MUNICIPAL ORDINANCE NO. 8 SERIES OF 2025

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 276 SERIES OF 2012, ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE MOTORCYCLE HELMET ORDINANCE OF CAPOOCAN, LEYTE, PROVIDING PENALTIES THEREFORE AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES"

Be it ordained by the Sangguniang Bayan of the Municipality of Capoocan, Leyte in session duly assembled, that:

SECTION 1. TITLE. This Ordinance shall be known and referred to as "THE MOTORCYCLE HELMET ORDINANCE OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF CAPOOCAN, LEYTE".

SECTION 2. DEFINITION OF TERMS. The following terms, words or phrases as used in this Ordinance are defined as follows:

- a. **Standard Protective Motorcycle Helmets** – are those appropriate types of helmets for motorcycle riders that comply with specifications issued by the Department of Trade and Industry (DTI).
- b. **Motorcycle** – from the legal point of view and for purposes of registration, taxation, rider licensing and use in this ordinance, motorcycle is defined as a powered two-wheel motor vehicle.
- c. **Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI)** – also known as intracranial injury. It occurs when an external force traumatically injures the brain. TBI can be classified based on severity mechanism (closed penetrating head injury), or other features (e.g. occurring in a specific location or over a widespread area). Head injury refers to TBI, but is a broader category because it can involve damage to structures other than the brain such as the scalp and skull.

TBI is a major cause of death and disability worldwide, especially in children and young adults. Cause include falls, vehicle accidents, and violence. Prevention measures include use of technology to protect those who are in accidents, such as seat belts and sports or motorcycle helmets, as well as efforts to reduce the number of accidents, such as safety education programs and enforcement of traffic laws.

- d. Strict enforcement of the helmet law means that the Municipal Government of Capoocan, Leyte adopts and enforces the ordinance without reservations or whatsoever guided with the principle

that "the law may be harsh, but it is still the law" is only to avert serious harm or even death among motorists or their passengers during road mishaps.

SECTION 3. DECLARATION OF POLICY

It is hereby declared policy of the Municipality of Capoocan, Leyte to undertake all necessary measures in order to protect and safeguard all constituents specially the motorcycle riders/drivers front and back passengers from the deadly road mishaps involving motorcycle and other transport vehicle and for its purpose. It shall strictly enforce wearing of the standard protective motorcycle helmets within the territorial jurisdiction of the Municipality of Capoocan, Province of Leyte.

SECTION 4. COVERAGE

This ordinance shall have full force and effect within the territorial jurisdiction of the Municipality of Capoocan, Province of Leyte.

SECTION 5. MANDATORY USE OF STANDARD PROTECTIVE MOTORCYCLE HELMETS

Pursuant to R.A. No. 10054, otherwise known as the "Motorcycle Helmet Act of 2009" and Section 16 of R.A. 7160, all motorcycle riders and back riders shall at all times wear the standard protective motorcycle helmets while traversing in any type of roads and highways within the territorial jurisdiction of the Municipality of Capoocan, Leyte regardless if it is for a long travel or just within the municipality.

The helmet should be worn properly in order to obtain the level of protection the headgear can provide. Whether it is a full face or open helmet that is being worn by riders and back riders, its integral parts such as the retention system or strap that holds the gear to the head and the children guard or full face guard should be used properly in accordance with the instructions from the manufacturer otherwise, misuse of those fixtures may diminish the overall protective capabilities of the helmet.

This mandate is also applicable even for enlisted personnel of the Armed Forces of the Philippines and enlisted personnel of the different Law Enforcement Agencies.

SECTION 6. EXEMPTION

The following situations/circumstances may exempt the motorcycle riders or back riders from wearing the standard protective motorcycle helmets as defined in this Ordinance, to wit:

- a. While under an emergency situation whereby a sick, ailing or dying person is being transported in a motorcycle to the nearest hospital for an immediate medical intervention;
- b. While in the performance of the hot pursuit operation by law enforcement officers, and
- c. While wearing turban/headdress on account of religious belief and affiliation.

SECTION 7. DUTY OF LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES

Aside from the Land Transportation Office (LTO), the local Police Officers and Traffic Enforcers shall ensure that the mandate of this Ordinance be strictly enforced in the Municipality of Capoocan, Leyte and to this end, they are duty bound to execute and maintain the monitoring and apprehensions of persons violating this Ordinance in their respective localities or areas of jurisdiction.

