**COMMITTEE ON HEALTH and SANITATION**

**COMMITTEE REPORT NO. 13**

Referred to this committee on May 27, 2025 were two proposed Provincial Ordinances:

1. **AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE LEYTE HEALTH ACADEMY, DEFINING ITS GOALS AND OBJECTIVES, AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS NEEDED THEREFORE AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES;**
2. **AN ORDINANCE CREATING THE LEYTE PROVINCIAL COUNCIL FOR THE PREVENTION, CONTROL, RISK REDUCTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF SEXUALLY TRANSMITTED INFECTIONS (STI), HUMAN IMMUNODEFICIENCY VIRUS (HIV), AND ACQUIRED IMMUNE DEFICIENCY SYNDROME (AIDS), AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.**

The Leyte Health Academy is envisioned to be a provincial center dedicated to enhancing the competencies of health professionals, community health workers, and other allied personnel. The measure addresses the gap in sustained, localized health capacity building, ensuring a pool of well-trained health workers capable of responding to the evolving needs of Leyte’s population. Its primary goals include:

- \* Providing continuing education and training in health service delivery.
- \* Upgrading skills in primary health care, emergency response, and specialized medical services.
- \* Supporting the implementation of Universal Health Care (UHC) in the province.

The proposed ordinance creating the Leyte Provincial Council for the Prevention, Control, Risk Reduction, and Management of STI, HIV, and AIDS as the lead policy-making and coordinating body at the provincial level, is in line with Republic Act No. 11166 or the “Philippine HIV and AIDS Policy Act”. While national policies and programs exist, there is a pressing need to establish a localized, multi-sectoral, and coordinated approach to prevention, control, risk reduction, and management to effectively respond to the health, social, and economic challenges brought about by these diseases. Upon consultation with the Provincial Health Office, through the Focal Person, Ms. Kimberly Alvero, instead of the ordinance being just the creation of the Council, it will now be,

**AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING INTERVENTIONS FOR THE PREVENTION, CONTROL, RISK REDUCTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF SEXUALLY TRANSMITTED INFECTIONS, HUMAN IMMUNODEFICIENCY VIRUS, AND ACQUIRED IMMUNE DEFICIENCY SYNDROME, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES, IN THE PROVINCE OF LEYTE.**

The said ordinance seeks to strengthen the province’s public health response to the growing challenge of Sexually Transmitted Infections (STIs), Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV), and Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome (AIDS) through:

- \* Prevention and awareness programs.
- \* Confidential, accessible, and stigma-free testing and treatment.
- \* Support systems for affected individuals and communities.
- \* Risk reduction strategies aligned with national and international best practices.

The Committee reviewed the proposed ordinances and found them consistent with the objectives of Republic Act No. 11223 (Universal Health Care Act) and Republic Act No. 7305 (Magna Carta of Public Health Workers) and Republic Act No. 11166 (Philippine HIV and AIDS Policy Act) respectively.

Consultations with the Provincial Health Office, local health board representatives, and allied medical professionals confirmed the necessity of establishing a provincial training institution to standardize and improve the quality of health services. Inputs emphasized the need for community-based interventions, intensified public education campaigns, and mechanisms to protect the rights and dignity of persons living with HIV (PLHIV).

Both measures are aligned with Governor Carlos Jericho Petilla’s vision of improving access to health services and reducing the shortage of qualified health professionals, contributing to better health outcomes by building local capacity and strengthening the provincial health workforce, and, delivering universally equitable and accessible health care services.

The Committee firmly believes that the establishment of the Leyte Health Academy will significantly upgrade the province’s health service capacity, while the comprehensive STI, HIV, and AIDS prevention ordinance will address urgent public health concerns with a rights-based and evidence-driven approach.

The Committee, therefore, recommends the approval of these Proposed Ordinances:

412 **A RESOLUTION ENACTING ON THIRD AND FINAL READING, PROVINCIAL ORDINANCE NO. 2025-06,**  
413 **ENTITLED: "AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE LEYTE HEALTH ACADEMY (LHA), DEFINING ITS FUNCTIONS,**  
414 **OBJECTIVES, AND FUNDING SOURCES, AND PROVIDING FOR ITS IMPLEMENTATION AND SUSTAINABILITY."**

415 **WHEREAS**, Article XIV, Section 1 of the 1987 Philippine Constitution provides that the state shall  
416 protect, and promote the right of all citizens to quality education at all levels, and shall take appropriate  
417 steps to make such education accessible to all;

418 **WHEREAS**, education is accorded with paramount importance towards the development of the  
419 human resource of the province in particular, and the country at large;

420 **WHEREAS**, the Province of Leyte recognizes the growing demand for a skilled and certified  
421 healthcare workforce to address the increasing complexity of health issues within the province;

422 **WHEREAS**, the Province of Leyte also recognizes the critical need for a well-trained and certified  
423 healthcare workforce to address the complex health challenges faced by its communities;

424 **WHEREAS**, the Leyte Health Academy (LHA) is envisioned as a premier institution for healthcare  
425 education, vocational training, capacity development, and health research, aiming to enhance health  
426 services and public health outcomes, with the primary goal of enhancing the capacity and  
427 competencies of health workers across Leyte;



- 472 2. **Executive Director:** An Executive Director shall oversee the daily operations of the  
473 Academy, appointed by the Governor.  
474 3. **Advisory Council:** An Advisory Council, composed of representatives from DOH, TESDA,  
475 local hospitals, and academic institutions, shall provide strategic guidance.

