



ORDINANCE NO. 11, S. 2025

AN ORDINANCE TO FURTHER ESTABLISH THE BARUGO MUNICIPAL INFIRMARY AS A SUSTAINABLE ECONOMIC ENTERPRISE HEALTHCARE FACILITY.

WHEREAS, the Barugo Municipal Infirmary was established under Ordinance No. 16 S.2022 dated December 5, 2022 to provide quality and accessible healthcare services to the residents of Barugo and neighboring areas;

WHEREAS, to ensure the continued delivery of quality services, it is essential to generate sufficient revenues for its operation, maintenance, and improvement;

WHEREAS, the Local Government Code of 1991 (Republic Act No. 7160) empowers local government units to create and operate economic enterprises, including healthcare facilities, to enhance service delivery and achieve fiscal sustainability;

WHEREAS, Section 17 of Republic Act No. 7160 (Local Government Code of 1991) mandates municipalities to provide basic services and facilities, including infrastructure facilities intended primarily to service the needs of the residents and funded out of municipal funds, such as clinics, health centers, and other health facilities to carry out health services;

WHEREAS, the municipality recognizes the importance of prescribing reasonable rates for hospital services while balancing the need for exemptions and discounts to support vulnerable sectors of the community;

WHEREAS, it is the policy of the Municipality of Barugo to establish fair and justifiable fees to sustain the Barugo Municipal Infirmary as an economic enterprise and to ensure equitable access to healthcare services;

NOW THEREFORE, On motion of Hon. Jeffrey P. Cañezal, duly seconded by Hon. Eduardo C. Calzita, resolve, as it is hereby resolved, to enact, as it is hereby enacted this ordinance To Further Establish The Barugo Municipal Infirmary as a Sustainable Economic Enterprise Healthcare Facility.

ORDINANCE NO. 11, S. 2025

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE HONORABLE MEMBERS OF SANGGUNIANG BAYAN OF BARUGO, LEYTE ON ITS REGUAR SESSION ASSEMBLED TO WIT:

SECTION 1. TITLE: This is an Ordinance Establishing the Barugo Municipal Infirmary as a Sustainable Economic Enterprise Healthcare Facility of Barugo, Leyte.

SECTION 2. PURPOSE

This ordinance aims to:

1. To improve the financial sustainability of the Barugo Municipal Infirmary (BMI) while ensuring that quality healthcare services are made accessible to the general public.
2. Prescribe fair and reasonable rates for room accommodations, laboratory fees, medicines, and other hospital services.
3. Ensure the sustainable operation of the Barugo Municipal Infirmary as an economic enterprise.
4. Establish clear guidelines for managing patients with outstanding balances.

SECTION 3. PRESCRIBED RATE AND FEES

For the purpose of generating revenue to support the maintenance and operations of the Barugo Municipal Infirmary, the following prescribed rates and fees enumerated hereunder for the services rendered and medicine administered at the Barugo Municipal Infirmary shall be applied to all in-patients and out-patients, except for cases where PhilHealth deductions or other government healthcare assistance / insurance program fully cover the total bill

3.1 ROOM FEE/RATE:

Note: The above rates may be reviewed annually by the Sangguniang Bayan, in coordination with the Hospital Management Committee or a duly designated committee, to consider any increases or inflation in prices based on PhilHealth adjustments or the facility's operational cost requirements.

3.2 LABORATORY FEES

Please refer to ordinance no. 26-B, series of 2020 The Comprehensive Revenue Code and Market Code for the rates/fees.

Note: The laboratory fees may be updated based on the availability of resources, the rising cost of medical supplies, or changes in medical technology.

3.3 MEDICINE FEES AND OTHER SUPPLY FEES

The Barugo Municipal Infirmary shall provide essential medicines to patients at affordable prices. The prices for medicines dispensed to patients shall be based on the actual cost plus a reasonable markup to cover administrative and operational expenses.

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Details on specific prices of medicines and other supply fees are available at the Pharmacy and Billing Section of the Infirmary.

Note: Medicine and other supply prices may be adjusted annually based on supplier costs or inflation.

All hospital fees and charges, including room rates, laboratory, medicines, and other service fees, shall be paid directly at the LGU Barugo Treasury Office.

