167 "An Ordinance Prohibiting the Use of Government-Issued Cash Cards as Collateral or
168 Security for Loans within the Province ofLeyte, and Providing Penalties Therefor. "

169 **I BACKGROUND**

170 Referred to this Joint Committee through SP Resolution No. 2025-469 dated October 7,
171 2025 is the proposed provincial ordinance entitled: "An Ordinance Prohibiting the Use of
172 Government-Issued Cash Cards as Collateral or Security for Loans within the Province
173 ofLeyte, and Providing Penalties Therefor. "

174 The ordinance was proposed with the intent of addressing the increasing practice of using
175 government-issued cash cards, particularly those intended for social welfare and financial
176 assistance programs as collateral for loans extended by both formal and informal lenders.

177 **II. PURPOSE AND POLICY OBJECTIVES**

178 The primary objective of the ordinance is to prohibit and penalize the use of government-
179 issued cash cards as collateral for the procurement of loans. It likewise seeks to:

- 180 1 . Establish enforcement mechanisms at the barangay, municipal, and provincial
181 levels to ensure effective implementation and compliance;
- 182 2 . Promote financial literacy among beneficiaries of government programs; and
- 183 3 . Encourage ethical and lawful lending practices as alternatives to exploitative
184 financial arrangements.

185 By institutionalizing these protective measures, the Province of Leyte affirms its
186 unwavering commitment to inclusive governance, social justice, and the responsible
187 administration of public assistance programs, in furtherance of the general welfare of its
188 people.

189 **III. FINDINGS AND OBSERVATIONS**

190 After careful evaluation and deliberation, the Joint Committee finds that:

- 191 1 . The practice of using government-issued cash cards as loan collateral exposes
192 program beneficiaries to financial exploitation and undermines the intent of public
193 assistance programs;
- 194 2 . The absence of local regulatory measures has allowed such exploitative practices
195 to persist unchecked; and
196
197 3 . The proposed ordinance provides a timely, necessary, and lawful mechanism to
198 safeguard the interests of vulnerable constituents and to ensure the integrity of
199 government financial aid.

200 **IV. CONCLUSION and RECOMMENDATION**

201 In light of the foregoing, the Joint Committee finds that the proposed ordinance is
202 necessary, and beneficial to the general welfare of the people of Leyte. The measure
203 provides clear safeguards against the misuse of public financial assistance, promotes
204 fiscal accountability, and strengthens the Province's commitment to good governance and
205 social justice. Hence, the Committee recommends the approval of the proposed ordinance
206 entitled "An Ordinance Prohibiting the Use of Government-Issued Cash Cards as

207 Collateral or Security for Loans within the Province of Leyte, and Providing Penalties
208 Therefor" for Second Reading.

5 Explanatory Note

6 The practice of pawning or surrendering government-issued Cash Cards—such as those
7 used for 4Ps and social pensions—has become alarmingly prevalent in many communities
8 across Leyte. This exploitative lending behavior undermines the very purpose of social
9 protection programs and places vulnerable individuals at further financial risk.

10 Beneficiaries who pawn their Cash Cards often lose access to essential funds, fall
11 deeper into debt, and become trapped in cycles of dependency. Informal lenders, meanwhile,
12 profit from coercive arrangements that violate the dignity and autonomy of the poor.

13 This ordinance seeks to prohibit and penalize the use of Cash Cards as collateral for
14 loans, whether by formal or informal lenders. It also establishes practical enforcement
15 mechanisms at the barangay, municipal, and provincial levels, and promotes financial
16 literacy and ethical lending alternatives.

17 By institutionalizing this protection, the Province of Leyte affirms its commitment to
18 inclusive governance, social justice, and the responsible stewardship of public assistance
19 programs.

20 **AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE USE OF GOVERNMENT-ISSUED CASH CARDS AS**
21 **COLLATERAL OR SECURITY FOR LOANS WITHIN THE PROVINCE OF LEYTE, AND**
22 **PROVIDING PENALTIES THEREFOR**

26 **WHEREAS**, the Constitution of the Republic of the Philippines guarantees the right of
27 every Filipino to social protection, dignity, and equitable access to public services;

28
29 **WHEREAS**, the Province of Leyte recognizes the importance of government-issued
30 Cash Cards as instruments for delivering financial assistance and social benefits to its
31 constituents, particularly the poor, elderly, and marginalized;

32
33 **WHEREAS**, the practice of pawning, surrendering, or using Cash Cards as collateral
34 for loans has led to widespread financial abuse, loss of access to essential funds, and the
35 erosion of the intended impact of government programs;

36
37 **WHEREAS**, there is an urgent need to protect beneficiaries from coercive lending
38 practices and to promote ethical, transparent, and community-based financial alternatives;

39 **NOW THEREFORE**, be it ordained by the Sangguniang Panlalawigan of Leyte, in
40 session duly assembled, that the use of government-issued Cash Cards as collateral or
41 security for loans is hereby prohibited, and penalties are imposed for violations thereof, in
42 pursuit of financial dignity, social equity, and good governance.

