

MUNICIPAL ORDINANCE NO. 505-040825

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE DISPOSITION AND ALLOCATION OF TRUST FUND RECEIVED FROM PHILHEALTH FOR THE ENHANCEMENT OF KONSULTA SERVICES IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF PALOMPON, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

WHEREAS, the Philippine Constitution declares as a state policy to protect and promote the right to health of the people and instill health consciousness among them;

WHEREAS, Section 3 of Republic Act No. 11223, otherwise known as the Universal Health Care (UHC) Act mandates a guaranteed equitable access to quality and affordable health care goods and services, and protected against financial risk to all Filipinos;

WHEREAS, the state likewise declares that the vesting duty, responsibility and accountability in local government units (LGU) shall be accompanied with provision for reasonably adequate resources in order to effectively carry out their functions;

WHEREAS, Philhealth has committed through Philhealth Board Resolution No. 24-79, s. 2019 to expand the primary care benefit to cover all Filipinos by mandating the issuance of PhilHealth Circular (PC) No. 2020-0003 entitled "Governing Policies of the PhilHealth Konsultasyong Sulit at Tama (Konsulta) Package: Expansion of the Primary Care Benefit to cover all Filipinos";

WHEREAS, the PhilHealth Konsulta Package provides a capitation-based payment mechanism to accredited health care providers for the delivery of primary care services to registered beneficiaries;

WHEREAS, the Municipality of Palompon aims to ensure that the capitation fund allocated under the Konsulta Package is properly managed, transparently reported, and effectively utilized to improve the quality of primary health care;

NOW THEREFORE, the Sangguniang Bayan of Palompon, Leyte, in a session duly assembled, hereby enacts this Ordinance.

SECTION 1. TITLE. This Ordinance shall be known as the "E-Konsulta Trust Fund Utilization Ordinance of the Municipality of Palompon."

SECTION 2. PURPOSE. This Ordinance aims to authorize and provide guidelines for the disposition and allocation of PhilHealth capitation funds to enhance the delivery of Konsulta services within the municipality, pursuant to national policies and local development goals.

SECTION 3. DEFINITION OF TERMS AS USED IN THIS ORDINANCE.

1. **Capitation** – a payment mechanism where the LGU is paid a fixed amount per enrolled member, without regard to the actual number or nature of services provided to each person.
2. **PhilHealth Capitation Fund** – amount to be given by PhilHealth to LGU Palompon from the proceeds of outpatient consultation done in the municipality and from the diagnostic benefit package.

SECTION 4. SCOPE AND COVERAGE. This Ordinance shall cover all PhilHealth capitation funds received by the Municipal Health Office (MHO) or other authorized local health units under the e-Konsulta package.

SECTION 5. PURPOSE OF THE CAPITATION FUND AND ITS AUTHORIZED USES. Capitation funds received from PhilHealth shall be allocated and utilized for the following purposes:

1. Procurement of Essential Medicines, Medical Equipment, and Supplies
 - Includes, but is not limited to, drugs, vaccines, diagnostic tools, medical instruments, and other clinical and laboratory materials required for the delivery of Konsulta services.
2. Provision of Incentives and Support for Health Workers of this municipality
 - Includes performance-based incentives, Health Personnel Infectious Risk Compensation, transportation allowance, and other forms of support for doctors, nurses, midwives, Barangay Health Workers, Barangay Nutrition Scholar and other personnel directly involved in E-Konsulta service delivery.
3. Capability-Building and Continuing Professional Development (CPD)
 - Includes training, workshops, certifications, and other education activities aimed at enhancing the competencies of healthcare providers.

4. Facility Improvement for the upgrading, repair, and maintenance of healthcare facilities.
 - Includes but not limited to renovation or rehabilitation of rooms, installation of handwashing stations, proper ventilation systems, and accessible toilets, and the purchase or installation of furniture and basic equipment needed in the facility.
5. Operational and Administrative Support
 - Includes logistics, communication, information technology, utilities, and other operational costs necessary for effective and efficient health service delivery.

SECTION 6. FUND MANAGEMENT. The Municipal Health Officer, in coordination with the Local Finance Committee, shall be responsible for the preparation of the Quarterly and Annual Capitation Fund Utilization Plan (ACFUP) subject to the approval of the Local Chief Executive and submission to PhilHealth, in accordance with the existing guidelines.

As per PhilHealth circular 2024-0013, the maximum per capita amount for konsulta (per patient) shall be at ₱ 1,700 for both government and private package providers, respectively.

- a. The Konsulta Package Provider (KPP), the MHO, shall receive 40% of this amount based on the number of registered members with first patient encounter. (₱ 680 per patient)
- b. The KPP shall receive 60% of this amount based on the number of registered members with first patient encounter as of December that year and achieve performance targets at the end of the year. Maximum of ₱ 1,020 per patient based on the performance targets and the calculated performance factor as stipulated on PhilHealth circular 2024-0013.

