

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE MUNICIPAL ORDINANCE ROAD INFRASTRUCTURE DEVELOPMENT AND MAINTENANCE PROGRAM IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF ALANGALANG, LEYTE

WHEREAS, Adequate road infrastructure is fundamental to economic development, emergency response, and overall quality of life for residents;

WHEREAS, Republic Act No.7160 empowers local government units to establish nfrastructure development programs within their jurisdiction;

WHEREAS, systematic road development and maintenance requires comprehensive planning, community participation, and sustained funding mechanisms;

WHEREAS, climate-resilient infrastructure is essential for long-term sustainability and disaster risk reduction;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it Ordained by the Sangguniang Bayan of Alangalang, Leyte:

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE. This Ordinance shall be known as the **“Municipal Road Infrastructure Development and Maintenance Program of Alangalang, Leyte.”**

SECTION 2. DECLARATION OF POLICY.

It is hereby declared the policy of the municipality to develop and maintain a comprehensive road network that supports economic growth and community welfare while ensuring equitable distribution of road infrastructure improvements across all barangays.

The municipality shall sustainable and climate-resilient road construction practices while fostering meaningful community participation in road development planning and prioritization processes.

SECTION 3. PROGRAM ESTABLISHMENT.

A Municipal Road shall Infrastructure Development and Maintenance Program is hereby established to systematically address road construction, improvement, and maintenance needs throughout the municipality. This program shall serve as the primary framework for coordinating all road infrastructure activities, ensuring efficient resource allocation, and maintaining accountability to the community.

SECTION 4. PROGRAM COMPONENTS.

The program shall encompass comprehensive road development initiatives including annual road construction and rehabilitation projects based on rigorous community needs assessment, integration with provincial and regional road network development plans, implementation of climate-resilient design standards and materials, and utilization of prioritization matrices considering traffic volume, economic impact, and emergency access requirements.

Maintenance system protocols will establish quarterly road condition assessments and documentation using standardized evaluation criteria, preventive maintenance scheduling to extend road lifespan and reduce long-term costs, emergency repair response protocols with 48-hour mobilization targets, and quality control monitoring with comprehensive contractor performance evaluation systems.

SECTION 5. ROAD CLASSIFICATION AND STANDARDS.

Municipal Arterial Roads shall maintain minimum 7-meter carriageway width with concrete pavement, proper drainage systems and road shoulder maintenance, and traffic safety features including comprehensive signage and road markings that meet national standards.

Barangay Collector Roads shall provide minimum 5-meter carriageway width with appropriate surfacing material based on traffic volume and local conditions, basic drainage infrastructure with pedestrian safety considerations, and design specifications developed through extensive community consultation.

Local Access Roads require minimum 4-meter passable width with all-weather surface treatment suitable for year-round access, simple drainage solutions and erosion control measures appropriate to local topography, and cost-effective materials suitable for local traffic patterns while ensuring long-term durability.

SECTION 6. PLANNING AND PRIORITIZATION FRAMEWORK.

A comprehensive Five-Year Road Development Master Plan shall provide systematic assessment of municipal road network conditions and needs, integration with the Municipal Comprehensive Land Use Plan and Comprehensive Development Plan, and alignment with Regional Development Investment Program priorities and national infrastructure strategies.

Annual road project programming will incorporate community consultation through barangay assemblies and public hearings, technical feasibility studies and environmental impact screening for all major projects, cost-benefit analysis and financing strategy development, and performance monitoring and evaluation indicators to ensure accountability and continuous improvement.

SECTION 7. COMMUNITY PARTICIPATION MECHANISMS.

Barangay Road Committees shall be established to identify local priorities and monitor project implementation while ensuring community ownership of infrastructure investments. Public consultation requirements apply to all major road projects exceeding P2,000,00, with clear community counterpart contribution guidelines for local road improvements and comprehensive citizen feedback systems for ongoing maintenance and quality concerns.

SECTION 8. FUNDING STRATEGY.

Local funding sources shall include annual municipal budget allocation of minimum 15% of regular income specifically dedicated infrastructure development and maintenance, Special Development Fund utilization for major road projects that exceed routine maintenance capabilities, and barangay counterpart contributions through labor, materials, or cash equivalent based on community capacity and project scope.

External funding mechanisms will pursue grant applications to the Department of Public Works and Highways and other national agencies, partnership agreements with provincial government for connecting road projects that that serve regional development goals, development assistance from international and bilateral funding institutions, and public-private partnership opportunities for economic corridor development that benefit both investors and communities.

SECTION 9. TECHNICAL STANDARDS AND SPECIFICATIONS.

All road construction shall comply with Department of Public Works and Highways Blue Book standards while incorporating climate-resilient design features including proper drainage, slope protection, and flood-resistant materials. The municipality shall prioritize use of locally available materials where technically feasible to support the local economy while integrating universal design principles for accessibility by persons with disabilities.

SECTION 10. ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION MEASURES.

Environmental compliance screening shall be conducted for all road projects with appropriate mitigation measures. Tree replanting requirements at 3:1 ratio for trees removed during construction will be strictly enforced, along with proper construction waste management and disposal protocols. Protection of water sources and natural drainage systems during construction activities is mandatory, with restoration requirements for any environmental damage.

SECTION 11. ROAD INFRASTRUCTURE COMMITTEE.

A Municipal Road Infrastructure Committee is hereby created with the following composition:

- Municipal Engineer (Chairperson)
- Municipal Planning and Development Officer (Vice-Chairperson)
- Municipal Budget Officer
- Representative from Association of Barangay Captains
- Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Officer
- Civil Society Organization representative

SECTION 12. QUALITY ASSURANCE AND MONITORING.

Comprehensive quality assurance measures include pre-construction soil testing and material quality verification, regular construction supervision and progress monitoring by qualified personnel, post-construction evaluation and warranty compliance tracking, and annual road condition surveys with maintenance needs assessment to inform future programming.

SECTION 13. IMPLEMENTATION TIMELINE.

- Master Plan development within six (6) months from ordinance effectivity
- First annual program implementation within twelve (12) months
- Quarterly progress reports to the Sangguniang Bayan
- Annual comprehensive evaluation and program adjustments

SECTION 14. PERFORMANCE MEASUREMENT AND ACCOUNTABILITY.

The program shall maintain comprehensive performance indicators including road network condition improvement rates, project completion timelines and budget compliance, community satisfaction levels through regular surveys, and economic impact assessment of infrastructure investments. Annual performance reports shall be presented to the Sangguniang Bayan and made available to the public for transparency and accountability.

SECTION 15. EMERGENCY RESPONSE AND DISASTER RESILIENCE.

Road infrastructure planning shall incorporate disaster risk reduction principles, with emergency access routes clearly identified and maintained to higher standards. Rapid response protocols for post-disaster road repairs shall be established, including pre-positioned equipment and materials, contractor standby agreements, and coordination mechanisms with disaster response agencies.

SECTION 16. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE. If any provision of this ordinance is declared invalid or unconstitutional, the remaining provisions shall continue to be valid and effective.

SECTION 17. REPEALING CLAUSE. All ordinances, resolutions, or administrative orders inconsistent with this ordinance are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

SECTION 18. EFFECTIVITY. This ordinance shall take effect (15) days after publication in a newspaper of general circulation or posting in conspicuous public places.