476 **Section 6. Funding and Budget Allocation.** The LHA's establishment budget shall be sourced from  
477 provincial funds, grants from TESDA, DOH, and other national agencies, and private sector donations.

478 **Section 7. Facilities and Infrastructure**

479 LHA shall include the following:

- 480 1. Training facilities for BHS NC II, EMS NC II, and Pharmacy Assistant courses, Healthcare  
481 Services;  
482 2. Simulation laboratories, pharmacy practice areas, and classrooms equipped with modern  
483 tools and equipment;  
484 3. Administrative offices, research hubs, and resource centers;  
485 4. Dormitories and support facilities for trainers and trainees as needed.

486 **Section 8. Monitoring and Evaluation**

- 487 1. **Quarterly Reviews:** The LHA Board of Directors shall conduct quarterly reviews to assess  
488 performance and progress.  
489 2. **Trainee Assessments:** Graduates shall undergo TESDA National Competency Assessments  
490 to ensure they meet national standards.  
491 3. **Feedback Mechanism:** A feedback system shall be implemented for continuous  
492 improvement of training programs.

493 **Section 9. Sustainability Mechanisms**

494 To ensure long-term sustainability, LHA shall:

- 495 1. Establish partnerships with hospitals and private institutions for funding and employment  
496 pipelines;  
497 2. Offer CPD programs for professionals to generate additional revenue;  
498 3. Engage in research projects funded by external grants and donors.

499 **Section 10. Separability Clause**

500 If for any reason, any section of this Ordinance shall be held unconstitutional or invalid, other sections  
501 which are not affected thereby shall continue to be in full force or in effect.

502 **Section 11. Repealing Clause**

503 All ordinances, rules and regulations as parts thereof that are inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby  
504 repealed, modified or amended accordingly.

505 **Section 12. Effectivity**

506 This Ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days after its publication in a newspaper of general circulation  
507 in the Province of Leyte.

509 Philippines.

618 **WHEREAS**, Section 11, Article II of the 1987 Constitution provides that "the State values the dignity  
619 of every human person and guarantees full respect for human rights;"

620 **WHEREAS**, Section 15, Article II of the Constitution provides that "the State shall protect and  
621 promote the right to health of the people and instill health consciousness among them;

622 **WHEREAS**, Section 11, Article XIII of the Constitution, declares that, "the State shall adopt an  
623 integrated and comprehensive approach to health development which shall endeavor to make  
624 essential goods, health, and other social services available to all people at affordable cost;"

625 **WHEREAS**, Section 16, the General Welfare Clause of Republic Act 7160, otherwise known as the  
626 Local Government Code of 1991, mandates all Local Government Units (LGUs) to exercise the powers  
627 expressly granted, those necessarily implied, and those necessary, appropriate, or incidental for the  
628 promotion of the general welfare, particularly to:

- 629 • Enhance the well-being and quality of life of their constituents;
- 630 • Ensure the provision of basic services, including health and social services; and
- 631 • Promote health and safety, enhance prosperity, and improve public morals, among others;

642 **WHEREAS**, pursuant to Republic Act No. 11166, otherwise known as "An Act Strengthening The  
643 Philippine Comprehensive Policy on Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV) and Acquired Immune  
644 Deficiency Syndrome (AIDS) Prevention, Treatment, Care, and Support, and Reconstituting The  
645 Philippine National AIDS Council, And Appropriating Funds Therefor", provides for a comprehensive,  
646 rights-based, and community-led response to the prevention, treatment, care, and support for HIV and  
647 AIDS, and mandates local government units to develop and implement relevant programs;  
648

649 **WHEREAS**, the Department of Health (DOH) has identified Sexually Transmitted Infections (STIs),  
650 including Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV) and Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome (AIDS), as  
651 significant public health concerns requiring sustained prevention, control, and treatment interventions;  
652

653 **WHEREAS**, in line with this mandate, it is the duty of the Leyte Provincial Government to safeguard  
654 its constituents from public health risks, including the growing threat of Sexually Transmitted Infections  
655 (STIs), Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV), and Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome (AIDS);  
656

657 **WHEREAS**, the Provincial Government of Leyte, in collaboration with national agencies, local  
658 government units, civil society organizations, and the private sector, is committed to establishing  
659 sustainable programs and mechanisms that address STIs, HIV, and AIDS in an integrated and holistic  
660 manner;

662 **WHEREAS**, the enactment of a Provincial Ordinance shall institutionalize these interventions,  
663 ensure continuity of programs, and provide the legal framework for their effective implementation in  
664 the Province of Leyte.

