

WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 8972 as amended by Republic Act No. 11861, otherwise known as the Expanded Solo Parents Welfare Act, provides benefits and privileges to solo parents and their children;

WHEREAS, it is the policy of the State to promote the family as the foundation of the nation, strengthen its solidarity and ensure its total development;

WHEREAS, Section 14, Article XV of the 1987 Constitution mandates the State to strengthen the family as a basic autonomous social institution;

WHEREAS, Section 16 of the Local Government Code (R.A. 7160) empowers local government units to provide basic services and facilities;

WHEREAS, the Municipality recognizes the unique challenges faced by solo parents in raising their children and the need for comprehensive local support systems;

WHEREAS, there is a need to adopt local implementing guidelines and programs to ensure that the provisions of Republic Act No. 8972 as amended by the provisions of Republic Act No. 11861 are effectively and efficiently carried out in the Municipality of Alangalang;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Sangguniang Bayan of the Municipality of Alangalang, Leyte in session duly assembled:

SECTION 1. TITLE

This Ordinance shall be known as the **"Solo Parents Welfare Implementation Ordinance of 2025"**

SECTION 2. DEFINITION OF TERMS

For purposes of this Ordinance, the following terms shall mean:

Solo Parent – refers to any individual who falls under any of the following categories:

- (a) A woman who gives birth as a result of rape and other crimes against chastity even without a final conviction of the offender;
- (b) Parent left solo or alone with the responsibility of parenthood due to death of spouse;
- (c) Parent left solo or alone with the responsibility of parenthood while the spouse is detained or is serving sentence for a criminal conviction for at least three (3) months;
- (d) Parent left solo or alone with the responsibility of parenthood due to physical and/or mental incapacity of spouse as certified by a public medical practitioner;
- (e) Parent left solo or alone with the responsibility of parenthood due to legal separation or de facto separation from spouse for at least six (6) months, as long as he/she is entrusted with the custody of the children;
- (f) Parent left solo or alone with the responsibility of parenthood due to declaration of nullity of marriage or annulment of marriage, as decreed by a court recognized by law, or due to divorce, subject to existing laws, as long as he/she is entrusted with the sole parental care and support of the child or children;
- (g) Parent left solo or alone with the responsibility of parenthood due to abandonment of spouse for at least six (6) months;
- (h) Unmarried mother/father who has preferred to keep and rear her/his child/children instead of having others care for them or give them up to a welfare institution;

- (i) Any legal guardian, adoptive or foster parent who solely provides parental care and support to a child or children;
- (j) Any relative within the fourth (4th) civil degree of consanguinity or affinity of the parent or legal guardian who assumes parental care and support of the child or children as a result of the death, abandonment, disappearance or absence of the parents or solo parent for at least six (6) months;
- (k) A pregnant woman who provides sole parental care and support to the unborn child or children; and
- (l) Any other person or individual falling under any of the categories of Solo Parent as defined and expanded under the provisions of Republic Act No. 11861.

Solo Parent Identification Card (SPIC) – refers to the identification card issued by the Municipal Social Welfare and Development Office (MSWDO) to qualified solo parents, defined and categorized, as such, under the provisions of Republic Act No. 8972 as amended by Republic Act No. 11861 and, as such, under this Ordinance as well.

Child-Minding Center – refers to a facility or area within the workplace or in accessible locations to the solo parent or workplace of the guardian provided by the employer where the children of a solo parent-employee aged seven [7] years old and below are habitually received for purposes of care and supervision during working hours.

Municipal Social Welfare and Development Office (MSWDO) – refers to the local government department of the Local Government Unit of Alangalang responsible for implementing the provisions of this Ordinance.

Solo Parent Division (SPD) – refers to the Solo Parent Division of the Municipal Social Welfare and Development Office.

