AN ORDINANCE INSTITUTIONALIZING THE PROGRAMS, SERVICES, PRIVILEGES AND BENEFITS FOR SOLO PARENTS AND THEIR CHILDREN AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREOF AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES PURSUANT TO REPUBLIC ACT 8972, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS "THE SOLO PARENT ACT OF 2000, AS AMENDED BY RA 11861"

WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 8972 or the Solo Parents Welfare Act of 2000 declares that it is the policy of the government to promote family as the foundation of the nation, strengthen its

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solidarity and ensure its total development;

WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 11861, also known as the Expanded Solo Parents Welfare Act of 2022, was signed into law on June 4, 2024, amending Republic Act No. 8972 or the Solo Parents Welfare Act of 2000, expanding the coverage of who is considered a solo parent, providing additional and clarified benefits and introduce additional government interventions to improve the welfare of solo parents and their children;

WHEREAS, Article II, Sections 10 & 11 of the 1987 Philippine Constitution, provides that the State shall promote social justice in all phase of national development, value the dignity of every human person and guarantee full respect for human right. To this effect, the government shall protect and promote the welfare of solo parents and their children by providing or extending to them assistance in social development and welfare benefits, ensuring their rights and privileges;

NOW, THEREFORE, on motion of the Hon. Joenlee C. Larraga, seconded by all SB members present, be it ENACTED by the Sanggunian Bayan of Carigara, in a regular session assembled, that:

ARTICLE I TITLE, POLICY AND OBJECTIVE

SECTION 1. TITLE. This Ordinance shall be cited as the "SOLO PARENTS' ORDINANCE OF CARIGARA, LEYTE".

SECTION 2. DECLARATION OF POLICY. The Local Government Unit of Carigara, Province of Leyte shall therefore adopt and localize the implementation of the Expanded Solo Parents Welfare Act to protect and strengthen family as the basic foundation of the Filipino nation.

SECTION 3. DEFINITION OF TERMS. As used in this Ordinance, the following terms are defined as follows:

A. SOLO PARENT - any person/individual falling under the following categories as provided under Section 4 of RA 11861, also known as An Act Granting Additional Benefits to Solo Parents, amending for the Purpose RA 8972 (Solo Parents Welfare Act of 2000) and its Implementing Rules and Regulations, who has assumed the sole parental

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care and support of the child/children:

- a. A parent who provides solo parental care and support of the child or children due to:
 - 1. Birth as a result of rape, even without final conviction: Provided, That the mother keeps and raises the child;
 - 2. Death of the spouse;
 - 3. Detention of the spouse for at least three (3) months or service of sentence for a criminal conviction;
 - 4. Physical or mental incapacity of the spouse as certified by a public or private medical practitioner;
 - 5. Legal separation or de facto separation for at least six (6) months, and the solo parent is entrusted with the solo parental care and support of the child or children;
 - 6. Declaration of nullity or annulment of marriage, as decreed by a court recognized by law, and the solo parent is entrusted with the sole parental care and support of the child or children; or
 - 7. Abandonment by the spouse for at least six (6) months
- b. Spouse or any family member of an Overseas Filipino Worker (OFW), or the guardian of the child or children of an OFW: Provided, That the said OFW belongs to the low/semi-skilled worker category and is away from the Philippines for an uninterrupted period of twelve (12) months: Provided, further, That the OFW, his or her spouse, family member, or guardian of the child of an OFW falls under this section;
- c. Unmarried mother or father who keeps and rears the child or children;
- d. Any legal guardian, adoptive or foster parent who solely provides parental care and support to a child or children;
- e. Any relative within the fourth (4th) civil degree of consanguinity or affinity of the parent or legal guardian who assumes parental care and support of the child or children as a result of the death, abandonment, disappearance or absence of the parents or solo parent for at least six (6) months: Provided, That in cases of solo grandparents who are senior citizens but who have the sole parental care and support over their grandchildren who are unmarried, or unemployed and twenty-two (22) years old or





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below, or those twenty-two (22) years old or over but who are unable to fully take care or protect themselves from abuse, neglect, cruelty, exploitation, or discrimination because of a physical or mental disability or condition, they shall be entitled to the benefits granted to them by RA 9257, otherwise known as the Expanded Senior Citizens Act of 2003; or

