



AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING AN ANIMAL BITE TREATMENT CENTER UNDER THE MUNICIPAL HEALTH OFFICE OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF VILLABA PROVINCE OF LEYTE, PROVIDING FUNDS THEREOF AND IMPOSING COLLECTION OF FEES THEREFOR

Prefatory statement





Section 15 Article III of the 1987 Philippine Constitution specifically provides that “the state shall protect the right to health of the people and instill health consciousness among them. Further, Section 16 of the same code mandates that the local government units shall ensure and support the promotion of health and safety of its people.

Rabies is considered a neglected disease of poor and vulnerable populations and remains to be a public problem which is fatal, though preventable through vaccination. It is a human infection that occurs after a transdermal bite or scratch by an infected animal, like dogs and cats. It is transmitted when an infectious material, usually saliva comes into direct contact with a victim’s wounds.

Section 7 of Republic Act No. 9482 also known as the Anti-Rabies Act of 2007, requires LGU’s to enact ordinance that will support the National Rabies and Control Program and allocate funds for implementation.

Rule 6-B of BAI Joint DA, DOH, DepEd, and DILG Administration Order No. 1, series of 2008, focuses on the establishment and operation of their respective Animal Bite Treatment Centers to help in the prevention and eventual eradication of rabies in the country.

The passage of this Ordinance aimed at reducing the public’s risks and deaths caused by rabies, and discourage the traditional practice of treating animal

SECTION 1. TITLE. This Ordinance shall be known as “AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING AN ANIMAL BITE TREATMENT CENTER UNDER THE MUNICIPAL HEALTH OFFICE IN THE MUNICIALITY OF VILLABA, PROVINCE OF LEYTE AND PROVIDING FUNDS THEREOF”

SECTION 2. DEFINITION OF TERMS. As used in this Ordinance the following shall mean:

- a. Animal bite – defined as having one’s skin pierced or abraded by animal’s teeth claws or by any saliva or tissue coming in contact, with abraded skin, eyes or mucus membrane.
- b. Vaccination – the administration of proper anti-rabies vaccine to human bitten by animals.
- c. Trained health personnel – any person who has undergone training in rabies vaccination.
- d. Compensable Cases- these are medical conditions or health services for which PhilHealth provides coverage and reimbursement. The patient must meet certain criteria set by PhilHealth, such as membership status, payment of premiums, and adherence to the guidelines for availing of benefits. Typically includes treatment for illnesses, surgeries, hospital stays, and preventive healthcare measures that are listed in the PhilHealth benefits package. In the table, compensable cases include specific conditions such as CAT II (head and neck) and CAT III, as well as services for indigent patients.
- e. Non-Compensable Cases- these are medical conditions or health services for which PhilHealth does not provide coverage and reimbursement. The reasons for non-compensability may include the treatment or procedure not being included in PhilHealth’s benefits package, the patient not meeting the eligibility criteria, or other specific exclusions outlined by PhilHealth. Patients must pay for these medical services out-of-pocket without financial assistance from PhilHealth.

f. Category of Bites-
Category I

- A. Touching/feeding an animal
- B. Licking of intact skin (with reliable history and thorough physical examination)
- C. Exposure to patient with S/Sx of rabies by sharing of eating or drinking utensils
- D. Casual contact to patient with S/Sx or rabies (talking to, visiting, feeding routine health care delivery)

Category II

- A. Superficial scratch/abrasion without bleeding
- B. Superficial scratch/abrasion that were induced to bleed.
- C. Nibbling of uncovered skin with bruising hematoma

Category III

- A. Transdermal bites or scratches with spontaneous bleeding (to include puncture wounds, lacerations, evulsions)
- B. Exposure to bat bites or scratches
- C. Exposure to a rabies patient through bites, contamination of mucus membranes (eye, oral/nasal genital/anal mucus membranes) or open skin lesions with body fluids through splattering through mouth-mouth resuscitation
- D. Licking of mucus membrane
- E. Licks on broken skin
- F. All category if exposures on head and neck area
- G. Handling of infected carcass or ingestion of raw infected meal

SECTION 3. ESTABLISHMENT OF THE ANIMAL BITE TREATMENT CENTER. The Animal Bite Treatment Center in the Municipality of Villaba, Leyte is hereby established and shall be under the control, supervision and maintenance of the Municipal Health Office.

SECTION 4. FUNCTIONS OF THE CENTER. The Animal Bite Treatment Center shall have the following functions:

- a. Develop plans and programs geared towards the successful implementation of the National Rabies Prevention and Control Program in the Municipality of Villaba, Leyte.
- b. Treat all animals bit-related patients by trained health personnel.
- c. Maintain sufficient anti-rabies vaccine shots to treat patients bitten by rabid animals.
- d. Maintain sufficient anti-tetanus vaccine shots to address concerns in treating bit-related patients.
- e. Strengthen public awareness through information, education and communication campaign against rabies.
- f. Report all cases of animal bites and coordinate with the Municipal Agriculture Office to intensify the promotion of dog vaccination as well as the control of stray animals.
- g. Perform such other functions and duties as may be assigned to it by law, ordinance or through the directive of the Municipal Mayor.