In cases of joint operations by the LTO and the LGU through the local police and traffic enforcers, a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) between the two (2) government entities may be entered into, stipulating therewith the manner by which the operations will be conducted for the purpose of proper coordination and for the effective implementation of this Ordinance.

SECTION 8. DUTY OF THE DEPARTMENT OF TRADE AND INDUSTRY (DTI-LEYTE)

The Department of Trade and Industry shall conduct regular inspection and monitoring of all establishments engaged in selling and/or dealing helmets to the standards set by the Bureau of Product

Standards (BPS) of DTI. Only motorcycle helmets bearing the Philippine Standard (PS) mark or Import Commodity Clearance (ICC) of the Bureau of Product Standards (BPS) shall be sold to persons with motorcycle or to persons who has yet to purchase a motorcycle.

SECTION 9. PROHIBITED ACTS

The following acts are prohibited under this Ordinance, to wit:

- a. Driving or back riding a motorcycle without wearing protective motorcycle helmet as determined by the Bureau of Product Standards (BPS) of DTI.
- b. Improper wearing of helmet contrary to Section 5 of this Ordinance;
- c. Selling/dealing of non-compliant helmets to the standards set forth by the Bureau of Product Standards (BPS) of DTI;
- d. Non-performance of official duties mandated under this Ordinance by a law enforcement agent referred to in Section 7 of this Ordinance;
- e. Tampering, alteration, forgery and imitation of the PS mark and the ICC certificates in the helmets to make the same appear to be compliant to the standards set forth by the Bureau of Product Standards (BPS) of DTI.

SECTION 10. LIABILITY

The liability for the infraction of the provisions of this Ordinance as to the mandate or wearing the standard protective motorcycle helmet shall rest upon the driver/rider regardless of whether or not the back rider is a minor or of legal age. Therefore, the safety of back riders is the responsibility of the driver/rider.

SECTION 11. INFORMATION CAMPAIGN

It shall be the duty of the Barangay Local Government Units within the territorial boundaries of the Municipality of Capoocan, Leyte to conduct massive information campaign within their respective jurisdictions to properly apprise their constituents about the existence of this Ordinance and the manner by which this will be implemented in their localities.

SECTION 12. PENAL PROVISION and CITATION TICKETS

Citation Tickets. For violation of this ordinance, the offender will be issued a Citation Ticket by any member of the Capoocan PNP or any member of the duly deputized Capoocan Traffic Enforcers. Said offender will be directed to personally report and appear before the Capoocan Municipal Police Station Chief of Police within seventy-two (72) hours or three (3) days from the date of issue of the citation ticket. Their personal data will be recorded and entered into the Capoocan MPS's system, then the offender will be directed to pay the corresponding fine at the LGU's Municipal Treasurer's Office.

First Offense - A fine of Five Hundred Pesos (PhP500.00);

Second Offense - A fine of Two Thousand Pesos (PhP2,000.00) or imprisonment of two (2) months, or both fine and imprisonment, at the discretion of the court;

Third Offense - A fine of Two Thousand Five Hundred Pesos (PhP2,500.00) or imprisonment of six (6) months, or both fine and imprisonment, at the discretion of the court;

If it is a law enforcement agent violating the provisions of this Ordinance, he shall be meted out with administrative sanctions in addition to the fine and imprisonment herein provided.


SECTION 13. FINES PAID shall accrue to the Local Government Unit of the Municipality of Capoocan, Leyte and the disposal of which will be determined by the LGU.



Section 12. PENAL PROVISION

- First Offense** - A fine of Five Hundred (Php500.00) pesos;
- Second Offense** - A fine of Two Thousand (Php2,000.00) pesos and imprisonment for a period of two (2) months;
- Third Offense** - A fine of Two Thousand Five Hundred (Php2,500.00) pesos and imprisonment for a period of six (6) months.

If it is a law enforcement agent violating the provisions of this Ordinance, he shall be meted out with administrative sanctions in addition to the fine and imprisonment herein provided.

Section 13. FINES PAID shall accrue to the Local Government Unit that apprehended the violators and the disposal of which will be determined by the LGU concerned.







The Regular Session cum public hearing was called to order by the Honorable Presiding Officer at 10:05 in the morning. It was followed by an Opening Prayer, singing of the Pambansang Awit, Panunumpa sa Watawat ng Pilipinas, Panunumpa ng Lingkod Bayan and singing of the Capoocan Hymn.

A quorum was confirmed by the SB Secretary with all members of the Sanggunian present.