Dependent Children – refer to those living with and dependent upon the solo parent for support who are unmarried, unemployed and twenty-two (22) years old or below, or those over twenty-two (22) years old but who are unable to fully take care or protect themselves from abuse, neglect, cruelty, exploitation or discrimination because of a physical or mental disability or condition: *Provided*, that this definition shall only apply for purposes of availing the benefits under Republic Act No. 8972 as amended by Republic Act No. 11861, otherwise known as the Expanded Solo Parents Welfare Act and so too, under this Ordinance.

Spouse – refers to a husband or wife by virtue of a valid marriage or a partner in a common-law relationship as defined under Article 147 of Executive Order No. 209, otherwise known as "The Family Code of the Philippines."

Parental Care and Support – refer to the acts of providing for the basic needs, health care, mental and physical safety, emotional support and formation of the personality of the child.

Flexible Work Schedule – refers to a work arrangement granted to solo parent-employee to vary the arrival and departure time in the workplace without affecting the core work hours as defined by the employer.

Parental Leave – refers to leave benefits granted to a solo parent to enable the performance of parental duties and responsibilities where physical presence is required or beneficial to the child.

IRR – Implementing Rules and Regulations of Republic Act No. 8972 as amended by Republic Act No. 11861, otherwise known as “The Expanded Solo Parents Welfare Act.”

GAD – Gender and Development

SECTION 3. ESTABLISHMENT OF SOLO PARENT DIVISION (SPD)

There shall be established a Solo Parent Division (SPD) under the Municipal Social Welfare and Development Office of the Municipality of Alangalang. The Head of the SPD, who shall be appointed by the Municipal Mayor and shall hold a permanent position with salaries and wages corresponding to at least Salary Grade 10, must possess a Bachelor’s Degree. The SPD of the MSWDO of the Municipality of Alangalang, which shall have at least one (1) Staff Member, shall be under the supervision of the Office of the Municipal Mayor and the MSWDO as well and shall establish linkages and work together with accredited civil society and nongovernment organizations, political organizations and the barangays within the territorial jurisdiction of the Municipality of Alangalang. The Solo Parent Division shall likewise be responsible for:

- a. Maintaining and regularly updating, on a quarterly basis, a database or list of registered Solo Parents in the Municipality of Alangalang and issuing free Solo Parent Identification Cards (SPIC) and/or free Booklets to Solo Parents;
- b. Coordinating with other government agencies and NGOs for the provision of services and establishing linkages with private sector partners for employment and livelihood opportunities;
- c. Conducting regular advocacy and information campaigns and serving, as well, as the general information and liaison center for Solo Parents in the Municipality of Alangalang under the provisions of Republic Act No. 8972 as amended by Republic Act No. 11861 otherwise known as the Expanded Solo Parents Welfare Act;
- d. Processing applications and verifying qualifications of Solo Parent applicants, maintaining the confidentiality of solo parent records and information in compliance with the provisions Republic Act No. 10173, otherwise known as “The Data Privacy Act of 2012” and drawing up a list of available and required services for Solo Parents in the Municipality of Alangalang under the provisions of Republic Act No. 8972 as amended by Republic Act No. 11861 otherwise known as the Expanded Solo Parents Welfare Act;
- e. Preparing periodic reports on solo parent demographics and program implementation in the Municipality of Alangalang as well as reporting to the Municipal Mayor or the MSWDO, any individual, establishment, business entity, institution or agency that violates any provision of Republic Act No. 8972 as amended by Republic Act No. 11861 otherwise known as the Expanded Solo Parents Welfare Act;
- f. Facilitating access to benefits and privileges under this Ordinance and monitoring compliance with the provisions of Republic Act No. 8972 as amended by Republic Act No. 11861 otherwise known as the Expanded Solo Parents Welfare Act, particularly the grant of privileges and additional benefits;
- g. Monitoring and evaluating the effectiveness of programs/services and assisting Solo Parents in filing the complaints against any individual, establishment, business entity, institution or agency that refuses or fails to provide the privileges and additional benefits of Solo Parents under Republic Act No. 8972 as amended by Republic Act No. 11861 otherwise known as the Expanded Solo Parents Welfare Act.

