ORDINANCE NO. 2026-05

AN ORDINANCE PRESCRIBING LOCALIZED GUIDELINES ON THE SUSPENSION OR CANCELLATION OF CLASSES IN SCHOOLS AND WORK IN GOVERNMENT OFFICES DURING DISASTERS AND CALAMITIES IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF HINDANG, PROVINCE OF LEYTE

EXPLANATORY NOTE

Disasters and emergencies place individuals in situations beyond their personal control, exposing them to risks that threaten life, safety, health, and property. While international human rights instruments may not expressly enumerate a specific “right to disaster relief,” such protection is inherent in the right to life and the right to an adequate standard of living – rights that remain enforceable even during crises.

Governments, regardless of resource constraints, are duty-bound to take timely and appropriate action to protect lives and ensure public safety. Disaster risk reduction and mitigation are not acts of charity, but obligations rooted in constitutional principles, social justice, and the social contract between the State and the people.

The 1987 Philippine Constitution mandates the State to protect life, liberty, and property, and to promote the general welfare. In line with this, the State has adopted policies institutionalizing disaster risk reduction and management (DRRM) from the national down to the local level, recognizing the importance of local risk patterns and strengthening local government capacity through decentralization.

Key national agencies such as the Philippine Atmospheric, Geophysical and Astronomical Services Administration (PAGASA) and the Philippine Institute of Volcanology and Seismology (PHIVOLCS) play vital roles in hazard monitoring and issuance of advisories for public safety. Likewise, the Department of Education (DepEd) has issued updated policies governing class and work suspension in schools to protect learners and school personnel while ensuring continuity of learning.

On 23 December 2024, the Department of Education issued DepEd Order No. 022, s. 2024, entitled “Guidelines on Class and Work Suspension in Schools During Disasters and Emergencies,” emphasizing that learner and personnel safety remain paramount while also promoting uninterrupted learning through flexible learning delivery modalities such as online, modular, or blended learning whenever feasible.

Pursuant to Republic Act No. 7160 (Local Government Code of 1991), the Sangguniang Bayan is empowered to enact ordinances necessary to protect the welfare of its constituents, including measures to reduce exposure to hazards and protect residents from the effects of natural and human-induced disasters.

The Municipality of Hindang, located in Eastern Visayas—a region historically vulnerable to typhoons, flooding, earthquakes, storm surges, and other hazards—requires clear and localized rules to avoid confusion and ensure timely decisions during emergencies, especially in the context of rapidly circulating information through social media.

This Ordinance therefore establishes a uniform and responsive framework for the suspension or cancellation of classes and work in the Municipality of Hindang during disasters and emergencies, ensuring coordinated action, authoritative communication, protection of learners, educators, government employees, and the general public, and continuity of essential public services.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Sangguniang Bayan of Hindang, Leyte, in session duly assembled, that:

**SECTION 1. TITLE.** This Ordinance shall be known as the *"Hindang Policy on the suspension or cancellation of classes and work during disasters and emergencies Ordinance"*

**SECTION 2. DECLARATION OF POLICY.** It is hereby declared the policy of the Municipality of Hindang to prioritize the safety and welfare of learners, teaching and non-teaching school personnel, government employees, and the general public by establishing clear and localized procedures for the suspension or cancellation of classes and work during disasters, calamities, and emergency situations, while promoting learning continuity through appropriate Alternative Delivery Modes (ADMs) whenever feasible.

**SECTION 3. COVERAGE.** This Ordinance prescribes local guidelines for the suspension or cancellation of classes and work applicable to:

- A. All public and private schools, including day care centers, community learning centers, and institutions offering Kindergarten to Grade 12 education;
- B. DepEd-operated Community Learning Centers under the Alternative Learning System (ALS);
- C. Colleges, private higher education institutions, and technical-vocational and training centers; and
- D. All offices of the Municipal Government of Hindang and national government agencies operating within its jurisdiction.

Hazards covered include typhoons, heavy rainfall, flooding, earthquakes, low air quality/vog, extreme heat conditions, and other emergencies. Other hazards shall be subject to determination by the Local Chief Executive/Municipal Mayor upon recommendation of the MDRRMC and other competent authorities.