687 Be it enacted by the Sangguniang Panlalawigan of Leyte in session assembled:  
688

689 **Section 1. Short Title.** This Ordinance shall be known as the "Leyte STI, HIV, and AIDS Prevention and  
690 Management Ordinance or the Leyte SHARE (STI, HIV, and AIDS Risk Reduction and Education)  
691 Ordinance".  
692

693 **Section 2. Scope.** This ordinance shall apply to all inhabitants within the territorial jurisdiction of the  
694 Province of Leyte.  
695

696 **Section 3. Definition of Terms.** As used in this Ordinance, the following terms are defined as follows:  
697

- 698 a. **Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome (AIDS)** refers to a condition characterized by a  
699 combination of signs and symptoms, caused by HIV contracted from another person which  
700 attacks and weakens the body's immune system, making the afflicted individual susceptible to  
701 other life-threatening infections;  
702
- 703 b. **AIDS Medium Term Plan (AMTP)** refers to the Philippines' strategic framework to address the  
704 country's growing HIV/AIDS epidemic. The plan is formulated by the Philippine National AIDS  
705 Council (PNAC) in partnership with government agencies, civil society, and international

- 706 organizations. The AMTP provides a roadmap for implementing comprehensive and  
707 multisectoral HIV/AIDS responses across the country over a defined period, usually five years.  
708
- 709 c. **Compulsory HIV Testing** refers to HIV testing imposed upon a person attended or characterized  
710 by lack of consent, use of physical force, intimidation or any form of compulsion;  
711
- 712 d. **Contact Tracing** refers to the method of finding and counselling the sexual partner(s) of a person  
713 who has been diagnosed of as having sexually transmitted infection;  
714
- 715 e. **Entertainer** refers to a person who is employed in the entertainment establishment and renders  
716 establishment service to customers. Entertainers include GROs, dancers, masseurs, cocktail  
717 waiters and waitresses and other similar occupation;  
718
- 719 f. **Entertainment Establishments** refers to business establishments which include but are not limited  
720 to the following: bars, night clubs, disco houses, beer houses, cocktail lounges, massage clinics,  
721 karaoke bars/sing along pub houses, hotels, motels, lodging houses, saunas, and other similar  
722 establishments wherein the services of hired entertainers are employed and patrons are  
723 entertained and thus, secured a permit to operate within the municipality;  
724
- 725 g. **HIV Transmission** refers to the transfer of HIV from one infected person to an uninfected  
726 individual, most commonly through sexual intercourse, blood transfusion, sharing of intravenous  
727 needles and during pregnancy;  
728
- 729 h. **Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV)** refers to the virus which causes AIDS;  
730
- 731 i. **Informed Consent** refers to the voluntary agreement of a person to undergo or be subjected to  
732 a procedure based on full information, whether such permission is written, and/or conveyed  
733 verbally;  
734
- 735 j. Key Population include the following:  
736
- 737 1. **Males having Sex with other Males (MSM)** refers to all men who engage in sexual and/or  
738 romantic relations with other men;
  - 739 2. **Transgender having Sex with other Males (TSM)** refers to people who have a gender identity  
740 or gender expression that differs from their assigned sex at birth and who engage in sexual  
741 and/or romantic relations with men;
  - 742 3. **Transactional Sex Workers (TSW)** is defined as persons who in exchange of money, favors, or  
743 gifts engage in sexual and/or romantic relations;
  - 744 4. **Injecting Drug Users** refers to persons who undergo the method of illicit drug use. The drugs  
745 are injected directly into the body, into a vein, into a muscle, or under the skin with a needle  
746 and syringe. Blood-borne viruses, including HIV and hepatitis, can be transmitted via shared  
747 needles or other drug injection equipment;
  - 748 5. **Young Key Population** refers to children (below 18 years old) and adolescents (18-24 years  
749 old);
  - 750 6. **Overseas Filipino Workers (OFWs) or Migrant Workers** refers to persons who are to be  
751 engaged, are engaged, or have been engaged in a remunerated activity in a state of  
752 which they are citizens or on board a vessel navigating the foreign seas other than a  
753 government ship used for military or noncommercial purposes, or on an installation located  
754 offshore or on high seas. "Persons to be engaged in a remunerated activity" refers to  
755 applicant workers who have been promised or assumed employment overseas;
  - 756 7. Pregnant Women;
  - 757 8. TB Patient;
  - 758 9. Persons Deprived of Liberty or PDLs
- 759 k. **Medical Confidentiality** refers to the relationship of trust and confidence created or existing  
760 between a patient or a person with HIV and his attending physician, consulting medical  
761  
762  
763  
764  
765  
766  
767  
768  
769

