**MUNICIPAL ORDINANCE NO. 516-241125**

**AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE SALE, DISTRIBUTION, AND USE OF  
 FIRECRACKERS AND FIREWORKS WITHIN THE MUNICIPALITY OF PALOMPON,  
 LEYTE, PROVIDING FOR DESIGNATED FIRECRACKER ZONES, SAFETY AND  
 ENVIRONMENTAL GUIDELINES, PENALTIES, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES**

**WHEREAS**, Section 16 of Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as the *Local Government Code of 1991*, empowers local government units to exercise powers necessary for the promotion of the general welfare;

**WHEREAS**, Republic Act No. 7183 regulates the manufacture, sale, distribution, and use of firecrackers and other pyrotechnic devices, and authorizes local government units to impose additional restrictions to ensure safety and order;

**WHEREAS**, Executive Order No. 28 (s. 2017) by the President of the Philippines, provides for the regulation and control of the use of firecrackers and other pyrotechnic devices and directs local governments to designate areas for fireworks display;

**WHEREAS**, the Department of the Interior and Local Government, through Memorandum Circular Nos. 2017-105, 2017-168, and 2023-202, enjoins all LGUs to regulate the use of firecrackers and fireworks within their jurisdictions and to strengthen coordination with the Bureau of Fire Protection (BFP), Philippine National Police (PNP), and other concerned agencies;

**WHEREAS**, the Municipality of Palompon recognizes its duty to ensure that festivities and celebrations are conducted in a manner that preserves peace and order, prevents injury and property damage, and upholds the protection of the environment and public health;

**WHEREAS**, it is necessary to institutionalize the designation of firecracker selling zones and fireworks display areas, including prior Executive Orders issued by the Municipal Mayor, to provide consistency, safety clarity, and long-term compliance;

**SECTION 1. TITLE.**

This Ordinance shall be known and cited as the **"FIRECRACKERS AND FIREWORKS REGULATION ORDINANCE OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF PALOMPON, LEYTE."**

It may also be referred to, for brevity, as the **"Palompon Firecrackers and Fireworks Ordinance of 2025."**

**SECTION 2. DECLARATION OF POLICY.**

It is hereby declared the policy of the Municipality of Palompon, Leyte to safeguard the life, health, property, peace, order, environment, and general welfare of its constituents by ensuring that the sale, distribution, handling, and use of firecrackers and fireworks within the Municipality are conducted safely, responsibly, and in a manner consistent with environmental protection and community well-being.

To achieve these objectives, the Municipality shall:

- a. Protect public safety and order by preventing injuries, fires, disturbances, and property damage arising from the improper or indiscriminate use of firecrackers and fireworks.
- b. Preserve and protect the environment by minimizing noise and air pollution, reducing hazardous and non-biodegradable residues, and ensuring proper waste management and cleanup after any firecracker- or fireworks-related activity.
- c. Designate controlled and supervised zones for the sale, distribution, and ignition of firecrackers and fireworks, ensuring compliance with national fire-safety regulations and environmental standards.
- d. Promote safe and responsible celebration by encouraging organized, community-based fireworks displays conducted by licensed pyrotechnicians under the supervision of the BFP, PNP, MDRRMO, and MEETO.
- e. Strengthen inter-agency coordination among the Municipal Mayor's Office, Sangguniang Bayan, Bureau of Fire Protection (BFP), Philippine National Police (PNP), Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (MDRRMO), and the Municipal Environment and Eco-Tourism Office (MEETO) to ensure a unified and effective enforcement approach.
- f. Integrate this Ordinance with the Municipality's Eco-Tourism Management Plans, Solid Waste Management Program, Disaster Risk Reduction and Climate Resiliency Framework, and other related development and environmental policies.

- g. Promote awareness, education, and community participation by informing citizens, schools, business establishments, and event organizers of safe practices, environmental responsibilities, and legal requirements related to firecrackers and fireworks.
- h. Promote awareness, education, and community participation by informing citizens, schools, business establishments, and event organizers of safe practices, environmental responsibilities, and legal requirements related to firecrackers and fireworks.