**SECTION 4. DEFINITION OF TERMS.**

A. **Disaster** - refers to a serious event that disrupts the normal life of a community and causes widespread harm to people, property, and the environment. It happens when a hazard affects vulnerable areas and the community has limited ability to cope. Its effects may include loss of life, injuries, sickness, emotional and social stress, damage to homes and facilities, disruption of services, economic losses, and environmental damage.

B. **Flood Warning** - refers to an official advisory issued when flooding is imminent or expected to occur, generally at least twenty-four (24) hours before the anticipated flooding event.

C. **Frontline Workers** - refer to government officers and employees tasked to provide emergency response, disaster management, security, and other essential public services during disasters or emergencies.

D. **Hazards** - refer to natural or human-induced events that may cause loss of life, injury, damage to property, social and economic disruption, or environmental degradation, including but not limited to earthquakes, fires, typhoons, floods, landslides, heavy rainfall, drought, epidemic, industrial accidents, and similar events.

E. **Alternative Delivery Modes (ADMs)** - refer to learning delivery approaches used to ensure continuity of learning during disruptions, including online distance learning, modular distance learning, blended learning, performance tasks, projects, or make-up classes, as may be provided in the Learning and Service Continuity Plan (LSCP).

F. **Public Official** - refers to any person who performs public functions by virtue of law, election, or appointment, and is tasked with the implementation or enforcement of this Ordinance.

G. **Schools** - refer to all educational institutions at all levels, including day care centers, community learning centers, elementary and secondary schools, ALS learning centers, and colleges within the Municipality of Hindang.

H. **School Head** - refers to the person exercising administrative and instructional supervision over a school or learning center, including principals, administrators, or presidents, as applicable.

**SECTION 5. GUIDELINES FOR SUSPENSION OR CANCELLATION OF CLASSES AND WORK IN PUBLIC AND PRIVATE PRE-SCHOOL, ELEMENTARY, SECONDARY, DAY CARE, AND COMMUNITY LEARNING CENTERS (K-12 AND ALS)**

The following guidelines shall apply to the suspension of face-to-face classes and work in schools for Kindergarten to Grade 12 and ALS, consistent with DepEd Order No. 022, series of 2024:

**A. Typhoons and Tropical Cyclones**

1. TCWS 1 - Face-to-face classes for Kindergarten are automatically suspended. Kindergarten learners shall not report to school for face-to-face classes. Kindergarten teachers and personnel shall not be required to report on-site, unless assigned to essential duties.

2. TCWS 2 - Face-to-face classes for Kindergarten to Junior High School (Grade 10) are automatically suspended. Covered learners shall not report to school for face-to-face classes. Teachers and personnel shall not be required to report on-site, unless assigned to essential duties. ADMs may be implemented when feasible, based on the LSCP.

3. TCWS 3 or higher - Classes and work in schools at all levels are automatically suspended. All learners, teaching and non-teaching personnel shall not report on-site, except those teaching and non-teaching personnel assigned to essential duties for safety, security, and disaster response.

4. If TCWS is raised after classes have begun, the school shall immediately suspend classes and work and send learners and personnel home if safe. If travel is unsafe, schools shall keep learners and personnel secure within school premises.

5. In cases where PAGASA has not issued any typhoon signal, the Local Chief Executive may still order the suspension or cancellation of classes and work in schools, upon the recommendation of the Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (DRRMC) and in coordination with PAGASA and the Office of Civil Defense (OCD), particularly in flood-prone or high-risk areas, or when strong winds are experienced in specific or all parts of the Municipality of Hindang that are not associated with a tropical cyclone.

**B. Heavy Rainfall and Flooding**

1. Yellow Rainfall Warning / Alarm Water Level (Flooding) - Suspension shall be localized based on risk assessment. The Schools Division Superintendent (SDS), through proper coordination with the LGU, may recommend localized suspension. The Local Chief Executive (LCE) shall decide on the suspension of face-to-face classes and work in schools, with learning continuity measures implemented when feasible based on LSCP when PAGASA issues a Yellow Rainfall Warning affecting the LGU, or when continuous or heavy rains are experienced in specific or all areas of the locality even without an official rainfall alert from PAGASA.