SECTION 4. DOCUMENTARY REQUIREMENTS FOR REGISTRATION, ISSUANCE OF SOLO PARENT IDENTIFICATION CARD (SPIC)/BOOKLET

Any qualified Solo Parent residing in the Municipality of Alangalang may apply with the SPD of the MSWDO of the Municipality of Alangalang for registration as such Solo Parent and for the

issuance of a Solo Parent Identification Card (SPIC) and/or Booklet by submitting authenticated or certified true copies of the documentary requirements, applicable and appurtenant to each category of Solo Parent, as prescribed and enumerated in Section 19 of Republic Act No. 11861 which amended Republic Act No. 8972, otherwise known as the Expanded Solo Parents Welfare Act.

The SPD of the MSWDO of the Municipality of Alangalang shall review and verify the documents submitted by the applicant and shall issue the SPIC and Booklet, if applicable, within seven (7) working days from receipt of complete documents. In case of dispute, the MSWDO shall resolve the same within five (5) working days. The SPIC and Booklet are valid for one (1) year, subject to renewal.

The renewal of SPIC and/or Booklet shall be done thirty (30) days prior to expiration by submitting updated documentary requirements and renewed application form.

SECTION 5. BENEFITS AND PRIVILEGES

Registered Solo Parents in the Municipality of Alangalang shall, within the territorial jurisdiction thereof, be entitled to the following privileges and benefits, in addition to the Comprehensive Package of Social Protection Services for Solo Parents and their families, mandated to be developed and implemented by the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) in coordination with the concerned agencies pursuant to the pertinent provisions of Republic Act No. 8972 as amended by Republic Act No. 11861, otherwise known as the Expanded Solo Parents welfare Act, to wit:

1. Flexible Work Schedule: Solo Parents employed in the municipal government and those employed in the private sector within the territorial jurisdiction of the Municipality of Alangalang shall be provided with a flexible working schedule as herein defined and/or arrangements, including but not limited to adjusted work hours, work- from-home options where feasible, and priority consideration for positions with regular hours compatible with child-rearing responsibilities: *Provided*, That the same shall not affect individual and company productivity: *Provided*, further, That any employer may request exemption from the above requirements from the DOLE on certain meritorious grounds.

2. Parental Leave: In addition to leave privileges under existing laws, a forfeitable and noncumulative parental leave of not more than seven (7) working days with pay every year shall be granted to Solo Parents employed in the municipal government and to those employed in the private sector within the territorial jurisdiction of the Municipality of Alangalang, regardless of employee status, who have rendered service of at least six (6) months.

3. No Work Discrimination: No Solo Parent employee in the Municipality of Alangalang shall be discriminated against by any employer with respect to terms and conditions of employment on account of his or her status.

4. Educational Benefits: Solo Parents in the Municipality of Alangalang, and their children, shall be entitled to educational benefits in the form of scholarship programs and/or full scholarships in institutions of basic, higher and technical vocational skills education, in the manner and under such conditions set forth under Section 9 of Republic Act No. 11861 which amended Republic Act No. 8972, otherwise known as the Expanded Solo Parents Welfare Act and in the Rules and Regulations as well to be promulgated by the DepEd, CHED and TESDA Republic Act No. 11861

which amended Republic Act No. 8972, otherwise known as the Expanded Solo Parents Welfare Act for the proper implementation of this program.

5. Child-Minding Centers: There shall be, within the territorial jurisdiction of the Municipality of Alangalang, appropriate Child-minding Centers within the workplace or in accessible locations to the workplace or residence of the Solo Parent, the establishment of which shall be promoted by the DOLE and the CSC.

6. Housing Benefits: Priority access to socialized housing programs, rent-to-own arrangements, and housing loan programs implemented by the Municipal Government and/or within the territorial jurisdiction of the Municipality of Alangalang.