- 770 specialist, nurse, medical technologist and all other health workers or personnel involved in any  
 771 counseling, testing or professional care of the former; it also applies to any person who, in any  
 772 official capacity, has acquired or may have acquired such confidential information;  
 773  
 774 l. **Peer Educators (PE)** refer to the volunteers from the community who have knowledge, skills and  
 775 dedication to educate others about STI, HIV and AIDS and safer sex practices;  
 776  
 777 m. **Person Living with HIV (PLHIV)** refers to person with HIV infection;  
 778  
 779 n. **Ports of Entry or Exit** refer to a place where people or goods may lawfully enter or exit the  
 780 province;  
 781  
 782 o. **Post-Test Counselling** refers to the process of providing risk reduction information and emotional  
 783 support to a person who submitted to HIV testing at the time that the test result is released;  
 784  
 785 p. **Pre-Test Counselling** refers to the process of providing an individual information on the  
 786 biomedical aspects of HIV/AIDS and emotional support to any psychological implications of  
 787 undergoing HIV testing and the test result itself before he/she is subjected to the test;  
 788  
 789 q. **Prophylactic** shall mean any of the agent or device used to prevent the transmission of a disease  
 790 (e.g. condom);  
 791  
 792 r. **Sexually Transmitted Infections (STIs)** refers to diseases acquired from sexual contact, such as  
 793 but not limited to gonorrhoea, syphilis, trichomoniasis, chlamydia, genital herpes, genital warts,  
 794 hepatitis B, bacterial vaginosis, scabies, pubic lice, HIV and AIDS;  
 795  
 796 s. **Voluntary HIV Testing** refers to HIV testing done on an individual who, after having undergone  
 797 pre-test counselling, willingly submits himself/herself to such test.  
 798

799 **Section 4. The Council.** There is hereby created the Leyte Provincial Council for the Prevention, Control,  
 800 Risk Reduction, and Management of Sexually Transmitted Infections (STI), Human Immunodeficiency  
 801 Virus (HIV), and Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome (AIDS), hereinafter referred to as the Leyte  
 802 SHARE (STI, HIV, and AIDS Risk Reduction and Education) Council for brevity, along with its Technical  
 803 Working Group. The Leyte SHARE Council shall be responsible for overseeing the effective  
 804 implementation of this Ordinance, ensuring that all programs, projects, and initiatives are aligned with  
 805 the goals of prevention, control, risk reduction, and management of STIs, HIV, and AIDS within the  
 806 Province of Leyte.  
 807

808 **Section 5. Purpose.** The Council is hereby created to serve as the central advisory, planning, and  
 809 policymaking body tasked with the following responsibilities:  
 810

- 811 a. Lead the prevention, control, risk reduction, and management of Sexually Transmitted Infections  
 812 (STI), Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV), and Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome (AIDS)  
 813 within the Province of Leyte;  
 814  
 815 b. Define the specific functions and responsibilities of the Council and its Technical Working Group,  
 816 ensuring a coordinated and efficient response to STI, HIV, and AIDS-related challenges;  
 817  
 818 c. Provide comprehensive responses through the development and implementation of programs,  
 819 projects, and other related initiatives aimed at addressing STI, HIV, and AIDS prevention, control,  
 820 risk reduction, and management;  
 821  
 822 d. Offer technical assistance and capacity-building to Local AIDS Councils in the component  
 823 municipalities and cities of Leyte, ensuring they have the resources and expertise to address  
 824 local STI, HIV, and AIDS concerns;  
 825  
 826 e. Ensure the establishment of Local SHARE Councils in all municipalities and component cities in  
 827 the Province of Leyte, promoting a uniform and localized approach to STI, HIV, and AIDS  
 828 prevention and management.  
 829  
 830

831 **Section 6. Composition.** The Leyte SHARE Council shall be composed of the following:  
 832

- 833 a. Chairperson – Provincial Governor

- 834 b. Vice-Chairperson – Sangguniang Panlalawigan Committee Chairperson on Health and

 836 c. Members shall be composed of the following or their authorized permanent representative or  
 837 alternate:

 839 1. Provincial Health Officer  
 840 2. HIV/AIDS Core Team Chairperson from the Treatment Hubs under the Province of Leyte  
 841 3. Provincial Social Welfare and Development Officer;  
 842 4. Provincial Population Officer;  
 843 5. DILG Provincial Director  
 844 6. DOH Representative  
 845 7. DepEd Representative  
 846 8. CHED Representative  
 847 9. PNP Representative  
 848 10. Representative from Faith-based Organization  
 849 11. Representative from NGOs/ POs working with groups vulnerable or most at risk for  
 850 HIV/Development Partner  
 851 12. Representative from LGBT Community  
 852 13. Representative from an Organization of PLHIV  
 853 14. Representative from Youth Organizations in the Province of Leyte  
 854 15. Representative from Women’s Organizations in the Province of Leyte

856 The members of the Council must inform the Secretariat of any changes pertaining to their  
 857 authorized permanent representative and/or alternate.  
 858