43
44 **Section 1.** Declaration of Policy - The Province of Leyte upholds the financial dignity of
45 its constituents by prohibiting exploitative lending practices involving the use of government-
46 issued Cash Cards as loan collateral. This ordinance aims to safeguard beneficiaries of
47 national and local programs from coercion, financial abuse, and loss of access to essential
48 funds.

49
50 **Section 2.** Coverage - This ordinance shall apply to all cities and municipalities within
51 the territorial jurisdiction of the Province of Leyte.

52 **Section 3.** Definition of Terms

- 53 a. Cash Card — Any ATM, debit, or prepaid card issued by government agencies or LGUs
54 for the disbursement of stipends, allowances, or financial assistance;

- 55 b. Loan Collateral — Any item or instrument pledged to secure payment or repayment of
56 a loan;
- 57 c. Lender — Any person, group, or entity engaged in lending money, whether formal (e.g.,
58 cooperatives, microfinance institutions) or informal (e.g., "5-6" lenders, Unlicensed
59 lenders who operate outside of government regulation).
- 60 d. Beneficiary — Any individual receiving financial assistance through a government-
61 issued Cash Card;
- 62 e. Cash Grants — monetary assistance released to the beneficiaries of assistance
63 programs subject to compliance of certain conditions whenever warranted;
- 64 f. Grievance Redress Process - is a formal mechanism established by the Department of
65 Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) to address complaints, concerns, and
66 feedback from beneficiaries, stakeholders, and the public. It's not just a complaints desk
67 but a system for accountability, policy improvement, and service enhancement.
68

69 **Section 4. Prohibited Acts - It shall be unlawful for any person to:**

- 70 a. Accept or require the surrender of a Cash Card as collateral or security for any loan;
- 71 b. Retain, withhold, or delay the return of a Cash Card used in connection with a loan;
- 72 c. Coerce or influence any cardholder to use their Cash Card to secure a loan.
- 73 d. Offer as collateral or payment security, the beneficiary's ATM or Cash Card;
74

75 **Section 5. Penalties - Violators shall be penalized as follows:**

76 5.1 For Lenders or Creditors

77 First Offense: P2,000 fine and issuance of a written warning; Second
78 Offense: 93,000 fine and 16 hours of community service.

79 Third Offense and Beyond: 95,000 fine and/or imprisonment of up to 30 days, subject to
80 the discretion of the court.

81 Possession of an ATM or Cash Card not his or her own by any person engage in
82 the lending of money shall be considered a prima facie case against the latter. Further,
83 the imposition of the penalties as provided for under this section shall not preclude the
84 filing of such other cases which may have also been violated by the lender financier under
85 such existing national laws as the case may be.

86 5.2 For 4Ps Beneficiaries

87 After due process and in accordance with NAC Resolution No. 20, s. 2014 and
88 MC No. 36, s. 2020, the following sanctions shall apply:

89 First Offense: Written warning and counseling by the Municipal Link or MSWDO;

90 Second Offense: Suspension of cash grants for two (2) months and second written
91 warning from the DSWD Regional Office; Home visit & counseling by
92 the Social Welfare officer;

93 Third Offense: Permanent delisting from the 4Ps program, which shall be non-
94 appealable

95 5.3. For Senior Citizen - Sanctions for senior citizen beneficiaries shall be grounded on
96 Republic Act No. 9994 and relevant DSWD administrative guidelines, which authorize
97 the suspension or removal of beneficiaries found to have misused government-issued
98 Cash Cards or violated program conditions. The Provincial Government shall coordinate
99 with DSWD Field Office Vill to ensure due process and proper documentation.

