the laboratory test fees of all kanangahanons.

4. **Ordinance No. 23L24-066**-An Ordinance prohibiting the sale, dispensing, distribution, reselling of any pharmaceutical products in Sari-sari Stores and other similar retail outlets within the territorial jurisdiction of the Municipality of Kananga, and providing penalties for violations thereof.

Hon. Capanas said that this ordinance is pursuant to Republic Act No. 8203, otherwise known as the Special Law on Counterfeit Drugs, also prohibits any person from manufacturing, selling, offering for sale, donating, distributing, trafficking, brokering, exporting, importing or possessing counterfeit drugs.

Hon. Elna Gabilan (Brgy. Chairman of Brgy. Montebello) asked regarding the pharmaceutical products donated by the governor. She asked if the barangay is allowed to dispense those products.

Hon. Capanas answered that dispensing those pharmaceutical products in the barangay must be assisted by the medical professional.

5. Ordinance No. 23L24-067- An Ordinance establishing the Municipal Epidemiology and Surveillance Unit (MESU) of Kananga, Leyte, providing its composition, duties and functions, appropriating funds therefor and for other purposes.

Hon. Capanas said that this ordinance is pursuant to Section 6 and 8 of Republic Act No. 11332 otherwise known as the "Mandatory Reporting of Notifiable Diseases and Health Events of Public Health Concerns Act" provides that the DOH and its local counterpart are mandated to implement the mandatory reporting of notifiable diseases and health events of public concern, and it shall ensure that the Epidemiology and Surveillance Units (ESUs) are established and functional in all levels of the DOH and its local counterparts, and in public and private health facilities and laboratories, as well as ports and airports in all provinces, cities and municipalities throughout the country. And also Republic Act. 3573 mandates individuals and health facilities to report communicable diseases to local and national health authorities to suppress and prevent widespread of the disease. Such mandate was also mentioned in the International Health Regulations of 2005 and DOH Administrative Order 2007-036. He added that this ordinance is enacted in response to the need of a Municipal Epidemiology and Surveillance Unit (MESU) under the Municipal Health Office of Kananga that will serve as a central point for data banking and response activities on health service delivery and disease surveillance system. He reiterated that all ordinances mandated barangays to support the implementation in barangay level.

The closing and final message was rendered by Municipal Vice Mayor Hon. Miguel Jorge P. Tan and public hearing formally ended at 12:10 PM.