The Municipal Vice-Mayor, Honorable Fe Claire P. Carolino-Paragatos welcomed the participants of the regular session cum public hearing. It was followed by a message from the Municipal Mayor, Honorable Federico H. Carolino, Sr., then the participants were presented and acknowledged by Honorable Jaime A. Dalde, Jr.

FIRST READING AND REFERRAL OF MEASURES TO COMMITTEES

A. ORDINANCE NO. 24, Series of 2025, "AN ORDINANCE DECLARING THE TEMPORARY ANNUAL CLOSURE OF FLORES STREET, POBLACION ZONE I, CAPOOCAN, LEYTE, FROM NOVEMBER 1 TO THE SECOND SUNDAY OF JANUARY, IN OBSERVANCE OF THE TOWN'S FOUNDING ANNIVERSARY AND THE CHRISTMAS SEASON"

Hon. Presiding Officer: (Read Item A of the First Reading and Referral of Measures to Committees).

Hon. Carolino: Madame Chairman, I accept, and I move to treat this matter under plenary today.

1 "the law may be harsh, but it is still the law" is only to avert serious harm or even death among
2 motorists or their passengers during road mishaps.

4 SECTION 3. DECLARATION OF POLICY

5 It is hereby declared policy of the Municipality of Capoocan, Leyte to undertake all necessary
6 measures in order to protect and safeguard all constituents specially the motorcycle riders/drivers front and
7 back passengers from the deadly road mishaps involving motorcycle and other transport vehicle and for its
8 purpose. It shall strictly enforce wearing of the standard protective motorcycle helmets within the territorial
9 jurisdiction of the Municipality of Capoocan, Province of Leyte.

1 SECTION 4. COVERAGE

2 This ordinance shall have full force and effect within the territorial jurisdiction of the Municipality of
3 Capoocan, Province of Leyte.

4 SECTION 5. MANDATORY USE OF STANDARD PROTECTIVE MOTORCYCLE HELMETS

5 Pursuant to R.A. No. 10054, otherwise known as the "Motorcycle Helmet Act of 2009" and Section
6 16 of R.A. 7160, all motorcycle riders and back riders shall at all times wear the standard protective
7 motorcycle helmets while traversing in any type of roads and highways within the territorial jurisdiction of the
8 Municipality of Capoocan, Leyte regardless if it is for a long travel or just within the municipality.

9 The helmet should be worn properly in order to obtain the level of protection the headgear can
10 provide. Whether it is a full face or open helmet that is being worn by riders and back riders, its integral parts
11 such as the retention system or strap that holds the gear to the head and the children guard or full face
12 guard should be used properly in accordance with the instructions from the manufacturer otherwise, misuse
13 of those fixtures may diminish the overall protective capabilities of the helmet.

14 This mandate is also applicable even for enlisted personnel of the Armed Forces of the Philippines
15 and enlisted personnel of the different Law Enforcement Agencies.

16 SECTION 6. EXEMPTION

17 The following situations/circumstances may exempt the motorcycle riders or back riders from
18 wearing the standard protective motorcycle helmets as defined in this Ordinance, to wit:

19 While under an emergency situation whereby a sick, ailing or dying person is being transported in a
20 motorcycle to the nearest hospital for an immediate medical intervention;

21 While in the performance of the hot pursuit operation by law enforcement officers, and

22 While wearing turban/head dress on account of religious belief and affiliation.



23 SECTION 7. DUTY OF LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES

24 Aside from the Land Transportation Office (LTO), the local Police Officers and Traffic Enforcers shall
25 ensure that the mandate of this Ordinance be strictly enforced in the Municipality of Capoocan, Leyte and to
26 this end, they are duty bound to execute and maintain the monitoring and apprehensions of persons
27 violating this Ordinance in their respective localities or areas of jurisdiction.

28 In cases of joint operations by the LTO and the LGU through the local police and traffic enforcers, a
29 Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) between the two (2) government entities may be entered into,
30 stipulating therewith the manner by which the operations will be conducted for the purpose of proper
31 coordination and for the effective implementation of this Ordinance.

32 SECTION 8. DUTY OF THE DEPARTMENT OF TRADE AND INDUSTRY (DTI-LEYTE)

33 The Department of Trade and Industry shall conduct regular inspection and monitoring of all
34 establishments engaged in selling and/or dealing helmets to the standards set by the Bureau of Product
35 Standards (BPS) of DTI. Only motorcycle helmets bearing the Philippine Standard (PS) mark or Import
36 Commodity Clearance (ICC) of the Bureau of Product Standards (BPS) shall be sold to persons with
37 motorcycle or to persons who has yet to purchase a motorcycle.