859 Membership may be increased by the Sangguniang Panlalawigan upon the recommendation  
 860 of the Leyte SHARE Council.  
 861

862 **Section 7. Powers and Functions.** The Leyte SHARE Council shall have the following powers and functions:  
 863

- 864 a. Formulate policies, strategies, and implementing rules and regulations consistent with Republic  
 865 Act No. 11166, for the prevention, control, risk reduction, and management of STIs, HIV, and AIDS  
 866 in the Province of Leyte;  
 867  
 868 b. Prepare multi-sectoral plans and strategies aligned with the AIDS Medium Term Plan (AMTP) for  
 869 the prevention, control, risk reduction, and management STIs, HIV, and AIDS;  
 870  
 871 c. Network, partner, and coordinate with local, national, and international organizations for data  
 872 gathering and program implementation;  
 873  
 874 d. Strengthen working relationships and coordinate activities between government agencies and  
 875 non-government organizations (NGOs) involved in the campaign against HIV and AIDS;  
 876  
 877 e. Mobilize resources, foster collaboration and convergence among government agencies,  
 878 NGOs, and other stakeholders involved in the prevention, control, risk reduction, and  
 879 management of STIs, HIV, and AIDS;  
 880  
 881 f. Determine methods to control the prevalence of STIs and identify potential sources of infection  
 882 within the province;  
 883  
 884 g. Develop strategies and provide skills training programs targeted at populations most at risk for  
 885 STIs, HIV, and AIDS;  
 886  
 887 h. Identify gaps in program coordination and policy guidelines, and recommend to the  
 888 Sangguniang Panlalawigan the enactment of ordinances to enhance the prevention, control,  
 889 risk reduction, and management of STIs, HIV, and AIDS;  
 890  
 891 i. Promote and conduct information, education, and communication (IEC) campaigns on STI, HIV,  
 892 and AIDS prevention, control, risk reduction and management, ensuring that key populations  
 893 are adequately informed and reached;  
 894  
 895 j. Develop an annual STI, HIV, and AIDS prevention, control, risk reduction, and management plan;  
 896

- 897 k. Continuously monitor and evaluate the effectiveness of the SHARE Program in the province, and  
 898 provide recommendations for the optimal mobilization and utilization of resources to maximize  
 899 the program's impacts and outcomes;  
 900
- 901 l. Initiate skills development, capability-building, and advocacy programs that benefit key  
 902 populations, while developing innovative strategies to improve public health outcomes;  
 903
- 904 m. Recommend to the Sangguniang Panlalawigan the enactment of additional ordinances that  
 905 support the prevention, control, risk reduction, and management of STIs, HIV, and AIDS;  
 906
- 907 n. Assist in sourcing funds, requesting funding, and recommending the allocation of resources to  
 908 ensure the availability of medications, medical services, and treatment facilities as provided by  
 909 of this Ordinance;  
 910
- 911 o. Establish the Technical Working Group, define its composition, and outline its specific powers  
 912 and functions; and  
 913
- 914 p. Perform all other tasks and functions necessary to achieve the overall objective for the  
 915 prevention, control, risk reduction, and management of STIs, HIV, and AIDS in the Province of  
 916 Leyte.  
 917

918 **Section 8. Structure.** The SHARE Council shall be divided into three (3) committees performing specific  
 919 roles as follows:  
 920

921 8.1 Committee on Information, Education, and Communication  
 922

- 923 a. Initiate skills training and advocacy programs and develop strategies to benefit people at  
 924 risk of STI/HIV/AIDS and other stakeholders;  
 925
- 926 b. Conduct regular seminars on STI/HIV/AIDS in all educational institutions and produce  
 927 relevant modules or education materials;  
 928
- 929 c. Ensure the conduct of education and information activities on Reproductive Health in the  
 930 private sector, NGOs, and the general public;  
 931
- 932 d. Design, produce, mobilize and distribute IEC (information, education, and communication)  
 933 materials on STI/HIV/AIDS;  
 934
- 935 e. Compulsory STI/HIV/AIDS education in key populations;  
 936
- 937 f. Universal access to STI healthcare;  
 938
- 939 g. Develop communication/s plan for the Leyte SHARE Council; and  
 940
- 941 h. Network and coordinate with the media, church-based organizations and other services.  
 942

943 8.2 Committee on Surveillance, and Monitoring  
 944

- 945 a. Implement, monitor, and evaluate STI/HIV/AIDS prevention policies:  
 946
- 947 b. Prepare short term, medium term, and long-term plans for STI/HIV/AIDS prevention, control,  
 948 risk reduction and management;  
 949
- 950 c. Monitor compliance with existing municipal and city ordinances;  
 951
- 952 d. Recommend the closure of any establishment found in violation of prohibited acts  
 953 mentioned in this Ordinance and the Labor and Sanitation Laws.  
 954