SECTION 4. OTHER HOSPITAL SERVICE FEES

The following service charges shall be imposed for various auxiliary services rendered and to be rendered by the Barugo Municipal Infirmary:

Note: Hemodialysis

- Covers both inpatient and outpatient procedures including emergency dialysis procedures for acute renal failure
- Claims for multiple sessions may be filed using one (1) claim form for both inpatient and outpatient hemodialysis.
- May be availed of even as second case rate (full case rate amount)
- 90 days benefit limit: One session is equivalent to one day deduction from the 90 allowable days per year.
- If procedure is done during confinement, only the total number of confinement days shall be deducted.

SECTION 5. PHILHEALTH COVERAGE, OUTPATIENT SERVICES, AND SPECIAL TREATMENT PACKAGES

Guidelines:

1. Coverage Through PhilHealth:

- If the patient is a **Registered PhilHealth member**, professional fees for doctors shall be primarily covered through PhilHealth benefit packages.
- These benefits are paid through All Case Rates.
- The case rate amount shall be deducted by the Health Facility from the member's total bill, which shall include professional fees of attending physicians, prior to discharge
- The case rate amount is inclusive of hospital charges and professional fees of attending physician
- Documents needed: copy of Member Data Record or PhilHealth Benefit Eligibility Form (PBEF) and duly accomplished [PhilHealth Claim Form 1](#)
- Only admissible cases shall be reimbursed
- Any remaining balance after PhilHealth deduction may be covered through the **Assistance to Individuals in Crisis Situation (AICS)** or other government healthcare assistance / insurance program subject to evaluation and availability of funds.

2. **Billing and Collection:** All professional fees shall be reflected in the patient's billing statement and collected through the Barugo Municipal Infirmary's official billing process. Patients or their significant others shall settle the professional fees at the LGU Barugo Treasury Office upon issuance of the Statement of Account.
3. **Municipal Employees and Indigent and Non Indigent Residents:** Remaining professional fees, after PhilHealth deductions, may be charged to the Assistance to Individuals in Crisis Situation (AICS) program or other government healthcare assistance as applicable.
4. **Residents of Barugo who choose to avail of private or semi-private room accommodations** will receive free hospital services. However, any remaining hospital bill after PhilHealth deductions shall be paid by the patient. They shall not be eligible for Assistance to Individuals in Crisis Situation (AICS) or any other government healthcare assistance programs.
5. **Non-resident Patients:** All **non-resident patients** of the Municipality of Barugo shall pay the applicable **professional fees in full**, after PhilHealth deductions. These fees are **not covered by the AICS program** unless otherwise approved by the MSWDO on a case-by-case basis for indigent individuals.

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6. **Adjustment of Fees:** The above professional fees may be reviewed and adjusted annually by the Chief of Hospital in consultation with the Sangguniang Bayan, depending on current DOH guidelines and prevailing local conditions.

SECTION 6-A. OUTPATIENT SERVICES

To promote preventive care, early disease detection, and accessible primary healthcare, the Barugo Municipal Infirmery shall continuously provide outpatient services to all individuals seeking medical consultation, including both residents and non-residents of Barugo.

1. Scope of Outpatient Services

The following services shall be offered under the outpatient program:

- General medical consultations
- Minor surgical procedures (e.g., wound dressing, suturing)
- Family planning and reproductive health consultations
- Child and maternal care (e.g., immunizations, prenatal checkups)
- Non-emergency laboratory and diagnostic procedures
- Preventive screenings (e.g., blood pressure monitoring, blood sugar checks)
- Mental health and wellness counseling (subject to personnel availability)

2. Eligibility and Prioritization

- All patients, regardless of residency, may avail of outpatient services.
- Priority shall be given to:
 - Senior Citizens and Persons with Disabilities (PWDs)
 - Pregnant women and children
 - Residents of Barugo and Registered Philhealth Konsulta beneficiaries.

3. Non-Resident and Indigent Non-Resident Patients

- **Non-resident patients** may avail of outpatient services subject to applicable fees. PhilHealth benefits shall be applied first, and the remaining balance shall be paid out-of-pocket.
- **Indigent non-resident patients** may request financial assistance through the Municipal Social Welfare and Development Office (MSWDO), which may evaluate the case for support through the Assistance to Individuals in Crisis Situation (AICS) program or government healthcare assistance, subject to availability of funds.
- In emergency outpatient cases, immediate care shall not be denied due to financial limitations; payment arrangements may be facilitated per Section 7 of this ordinance.

4. Fee Structure and Coverage

- Outpatient services shall follow the service fees outlined in Sections 3 of this ordinance.
- PhilHealth Konsulta Package benefits shall be applied to all registered members.
- Remaining fees may be settled by patients directly or through the AICS program or other government healthcare assistance depending on eligibility and residency status.