**SECTION 3. LEGAL BASIS.**

This Ordinance is enacted pursuant to the following national laws, executive issuances, and regulatory frameworks:

- 1) Republic Act No. 7160 (Local Government Code of 1991).
  - a. *Section 16* — granting local government units the authority to exercise powers necessary and appropriate for the promotion of the general welfare.
  - b. *Section 447(a)(1)(ii) and (vi)* — authorizing municipalities to regulate activities related to public safety, health, environmental protection, and to prescribe penalties for violations of municipal ordinances.
- 2) Republic Act No. 7183 — An Act Regulating the Sale, Manufacture, Distribution, and Use of Firecrackers and Other Pyrotechnic Devices — particularly:
  - a. *Section 4* — requiring that no person shall manufacture, sell, or distribute firecrackers or pyrotechnic devices without a valid license issued by the Chief of the PNP.
  - b. Provisions prohibiting the production and sale of dangerous or illegal firecrackers and pyrotechnic devices.
- 3) Executive Order No. 28 (s. 2017) by the President of the Philippines. Providing for the regulation and control of the use of firecrackers and other pyrotechnic devices nationwide and directing LGUs to designate areas for community fireworks displays.
- 4) DILG Memorandum Circular Nos. 2017-105, 2017-168, and 2023-202. Enjoining all LGUs to adopt stricter measures on the sale, distribution, and use of firecrackers and fireworks; requiring inter-agency coordination among the BFP, PNP, and DOH; and encouraging the promotion of community fireworks displays.
- 5) The Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR) of the Fire Code of the Philippines and the PNP Firearms and Explosives Office (PNP-FEO). Prescribing technical safety standards for handling, storage, sale, display, transport, and ignition of firecrackers and pyrotechnic devices.
- 6) Other applicable national policies, safety bulletins, and environmental directives issued by the Bureau of Fire Protection (BFP), PNP, Department of Health (DOH), Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR), and related agencies that guide the safe, orderly, and environmentally responsible management of firecracker and fireworks activities.

**SECTION 4. DEFINITION OF TERMS.**

For purposes of this Ordinance, the following terms shall be construed as hereunder defined:

- a. Firecracker – refers to any small explosive device designed primarily to produce noise or sound through combustion or explosion, including but not limited to “Small Triangulo,” “Kwitis,” “Luces,” and similar devices authorized under Republic Act No. 7183.
- b. Fireworks / Pyrotechnic Device – refers to any device containing combustible or explosive substances which, upon ignition, produces visible or audible effects such as light, color, smoke, or sound for entertainment or ceremonial purposes. This includes fountains, sparklers, aerial fireworks, and pyrotechnic display shells.
- c. Prohibited Firecrackers and Pyrotechnic Devices – refers to devices explicitly banned under Section 3 of Republic Act No. 7183 and subsequent issuances of the PNP-FEO and BFP, including oversized firecrackers, explosive mixtures and dangerously modified devices.
- d. Authorized Fireworks Display – refers to a pyrotechnic exhibition conducted by a duly licensed pyrotechnician or fireworks operator, held only in designated zones or areas approved by the LGU, BFP, and PNP, and covered by a valid permit under Section 9 of this Ordinance.
- e. Dealer / Retailer – refers to any person, partnership, corporation, or entity duly licensed by the PNP to sell or distribute firecrackers or fireworks and duly permitted by the Municipality of Palompon to operate within its jurisdiction.
- f. Permit – refers to a written authorization issued by the Municipal Mayor, upon endorsement of the BFP, PNP, MDRRMO, and MEETO, allowing a person or entity to sell, distribute, handle, or display firecrackers or fireworks under this Ordinance.
- g. Special Permit – refers to a written authority issued by the Municipal Mayor for activities conducted outside designated zones, including but not limited to off-zone fireworks displays, mobile pyrotechnic exhibitions, and special celebrations, after favorable endorsement by the BFP, PNP, MDRRMO, and MEETO.
- h. Public Place – refers to any open or enclosed area accessible to the general public, whether publicly or privately owned, including streets, plazas, parks, beaches, structures, markets, terminals, commercial areas, and similar locations.
- i. Minor – refers to any person below eighteen (18) years of age.
- j. Designated Zone – refers to a specific area officially approved by the Municipal Mayor, upon recommendation of the BFP and MDRRMO, for the sale, distribution, ignition, and exhibition of firecrackers and fireworks.

- k. Environmental Clearance – refers to the written approval issued by the Municipal Environment and Eco-Tourism Office (MEETO) certifying that the proposed selling area, storage area, or exhibition site complies with environmental, waste-management, and eco-tourism protection standards.
- l. Waste Residue / Firecracker Debris – refers to any paper, plastic, ash, chemical by-product, or other materials left after the ignition or display of firecrackers and fireworks.
- m. Pyrotechnician – refers to a person duly licensed by the PNP–Firearms and Explosives Office (PNP-FEO) to operate, manage, or execute fireworks displays or pyrotechnic shows.
- n. Ignition / Discharge – refers to the act of lighting, exploding, activating, or causing any firecracker or fireworks device to produce its intended effect.
- o. Stall / Booth / Display Area – refers to the allocated or permitted space designated for the storage, sale, or public display of firecrackers and fireworks.
- p. Continuing Violation – refers to an offense where each day of non-compliance is treated as a separate and distinct violation, in accordance with Section 447(a)(1)(ii) of the Local Government Code of 1991.