955 8.3 Committee on Care and Support  
 956

- 957 a. Establish Treatment Hubs with HIV/AIDS CORE Team and develop capabilities through  
 958 trainings;  
 959

- 960           b. Community-Based Services – Strengthen knowledge, attitude, skills, and practices of health  
961 workers and develop their capabilities through reorientation and updates.  
962
- 963           c. Social Hygiene and Wellness Clinic – Enhance STI services and management by integrating  
964 comprehensive reproductive health care, and ensure the availability of essential drugs and  
965 medicines for the effective treatment of STI cases.  
966
- 967 **Section 9. Meeting.** The Council shall meet at least once every quarter or as often as may be necessary  
968 by serving the notice to all members at least five working days before the meeting.  
969
- 970 **Section 10. Quorum.** The presence of a simple majority shall constitute a quorum for purposes of doing  
971 business.  
972
- 973 **Section 11. Secretariat.** The Secretariat shall be headed by the Provincial Health Office.  
974
- 975 **Section 12. Functions of the Secretariat.** The Secretariat of the Leyte SHARE Council shall perform the  
976 following duties and functions:  
977
- 978           a. Prepare the agenda for Leyte SHARE Council meetings and accurately record the minutes;  
979
- 980           b. Maintain and safeguard all records of the Leyte SHARE Council;  
981
- 982           c. Collate reports from the member agencies of the Leyte SHARE Council;  
983
- 984           d. Submit an Annual Accomplishment Report;  
985
- 986           e. Issue communication letters to authorized and permanent representatives regarding the  
987 schedule of Leyte SHARE Council meetings; and  
988
- 989           f. Perform other tasks as may be assigned by the Leyte SHARE Council.  
990
- 991 **Section 13. Training of Peer Educators.** All individuals or organizations conducting STI, HIV, and AIDS  
992 education and information activities must undergo seminars or trainings accredited by the Department  
993 of Health (DOH). The DOH, in concurrence with the Leyte SHARE Council, shall certify the competency  
994 of those conducting STI, HIV, and AIDS education.  
995
- 996 **Section 14. Education in Schools.** The Leyte SHARE Council shall encourage the Department of  
997 Education (DepEd) and the Commission on Higher Education (CHED) to integrate STI, HIV, and AIDS  
998 education into the curriculum of public and private schools at the elementary, secondary, and tertiary  
999 levels, respectively. This education should focus on the causes, modes of transmission, and prevention  
1000 methods for STI, HIV, and AIDS. Additionally, this content shall be incorporated into non-formal  
1001 education programs and indigenous learning systems. Family Development Sessions conducted in  
1002 communities shall also include topics related to STI, HIV, and AIDS.  
1003
- 1004 **Section 15. Education in Entertainment Establishments.** Operators and/or managers, entertainers of  
1005 entertainment establishments, and transactional sex workers shall attend seminars on STI, HIV, and AIDS  
1006 prevention and control, conducted by the Municipal Health Office. Additionally, operators and/or  
1007 managers shall be responsible for developing, implementing, and evaluating a workplace STI, HIV, and  
1008 AIDS education and information program for all entertainers and identified transactional sex workers  
1009 who frequent their establishments.  
1010
- 1011 **Section 16. Education in Other Workplaces.** Pursuant to Department Order No. 102-10, Series of 2010 of  
1012 the Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE) and Announcement No. 21 Series of 2010 of the  
1013 Commission of Civil Service, STI, HIV and AIDS education shall be integrated in the orientation, training,  
1014 continuing education and other human resource development programs of employees and employers  
1015 in the government and private offices. Employers shall develop, implement, and evaluate a workplace  
1016 STI, HIV and AIDS education and information program for all their workers.  
1017
- 1018 **Section 17. Education in the Communities.** Local government units through their health, social welfare,  
1019 and population offices shall undertake an STI, HIV and AIDS education and information programs in their  
1020 communities in coordination with non-government organizations and civil society groups.  
1021
- 1022 **Section 18. Information for Tourists and Transients.** Adequate information materials for STI, HIV, and AIDS  
1023 shall be made available in all forms (printed, television, social media)

1024 **Section 19. Information Dissemination as Health Service.** STI, HIV, and AIDS education shall be included  
1025 in the services provided by health workers in both the government and private sectors. Information  
1026 dissemination shall cover HIV-related ethical issues, including confidentiality, informed consent, and the  
1027 duty to provide treatment.  
1028

1029 **Section 20. Mass Media.** The Leyte SHARE Council shall conduct information dissemination through mass  
1030 media, social media, and other platforms, leveraging advancements in information and  
1031 communication technology (ICT). This will be done in partnership with the Philippine Information Agency  
1032 (PIA) and Provincial Public Information Officer, as well as media organizations and establishments within  
1033 the province.  
1034