SECTION 5. LOCATION. The Animal Bite Treatment Center shall be located at the Rural Health Unit (RHU), Villaba, Leyte.

SECTION 6. ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE. The Animal Bite Treatment Center shall operate under the Municipal Health Office and be directly supervised and managed by the Municipal Health Officer, who shall lead, recommend and assist in the implementation

of policies and guidelines on all matters pertaining to this Ordinance. Two (2) trained health personnel shall be assigned in the operation of the Center.

SECTION 7. FUNDING AND UTILIZATION. The amount of THREE HUNDRED THOUSAND PESOS (P300,000.00) shall be appropriated from the General Fund as initial funding for the operation of the Animal Bite Treatment Center. Additional funds may be appropriated as may be deemed necessary to sustain the operation of the Center. The fund shall be utilized exclusively for the purpose of implementing the plans and programs of the Center.

SECTION 8. FEES TO BE COLLECTED. A fee shall be collected for every dose of anti-rabies vaccine administered at the Center to be paid at the Municipal Treasurer's Office.

8.1 For every dose of anti-rabies vaccine administered at the Center, the amount of SIX HUNDRED PESOS (P600.00) shall be collected.

8.2 Indigent patients who are residents of Villaba, Leyte may avail of the vaccine thru the Assistance to Individuals in Crisis Situation (AICS) Program of the Municipal Social Welfare and Development Officer (MSWDO) of Villaba, Leyte.

8.3 All fees collected shall accrue to the Trust Fund of the Municipal Health Office which will be utilized for the purchase of anti-rabies vaccines, medical supplies and equipment.

To ensure the sustainability of the Animal Bite Treatment Center operations, the following free structure is established wherein Table 2 outlines the cost structure for various rabies and tetanus prophylaxis and treatment services categorized by different patient cases. The categories include Pre-exposure Prophylaxis, CATEGORY I, CATEGORY II, Compensable Cases (CAT II for head and neck, CAT III, and indigent patients), Non-Compensable Cases (CAT II and CAT III).

1. Pre-exposure Prophylaxis:

Anti-rabies vaccine: P600.00 per dose

2. CAT II:

Anti-rabies vaccine: P600.00 for the 1st dose, free for subsequent doses

Rabies immunoglobulin: P600.00

3. Compensable Cases (CAT II for head and neck, CAT III, and indigent patients)

4. Non-compensable Cases- (CAT II and CAT III)

SECTION 9. OPERATION. The Animal Bite Treatment Center shall operate only upon the issuance of a License to Operate by the Department of Health (DOH).

SECTION 10. IMPLEMENTING RULES AND REGULATIONS. The implementing Rules and Regulations shall be issued by the Municipal Mayor within sixty (60) days upon final consideration and approval of this Ordinance.

SECTION 11. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE. If, for any reason/s any part of provision of this Ordinance shall be held unconstitutional or invalid, other parts of provisions hereof which are not affected thereby shall continue to be in full force and effect.

SECTION 12. REPEALING CLAUSE. All existing ordinance, regulations and executive orders inconsistent with the provisions of the herein ordinance is hereby repealed and/or modified accordingly.

SECTION 13. EFFECTIVITY. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its approval and the completion of its publication requirements.

Being moved for approval by the Hon. Richard Veloso, duly seconded en masse, this ordinance was approved on August 7, 2025.



MINUTES OF THE PUBLIC HEARING CONDUCTED BY THE COMMITTEE ON HEALTH AND SANITATION ON THE PROPOSED ORDINANCE AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING AN ANIMALBITE TREATMENT CENTER UNDER THE MUNICIPAL HEALTH OFFICE OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF VILLABA PROVINCE OF LEYTE AND PROVIDING FUNDS THEREOF AND IMPOSING COLLECTION OF FEES THEREFOR

ON JULY 23, 2025 AT THE SB SESSION HALL

The public hearing commenced at exactly 2:15 in the afternoon, with a prayer and the singing of the Philippine National Anthem.

The hearing was attended by Dr. Oliver B. Razo, Municipal Health Officer; Renato N. Casas, Municipal Agriculturist; Rhoda A. Lacanaria, Municipal Local Government Operations Officer; Ronie S. Romero and Kenneth S. Gabisay, representatives from Liga ng mga Barangay (LNB); Celsa R. Dela Cerna, DILG Staff; and Rhodora Avon C. Ylaya, Local Legislative Staff Officer. The Vice Chairman and a member of the concerned committee of the Sangguniang Bayan were also present, in the persons of the Hon. Randel V. Loon and the Hon. Jamel O. Gonzales, respectively, along with other concerned individuals.