2. Orange or Red Rainfall Warning / Critical Water Level (Flooding):

a. If issued before classes start - classes and work in schools from Kindergarten to Grade 12 and ALS are automatically suspended.

b. If issued after classes start - the school head shall immediately suspend classes and work and send everyone home if safe, or keep them safely in school if travel is unsafe.

**C. Earthquakes (PHIVOLCS Intensity)**

1. Intensity VI and above- Classes and work at all levels, including ALS, shall be automatically suspended.

2. Intensity V and below- The Local Chief Executive shall decide on the suspension of face-to-face classes and work. For localized suspensions, the SDS shall coordinate with the LGU, provided that schools will shift to ADMs based on their LSCP, where feasible.

3. College administrators or school heads may suspend classes at any intensity level if, based on their assessment, school buildings or other structures are unsafe or have sustained significant damage.

4. The Head of the School Disaster Risk Reduction and Management (DRRM) Team shall be responsible for clearing and certifying the safety of buildings and structures prior to the return of students and personnel.

**D. Extreme Heat Conditions**

There shall be no automatic suspension due to extreme heat. However, the Local Chief Executive, upon coordination with the SDS and assessment of conditions, may order localized suspension when heat poses risks to health and safety.

**E. Low Air Quality / Vog (Volcanic Fog).** Suspension shall depend on the PM 2.5 Air Quality Index as reported by the DENR-EMB:

1. **Acutely Unhealthy (Purple)** - The Local Chief Executive shall decide on localized suspension, upon coordination with the SDS, with learning continuity measures implemented when feasible.

2. **Emergency (Maroon)** - Classes and work in schools shall be automatically suspended.

**F. Power Outages / Brownouts**

There shall be no automatic suspension due to power interruption. However, school heads may recommend localized suspension if power interruption lasts more than half of the school day and conditions become unsafe or not conducive to learning, subject to coordination with the LCE and SDS.

**SECTION 6. LOCALIZED OR GRANULAR SUSPENSION AUTHORITY**

In emergencies not listed in Section 5, or when localized hazards threaten safety, notwithstanding the absence of a warning or advisory from the Philippine Atmospheric, Geophysical and Astronomical Services Administration (PAGASA) or a formal declaration from the Local Government Unit, School Heads or District/Division Alternative Learning System (ALS) Coordinators are hereby authorized to order the localized or granular suspension of face to-face classes and on-site school-based work when, based on their assessment, conditions pose risks to the safety of learners and school personnel. This authority may be exercised particularly in, but not limited to, mountainous or upland areas, schools located near rivers or waterways, and communities with roads, bridges, or access routes that are unsafe or impassable due to adverse weather or other hazardous conditions.

Any suspension declared under this Section shall be immediately reported to and coordinated with the Local Chief Executive (LCE) and the Schools Division Superintendent (SDS). When feasible, learning continuity measures through Alternative Delivery Modes (ADMs) may be implemented in accordance with the school's Learning and Service Continuity Plan (LSCP).

**SECTION 7. GUIDELINES ON SUSPENSION OR CANCELLATION OF CLASSES AND WORK IN COLLEGES, TECHNICAL-VOCATIONAL, AND OTHER TRAINING CENTERS**

The following guidelines shall apply to colleges, SUCs/LUCs, private higher education institutions, and technical-vocational and training centers within Hindang:

A. The Municipal Mayor, upon recommendation of the MDRRMC and in coordination with concerned school administrators, may order suspension of face-to-face classes and work in these institutions during disasters and emergencies.

B. These institutions are encouraged to adopt DepEd-recommended learning continuity measures, including online learning, modular learning, blended learning, performance tasks, projects, and make-up classes, where feasible.

C. School administrators may declare localized suspension when safety risks exist, including unsafe structures, flooding, severe weather, or other emergencies.

**SECTION 8. CANCELLATION OR SUSPENSION OF WORK IN GOVERNMENT OFFICES**

1. Work in all departments and offices of the Municipal Government of Hindang, including national government agencies within the municipality, shall be automatically cancelled or suspended whenever TCWS No. 3 or higher is issued by PAGASA.

2. Work in government offices shall likewise be automatically cancelled when PAGASA issues a Red Rainfall Warning and/or when flooding conditions reach critical levels, as assessed by the MDRRMC.