1035 **Section 21. Promotion of Prophylactics and Information Materials for Prevention.** To prevent STI, HIV, and  
1036 AIDS infections, all entertainment establishments are required to provide accessible prophylactics (e.g.,  
1037 condoms) and informational materials on STI, HIV, and AIDS prevention and control within their premises.  
1038 Establishments must also offer guidance on the correct and consistent use of these prophylactics.  
1039 Posters containing this information shall be prominently displayed, especially in comfort rooms and  
1040 dressing rooms.  
1041

1042 **Section 22. Compilation of Roster of Entertainers/Employees in Entertainment Establishments.** The  
1043 Municipal Health Office of respective Local Government Units shall maintain a roster of  
1044 entertainers/employees indicating their age and place of employment. In relation thereto, all operators  
1045 and/or managers of entertainment establishments shall submit to their respective Municipal Health  
1046 Office a monthly updated list (or any time a new employee is hired) of their employees.  
1047

1048 **Section 23. Regular STI Screening and HIV Testing for Entertainers, Transactional Sex Workers and Others  
1049 with Similar Occupations.** All entertainers, transactional sex workers and others with similar occupations  
1050 shall be encouraged to undergo voluntary medical checkup (gram staining) once a month, or as  
1051 frequent as necessary at the Social Hygiene and Wellness Clinic in their respective Municipal Health  
1052 Office and secure a health certificate as requirement for work.  
1053

1054 **Section 24. Declaration of AIDS Awareness Month.** The month of December, recognized as World AIDS  
1055 Prevention Month, is hereby declared AIDS Awareness Month in the Province of Leyte. The Leyte SHARE  
1056 Council shall lead the advocacy programs during December and ensure that adequate funds for these  
1057 events are appropriated, allocated, or sourced.  
1058

1059 **Section 25. Social Hygiene And Wellness Clinic.** The Leyte SHARE Council encourages the establishment  
1060 of a Social Hygiene and Wellness Clinic in every Municipal Health Office to serve as a frontline facility  
1061 for STI, HIV, and AIDS prevention and control. The Provincial Government shall strengthen these clinics  
1062 by providing adequate technical and logistical support, facilities, and funding.  
1063

1064 **Section 26. Precautions Against HIV Transmission.** The principles and guidelines to protect any person  
1065 from HIV transmission and precautionary measures on the donation of blood, tissue or organ; during  
1066 surgical, dental, embalming, tattooing or similar procedures; and on the handling and disposition of  
1067 cadavers, body fluids or wastes of persons known or believed to be HIV-positive, as mandated in  
1068 Republic Act 11166 shall be strictly observed.  
1069

1070 **Section 27. Screening, Testing, and Counseling**

- 1071 a. HIV Testing. The Province adheres to the policy of voluntary HIV testing. Written consent  
1072 from the person taking the test must be obtained before taking the test.  
1073
- 1074 b. Prohibitions on Compulsory HIV Testing. Compulsory HIV testing as a precondition to  
1075 employment, admission to educational institutions, the exercise of freedom of abode, entry  
1076 or continued stay in the country, or the right to travel, the provision of medical service or any  
1077 other kind of service, or the continued enjoyment of said undertakings shall be deemed  
1078 unlawful.  
1079
- 1080 c. Conditions for voluntary HIV testing and exceptions to compulsory HIV testing, as provided  
1081 in Article IV of Republic Act No. 11166, shall be strictly observed.  
1082
- 1083 d. The Social Hygiene and Wellness Clinics and HIV testing centers shall guarantee anonymity  
1084 and medical confidentiality in the conduct of the HIV test.  
1085