**SECTION 5. DESIGNATED ZONES AND PERIOD OF SALE.**

- 1. Designated Firecracker and Fireworks Selling Zone.

The official area for the sale and display of firecrackers and fireworks shall be the vacant lot across the Municipal Hall, corner Washington and Rizal Streets, or such other site as may later be designated by the Municipal Mayor upon the recommendation of the Bureau of Fire Protection (BFP) and the Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (MDRRMO), subject to a safety inspection and crowd-control evaluation.

- 2. Designated Area for Firecracker and Fireworks Display
  - a. All public fireworks displays shall be conducted only within areas approved by the BFP, Philippine National Police (PNP), and MDRRMO.
  - b. The primary fireworks exhibition area shall be the bay area behind the Municipal Town Hall fronting the Bitag Tree.
  - c. Any fireworks display outside the designated exhibition zone shall require a Special Permit, duly issued by the Municipal Mayor in accordance with Section 9.D of this Ordinance, after favorable endorsement by the BFP, PNP, MDRRMO, and MEETO.
  - d. Applicants shall submit a site layout, safety plan, and an environmental-management and cleanup plan as part of the permit process.

- 3. Minimum Safety Buffer Zones.

A clear distance of at least fifteen (15) meters shall be maintained around all selling, storage, and display areas.

The BFP may increase this distance based on risk assessment, weather conditions, the class of pyrotechnic device, or nearby structures and population density.

4. Environmental and Waste-Management Provisions.

- a. All vendors and organizers shall provide segregated waste bins and ensure immediate cleanup of their selling and exhibition areas after each operation or event, under the supervision of the Municipal Environment and Eco-Tourism Office (MEETO).
- b. The sale, ignition, or disposal of firecrackers and fireworks in coastal zones, beaches, waterways, drainage outlets, or other environmentally sensitive areas is strictly prohibited.
- c. Failure to comply with environmental requirements shall constitute a violation punishable under Section 11 of this Ordinance.

5. Period of Sale.

- a. The authorized period for the sale and retail of firecrackers and fireworks shall be from December 20 to December 31 of every calendar year, unless otherwise extended or adjusted by the Municipal Mayor for specific local festivities or officially sanctioned events.
- b. All sales, distribution, or transactions conducted before December 20 or after December 31 shall be considered unauthorized and subject to penalties under Section 11 hereof.
- c. Any unsold stocks after the authorized period shall be returned to the supplier or disposed of properly under the supervision of the BFP and PNP.

6. Posting of Permits and Inspection.

All permits and national licenses required under this Ordinance shall be displayed prominently in every stall, booth, or exhibition area. The BFP, PNP, MDRRMO, and MEETO shall jointly conduct regular inspections to ensure compliance with this Ordinance, the Fire Code of the Philippines, Republic Act No. 7183, and applicable national safety and environmental regulations.

**SECTION 6. SAFETY GUIDELINES.**

To ensure the protection of life, property, and the environment, all activities involving firecrackers and fireworks within the Municipality of Palompon shall strictly adhere to the following safety standards:

A. General Safety Provisions.

- 1. Firecrackers and fireworks shall be sold, stored, handled, transported, and ignited only by persons or entities duly licensed by the PNP pursuant to Section 4 of Republic Act No. 7183 and duly permitted by the Municipal Mayor under Section 9 of this Ordinance.

2. Ordinary or permissible firecrackers and fireworks intended for consumer use shall be handled and ignited only by a responsible adult. Minors are strictly prohibited from handling, igniting, testing, purchasing, or assisting in the use of any firecracker or fireworks device.
3. All stocks must be stored in non-combustible containers, kept away from open flames, heat sources, electrical outlets, cooking areas, and direct sunlight.
4. All selling booths or stalls shall be equipped with, at minimum:
  - a. One (1) functional 10-lb fire extinguisher.
  - b. Two (2) sand buckets.
  - c. Clear and visible "NO SMOKING / NO OPEN FLAME / NO TESTING OF FIRECRACKERS" signage.
5. Smoking, vaping, or use of any open flame within or near selling or storage areas is strictly prohibited.
6. The BFP, in coordination with the PNP, MDRRMO, and MEETO, shall conduct regular and unannounced inspections of all selling areas, storage points, and display sites to ensure compliance with safety and environmental standards.