- f. A pregnant woman who provides sole parental care and support to her unborn child or children."
- B. Children/Dependents refer to those living with and dependent upon the solo parent for support who are unmarried, unemployed and twenty-two (22) years old and below, or those over twenty-two (22) years old but uncapable to take care or protect themselves from abuse, neglect, cruelty, exploitation or discrimination due to physical or mental disability.
- C. Spouse refers to a husband or wife by virtues of a valid marriage or a partner in a common-law relationship
- D. Baby's milk refers to breastmilk substitute or replacement for breastmilk that is being sold in the market, such as infant formula;
- E. Child-minding center refers to a facility or an area within the workplace or in accessible locations to the solo parent or workplace of the guardian provided by the employer where the solo parent employee's child, children, or dependent/s who are aged seven (7) years old and below is/are being taken care and supervise during working hours;
- F. SPIC refers to the Solo Parent Identification Card issued to the solo parent as his/her competent proof of identification and the primary evidence of his/her status as a solo parent to enable him/her to avail of the benefits under this Ordinance;
- G. SPD refers to Solo Parents' Desk

ARTICLE II QUALIFICATIONS OF SOLO PARENT

Section 4. QUALIFICATIONS OF SOLO PARENT - For solo parent to qualify with the assistance provided under this Ordinance, he/she shall be:

1. A resident of the Municipality of Carigara, Leyte, as certified by the barangay







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chairperson, or his/her duly authorized representative;

- 2. With an income level equal to or below the poverty threshold, as assessed by a social worker at the MSWDO; and
- 3. Have been issued a Solo Parent Identification Card (SPIC) by the MSWDO, as proof/evidence of identity and membership in the said sector.

Section 5. SPIC AND BOOKLET - The Solo Parent Desk (SPD) of the Municipality of Carigara shall review and verify the documents submitted by the applicant solo parent and shall issue the Solo Parent Identification Card (SPIC) and booklet, within seven (7) workings days from receipt of the complete documents or requirements.

The SPIC is valid for one (1) year, subject to renewal upon assessment and evaluation of the solo parent by the social worker in the municipality.

Section 6. REQUIREMENTS FOR THE ISSUANCE OF THE SPIC. The Solo Parent shall submit authenticated or certified true copies of the required documents under the category which he/she belongs, to the SPD of the Municipality of Carigara, Leyte, as follows:

(a) For the solo parent with child or children as a consequence of rape

- (1) Birth certificate/s of the child or children;
- (2) Complaint affidavit;
- (3) Medical record on the incident of rape; and
- (4) Sworn affidavit declaring that the solo parent has the sole parental care and support of the child or children at the time of the execution of affidavit: Provided, that for purposes of issuance of subsequent SPIC or booklet, only the sworn affidavit shall be submitted every year.

(b) For the solo parent on account of the death of the spouse

- (1) Birth certificate/s of the child or children;
- (2) Marriage certificate;
- (3) Death certificate of the spouse; and
- (4) Sworn affidavit declaring that the solo parent is not cohabiting with a partner of coparent, and has the sole parental care and support of the child or children: Provided, that for purposes of issuance of subsequent SPIC or booklet, only the sworn affidavit shall be submitted every year.







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(c) For the solo parent on account of the detention or criminal conviction of the spouse

- (1) Birth certificate/s of the child or children;
- (2) Marriage certificate;
- (3) Certificate of detention or a certification that the spouse is serving sentence for at least three (3) months issued by the law enforcement agency having actual custody of the detained spouse, or commitment order issued by the court pursuant to a conviction of the spouse; and
- (4) Sworn affidavit declaring that the solo parent is not cohabiting with a partner or coparent, and has sole parental care and support of the child or children: Provided, That for purposes of issuance of subsequent SPIC or booklet, requirement numbers (3) and (4) under this paragraph shall be submitted every year.

(d) For solo parent on account of physical or mental incapacity of the spouse

- (1) Birth certificate/s of the child or children;
- (2) Marriage certificate or affidavit of cohabitation;
- (3) Medical record or medical abstract evidencing the physical or mental state of the incapacitated spouse issued not more than three (3) months before the submission; and (4) Sworn affidavit that the solo parent is not cohabiting with a partner or co-parent, and has sole parental care and support of the child or children: Provided, That for purposes of issuance of subsequent SPIC or booklet, requirement numbers (3) and (4) under this paragraph shall be submitted every year.

(e) For the solo parent on account of legal or de facto separation of spouse

- (1) Birth certificate/s of the child or children;
- (2) Marriage certificate;
- (3) Judicial decree of legal separation of the spouses or, in the case of de facto separation, an affidavit of two (2) disintegrated persons attesting to the fact of separation of the spouses; and
- (4) Sworn affidavit declaring that the solo parent is not cohabiting with a partner or coparent, and has sole parental care and support of the child or children: Provided, That for purposes of issuance of subsequent SPIC or booklet, requirement numbers (3) and (4) under this paragraph shall be submitted every year.