SECTION 6.1. FUND MANAGEMENT FOR THE FIRST PATIENT ENCOUNTER ALLOCATION (40%). The accumulated amount equivalent to 40% of the annual capitation rate, computed based on the number of registered eligible beneficiaries with a recorded first Patient Encounter (FPE), shall be divided into two shares respectively:

- a. 45% of the accumulated FPE fund shall be allocated for essential services and medicines under PhilHealth circular 2024-0013 and other operating expenses such as but not limited to:
 - Medicines
 - Laboratory reagents, equipment, and other logistics
 - Internet subscription, EMR service provider subscription fees and IT hardware or equipment
 - Maintenance of health facility
 - Acquisition of MHO vehicle
 - Service delivery programs
 - Hiring of health workers, non-health workers such as encoders and etc.
 - Capacity building
- b. 55% of the accumulated FPE fund shall be allocated for performance incentives of the primary care workers and administrative staff. The computation of the allocation is as follows:

SECTION 6.2. FUND MANAGEMENT FOR THE PERFORMANCE-BASED ALLOCATION (60%). The accumulated amount equivalent to 60% of the annual capitation rate, based on the number of registered members with first patient encounter as of December that year which achieve the performance targets at the end of the year will be divided into two shares respectively as stipulated in Section 6.1.

- 45% of the performance-based allocation shall be allocated for essential services and medicines under PhilHealth circular 2024-0013 and other operating expenses as enumerated in Section 6.1 (a) of this ordinance.
- 55% of the performance-based allocation shall be allocated for performance incentives of the primary care workers and administrative staff. The computation of the allocation is as stipulated in Section 6.1.

SECTION 7. TREATMENT OF THE CAPITATION FUND. All funds generated from the capitation fund shall be treated as trust fund of the Local Government Unit of Palompon, Leyte and shall be used only for the specified purposes specified herein.

SECTION 8. TRANSPARENCY AND ACCOUNTABILITY. The Municipal Health Office shall submit periodic reports on the utilization of capitation funds to the Sangguniang Bayan, Municipal Mayor, and concerned oversight agencies. Said reports shall be posted in conspicuous public places and made available through the LGU's information board.

SECTION 9. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE. If any provision or part of this Ordinance is declared unconstitutional or invalid, the other provisions not affected thereby shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 10. REPEALING CLAUSE. All ordinances, executive orders, and regulations inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed, amended or modified accordingly.

SECTION 11. EFFECTIVITY. This Ordinance shall take effect upon approval and compliance with posting and publication requirements pursuant to the Local Government Code of 1991.

The Committee Meeting was called to order at exactly 2:55 P.M.

The Municipal Vice-Mayor waived the right to preside the meeting to the chairman of the committee. The Presiding Chairman Sangguniang Bayan Member Vanessa N. Avenido acknowledged the presence of the members and invited resource persons. She then formally introduced the draft ordinance entitled, "An Ordinance Authorizing the Disposition and Allocation of Trust Fund Received from PhilHealth for the Enhancement of Konsulta Services in the Municipality of Palompon, and for Other Purposes."

She emphasized that the proposed ordinance aims to institutionalize the management and utilization of capitation funds provided by PhilHealth under the Konsulta Package, in line with the Universal Health Care Act. The purpose is to enhance primary care service delivery through a transparent, accountable, and efficient allocation of resources.



The Municipal Health Office proposed a fund sharing for the eKonsulta Package Trust Fund.

- Dr. Monforte discussed the background for the eKonsulta Package and other benefit packages from PhilHealth. The Philhealth Konsulta benefit package shall be paid as an annual capitation computed and released as performance-based payment. The maximum per capita rate shall be 1,700 to be paid in tranches.
- Payment to the facility is divided into two tranches. The first, representing 40% of the package (P680), is paid monthly following a member's First Patient Encounter. The second tranche of 60% (P1,020) is a variable payment released in January of the subsequent year, contingent upon the facility meeting specific performance criteria set by PhilHealth.


The proposed fund allocation was also discussed as follows:

- c. 45% of each tranche to be used for essential services and medicines under PhilHealth circular 2024-0013 and other operating expenses such as but not limited to:
 - Medicines
 - Laboratory reagents, equipment, and other logistics
 - Internet subscription, EMR service provider subscription fees and IT hardware or equipment
 - Maintenance of health facility
 - Acquisition of MHO vehicle
 - Service delivery programs
 - Hiring of health workers, non-health workers such as encoders and etc.
 - Capacity building








55% to be distributed as performance-based incentives to primary care workers and support staff, broken down as follows:

- 22.46% for Certified and Accredited Primary Care Nurses, Midwives, and other/ permanent Health Workers
 - 8.55% for Allied Professionals (BHW & BNS)
 - 36.90% for Certified and Accredited Primary Care Physician
 - 10.70% for Administrative staff directly involved in the Konsulta Package (PhilHealth Encoders)
 - 16.04% for Other Job Order or Contractual support staff at the RHU
 - 3.21% for LGU Administrative staff directly involved in the Konsulta Package (may include the Head of the MSWDO & his/her designated staff, Municipal Accountant and his/her designated staff, Municipal Treasurer and his/her designated staff, Municipal Budget Officer and his/her designated staff)
 - 2.14% for Human Resource for Health (DOH)
- Following this, Sangguniang Bayan Member Burt Mari M. Bregaudit contributed his perspective on the distribution method.
 - To accelerate the data entry process for eKonsulta, it was proposed that dedicated encoders be assigned to the Municipal Health Office (MHO).

After due deliberation and taking into account prior/technical meetings and consultations conducted between the Municipal Health Office, Local Finance Department and key stakeholders, the Committee on Health and Sanitation found the proposed ordinance to be timely, necessary, and aligned with national health priorities.