B. Guidelines for Ignition and Display.

1. Ignition or explosion of any firecracker or fireworks device shall be permitted only within designated zones defined under Section 5, unless covered by a Special Permit under Section 9.D.
2. No firecracker or pyrotechnic device shall be ignited or discharged within a minimum distance of fifteen (15) meters from:
  - a. Any building or structure.
  - b. Any commercial or residential establishment.
  - c. Any person or group of persons.
  - d. Any vehicle, market, or public utility area.
3. For aerial fireworks or high-intensity pyrotechnic devices, the BFP may prescribe greater minimum safety distances based on weather conditions, wind direction, population density, and the type of device used.
4. Testing or trial Ignition of firecrackers in selling areas, public roads, pathways, residential zones, markets, terminals, or any non-designated area is strictly prohibited.
5. All fireworks displays must be supervised by a duly licensed pyrotechnician, and ignition shall proceed only upon clearance from the BFP present at the site.
6. Only pyrotechnic devices allowed under RA 7183 and duly endorsed by the PNP-FEO may be used.

C. Environmental and Waste-Management Measures.

1. All residues, packaging materials, ash, plastic, and other waste generated from the sale or ignition of firecrackers and fireworks shall be immediately collected, segregated, and disposed of properly under the supervision of MEETO.
2. It is strictly prohibited to dump, burn, or wash off firecracker debris into drainage systems, waterways, canals, coastal zones, beaches, mangrove areas, or other ecologically sensitive sites.
3. Organizers of fireworks displays shall submit to MEETO a post-activity environmental compliance report within twenty-four (24) hours after the event.
4. MEETO, in coordination with the BFP and MDRRMO, may order the suspension of activities that pose immediate environmental risks.

D. Public Information, Signage, and Crowd Safety.

1. The MDRRMO, BFP, and MEETO shall issue and disseminate official safety advisories at least fifteen (15) days before December 20 of every year.
2. All authorized sellers and event organizers shall display approved public safety reminders, including:
  - a. Safe-handling instructions.
  - b. Emergency contact numbers.
  - c. Environmental reminders.
  - d. Prohibited acts under Section 10.
3. Crowd-control measures for fireworks displays shall include:
  - a. Marked safety perimeters.
  - b. Barriers or cordons.
  - c. Clear entry and exit points
  - d. Visible signages.
4. Adequate lighting, security personnel, and communication systems shall be provided during events.

E. Emergency Response and Incident Reporting.

1. A BFP Fire Officer and PNP representative must be present at all authorized fireworks displays, with the MDRRMO providing medical standby and crowd-management support.
2. In case of any accident, injury, fire, or explosion involving firecrackers or fireworks, the person responsible or organizer must immediately notify the BFP, PNP, and MDRRMO within one (1) hour of the incident.

**SECTION 7. ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT AND RESPONSIBILITY.**

To ensure that the use, sale, distribution, and display of firecrackers and fireworks do not cause environmental degradation or harm to public health, the following environmental safeguards and responsibilities shall be strictly enforced:

A. Environmental Protection Measures.

All sellers, distributors, organizers, and pyrotechnicians shall ensure that no toxic, chemical, or non-biodegradable residues from firecrackers and fireworks are left in public places, waterways, drainage systems, coastal areas, beaches, mangrove zones, eco-tourism sites, or other environmentally sensitive locations.
- 2. Firecrackers and fireworks are strictly prohibited in the following areas:
  - a. Coastal zones, including beaches and foreshore areas.
  - b. Marine sanctuaries, mangrove forests, and wetland areas.
  - c. Eco-tourism sites and protected areas, including Kalanggaman Island, Tabuk Marine Park, and all areas designated as environmental conservation zones.
  - d. Watersheds, riverbanks, creeks, canals, and floodways.
  - e. Any site identified by MEETO as an environmental risk area.

B. Waste Management and Cleanup Requirements.

1. All vendors and event organizers shall provide segregated waste bins for:
  - a. Paper and cardboard residues.
  - b. Plastic and mixed residual waste.
  - c. Burnt materials and ash.

2. Vendors must keep their selling area clean and free of debris at all times.

Waste must be collected immediately after operations and transported to designated disposal points in accordance with the Municipal Solid Waste Management Ordinance.

