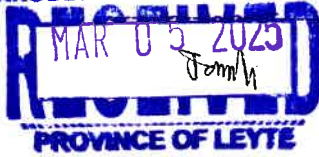

Respectfully returned to the Sangguniang Panlalawigan of Leyte, through the SP Secretary, the attached Ordinance No. 25-02 of the Sangguniang Bayan of Inopacan, Leyte.

**Issues/concerns for review/recommendation/legal opinion is/are as follows:**


- Ordinance No. 25-02 entitled: “Anti-Dispensing, Selling, anmd Reselling of Pharmaceutical Products in Sari-Sari Stores and Similar Retail Outlets.”

**REVIEW/RECOMMENDATION/LEGAL OPINION:**

This office is of the opinion that the subject Ordinance is generally in accordance with its power under Section 447(a)<sup>1</sup> of the Local Government Code of 1991 (R.A 7160) in relation to RA 10918<sup>2</sup>. Hence, we recommend for the declaration of its validity. It is however recommended that the citation of RA 10981 be changed to 10918 as the former pertains to a different statute.

We hope to have assisted you with this request. Please note that the opinion rendered by this Office are based on the facts available and may vary or change when additional facts and documents are presented or changed. This opinion is likewise without prejudice to the opinions rendered by higher and competent authorities and/or the courts.

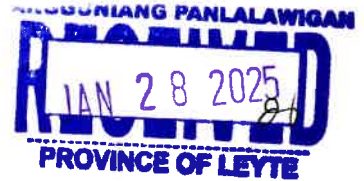

**WHEREAS**, the Local Government Code of the Philippines (Republic Act No. 7160) grants local government units the authority to regulate activities for the general welfare of the community;

**WHEREAS**, the regulations of food and drugs in the Republic of the Philippines is enshrined in the 1987 Philippine Constitution;

**WHEREAS**, Section 30 of Republic Act No. 10981, also known as the Philippine Pharmacy Law, and the Food and Drug Administration Act of 2009 (Republic Act No.9711), mandates that the dispensing of pharmaceutical products should only be conducted by licensed pharmacists in duly accredited pharmacies or drugstores licensed by the FDA to ensure public safety and compliance;

**WHEREAS**, sari-sari stores and similar retail outlets are not authorized to dispense, sell, or resell pharmaceutical products, which could pose serious health risks to the public due to the lack of proper handling, storage, and consultation from licensed professionals;

**WHEREAS**, DILG MC 2022 – 025 entitled “Prohibiting the Dispensing, Selling, and Reselling of Pharmaceutical Products in Sari – Sari Stores and other Similar Retail Outlets” was issued to all Local Government Units;

**NOW, THEREFORE**, on motion of Honorable Rowena K. Madrazo duly seconded by all the Members present, be it

**RESOLVED**, as it is hereby **RESOLVED** to enact the following:

**ORDINANCE NO. 25-02**

**“AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE DISPENSING, SELLING, AND RESELLING OF PHARMACEUTICAL PRODUCTS IN CONVENIENCE STORES, SARI-SARI STORES AND SIMILAR RETAIL OUTLETS WITHIN THE MUNICIPALITY OF INOPACAN, PROVINCE OF LEYTE, AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS THEREOF”**

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the Sangguniang Bayan of Inopacan, Leyte that:

**SECTION 1: TITLE.** This Ordinance shall be known as the “Anti Dispensing, Selling, and Reselling of Pharmaceutical Products in Sari – Sari Stores and Similar Retail Outlets”.

**SECTION 2: DEFINITION OF TERMS:**

For purposes of this Ordinance, the following terms are defined:

2.1 PHARMACEUTICAL PRODUCTS – shall refer to medicines, drugs, and health supplements regulated by the Food and Drug Administration (FDA).

2.2 PRESCRIPTION MEDICINES – are drugs that can only be dispensed by a pharmacist upon presentation of a valid prescription from a physician, dentist, or veterinarian, and require the pharmacist’s guidance and proper use.

2.3 RETAIL OUTLETS – includes all small convenience stores, kiosks, and similar establishments not accredited as pharmacies or drugstores by the FDA.

2.4 PHARMACIST- a licensed professional authorized to dispense medications and provide guidance for safe and proper use in accordance with regulatory standards.

2.5 OVER- THE- COUNTER (OTC) MEDICINES – are drugs that can be purchased and used without prescription, intended for self-care to treat common health conditions. These medicines must meet proper regulatory safety standards and include clear instructions for proper usage and dosage.

2.6 SARI-SARI STORES – small neighborhood retail outlets typically selling basic goods and commodities classified as micro -enterprise.