5.B Schedule of Outpatient Services

Outpatient services at the Barugo Municipal Infirmery shall be made available daily, but primarily under specific conditions. These include instances when no physician is available at the Rural Health Unit (RHU) between 8:00 AM and 5:00 PM. In such cases, patients may seek outpatient care at the infirmery during these hours.

Additionally, patients who arrive at the Emergency Room (ER) beyond regular hours—after 5:00 PM—shall be attended to regardless of whether their condition is an emergency or non-emergency.

Emergency cases shall be prioritized and given immediate care, while non-emergency cases will still be accommodated and managed appropriately, and also may be scheduled for outpatient consultation at the RHU clinic hours thus ensuring that all patients receive the necessary medical attention.

6. Coordination with the PhilHealth Konsulta Program

- The Barugo Municipal Infirmery shall fully integrate the Konsulta Package into its outpatient services, following PhilHealth Circular No. 2023-0013.
- Patients shall be encouraged to register Barugo Municipal Infirmery as their Konsulta Provider.
- Covered Konsulta services include outpatient consultations, diagnostic exams, health screenings, and essential medicines.

SECTION 6-B. ANIMAL BITE TREATMENT PACKAGE

The Barugo Municipal Infirmery shall offer an Animal Bite Treatment Package covering post-exposure prophylaxis (PEP) and wound care.

PACKAGE INCLUSIONS:

- Wound cleaning and dressing
- Tetanus Toxoid injection (if applicable)
- Rabies vaccination (first to sixth dose, per schedule)
- Rabies Immunoglobulin (RIG), if indicated
- Patient education and documentation

PACKAGE RATE:

CATEGORY	RATE (PHP)
Animal Bite Treatment (Rabies Category II & III)	3,000.00 – 5,850.00 (depending on case classification and vaccine requirement)

Note:

- Fees are subject to PhilHealth deduction.
- Indigent residents of Barugo may avail of financial assistance through the Assistance to Individuals in Crisis Situations (AICS) program, particularly in cases where tetanus toxoid or anti-tetanus serum is unavailable at the infirmery and must be purchased externally. The AICS assistance may be used to cover the remaining costs of the required medication, ensuring that patients receive timely and appropriate treatment.

SECTION 7. EXEMPTIONS AND DISCOUNTS

1. Senior Citizens and Persons with Disabilities (PWDs)

In accordance with Republic Act No. 9994 (Expanded Senior Citizens Act) and Republic Act No. 10754 (Expanding the Benefits and Privileges of PWDs), Senior Citizens and PWDs are entitled to:

- A **20% discount** on applicable fees, medicines, and services.
- **Free hospital services** (including room accommodation, laboratory tests, medicines, and other hospital services) after PhilHealth deductions from the total bill.
- Any remaining hospital bill after PhilHealth deductions will be charged to the Assistance to Individuals in Crisis Situation (AICS) or other government healthcare assistance.

For **non-residents of Barugo**, only the **20% discount** shall apply after PhilHealth deductions.

2. Barugo Municipal Officials and Employees

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Municipal employees and officials, along with their **spouses and unmarried children under 21 years old**, are entitled to:

- **Free hospital services** (including room accommodation, laboratory tests, medicines, and other hospital services) any remaining hospital bill after PhilHealth deductions will be charged to the Assistance to Individuals in Crisis Situation (AICS) or other government healthcare assistance.
- Family members may use the designated room type assigned to the municipal employee or official, subject to availability.

3. Residents of Barugo

Both indigent and non-indigent residents of Barugo are entitled to:

- **Free hospital services** (including room accommodation, laboratory tests, medicines, and other hospital services).
- Any remaining hospital bill after PhilHealth deductions will be charged to the Assistance to Individuals in Crisis Situation (AICS) or other government healthcare assistance.

4. Non-resident indigent individuals may be granted assistance or discounts after Philhealth deductions from the total bill and remaining bill will be charged to Assistance to Individuals in Crisis Situation (AICS) or other government healthcare assistance subject to availability of funds and the approval of the MSWDO.

5. Non-Resident but Not Indigent Individuals: Non-residents who do not qualify as indigent must pay all applicable fees after Philhealth deductions from the total bill for the medical services they receive at the Barugo Municipal Infirmary.