(f) For the solo parent on account of declaration of nullity or annulment of marriage

- (1) Birth certificate/s of the child or children;
- (2) Marriage certificate;







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- (3) Judicial decree of nullity or annulment of marriage or judicial recognition of foreign divorce; and
- (4) Sworn affidavit declaring that the solo parent is not cohabiting with a partner or coparent, and has sole parental care and support of the child or children: Provided, That for purposes of issuance of subsequent SPIC or booklet, requirement numbers (3) and (4) under this paragraph shall be submitted every year.

(g) For the solo parent on account of abandonment by the spouse

- (1) Birth certificate/s of the child or children;
- (2) Marriage certificate or affidavit of the applicant solo parent;
- (3) Affidavit of two (2) disinterested persons attesting to the abandonment of the spouse;
- (4) Police or barangay record of the fact of abandonment; and
- (5) Sworn affidavit declaring that the solo parent is not cohabiting with a partner or coparent, and has sole parental care and support of the child or children: Provided, That for purposes of issuance of subsequent SPIC or booklet, only sworn affidavit shall be submitted every year

(h) For the spouse or any family member of an OFW

- (1) Birth certificate/s of the child or children;
- (2) Marriage certificate of the applicant;
- (3) Overseas Employment Certificate (OEC) or its equivalent document;
- (4) Copy of passport stamps showing continuous twelve (12) months of overseas work;
- (5) Sworn affidavit declaring that the solo parent is not cohabiting with a partner or coparent, and has sole parental care and support of the child or children: Provided, That for purposes of issuance of subsequent SPIC or booklet, requirement numbers (3), (4), (5), and (6) under this paragraph shall be submitted every year.

(i) For the unmarried father or mother who keeps and rears the child or children

- (1) Birth certificate/s of the child or children:
- (2) Certificate of No Marriage (CENOMAR);
- (3) Affidavit of a barangay official attesting that the solo parent is a resident of the barangay and that the children are under the parental care and support of the applicant solo parent; and
- (4) Sworn affidavit declaring that the solo parent is not cohabiting with a partner or coparent, and has sole parental care and support of the child or children: Provided, that

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for purposes of issuance of subsequent SPIC or booklet, requirement numbers (2), (3) and (4) under this paragraph shall be submitted every year.

(j) For the solo parent who is a legal guardian, adoptive or foster parent

- (1) Birth certificate/s of the child or children;
- (2) Proof of guardianship, foster care or adoption;
- (3) Affidavit of a barangay official attesting that the solo parent is a resident of the barangay and that the children are under the parental care and support of the applicant solo parent; and
- (4) Sworn affidavit declaring that the solo parent is not cohabiting with a partner or coparent, and has sole parental care and support of the child or children: Provided, that for purposes of issuance of subsequent SPIC or booklet, requirement numbers (3) and (4) under this paragraph shall be submitted every year.

(k) For any relative within the fourth (4th) civil degree of consanguinity or affinity of the parent or legal guardian who assumes parental care and support of the child or children

- (1) Birth certificate/s of the child or children;
- (2) Death certificate of the parents or legal guardian, or police or barangay records evidencing the fact of disappearance or absence of the parent or legal guardian for at least six (6) months;
- (3) Affidavit of a barangay official attesting that the solo parent is a resident of the barangay and that the children are under the parental care and support of the applicant solo parent; and
- (4) Sworn affidavit declaring that the solo parent is not cohabiting with a partner or coparent, and has sole parental care and support of the child or children: Provided, that for purposes of issuance of subsequent SPIC or booklet, requirement numbers (3) and (4) under this paragraph shall be submitted every year.

(l) For the solo parent who is pregnant woman

- (1) Medical record of her pregnancy;
- (2) Affidavit of a barangay official attesting that the solo parent is a resident of the barangay and that the children are under the parental care and support of the applicant solo parent; and
- (3) Sworn affidavit declaring that the solo parent is not cohabiting with a partner or coparent, and has sole parental care and support of the child or children.







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(m) For the solo parent availing subsidy and discounts, the following additional documentary requirements shall be submitted:

- (1) Affidavit of no employment;
- (2) Income Tax Return (ITR);
- (3) Social case study issued by the DSWD; or
- (4) Any verifiable proof of income.

Custodians of the documents, records, data or information shall ensure the utmost confidentiality of the same, in compliance with Republic Act No. 10173, otherwise known as the 'Data Privacy Act of 2012'."