3. Organizers of fireworks exhibitions must complete full cleanup of the site within twenty-four (24) hours after the activity and submit a Post-Activity Environmental Compliance Report to MEETO.
4. Any vendor, pyrotechnician, or organizer who fails to comply with cleanup requirements shall be liable for penalties under Section 11, including environmental fines and possible revocation of permit.

C. Eco-Tourism and Community Safety Integration

1. Firecracker and fireworks activities shall be aligned with the Municipality's Eco-Tourism Development Plans, ensuring that tourism areas remain safe, clean, and environmentally stable.
2. Activities near tourist centers, ports, terminals, boat corridors, and docking areas shall require coordination with the:
  - a. Municipal Environment and Eco-Tourism Office (MEETO).
  - b. Municipal Council on Culture, Arts, and Tourism (MCCAT).
  - c. Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (MDRRMO).
  - d. Philippine National Police (PNP) or Philippine Coast Guard (PCG), when applicable.
3. MEETO shall ensure that all activities are consistent with the Municipality's climate-resiliency, pollution-reduction, and coastal-protection goals.

D. Public Awareness and Education.

1. MDRRMO, and the MEETO shall jointly conduct public awareness campaigns on the environmental impacts of firecrackers and fireworks, including:
  - a. Pollution prevention.
  - b. Proper disposal of firecracker debris.

2. Schools, barangays, and community organizations are encouraged to participate in environmental education efforts and to implement "Clean As You Go" practices during local festivities.

E. Monitoring and Enforcement.

1. MEETO shall conduct field inspections to monitor environmental compliance before, during, and after the Christmas and New Year season and other festivities involving firecrackers or fireworks.

2. The BFP, PNP, MDRRMO, and Barangay Officials shall assist MEETO in identifying violators, enforcing environmental restrictions, and ensuring safety protocols.

3. MEETO may recommend to the Municipal Mayor the suspension or revocation of any permit due to environmental violations, pollution incidents, improper waste disposal, or non-submission of required documentation.

4. Environmental violations under this Ordinance shall be subject to penalties under Section 11 without prejudice to liability under RA 9003 or other applicable laws.

**SECTION 8. MINIMUM SAFE DISTANCE FOR IGNITION OR EXPLOSION.**

To prevent accidents, injuries, fires, and damage to property, the following minimum safe-distance requirements shall be strictly observed for all firecracker and fireworks activities within the Municipality of Palompon:

A. Minimum Distances

1. No firecracker or pyrotechnic device shall be ignited, discharged, or exploded within a minimum radial distance of fifteen (15) meters from any:

- a. Building or structure.
- b. Commercial or residential establishment.
- c. Market, school, church, or public facility.
- d. Motor vehicle, tricycle terminal, or transport hub.
- e. Crowd, group of persons, or passerby.
- f. Stall, selling area, or display booth.
- g. Sensitive or hazard-prone area identified by the BFP or MDRRMO.

2. For aerial, high-intensity, or large-volume pyrotechnic devices, the Bureau of Fire Protection (BFP) may require a greater distance than fifteen (15) meters based on:

- a. Fire-safety assessment.



B. Off-zone Fireworks Display Requirements.

1. Any fireworks display or ignition conducted outside the designated exhibition zone identified under Section 5 shall require a Special Permit under Section 9.D, incorporating site-specific safe-distance requirements.
2. The approved minimum distance for off-zone displays must be:
  - a. Clearly indicated in the Special Permit.
  - b. Physically marked using barriers, cones, ropes, or barricades.
  - c. Announced to the public through signage and safety briefings.
3. The BFP may conduct on-site verification immediately before the event to ensure that required distances and safety perimeters are properly established.

C. Public Safety Measures

1. Safety perimeters shall be clearly marked using visible physical barriers such as ropes, warning tape, metal barricades, or cones.
2. "KEEP DISTANCE - FIRECRACKER / FIREWORKS AREA" signage shall be posted by organizers or vendors at visible locations around ignition sites.
3. Ignition shall only proceed when a BFP Fire Officer or authorized safety personnel has confirmed that the minimum safe distances are being observed.
4. No person shall be allowed to enter the safety perimeter during ignition except:
  - a. Licensed pyrotechnicians.
  - b. Authorized safety personnel from BFP, PNP, MDRRMO.
  - c. Municipal or barangay officers assigned for supervision.



D. Prohibitions

1. No ignition or explosion shall be conducted:
  - a. Near LPG tanks, gas stations, or flammable materials.
  - b. Under electrical lines or near transformers.
  - c. Inside buildings, vehicles, or enclosed spaces.

e. In any area where the BFP or MDRRMO has issued a safety warning or prohibition.