100 **Section 6. Enforcement** The Provincial Social Welfare and Development Office (PSWDO), in
101 coordination with Municipal/City Social Welfare Offices, barangay officials, and the PNP, shall
102 monitor compliance and receive complaints.
103

104 **Section 7. Implementation Mechanism - To ensure effective enforcement of this ordinance,**
105 **the following mechanisms shall be institutionalized:**

106 7.1. Barangay-Level Monitoring and Reporting

- 107 • Each barangay shall designate a Cash Card Protection Focal Person, preferably
108 the Barangay Secretary or a CSO representative, to monitor and report violations.

- Barangay Councils shall include this ordinance in their monthly sessions and issue Barangay Advisories in Waray-Waray for public awareness.

7.2. CSO and Youth Engagement

e In partnership with Local Social Welfare Office, accredited CSOs and youth organizations shall be tapped to conduct community forums, IEC campaigns, and peer-to-peer education on the risks of Cash Card pawning.

- The Local Social Welfare Office shall include in their budget funding for logistical support to initiatives in partnership with CSOs and youth organizations in the conduct community forums, IEC campaigns, and peer-to-peer education

7.3. LGU Integration

- Municipal and city governments shall pass harmonizing ordinances or resolutions to localize enforcement, designate enforcement teams, and allocate funds.

- MSWDOs shall include Cash Card protection in their regular case monitoring and family development sessions.

7.4. Hotline and Complaint Desk

- The Provincial Government shall establish a Cash Card Protection Hotline and online complaint desk under the PSWDO or Legal Office.

- Complaints may be filed anonymously and shall be acted upon within three (3), Seven (7) and twenty-one (21) days following the grievance redress process;

7.5. Coordination with Financial Institutions

- Banks shall be encouraged to issue reminders and warnings during card issuance and ATM transactions.

- Verbally brief beneficiaries about the prohibited use of Cash Cards as loan collateral o Provide a printed advisory (in the dialect) stating:

- "This card is non-transferable and must not be surrendered or pawned." u

- "Using this card as collateral may result in program suspension or delisting."

7.6. Public Disclosure and Naming

- Repeat violators may be subject to public disclosure through barangay bulletins and municipal advisories, subject to due process.

- A watchlist of exploitative lenders shall be maintained by the PSWDO and shared with LGUs quarterly.

7.7. Annual Review and Impact Assessment

- The Provincial Board shall conduct an annual review of the ordinance's implementation, with inputs from LGUs, CSOs, and beneficiaries.

- A Provincial Impact Report shall be published and presented during the annual CSO Summit or Provincial Development Council meeting.

Section 8. Information Campaign - The Provincial Government through the social welfare office shall conduct province-wide IEC (Information, Education, and Communication) campaigns to inform the public of their rights and the protections afforded by this ordinance.

Section 9. Support Mechanisms - The Province shall encourage LGUs to establish financial literacy programs and promote access to safe, ethical lending alternatives.

Section 10. Separability Clause - If any provision of this ordinance is declared invalid, the remaining provisions shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 11. Effectivity - This ordinance shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication and posting in at least three (3) conspicuous places in the province.

I.BACKGROUND

177

In the exercise of its legislative authority under the Local Government Code of 1991 , and in pursuit of its mandate to promote environmental protection, public safety, and general welfare, the Provincial Government of Leyte deems it necessary to regulate the extraction, hauling, and transport of quarry resources, sand, gravel, and other natural resources within its territorial jurisdiction.

This measure seeks to address the adverse impacts of environmental damage and road safety risks, while ensuring environmental sustainability, maintaining public order, and promoting accountability.

Accordingly, the proposed ordinance prescribes prohibited transport hours, imposes mandatory compliance requirements, including the use of tarpaulin covers, Ore Transport Permits (OTP), and delivery or official receipts and provides appropriate administrative and penal sanctions for violations. It further empowers the Philippine National Police and local enforcement units to implement and monitor compliance.

II. FINDINGS AND OBSERVATIONS

191

After due deliberation and consultation, the Committee finds the proposed measure to be consistent with existing national and provincial laws, rules, and policies on environmental protection and natural resource management.

The Committee further observes that the enactment of the proposed ordinance is both reasonable and imperative to address persistent concerns arising from the unregulated transport of quarry materials, which has often resulted in environmental degradation and road safety hazards.

Moreover, the Committee finds merit in the adoption of time-based transport regulations and mandatory compliance mechanisms, which are expected to facilitate effective monitoring, enhance transparency, and strengthen coordination among concerned local government offices and enforcement agencies.