7. Medical and Health Services:

- a. Free basic medical consultation and treatment at the municipal health center;
- b. Medicine assistance program;
- c. Annual medical and dental check-up for solo parents and their children;
- d. Mental health and counselling services.

8. Livelihood and Employment Assistance:

- a. Skills training and development programs;
- b. Microcredit and loan programs;
- c. Job placement assistance and referral services;
- d. Priority in municipal employment opportunities, subject to qualification requirements.

9. Counselling and Family Support Services:

- a. Individual and family counselling services;
- b. Support group activities and peer counselling programs;
- c. Parenting seminars and workshops;
- d. Legal assistance and referral services.

10. Social Safety Assistance during disasters, calamities, pandemics and other public health crises under Section 14 of Republic Act No. 11861 which amended Republic Act No. 8972, otherwise known as the Expanded Solo Parents Welfare Act.

11. Means-, pension-, and subsidy-tested monthly cash subsidy of one thousand pesos (P1,000.00) per month per solo parent in the manner and under such conditions set forth in Section 15 (a) of Republic Act No. 11861 which amended Republic Act No. 8972, otherwise known as the Expanded Solo Parents Welfare Act.

12. Ten percent (10%) discount and exemption from value-added tax (VAT) on baby's milk, food and micronutrient supplements and sanitary diapers purchased, duly prescribed medicines, vaccines and other medical supplements purchased from birth of the child or children until six (6) years of age, in the manner and under such conditions set forth in Section 15 (b) of Republic Act No. 11861 which amended Republic Act No. 8972, otherwise known as the Expanded Solo Parents Welfare Act

SECTION 6. FUNDING

The Municipal Government shall allocate not less than [specific percentage or amount] of its annual GAD budget for solo parent programs and services. Additional funding may be sourced from:

- a. Special Education Fund (SEF) for educational benefits;
- b. Local Development Fund;
- c. Grants and donations from partner organizations;

d. Special purpose funds as may be created by the Sangguniang Bayan.

The Municipal Treasurer shall establish a separate account for solo parent programs to ensure transparency and proper fund utilization.

SECTION 7. PENALTY CLAUSE

Any person, establishment, business entity or agency that discriminates against solo parents or denies them the benefits and privileges provided under this Ordinance shall be subject to the following penalties:

- a. First Offense: Warning and directive to comply within fifteen (15) days;
- b. Second Offense: Fine of not less than Five Hundred Pesos (₱500.00) but not more than One Thousand Five Hundred Pesos (₱1,500.00);
- c. Third and Subsequent Offenses: Fine of not more than Two Thousand Five Hundred Pesos (₱2,500.00) or imprisonment of not more than six (6) months, or both, at the discretion of the court, and for business establishments, recommendation to appropriate agencies for suspension or revocation of business permits.

SECTION 8. GRIEVANCE MECHANISM

Solo parents who encounter discrimination or are denied benefits may file complaints with the Solo Parent Division (SPD). The MSWDO shall then investigate and resolve complaints within thirty (30) days from filing. Unresolved cases may be elevated to the Municipal Mayor for final determination.

SECTION 9. IMPLEMENTING RULES AND REGULATIONS

The Municipal Mayor, through the MSWDO, shall promulgate the necessary implementing rules and regulations within sixty (60) days from the effectivity of this Ordinance.

SECTION 10. ANNUAL REVIEW

The Sangguniang Bayan shall conduct an annual review of this Ordinance and its implementation to ensure continued relevance and effectiveness.

SECTION 11. REPEALING CLAUSE

All ordinances, executive orders, rules and regulations, or parts thereof inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

SECTION 12. EFFECTIVITY CLAUSE

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately after completion of its posting at prominent places in the Municipal Hall for a minimum period of three (3) consecutive weeks or on the day following its publication in a newspaper of general circulation, where available, within the territorial jurisdiction of Alangalang, whichever occurs later.

SECTION 13: SEPARABILITY CLAUSE

If any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be held invalid, other parts or provisions that are not affected thereby shall continue to be in full force and effect.