2.7 CONVENIENCE STORES - a retail establishment that offers a limited range of essential goods, including packaged foods, beverages, household items, personal care products, and over-the-counter medicines. These stores are designed to meet the immediate needs of the community and are typically located in accessible areas such as barangay centers or near residential zones, focused on providing quick, efficient service for small, everyday purchases.

2.8 RONPD (Retail Outlet for Non-Prescription Drugs) – Establishments authorized under FDA Circular No. 2014-028 to sell Over-The-Counter (OTC) drugs that

do not require a prescription. These outlets are distinct from pharmacies and drugstores and are required to operate in strict compliance with FDA regulations and guidelines.

**SECTION 3. PROHIBITION.** Convenience stores, sari-sari stores and the like are hereby prohibited from dispensing, selling and reselling any pharmaceutical products and over-the-counter medicines without a licensed pharmacist whether acquired from accredited drugstore or other sources.

**SECTION 4. EXEMPTIONS.** The following are exempted from this Ordinance:

4.1 Accredited and licensed pharmacies, drugstores, and other establishments permitted by the FDA to dispense and sell pharmaceutical product.

4.2 Sari-sari stores, convenience stores and retail outlets may be allowed to sell and dispense Over-The-Counter (OTC) drugs, provided they secure a Retail Outlet for Non-Prescription Drugs (RONPD) license from the FDA.

**SECTION 5. IMPLEMENTATION AND MONITORING.** The Municipal Health Office, in coordination with the Business Permits and Licensing Office (BPLO), the Food and Drug Administration, the Barangays and the local police, shall be responsible for the monitoring and implementation of this Ordinance.

**SECTION 6. INFORMATION DISSEMINATION.** The Municipal Health Office shall conduct an information campaign regarding this Ordinance to ensure that all concerned establishments and the general public are aware of its provisions.

**SECTION 7. PENALTY.** Any person or owner of the establishment found violating the provisions of this Ordinance shall be meted the penalty hereunder;

First Offense. A written stern warning to be issued by the Municipal Health Officer, and shall be subject to a fine of ₱ 500.00.

Second Offense. A fine of ₱ 1,000.00, plus confiscation of the pharmaceutical products and suspension of business permit for 30 days.

Third Offense. A fine of ₱ 2,000.00, plus confiscation of all pharmaceutical products, revocation of business permit, and imprisonment of not less than 5 days, excluding the sanctions provided by the FDA as the case may be, at the discretion of the court.

**SECTION 8. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE.** If any provision or part of this Ordinance is declared invalid or unconstitutional, the remaining provisions shall remain in full force and effect.

**SECTION 9. REPEALING CLAUSE.** All ordinances, resolutions, or regulations inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

**SECTION 10. EFFECTIVITY.** This Ordinance shall take effect after 10 days from publication by way posting copies in conspicuous place at the municipal hall, public market, church, and in all the Barangay Hall of this municipality.

MINUTES OF THE PUBLIC HEARING OF THE PROPOSED MUNICIPAL ORDINANCE OF THE 15<sup>TH</sup> SANGGUNIANG BAYAN OF INOPACAN, LEYTE HELD ON DECEMBER 4, 2024 AT THE COVERED COURT OF BARANGAY LINAO, INOPACAN, LEYTE

1 **PRESENT: (Please see attached Attendance Sheet, also attached are the lists**  
2 **of personalities invited)**  
3

4 The proposed Ordinance submitted for public hearing is entitled, “An  
5 **Ordinance Prohibiting the Dispensing, Selling, and Reselling of**  
6 **Pharmaceutical Products in Convenience Stores, Sari-sari Stores and Similar**  
7 **Retail Outlets Within the Municipality of Inopacan, Province of Leyte, and**  
8 **Providing Penalties for Violation Thereof”.**  
9

10 The public hearing started at 9:15 in the afternoon with an opening prayer led  
11 by Honorable Sabino Dedal , Punong Barangay of Mara-o and was immediately  
12 followed by the singing of the national anthem synchronized with the sound system.  
13

14 The Master of Ceremony (MC), Ms. Maria Kahren Sombrado, SB Staff, after  
15 welcoming and thanking all the participants for their presence and taking part in the  
16 legislation process and mentioned the title of the proposed ordinance, acknowledged  
17 the Sangguniang Bayan Members present, namely: Honorable Sanders C. Lumarda,  
18 Honorable Fernando B. Rulete, Honorable Andrew B. Dedal, Honorable Joel D.  
19 Bernales, Honorable Daria D. Malanguis, Honorable Rowena K. Madrazo,  
20 Honorable Diosdado P. Siao, Honorable Panfila I. Alonzo and Honorable Nathaniel  
21 Dave M. Katigbe. She as well acknowledged the Barangay Chairpersons, and the  
22 LGU Department Heads present. The MC encouraged everyone to raise their  
23 queries after the discussions of the proposed ordinance, and to introduce their  
24 selves first before raising any question.  
25