Violation of safe-distance requirements constitutes a major safety offense under Section 11 and may result in:

a. Immediate stoppage of the activity.

b. Confiscation of materials by the BFP or PNP.

c. Suspension or revocation of permits.

d. Fines or imprisonment as provided under Section 11.

E. Emergency and Hazard Assessment.

1. The BFP and MDRRMO shall jointly assess ignition sites during unfavorable weather, strong winds, or crowd surges.

2. If the site is deemed unsafe, the ignition or fireworks display shall be:

a. Temporarily suspended, or

b. Cancelled outright, depending on the level of risk.

3. The Municipal Mayor may declare a temporary moratorium on firecracker use during times of high-risk weather, calamity, or disaster

**SECTION 9. PERMIT AND LICENSING REQUIREMENTS.**

To ensure public safety, environmental protection, and full compliance with national and local regulations, the following permits and licensing requirements are hereby imposed:

A. National License Requirement (RA 7183, Section 4)

1. In accordance with Section 4 of Republic Act No. 7183, any person, partnership, corporation, or entity desiring to manufacture, sell, or distribute firecrackers or pyrotechnic devices shall first secure the appropriate license or permit from the Chief of the Philippine National Police (PNP) through the Regional Civil Security Unit VIII (RCSU VIII) of Leyte or the PNP-Firearms and Explosives Office (PNP-FEO).

2. No license or permit shall be issued for the manufacture, sale, or distribution of prohibited firecrackers and pyrotechnic devices under RA 7183.

3. A valid PNP license is a mandatory prerequisite before any municipal permit may be issued under this Ordinance.

B. Municipal Permit to Sell or Distribute

1. Any person or business intending to sell, distribute, or display firecrackers and fireworks within the Municipality of Palompon shall secure a Municipal Permit, issued by the Municipal Mayor through the Business Permits and Licensing Office (BPLO).

2. The application shall be accompanied by:
  - a. A copy of the valid PNP license required under RA 7183.
  - b. BFP Fire Safety Inspection and endorsement.
  - c. PNP Verification of authenticity of the PNP license.
  - d. MDRRMO Safety Assessment of the selling or storage area.
  - e. MEETO Environmental Clearance, including waste-management plans.

3. The permit shall authorize selling and distribution only during the period specified in Section 5(5) of this Ordinance.
4. The Municipal Permit must be displayed prominently in the stall, booth, or designated area.

C. Permit to Conduct Fireworks Display or Exhibition.

1. A Permit to Conduct Fireworks Display shall be required for any fireworks show, whether public, private, commercial, or entertainment-related.
2. Only duly licensed pyrotechnicians registered with the PNP-FEO shall be allowed to conduct fireworks displays.
3. The applicant shall submit the following documents:
  - a. Copy of the pyrotechnician's valid PNP-FEO license.
  - b. Detailed site layout, including ignition points, crowd areas, and safety perimeters.
  - c. Certification of compliance with the minimum fifteen (15)-meter safety distance pursuant to Section 8.
  - d. BFP Fire-Safety Clearance.
  - e. PNP Endorsement for security and crowd management.
  - f. MDRRMO Risk and Emergency Plan, including medical standby.
  - g. MEETO-approved Environmental Management and Cleanup Plan.
  - h. Proof of liability insurance covering injuries, property damage, or fire incidents.
4. No fireworks display shall proceed unless a BFP Fire Officer is physically present at the site.

1. Any fireworks display or pyrotechnic activity outside the designated exhibition zone identified under Section 5(2) shall require a Special Permit issued by the Municipal Mayor.

2. The Special Permit shall be granted only after favorable endorsements from the:

- a. Bureau of Fire Protection (BFP).
- b. Philippine National Police (PNP).
- c. Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (MDRRMO).
- d. Municipal Environment and Eco-Tourism Office (MEETO).

3. Additional requirements for Special Permit applications include:

- a. Detailed off-zone site plan, including wind patterns and hazard mapping.
- b. Expanded crowd-control plan approved by MDRRMO.
- c. Enhanced safety-buffer plan, specifying BFP-mandated distances beyond 15 meters.
- d. Environmental Clearance and cleanup commitments approved by MEETO.
- e. Proof of event-specific insurance coverage.

4. A Special Permit shall:

- a. Be valid only for the specific date, time, and venue stated therein.
- b. Expire automatically after the event.
- c. Require a BFP pre-display inspection prior to ignition.

E. Validity, Non-Transferability, and Revocation.

1. All permits issued under this Ordinance are non-transferable and valid only for the period, activity, and location specified.