ARTICLE III BENEFITS

Section 7. COMPREHENSIVE PACKAGE OF SOCIAL PROTECTION SERVICES - The Municipal Social Welfare and Development Office (MSWDO) in coordination with other government agencies and civil society organizations shall provide or implement the following comprehensive package of social protection services for solo parents and their families: 1. Livelihood development services, such as training on livelihood skills, basic business management, value orientation, and the provision of seed capital or job placement; 2. Provision of medical, burial, educational, or transportation assistance to individuals in crisis situation, based on the existing programs guidelines of the Assistance to Individuals in Crisis Situations (AICS); 3. Counseling services, which include individual, peer group or family counseling; 4. Parent effectiveness service which include the provision and expansion of knowledge and skills of the solo parent on early childhood development, behavior management, health care and proper nutrition, rights and duties of parents and children; 5. Provision of critical incidence stress debriefing which includes preventive stress management strategy designed to assist solo parent in coping with crisis situation and cases of abuse; and 6. Special interventions for individual in need of special protection which include temporary shelter, counselling, legal advice and assistance, medical care, self-concept or ego-building, crisis management, sexual and reproductive health, and spiritual nourishment.

Section 8. FLEXIBLE WORKING SCHEDULE - The employer shall institute or provide for a flexible working arrangement to accommodate the different responsibilities of solo parents: Provided, That the same shall not affect the quality of their work: Provided further, that any employer may request exemption from the above requirements from the Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE) on certain meritorious grounds.

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Section 9. NON-DISCRIMINATION IN WORK OR EMPLOYMENT. No institutions, establishments, employers, whether public or private, within the Municipality of Carigara shall discriminate against any solo parent with respect to recruitment, promotion, salary, and terms and conditions of employment on account of his/her status.

Section 10. PARENTAL LEAVE - In addition to existing leave privileges, a forfeitable and noncumulative parental leave of not more than seven (7) working days with pay every year shall be granted to any solo parent employee in the public or private sector, who has rendered service of at least (6) months, regardless of employment status: Provided, that a valid SPIC shall be presented by qualified solo parents to avail such leave.

Section 11. EDUCATIONAL BENEFITS - A child of a solo parent shall be given priority to a scholarship or education programs provided by LGU-Carigara, DepEd, CHED, TESDA, and other concerned agencies. Non-formal education programs may, likewise, be provided to solo parents and their children.

Section 12. MEDICAL ASSISTANCE - Every solo parent and their children shall have access to package of primary care services provided by the LGU-Carigara through its rural health unit (RHU).

Section 13. CHILD-MINDING CENTER - LGU-Carigara shall establish and maintain a child-minding center in accessible locations in the municipality, free of charge to the employees, and prioritizing the child or children of solo parents who are seven (7) years old and below.

Section 14. BREASTFEEDING IN THE WORKPLACE – Breastfeeding shall be promoted in the Municipality of Carigara. Thus, employers, both in the private and public sectors shall establish a lactation station for the use of nursing mothers or employees, unless exempted from setting up a lactation station.

Employers shall give breastfeeding mothers/employees additional break aside from the regular timeoff for meals to express their breast milk for the period of at least one (1) year after the birth of her child or children, or until such time that the mother is still lactating.

Section 15. SOCIAL SAFETY ASSISTANCE – During disasters and calamities as declared by the National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (NDRRMC), or pandemics and other public health crises as declared by the Department of Health (DOH), the solo parents and their children residing in the municipality shall be entitled to a social safety assistance such as food,

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medicines, and financial assistance for house repair provided by LGU-Carigara and other concerned agencies.

ARTICLE IV ADDITIONAL BENEFITS

Section 16. ADDITIONAL BENEFITS. A solo parent shall also be accorded with the following additional benefits:

- a. A ten percent (10%) discount and value-added tax (VAT) exemption on baby's milk, food and micronutrient supplements, and sanitary diapers, duly prescribed medicines, vaccines, and other medical supplements purchased for infant or children until the age of six (6), provided that the solo parent is earning less than ₱250,000.00 annually;
- b. A Solo parent is automatically covered under the National Health Insurance Program (NHIP), administered by PhilHealth;
- c. Priority shall be given to solo parents in re-entering the work force and their children shall likewise, be given priority in apprenticeships, scholarships, livelihood training, reintegration programs for OFWs, employment information and matching services, and other poverty alleviation programs provided by LGU-Carigara, TESDA, DTI, DOLE, and other related government agencies; and
- d. A Solo parent shall be given priority in the allocation of housing project and shall be provided with liberal terms of payment on the said government low-cost housing in accordance with housing law provisions prioritizing applicants below poverty line as declared by the Philippines Statistics Authority (PSA);

ARTICLE V TERMINATION OF BENEFITS

Section 17. TERMINATION OF BENEFITS OF A SOLO PARENT. A change in the status or circumstances of the solo parent, shall terminate his or her eligibility to avail of the benefits accorded under this Ordinance.