The reading of the entire content of the proposed ordinance transpired and which was followed by a deliberation.

Dr. Oliver B. Razo raised concerns regarding specific parts of Section 2: Definition of Terms, and proposed additional details to be included in the ordinance. On the topic of compensable and non-compensable cases, he emphasized that not all animal bite cases will be covered by PhilHealth. He also noted that the categorization of bite types is addressed in the proposed ordinance.

The Hon. Jamel O. Gonzales inquired whether, in cases where the patient does not meet the criteria for PhilHealth coverage, is the Municipal Social Welfare and Development (MSWD) Office would shoulder the payment through the AICS program, as stated in Section 8 of the ordinance? However, since no MSWD representative present to clarify this matter—and considering that the AICS program funds are allocated for specific purposes—Dr. Razo recommended that the matter must be discussed directly with the MSWD.

The Hon. Jamel also asked about the location of the Animal Bite Treatment Center—whether it would be integrated into the Rural Health Unit (RHU) or established as a separate office? Dr. Razo confirmed that the center will be integrated into the RHU, as operation cannot proceed without accreditation from the Department of Health (DOH). Once accredited, the center can receive its license to operate and enter into a partnership with PhilHealth.

The Hon. Randel V. Loon suggested to specify in the ordinance the types of animal bites to be treated at the center to avoid public confusion. He also recommended including a list of animals known to be rabies carriers.

Mr. Rene Casas commented on the final part of the explanatory note, expressing those traditional methods of treating animal bites should not be entirely discouraged, as there have been reported recoveries. Dr. Razo, however, questioned whether those cases were truly due to animal bites, and emphasized that traditional practices may worsen the condition and do not guarantee proper healing. The Hon. Randel added that traditional remedies were relied upon in the past due to the unavailability of affordable vaccines, but now that vaccines are accessible, traditional treatments can be discouraged.

Ms. Rhoda A. Lacanaria proposed the inclusion of a section specifying the effectivity or the official start of the Animal Bite Treatment Center's operations, to prevent public misunderstanding. She noted that people may question why the center is not yet operational despite the existence of the ordinance. She suggested explicitly stating that the center shall commence operations only after obtaining a license to operate from the DOH, as previously mentioned by Dr. Razo.

She further inquired whether a dedicated space will be provided for the center. Dr. Razo responded that, for now, the RHU will serve as the center's location for the purpose of the DOH license application. If the center is later moved to a new health facility, a new license will need to be applied for, as licenses are site-specific. He emphasized the importance of having the ordinance in place first.

She also asked whether the center would have separate manpower or rely on existing RHU personnel. Dr. Razo stated that ideally, there should be trained personnel specifically assigned to the center, but given the limited number of nurses (currently three), one can be designated to the Animal Bite Treatment Center, while the remaining two continue serving general duties.

Regarding the collection of fees, she noted that in other centers, patients typically receive three to four vaccine doses, with the final dose often administered for free. She asked how this would be addressed, considering the ordinance states that a fee will be collected for each shot.

She also recommended revising Section 8, specifically Section 8.3, to include equipment in addition to supplies, as the ordinance should cover items such as refrigerators needed for proper vaccine storage. Therefore, a budget allocation should be specified for both supplies and equipment.

The Hon. Randel clarified that in some instances, patients pool their money to pay for anti-rabies vaccines. However, if there are no other patients to share the cost, an individual may need to shoulder the full amount. Dr. Razo explained that when there is no available supply of anti-rabies vaccine, patients must procure it themselves. However, if there is an existing supply at the center, the patient will not incur any cost.


Mr. Renato Casas raised a concern regarding the safety of the vaccines to be procured, noting that some pharmacies sell counterfeit vaccine brands. Therefore, even if opting for more affordable vaccines, they should only be purchased from authorized or legitimate suppliers to ensure the safety of those receiving them.

Without further deliberations, the committee hearing adjourned at 3:29 in the afternoon.



FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS:

The Municipal Health officer Dr. Oliver B. Razo manifested the Need for an Accredited Facility it was confirmed that the Animal Bite Treatment Center cannot operate without proper accreditation from the Department of Health (DOH). Accreditation is a key requirement for legality, quality, and for partnerships with agencies such as Philhealth.


For *non-compensable cases*, an amount of 600 pesos per dose will be collected from patients receiving pre-exposure prophylaxis, while *compensable patients*, receive the vaccine for free.

Vaccine supply and safety issues were raised regarding the authenticity and safety of vaccines purchased from unauthorized sources. It was emphasized that all vaccines must come from authorized or legitimate suppliers to ensure public safety.