2. The Municipal Mayor, upon recommendation of the BFP, PNP, MDRRMO, or MEETO, may suspend or revoke any permit for:

- a. Violation of this Ordinance.
- b. False statements or misrepresentation.
- c. Unsafe practices endangering life, property, or the environment.
- d. Failure to comply with cleanup and environmental rules.
- e. Any activity posing imminent danger as determined by the BFP or MDRRMO.

3. Revocation is without prejudice to administrative, civil, or criminal liability.

F. Registry and Coordination.

1. The BPLO shall maintain a Municipal Registry of Licensed Dealers, Retailers, Pyrotechnicians, and Fireworks Display Permits, including relevant PNP-issued licenses.
2. Copies of the registry shall be furnished to the:
  - a. BFP – Palompon Fire Station.
  - b. PNP – Palompon Police Station.
  - c. MDRRMO for monitoring and enforcement.
3. The registry shall be updated annually and made available to the Sangguniang Bayan and for the public upon request.

**SECTION 10. PROHIBITED ACTS.**

The following acts are hereby declared unlawful within the Municipality of Palompon, Leyte:

A. Violations Related to Licenses and Permits.

1. Selling, distributing, storing, or handling firecrackers or fireworks without a valid PNP license as required under Section 4 of Republic Act No. 7183.
2. Selling, distributing, or displaying firecrackers or fireworks without a Municipal Permit issued pursuant to this Ordinance.
3. Conducting a fireworks display without a Permit to Conduct Fireworks Display or Special Permit as required under Section 9.
4. Using an expired, forged, or altered permit or license.

B. Sale and Distribution Violations.

1. Selling or distributing prohibited firecrackers or pyrotechnic devices under Section 3 of RA 7183 and related PNP-FEO issuances.
2. Selling firecrackers or fireworks outside the authorized period (December 20 to December 31) except when covered by a Special Permit.
3. Allowing a minor to handle, ignite, test, purchase, possess, transport, or assist in the handling or ignition of any firecracker or fireworks device.
4. Open-display of firecrackers or fireworks outside the designated selling zone identified under Section 5.
5. Storing firecrackers or fireworks in unauthorized locations, including residences, tricycles, passenger vehicles, or near combustible materials.

C. Safety Violations.

1. Igniting or detonating firecrackers or fireworks within fifteen (15) meters of:
  - a. Any building, house, or structure.
  - b. Commercial or residential establishments.
  - c. Public markets, terminals, or transport areas.
  - d. Any vehicle, road, or crowd.
  - e. Schools, churches, or government buildings.
2. Conducting testing or trial ignition of firecrackers in selling areas, public roads, narrow streets, or residential zones.
3. Smoking, vaping, or using open flames within selling, storage, or ignition areas.
4. Igniting firecrackers under electrical lines, near fuel sources, LPG tanks, gas stations, or flammable materials.
5. Igniting firecrackers or fireworks during high-risk weather or when the BFP or MDRRMO orders the suspension of activities.
6. Allowing a minor to be present inside the safety perimeter or ignition area during the preparation, handling, or discharge of any firecracker or fireworks device.

D. Environmental Violations.

1. Dumping, burning, or washing off firecracker debris, ash, chemicals, or packaging materials in:
  - a. Drainage systems and canals.
  - b. Rivers, creeks, and waterways.
  - c. Coastal areas, beaches, and marine sanctuaries.

B. Bureau of Fire Protection (BFP – Palompon Fire Station).

1. Acts as the primary enforcement agency for fire-safety provisions.
2. Conducts regular and unannounced inspections of:
  - a. Selling zones and stalls;
  - b. Storage areas;
  - c. Fireworks display sites;
  - d. Transport vehicles carrying pyrotechnics.
3. Issues Fire-Safety Clearances and inspection reports.
4. Shall be physically present at all authorized fireworks displays.
5. May order the immediate stoppage of any activity that poses imminent danger.
6. Leads the confiscation and disposal of prohibited or unsafe firecrackers.

C. Philippine National Police (PNP – Palompon MPS).

1. Verifies the authenticity of PNP-FEO licenses required under RA 7183.
2. Maintains peace and order in selling and exhibition zones.
3. Assists in the enforcement of safety perimeters during displays.
4. Investigates incidents, complaints, property damage, and injuries related to firecrackers or fireworks.
5. Coordinates with the Women and Children's Desk for violations involving minors.
6. Assists in the confiscation and transport of prohibited devices.

D. Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (MDRRMO).