ARTICLE VI SOLO PARENTS DESK (SPD)

Section 18. THE SOLO PARENTS DESK (SPD). There shall be established a Solo Parents Desk

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under the Municipal Social Welfare Development Office (MSWD) of the Municipality of Carigara, Leyte.

The Roles and Functions of SPD shall be as follows:

- a) Plan, implement, and monitor annual work programs of the municipality;
- b) Draw up a list of available and required services from the solo parents;
- c) Maintain and regularly updated, on a quarterly basis, the list of solo parents and issue free Solo Parent Identification Card (SPIC);
- d) Issue free booklets to solo parents;
- e) Serve as a general information and liaison center for solo parents;
- f) Monitor compliance with the provision of this ordinance, especially the grant of privileges and additional benefits to solo parents;
- g) Report to the Municipal Mayor or MSWD Office, any individual, establishment, business entity, institution or agency that violates any provision of this Ordinance;
- Assist the solo parents in filing appropriate complaints against any individual, establishment, business entity, institution or agency that refuses or fails to provide the privileges and additional benefits of solo parents; and
- i) Provide such other services as may be required under this Ordinance.

The Municipal Mayor shall appoint or designate personnel in the SPD who shall be primarily responsible of the implementation and the management of the Solo Parents' plans, programs and activities.

ARTICE VII REGISTRATION OF SOLO PARENTS

Section 19. REGISTRATION OF SOLO PARENTS. The Office of the MSWD, shall register and maintain a centralized database of all solo parents in the municipality who have been issued of SPIC and booklets by the SPD.

ARTICLE VIII PROHIBITED ACTS AND PENALTIES

Section 20. PROHIBITED ACTS AND PENALTIES.

a) Any person, establishment, business entity or agency within the jurisdiction of this

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municipality that refuses or fails to provide the benefits granted to the solo parent shall be meted with the following penalties:

First Offense - A fine of \$\mathbb{P}\$1,000.00 will be imposed

Second Offense - A fine of \$\mathbb{P}\$1,500.00 will be imposed

Third Offense & subsequent violation - A fine of \$\mathbb{P}\$2,500.00 will be imposed or one (1) month imprisonment, or both, at the discretion of the Court.

If the violator is a corporation, partnership, organization or any similar entity, the officials and employees who directly participated in the violation/s shall be held liable.

The proper authorities may, after due notice and hearing, also cause the cancellation or revocation of the business permit, permit to operate, franchise and other similar privileges granted to any business that violates the provision of this Ordinance.

If the offender is a foreigner, the foreigner shall be deported immediately after service of sentence without further deportation proceedings.

b) Any misrepresentation made by any person or falsifies any documents to avail of the benefits, or cause another person to avail or be denied of the benefits provided under this Ordinance, or any person who abuses the privileges and benefits granted herein shall be punished with a fine of Php1,000.00 for first offense; Php1,500.00 for second offense and Php2,500.00, or one (1) month imprisonment, or both, at the discretion of the Court for third and subsequent violation.

When the offender or the person responsible for the offenses punishable under paragraph (a) and (b) of this section is a public officer or employee as defined in Executive Order No. 292, or the Administrative Code of 1987, and the offense was committed in the exercise of official duties, such officer or employee shall suffer the penalty of removal from office and perpetual disqualification from holding public office, in addition to the penalty provided in the preceding paragraph.

ARTICLE IX BUDGETARY APPROPRIATION

Section 21. APPROPRIATION. The amount necessary to implement the provisions of this

Ordinance shall be sourced from the Gender and Development (GAD) Fund in the Annual Budget of the Municipality of Carigara, Leyte.

ARTICLE X FINAL PROVISIONS

Section 22. APPLICABILITY CLAUSE - All other matters relating to the impositions or regulations provided in this Ordinance shall be governed by the pertinent provisions of existing laws and other ordinances. This shall apply to all solo parents and their child or children residing within the Municipality of Carigara, and all persons who may be subject to the provision of this Ordinance.

Section 23. REPEALING CLAUSE. All Ordinances and Resolutions inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed, amended, or modified accordingly.

Section 24. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE. If, for any reason, any section or provision of this Ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid, other sections or provisions thereof, which are not affected thereby shall continue in full force and effect.

Section 25. EFFECTIVITY. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its approval and fifteen (15) days after publication in a newspaper of local circulation.