26 A Welcome Message was delivered by Honorable Sanders C. Lumarda,  
27 Municipal Vice Mayor, Presiding Officer. He explained that a Public Hearing is duly  
28 conducted since the proposed Ordinance involves penalties. He as well encouraged  
29 the participants to voice out their suggestions and recommendation concerning the  
30 issues and concerns regarding the medicines that were sold everywhere.  
31

32 After the welcome message of the Presiding Officer, the MC gave the floor to  
33 the Author of the above-captioned Ordinance. Honorable Rowena K. Madrazo,  
34 Author, as her introductory message, reiterates to all the participants that a public  
35 hearing is necessary since the proposed Ordinance involves fees and penalties. And  
36 by law, any collections of the same will be anchored from a legal basis, hence, the  
37 15<sup>th</sup> Sangguniang Bayan has to enact an Ordinance for the purpose.  
38

39 Honorable Madrazo manifested that according to the given statement of the  
40 Chair, there are still people selling pharmaceutical products making the same  
41 accessible to anywhere instead of buying it from an FDA accredited store where  
42 there is a licensed Pharmacist. She also highlighted that it is also in compliance to  
43 the existing Rules and Regulation Governing the Sales of Medicines. After her  
44 thorough explanation, Honorable Madrazo then opened the floor for questions and  
45 queries.

46 Honorable Andres Lao, Punong Barangay of Esperanza, presented the  
47 scenario when there is a need for the basic/first aid medicines like Paracetamol  
48 Biogesic, Diatabs, etc, during late nights. Honorable Madrazo manifested that the  
49 Over the Counter Medicines is still not allowed hence, although it is for convenience  
50 and accessibility at the same time, however, quality and safety to our  
51 people/constituents must come first. For additional information, she then gave the  
52 floor to Dr. Josephine O. Zafico, Municipal Health Officer, this Municipality. Dr.  
53 Zafico explained that the statement given by Honorable Madrazo is correct. She  
54 also presented Mr. Paul Randel Aruela, Public Health Pharmacist, DOH Eastern  
55 Visayas for a further explanation. Mr. Aruela elaborates that Sari-sari Stores and the  
56 like are allowed to dispense OTC Medicines as long as the store has Retail Outlets  
57 for Non-Prescription Drugs and must have a Pharmacist to supervise them. Dr.  
58 Zafico manifested that they provide medicines to the barangays. She also advised  
59 everyone that the best thing to do is to have a certain stock of the basics/OTC  
60 Medicines which are bought from a legitimate drug store. Views, opinions,  
61 suggestions and recommendations regarding the matter were aired.

62  
63 Honorable Sergio Lico, Punong Barangay of Apid, informed that there is a  
64 sari-sari store that sells OTC medicines in their Barangay. He also presented that in  
65 the absence of a stock medicines, they find it hard buying medicines from an  
66 authorized drug stores at the mainland in times of emergencies. Dr. Zafico  
67 manifested that they have given generic medicines to the Barangays. But the sad  
68 thing is that, they will not intake the same. She then adds that it may not be branded  
69 but it is still the same as the biogesic and diatabs. Mr. Aruela manifested that there  
70 is that Botika sa Barangay but the problem is, the people will still buy. He suggested  
71 that the better way is to inform the Barangay Health Workers to have a certain stock  
72 of the medicines, the same as what is/are available in the RHU. He stresses that  
73 those medicines are safe to take. Dr. Zafico manifested that they will strive to  
74 address the said issues.


75  
76 Honorable Madrazo advised the Punong Barangays that when the RHU  
77 provides a stock of medicines, though Genrics, to inform their constituents that those  
78 products are not fake and are safe for intake. Dr. Zafico informs the Punong  
79 Barangay regarding the Peddlers who might selling fake medicines and are not FDA  
80 registered. Views and opinions regarding the roaming peddlers were aired.

81  
82 Honorable Madrazo asked for any more questions and there being none.  
83 There being no objections as well. She then requested the Punong Barangays to  
84 disseminate the information and the proposed Ordinance to its respective  
85 constituents.

86  
87 On the other hand, Honorable Fernando B. Rulete, Punong Barangay of  
88 Maljo, took the opportunity of having the presence of the Municipal Officials and  
89 requested for toilet bowls. He also relayed that some Barangays would not request  
90 as they already have the same. Views and opinions were aired.

91  
92 Since there were no other matters to discuss with, the Public Hearing was  
93 adjourned at 10:05 in the morning.