- 1086 e. Provider-Initiated and Client Initiated HIV Counseling and Testing. All HIV Testing Facilities  
1087 shall provide free Pre-test and Post-test HIV Counseling to individuals who wish to avail of HIV  
1088 Testing.  
1089
- 1090 **Section 28. Access to Services.** Persons with STI, HIV, and AIDS shall have access to basic health and  
1091 support services through the community and hospital-based programs without prejudice to optimum  
1092 medical care which may be provided by special AIDS wards and hospitals.  
1093
- 1094 **Section 29. Partner Notification.** Any person with HIV is obliged to disclose his/her status and health  
1095 condition to his/her spouse or sexual partner at the earliest opportune time.  
1096
- 1097 **Section 30. Ethics of Care.** Health workers providing services, examinations, and education to clients  
1098 shall adhere to the basic principles of the ethics of care. They must also be sensitive to gender and  
1099 sexual orientation in their treatment of patients, ensuring that individuals are informed of their rights,  
1100 including the right to file charges for any abuse committed against them.  
1101
- 1102 **Section 31. Livelihood Programs and Trainings.** The Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE) and  
1103 the Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA) are encouraged to conduct  
1104 livelihood, skills enhancement, and organizational development programs, making these opportunities  
1105 accessible to all individuals with HIV/AIDS.  
1106
- 1107 **Section 32. Monitoring and Reporting.** In coordination with the Department of Health, the SHARE Council  
1108 shall establish a comprehensive monitoring program and reporting procedures to track the prevalence  
1109 of STI, HIV, and AIDS across the Province.  
1110
- 1111 **Section 33. Documentation.** The Leyte SHARE Council, in coordination with the Treatment Hubs, shall  
1112 initiate STI, HIV, and AIDS contact tracing activities. The SHARE Council shall monitor and report on all  
1113 related activities.  
1114
- 1115 **Section 34. Handling of Medical Information.** Any person entrusted with medical records or test results  
1116 must strictly observe confidentiality in handling all medical information, especially regarding the identity  
1117 and status of individuals with HIV/AIDS. Exceptions to this confidentiality requirement, as well as  
1118 regulations on the release of HIV/AIDS test results, must strictly adhere to the provisions outlined in Article  
1119 VI of Republic Act No. 11166.  
1120
- 1121 **Section 35. Discriminatory Acts and Policies.** The following are considered discriminatory against a  
1122 person on the basis of actual, perceived or suspected HIV/AIDS status and are considered unlawful:  
1123
- 1124 a) Denial of hiring, promotion, assignment or benefits from employment; and termination of work;
  - 1125
  - 1126 b) Refusal of admission, participation in school activities, benefits and services to a student,  
1127 segregation or expulsion;
  - 1128
  - 1129 c) Abridgment of freedom of abode, lodging and travel, quarantine, isolation, or refusal of lawful  
1130 entry into the Province;
  - 1131
  - 1132 d) Disqualification from an election or appointive office;
  - 1133
  - 1134 e) Exclusion from credit and insurance services including health, accident and life insurance;
  - 1135
  - 1136 f) Refusal of health care services or be charged with a higher fee; and  
1137
  - 1138 g) Denial of decent burial services.  
1139
- 1140 **Section 36. Violations and Penalties.** Any person, group of persons, or establishment found guilty of  
1141 committing any of the following punishable acts shall be subject to the penalties outlined below:  
1142
- 1143 (1) Violation of Section 16 - Education in Entertainment Establishments;
  - 1144
  - 1145 (2) Violation of Section 22 - Promotion of Prophylactics and Information Materials for Prevention;
  - 1146
  - 1147 (3) Violation of Section 29 - Prohibition on Compulsory HIV Testing;
  - 1148
  - 1149 (4) Violation of Section 34 - Ethics of Care;

- 1150  
1151 (5) Violation of Section 39 - Handling of Medical Information; and  
1152  
1153 (6) Any discriminatory acts or policies against a person on the basis of actual, perceived or  
1154 suspected HIV/AIDS status as cited in Section 41;  
1155

1156 The penalties shall be as follows:

- 1157  
1158 (a) On the first offense, a fine of Two Thousand Pesos (P 2,000.00) and/or an imprisonment of one (1)  
1159 month, at the discretion of the court;  
1160  
1161 (b) On the second offense, a fine of Three Thousand Pesos (P 3,000.00) and/or an imprisonment not  
1162 exceeding three (3) months, at the discretion of the court;  
1163  
1164 (c) On the third offense, a fine of Five Thousand Pesos (P 5,000.00) imprisonment of six (6) months,  
1165 and/ or suspension or revocation of business permit and license to operate, at the discretion of  
1166 the court.  
1167

1168 For groups of persons or establishments, the penalties shall be imposed on the president or  
1169 manager in case of a company, corporation or association; the owner, proprietor or operator in case  
1170 of a single proprietorship; or the administrator in case of government property, office or building.  
1171

1172 All fines collected shall be allocated to finance STI, HIV and AIDS programs, projects and campaign  
1173 of the Province.  
1174

1175 **Section 37. Budgetary Requirement.** The operation of the SHARE Council and implementation of this  
1176 Ordinance, to be charged against the appropriations of the Provincial Health Office and/or GAD Fund  
1177 under the Annual Budget, and other sources such as provided by National Government Agencies and  
1178 Developmental Partners.  
1179

1180 **Section 38. Implementing Agencies.** All agencies and offices of the government and private sectors  
1181 shall implement this Ordinance in coordination with the SHARE Council.  
1182

1183 **Section 39. Implementing Rules and Regulations.** The SHARE Council shall, in consultation with relevant  
1184 offices, departments, associations, public agencies, and private organizations and non-government  
1185 organizations, shall formulate the implementing rules and regulations within sixty (60) days from the  
1186 effectivity of this Ordinance.  
1187

1188 **Section 40. Separability Clause.** If for any reason, any section of this Ordinance shall be held  
1189 unconstitutional or invalid, other sections which are not affected thereby shall continue to be in full  
1190 force or in effect.  
1191

1192 **Section 41. Repealing Clause.** All ordinances, rules and regulations as parts thereof that are inconsistent  
1193 with this Ordinance are hereby repealed, modified or amended accordingly.  
1194

1195 **Section 42. Effectivity Clause.** This Ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days after its publication in a  
1196 newspaper of general circulation in the Province of Leyte.  
1197
