WHEREAS, Section 16, Article II of the 1987 Constitution provides that the State shall protect and promote the right of the people to a balance and healthful ecology in accordance with the rhythm and harmony of nature.

WHEREAS Republic Act 9147 also known as the Wildlife Resources Conservation and Protection Act, Section 2 (a) states, "It shall be the policy of the state to conserve the country's wildlife resources and their habitats for sustainability.

WHEREAS, Section 35 of the same law provides that Local Government Unit shall initiate conservation measures in their areas,

WHEREAS, based on the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) records, the Philippines is the sole host to 1,137 animal species and 14,000 species of plants, the country is also one of the top biodiversity hotspots with 592 endemic species of amphibians, birds and mammals considered "threatened or endangered.

NOW THEREFORE, be it **ORDAINED** as it is hereby **ORDAINED** by the Sangguniang Panlalawigan in session assembled, that

Section 1 Short Title. This ordinance shall be known as the 'Santa Fe Wildlife Anti- Trafficking and Protection Program."

Section 2 Declaration of Policy. It shall be the policy of the state to conserve the country's wildlife resources and their habitats for sustainability in the pursuit of this policy, this ordinance shall have the following objectives:

- To conserve and protect wildlife species and their habitats to promote ecological balance and enhance biological diversity;
- To regulate the collection and trade of wildlife;
- To pursue, with regard to national interest, the Philippine commitment to international conventions, protection of wildlife and their habitats; and
- To initiate support scientific studies on the conservation of biological diversity.

Section 3. Scope. This ordinance shall be enforceable for all wildlife species found within Santa Fe Leyte.

Section 4. Definition of Terms. For the purpose of this ordinance, the following shall mean:

- a. Conservation-** means preservation and sustainable utilization of wildlife and/or maintenance, restoration and enhancement of the habitat.
- b. Critically endangered species-** refers to a species or subspecies that is not critically endangered but whose survival in the wild is unlikely if the casual factors continue operating;
Karpa, Gutan, Gurami, Ibul, Kasili. Gamak, Tikling, Tokmo, Takoyon, Tarak, Lapay. This is inclusive only of endangered fish and bird species found in Peat Land.
- c. Endemic species-** means species or sub species which is naturally occurring and found only within specific areas in the country.
- d. Exotic species-** means species or sub species which do not naturally occur in the country.
- e. Habitat-** means place or environment where species or sub species naturally occur or has naturally established its population.
- f. Indigenous Wildlife-** means species or sub species of wildlife naturally occurring or has naturally established population in the country.
- g. Wildlife-** means wild forms and varieties of flora and fauna, in all developmental stages, including those which are in captivity or are being breed or propagated.
- h. By product or derivatives-** means any part taken or substance extracted from wildlife in raw or in processed form. This includes stuffed animals and herbarium specimens.
- i. Collection or collecting-** products or derivatives means the act of gathering or harvesting wildlife, it by products or derivatives.
- j. Wildlife Collectors permit-** means a permit to take or collect form the wild certain species and quantities of wildlife for commercial purposes.

Section 5. Local Transport of Wildlife, By Products and Derivatives. Local transport of wildlife, products and derivatives collected or possessed through any other means shall be authorized unless the same is prejudicial to the wildlife and public health.

Transport of wildlife shall be accompanied by proper permit and documents from the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) The absence of permit shall be prima facie evidence that the wildlife is illegally obtained and transported Further the subject wildlife shall be immediately confiscated and transfer to the nearest Wildlife Rescue Center of the Municipality.

Provided further, that the ownership of the said conveyances belongs to the third persons who has not participation in or knowledge of the illegal acts, the same may be released to said owner after presentation of proper documents.

Section 6. Prohibited Acts. Unless otherwise allowed in accordance with RA 9147 shall be unlawful for any person to willfully and knowingly exploit wildlife resources and their habitats, or undertake the following acts:

- 1. Killing and destroying wildlife species except in the following instances
 - a) When the wildlife is afflicted with an incurable disease
 - b) When it is deemed necessary to put an end to the misery suffered by the wildlife
 - c) When it is done to prevent an imminent danger to the life or limb of a human being and
 - d) When the wildlife is killed or destroyed after it has been used in an authorized research or experiments.

Section 7. Wildlife Traffic Monitoring Unit.

There must be a wildlife traffic monitoring unit assigned in the Municipal Agriculture Office, who must have proper training in identifying the wildlife. Such unit, must also disseminate information on what acts are prohibited and banned species in every barangay. Such unit shall regularly monitor all Pet shop stores situated in Santa Fe to ensure that no wildlife is illegally traded.

Section 8. Creation and Composition of the Local Wildlife Enforcement Office

Chairman : Municipal Mayor
Vice Chairman : Chairman on the Committee on Environmental Protection
Members : Representative from the Municipal Agriculture Office
Representative from the Department of Agriculture
Representative from the Municipal Environment Resources Office
(MENRO)
Representative from the Municipal Legal Consultant Office
Representative from the Department of Environment and Natural Resources(DENR)
Representative from the Philippine National Police

Section 9. Deputation of Wildlife Enforcement Officers

The wildlife enforcement officers shall have the full authority to seize illegally traded wildlife and to arrest violators subject to existing laws, rules and regulations on arrest and detention.

Section 10. Wildlife Rescue Center

The Municipal Mayor's Office thru the Municipal Agriculture Office shall establish a wildlife rescue center that will temporarily detain all confiscated, abandoned and/or donated wildlife to ensure their welfare and well-being.

All confiscated wildlife shall be properly turned over to the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) in accordance with the guidelines set forth under RA 9147

Section 11. Penalties for Violation. Any person committing any act mentioned in Section 8 herein shall be punished by the following;

First Offense A fine of Five Hundred Pesos (P500.00)
Second Offense A fine of One Thousand Pesos (P1,000.00)
Third Offense A fine of Two Thousand Pesos (P2,000.00)

Such penalties imposed shall be without prejudice to the penalties imposed by Section 28 of Republic Act 9147 also known as the Wildlife Resources Conservation and Protection Act

Section 12. The Local Wildlife Enforcement Officers shall formulate guidelines an Implementing Rules and Regulation (IRR) for the smooth implementation of the ordinance subject to the approval of the Sangguniang Panlalawigan.

Section 13. Budget. The Municipality shall allocate an annual budget of One Hundred Thousand Pesos (Php 100,000.00) from the General Appropriation Fund for the purpose of this ordinance.

Section 14. Separability Clause. If any part of this Ordinance is declared as unconstitutional or unlawful, such declaration shall not affect the other parts or sections hereof that are not declared unlawful or unconstitutional.

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
Section 15. Repealing Clause. All previous ordinances inconsistent with this Ordinance shall be deemed repealed or modified accordingly.





18 magkaconduct kami hin public hearing para hiton mga tawo masabtan iton mga
19 penalidad. An aton penalty para hiton madadakpan na nandadakop nga nagbabaligya
20 ngan nagdadakop iton mga kahayupan first offense P500.00 second offense P1,000.00,
21 third offense is P2,000.00. Kun local la iton madadakpan iton penalties amu la adto
22 pero kun national na an makadakop ha iyo asya na iton an mayda na kaprisohan so
23 amu la iton aton dapat ikmatan".