3. Work shall be automatically cancelled when PHIVOLCS declares an earthquake intensity of VI (Six) or higher.

4. In cases of earthquake intensity V (Five) and below, the Local Chief Executive may order suspension of work when structures are assessed to be unsafe or at risk of collapse.

5. Employees classified as frontline or emergency workers shall continue to report for duty as directed, subject to safety protocols and issuance of a skeletal workforce arrangement.

**SECTION 9. DISCRETIONARY CANCELLATION AND REVERSION OF SUSPENSION.** Any declaration of suspension shall be issued on a day-to-day basis and shall apply only to the date stated in the official announcement. The Local Chief Executive may revoke or lift the suspension when conditions warrant the resumption of classes or work.

**SECTION 10. MAINTENANCE OF WORKFORCE AND ACTIVATION OF DRRM TEAMS.** Teaching and non-teaching school personnel, including ALS teachers, shall not be required to report on-site during suspensions, except those assigned to essential duties involving security, safety, finance, engineering, sanitation, health, and disaster response, consistent with applicable DepEd and CSC policies.

Schools shall activate DRRM Teams for preparedness, monitoring, and response. DRRM coordinators, engineers, and designated personnel may be required to report after disasters for inspection, validation, assessment, and coordination activities.




Personnel rendering service during work suspension shall be entitled to appropriate compensation such as overtime pay or Vacation Service Credits, subject to existing rules.

Private school administrators shall exercise discretion in determining work arrangements for their DRRM personnel.


Government offices involved in DRRM shall maintain essential operations through a skeletal workforce as determined by office heads, to ensure continuity of critical public services.

**SECTION 11. RESPONSIBILITY OF PARENTS OR GUARDIANS.** Parents or legal guardians shall bear the primary responsibility of deciding whether their children should attend classes during disasters or calamities, taking into account the physical and mental well-being of the learner, even in the absence of an official declaration suspending classes. Parents or guardians shall likewise ensure that their children are able to make up for missed lessons and attain the required learning competencies as may be necessary.

**SECTION 12. CONSIDERATION FOR STUDENTS AND LEARNING CONTINUITY.** Learners affected by class suspensions shall be given due consideration and opportunities to complete missed lessons through ADMs, learning recovery measures, or make-up classes, subject to feasibility. Schools and teachers shall consider limitations such as unstable connectivity and access to learning resources.

**SECTION 13. LEARNING AND SERVICE CONTINUITY PLAN (LSCP).** All public schools shall develop, review, and update their Learning and Service Continuity Plan (LSCP) in accordance with DepEd guidelines, including identification of suitable ADMs, learning resources, procedures for mobilization, stakeholder engagement, return plans, communication protocols, and assessment of effectiveness.

**SECTION 14. ROLE OF BARANGAYS.** The Barangay Disaster Risk Reduction and Management (BDRRMCs) shall maintain close coordination with the Municipal Mayor and MDRRMC on conditions within barangays. The Local Chief Executive may declare suspension of classes and work in specific barangays when warranted by localized risk.

**SECTION 15. ANNOUNCEMENT.** All official notices on suspension or cancellation of classes and work shall be issued upon the authority of the Local Chief Executive and disseminated through official channels of the Municipal Government. The Office of Barangay Affairs/ABC shall ensure timely relay of announcements to all barangays.

**SECTION 16. IMPLEMENTING AGENCIES.** The Municipal Government of Hindang, in coordination with DepEd Schools Division, CHED, TESDA, and other concerned agencies, shall implement and enforce this Ordinance.

**SECTION 17. AUTOMATIC CONFORMITY TO UPDATED NATIONAL GUIDELINES.** This Ordinance shall be interpreted and implemented in conformity with existing and future issuances of the Department of Education (DepEd), NDRRMC, PAGASA, PHIVOLCS, OCD, CSC, and other competent government authorities relating to the suspension or cancellation of classes and work during disasters and emergencies. In case of inconsistency, the latest applicable national issuance shall prevail and shall be applied as part of the implementation of this Ordinance.

**SECTION 18. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE.** If any provision of this Ordinance is declared invalid, the remaining provisions shall remain in full force and effect.

**SECTION 19. REPEALING CLAUSE.** All ordinances, rules, regulations, and issuances inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

**SECTION 20. EFFECTIVITY.** This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon approval and compliance with posting and publication requirements under existing laws.