III.RECOMMENDATION

203

In view of the foregoing premises and considerations, the Committee recommends that the Proposed Provincial Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance Regulating the Transport of Quarry, Sand, Gravel, and Other Natural Resources Within the Territorial Jurisdiction of the Province of Leyte, and for Other Purposes" be certified as urgent.

**AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE TRANSPORT OF QUARRY,
SAND, GRAVEL, AND OTHER NATURAL RESOURCES WITHIN THE
TERRITORIAL JURISDICTION OF THE PROVINCE OF LEYTE AND FOR OTHER
PURPOSES.**

WHEREAS, in the transport of quarry, sand, gravel, and other natural resources within the territorial jurisdiction of the Province of Leyte, environmental protection, the safety of motorists and pedestrians, and accountability are primary considerations and utmost concern.

WHEREAS, every local government unit has the sworn obligation to enact measures that will enhance, among others, the safety and convenience and promote the general prosperity of the inhabitants of the local units.

NOW, THEREFORE, on motion duly seconded, be it.

RESOLVE, as it is hereby resolved, to REGULATE THE TRANSPORT OF QUARRY, SAND, GRAVEL, AND OTHER NATURAL RESOURCES WITHIN THE TERRITORIAL JURISDICTION OF THE PROVINCE OF LEYTE, PRESCRIBING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION THEREOF.

Section 1. PROHIBITIVE TRANSPORT TIME - Except upon application and prior authorization from the Office of the Governor or his duly authorized representative, no person, whether natural or juridical, shall operate an inland transport of quarry, sand, gravel, and other natural resources within the territorial jurisdiction of the Province of Leyte, from 6:00 p.m. up to 8:00 a.m. of the following day.

Section 2. MANDATORY REQUIREMENT - In the conduct of inland transport of quarry, sand, gravel, and other natural resources within the territorial jurisdiction of the Province of Leyte, the following shall be strictly observed, to wit:

- a. All inland transport or hauling of quarry, sand, gravel, and other natural resources shall at all times be covered with tarpaulin, also known as "trapal" or "lona" or other similar material, and;
- b. For sea and land, whether within or going outside the territorial jurisdiction of the Province of Leyte, subject to the application requirement and payment of required fees, the transport of said resources shall, before its departure, be covered by an Ore Transport Permit (OTP) issued by the Office of the Provincial Governor or his duly authorized representative.
- c. Transport of said resources shall at all times be covered by a duly accomplished Delivery Receipt or Official Receipt, as the case may be.

Section 3. PENALTY — Without prejudice to the provisions of the Republic Act No. 7942, otherwise known as the Philippine Mining Act of 1995, Revised Penal Code, and the related laws, rules, regulations, and Ordinances, any person found to be violating this Ordinance in flagrante delicto, shall be meted the following:

- a. FINE not exceeding Five thousand pesos (P5,000.00);

306 b. IMPOUND or CONFISCATE the subject vehicle, including the
307 loaded quarry, sand or gavel, or other natural resources;

308 c. Repetition of similar violation of this Ordinance and after due notice,
309 at the discretion of the Governor, SUSPEND or REVOKE the
310 concerned Quarry, Sand, and Gravel Permit issued by the Provincial
311 Government of Leyte.

312 **Section 4.** Deputization of the PNP — The members of the Leyte Police Provincial
313 Office (LPPO) and/or the concerned Municipal Police Office are hereby deputized to
314 enforce and implement this Ordinance.

315 **Section 5. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE—** Any provision or provisions of this Ordinance
316 declared to be unconstitutional by a competent court, the unaffected portion or portions
317 shall remain valid and shall continue to have the full force and effect of law.

318 **Section 6. REPEALING CLAUSE—** All Ordinances and other issuances inconsistent
319 with this ordinance are hereby amended, modified, or repealed accordingly.

320 **Section 7. EFFECTIVITY -** This Ordinance shall take effect after fifteen
321 (15) days from publication in a newspaper of general circulation.

545 maintains that they are exempted under its franchise law, Republic Act No. 9511. However,
546 Section 9 of the said act states that the grantee and successors that are assigned should be
547 liable to pay taxes on the real estate, buildings, and real property exclusive of the franchise.
548 And the Local Government Code also affirms that the taxing power of LGUs can extend to
549 certain franchises but these are not absolute and they do not necessarily override the
550 provisions of the Local Government Code.

551 So, considering the foregoing, I move to refer the said resolution to the Committee on
552 Rules, Laws and Privileges and the Committee on Ways and Means. I so move.