1. Conducts risk assessments, crowd-control planning, and emergency response planning for fireworks displays.
2. Provides medical standby, first-aid teams, and emergency response units during events.
3. Assists in evaluating safe distances and hazard risks at proposed ignition sites.
4. Compiles and submits consolidated Incident Reports to the Municipal Mayor and the Sangguniang Bayan.
5. May recommend suspension or cancellation of activities during hazardous weather or disaster alerts.

E. Municipal Environment and Eco-Tourism Office (MEETO).

1. Issues Environmental Clearances for selling areas and fireworks display sites.
2. Ensures compliance with environmental safeguards, including waste segregation and cleanup.
3. Conducts environmental monitoring before, during, and after the Christmas & New Year period or other festivities involving pyrotechnics.
4. Evaluates and approves Environmental Management and Cleanup Plans submitted by sellers and event organizers.
5. Ensures that eco-tourism sites and sensitive areas (e.g., Kalanggaman Island, Tabuk Marine Park, coastal and mangrove zones) are protected from firecracker-related activities.
6. May recommend sanctions, fines, or revocation of permits for environmental violations.

F. Business Permits and Licensing Office (BPLO).

1. Processes applications for Municipal Permits under this Ordinance.
2. Maintains the Municipal Registry of Licensed Dealers, Retailers, Pyrotechnicians, and Fireworks Display Permits, as required under Section 9(F).
3. Ensures that all national license requirements under RA 7183 are submitted and verified.
4. Coordinates with BFP, PNP, MDRRMO, and MEETO before releasing any permit.

G. Barangays. (Barangay Officials, Tanods and other appointed employees)

1. Assist in surveillance and enforcement within their respective barangays.
2. Report any illegal sale, storage, transport, or use of firecrackers.
3. Support crowd control and safety perimeters during barangay-level events.
4. Coordinate directly with the BFP, PNP, MDRRMO, and MEETO for any firecracker-related incident.

H. Inter-Agency Coordination.

1. The BFP, PNP, MDRRMO, MEETO, BPLO, and Barangays shall coordinate through a unified monitoring system to ensure real-time reporting and emergency response.
2. Joint inspection teams may be created during peak seasons for intensified enforcement.

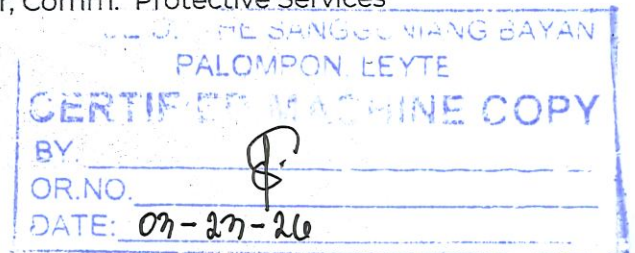

With the presence of the Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (MDRRMO), Bureau of Fire Protection (BFP), Philippine National Police (PNP), Municipal Environment and Eco-Tourism Office (MEETO), Business Permits and Licensing Office (BPLO), Educational Institutions and Civil Society Organization (CSO), and other stakeholders, the public hearing was called to order at exactly 9:41 A.M. and commenced with an opening prayer led by Mr. Dario Raymundo, followed by the singing of the National Anthem and Palompon Hymn by the sound system.

The Municipal Vice Mayor, Hon. Javes Keith R. de la Calzada, opened the public hearing by expressing his gratitude to all the visitors and participants who took the time to attend. He then gave an overview and a brief insight into the purpose and scope of the discussion, emphasizing the importance of regulating the sale, distribution, and use of firecrackers and fireworks in Palompon to ensure public safety, environmental protection, and orderly community celebrations.

The hearing was presided over by Vice Mayor de la Calzada, the Overall Presiding Officer of the Sangguniang Bayan, in coordination with the Committee on Protective Services together with the participation of other concerned committees of the Sangguniang Bayan. He underscored the legislative intent of the proposed ordinance to establish clear safety guidelines, designate firecracker zones, align local practices with national laws such as R.A. 7183, and prevent fire incidents, injuries, noise disturbances, and environmental hazards commonly experienced during holiday celebrations.

During the presentation of the proposed ordinance, the key provisions were introduced, including the regulation of authorized sellers, requirements prior to issuance of business permits, designation of safe-use areas, prohibited acts, penalties, and responsibilities of concerned offices.

The Presiding Officer then opened the floor for comments, questions, and recommendations.

The following points were raised:

- Community Safety: Ms. Valenzona (CSO) recommended extending enforcement to barangay levels to improve compliance.