SECTION 8. USE OF REVENUES

All revenues collected from room rates, laboratory services, medicine fees, and other hospital charges shall be allocated solely for the following purposes:

- Payment for hospital operational expenses (e.g., medical supplies, utilities, maintenance of equipment, etc.)
- Improvement and upgrading of hospital facilities, equipment, and services
- Development and implementation of new healthcare programs for the community
- Payment of any legal, regulatory, and accreditation requirements related to hospital operations.
- Hiring and training of medical and support personnel to ensure quality service delivery
- Procurement of essential drugs, vaccines, and emergency medical supplies
- Establishment and maintenance of an efficient patient referral and transport system
- Enhancement of administrative systems, including health information systems and patient records management
- Provision of indigency support or assistance programs for underprivileged patients

SECTION 9. POLICY ON OUTSTANDING BALANCES

1. Issuance of Statement of Account:

- Upon discharge, patients with unpaid bills will be issued a detailed **Statement of Account (SOA)** indicating the total outstanding balance, due dates, and payment instructions.
- All payments shall be made at the LGU Barugo Treasury Office, and an Official Receipt shall be issued accordingly.

2. Payment Arrangements:

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- Patients unable to pay in full may enter into a **Payment Agreement/Promissory Note** with the Municipal Treasurer's Office. The agreement must include a payment schedule and terms.
- 3. **Grace Period:**
 - A 30-day grace period from the date of discharge will be granted for payment or negotiation of terms.
- 4. **Demand for Payment:**
 - If the balance remains unpaid after the grace period, the following steps will be taken:
 - a. A **Notice of Demand** will be issued, giving the patient 15 additional days to settle the balance or renegotiate terms.
 - b. Failure to respond to the notice will result in legal action as authorized by the Municipal Mayor.
- 5. **Access to Services:**
 - Patients with outstanding balances may still access emergency services but will not qualify for elective or non-emergency services until balances are cleared or a new payment plan is agreed upon.

SECTION 10. POLICY ON AFTER-HOURS EMERGENCY ROOM SERVICES FOR NON-RESIDENTS

1. **Payment of Applicable Medical Fees**
 - Non-resident patients seeking emergency medical services during non-office hours are required to pay the applicable medical fees at the time of service.
2. **Collection of Payment and issuance of Temporary Receipt**
 - In the absence of Treasury staff during non-office hours, the Nurse on Duty or Doctor on Duty shall temporarily collect the applicable fees and issue a **Temporary Receipt**.
3. **Provision of Official Receipt**
 - Patients or their representatives shall be advised to settle the amount officially at the **LGU Barugo Treasury Office** during office hours, where they will be issued an **Official Receipt**.

This policy ensures that non-resident patients receive necessary emergency care promptly while maintaining proper financial and administrative procedures.

SECTION 11. PROVISION FOR UNAVAILABLE MEDICINES AND SUPPLIES

In cases where specific medicines or medical supplies are unavailable at the Barugo Municipal Infirmary, patients or their guardians shall be responsible for procuring the necessary items from external sources. To ensure the accuracy and appropriateness of the items, the infirmary staff shall provide a prescription or a list of required supplies.

For indigent patients who are financially unable to purchase the prescribed medicines or supplies, assistance may be sought from the Municipal Social Welfare and Development Office (MSWDO). This provision helps ensure that no patient is deprived of necessary care due to financial constraints, in line with the ordinance's objective of delivering accessible and quality healthcare services to all members of the community.

SECTION 12. MONITORING AND REVIEW

The Municipal Health Officer, together with the Hospital Management Team, shall conduct an annual review of the rates and fees to ensure they remain in line with the hospital's operational and financial needs. The Sangguniang Bayan shall review and, if necessary, amend the fees based on recommendations from the Municipal Health Office and Barugo Municipal Infirmary.

SECTION 13. IMPLEMENTING RULES AND REGULATIONS

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The Municipal Health Officer and the Barugo Municipal Chief of Hospital, in coordination with the Municipal Treasurer's Office, shall issue the necessary rules and regulations for the proper implementation of this ordinance.

SECTION 14. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE

If any provision of this ordinance is found to be unconstitutional, inconsistent or parts thereof in conflict, are hereby repealed, amended or modified accordingly.

SECTION 15. EFFECTIVITY

This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its approval and posting in conspicuous public places within the municipality.

RESOLVED FURTHER, to furnish copies of this Ordinance to Dr. Jakko Jake Dublado, Chief of Hospital and to Mr. Roderick L. Balais, Chief Nurse Designate, Barugo, Leyte for their information and guidance.


