853 Thank you, Mr. Chair. Thank you, Mr. Floor Leader. My esteemed colleagues, thank
854 you very much.

855 I would like to address agenda Item no. 42 regarding the letter from DILG Leyte
856 Provincial Office requesting this body to submit the timeline of actions undertaken relative to the
857 administrative appeal filed by Honorable Basilio de Calda of Barangay Cabuloran Dagami, Leyte
858 together with the corresponding supporting documents. Mr. Chair, this matter was referred to
859 the Blue Ribbon Committee and after a careful review of the records and the applicable rules
860 the Committee respectfully submits its findings and recommendation. At the outset, the

861 Committee finds that the Sangguniang Panlalawigan acted continuously on the appeal from the
862 time it was filed. The timeline as shown on the screen reflects that the case was received referred
863 evaluated and acted upon through Committee proceedings and directives. However, the
864 Committee likewise found that the progression of the case was contingent upon the transmittal
865 of the complete records from the Sanguniang Bayan of the Dagami under Section 44, Rule 16
866 of the Revised Internal Rules of Procedure. The transmittal of complete records is a mandatory
867 procedural prerequisite before full appellate review may validly proceed. As such, the case could
868 not yet be fully resolved pending completion of the evidentiary records necessary for proper
869 appellate review. Upon compliance and receipt of the complete records on March 19, 2026, the
870 case has since moved forward to the appellate stage including the issuance of notices and
871 orders for the filing of briefs in accordance with our Revised Internal Rules of Procedure. Further,
872 Mr. Chair, the Committee deems it necessary to qualify that the suspension being referred to in
873 the DILG letter is not preventive in nature but a penalty imposed after adjudication on the merits
874 by the Sanguniang Bayan of the Dagami which is now under review by this appellate body.
875 Accordingly, the committee prepared a comprehensive timeline together with a draft letter reply
876 to formally respond to the DILG request and clarify the status of the case.

882 Mr. Chair, as shown on the screen the timeline reflects 3 phases in handling of the case.

883 First phase, the initial action phase which runs from September 29 upon the receipt of the notice

884 of appeal up to January, that this committee conducted evaluation legal research as well as

885 verification of records. At this stage it was already determined that essential records were

886 missing and the case was not yet right for adjudication. In short, in the initial action phase the

887 SP immediately but the records were incomplete. From February to March are the compliance

888 phase. The committee recommended and the SP issued a directive requiring the SB of Dagami

889 to transmit the complete records. This was personally served to ensure compliance. On March

890 19, the complete 527-page-rollo was finally transmitted. In short, in this compliance phase the

891 SP compelled compliance and the records were completed. This last stage from March onwards
892 is what we now say the appellate phase. Upon receipt of the complete records, the case was
893 calendared the parties were notified and given access to records and orders were issued for the
894 filing of the appellants and appellees brief. The case is now in the proper appellate stage and
895 ready for resolution on the merits upon filing of the appellees brief or about 60 days from the
896 time the orders were received. In short, right now orders have already been issued for a tenant
897 to file his brief within 30 days from receipt of notice. Once the appellee has received the appellant
898 brief, he is again given 30 days to file Appellee's brief. In our Rules of Internal Procedure, it says
899 "failure to file the briefs in the stated period is deemed a waiver". Therefore, whether briefs will
900 be filed or not the case will be finally decided, after the completion of the 30 day period.

913 Dear Director Dorado:

914 This refers to your letter dated 15 April 2026, requesting this Office to provide the timeline of actions
915 undertaken by the Sangguniang Panlalawigan relative to the Notice of Appeal filed by Punong
916 Barangay Basilio D. Calda, as well as the submission of supporting documents.

917 In compliance therewith, we respectfully submit the following:

918 **I. SUBMISSION OF TIMELINE AND DOCUMENTS**

919 Attached herewith is the comprehensive timeline of actions undertaken by the Sangguniang
920 Panlalawigan from the receipt of the Notice of Appeal on 29 September 2025 up to the present,
921 together with copies of the corresponding documents forming part of the records.

922 **II. CLARIFICATION ON THE NATURE OF SUSPENSION**

923 It is respectfully clarified that the characterization of the suspension of Punong Barangay Basilio D.
924 Calda as a "prolonged preventive suspension" is inaccurate.

925 Records show that the suspension imposed by the Sangguniang Bayan of Dagami was rendered after
926 adjudication on the merits of the administrative complaints, and therefore constitutes a penalty of
927 suspension, not a preventive suspension pending investigation.

928 Jurisprudence and administrative law consistently distinguish:

- 929 • Preventive suspension – a temporary measure pending investigation; and
- 930 • Suspension as penalty – imposed after a finding of administrative liability.

931 Thus, the suspension subject of appeal is a disciplinary sanction, the validity of which is now under
932 review by this Honorable Body.

933 Further, while jurisprudence recognizes the concept of preventive suspension pending appeal, such
934 classification is relevant only in determining the effects of suspension (e.g., crediting or compensation)
935 and does not alter the fundamental nature of a suspension imposed as a result of a decision on the
936 merits.

937 **III. STATUS OF THE APPEAL**

938 The Notice of Appeal filed by the appellant was duly received by this Office.

939 Pursuant to applicable rules, the elevation of the complete records from the originating Sangguniang
940 Bayan is necessary to enable the Sangguniang Panlalawigan to properly exercise its appellate
941 jurisdiction.

942 While an Order directing the transmittal of records was issued, it bears noting that the elevation of
943 records is a ministerial duty of the originating office, and the completion of the appellate process is
944 necessarily dependent on the submission of such records or certified copies thereof.

945 In the interim, the parties are not precluded under the rules from submitting certified copies of pleadings
946 and documents to facilitate appellate review.

947 Subsequent compliance by the originating office has since completed the records, allowing the appeal
948 to proceed.

949 All actions undertaken are consistent with the Sangguniang Panlalawigan's Internal Rules of Procedure
950 governing appeals.

951 **IV. GOOD FAITH AND COMPLIANCE**

952 The Sangguniang Panlalawigan has acted in good faith and within the bounds of its procedural rules,
953 and continues to take appropriate steps to ensure the proper disposition of the appeal in accordance
954 with law.

955 There is no intent to delay, and all actions undertaken are in furtherance of ensuring that the case is
956 resolved on the basis of a complete and proper record, consistent with due process.

957 **V. CONCLUSION**

958 In view of the foregoing, we respectfully submit that:

- 959 1. The suspension in question is not preventive in nature, but a penalty imposed after adjudication;
- 960 2. The appeal remains pending for proper resolution, the records having been completed and the
961 case now proceeding in accordance with applicable rules; and
- 962 3. The Sangguniang Panlalawigan has undertaken appropriate procedural actions consistent with
963 governing rules.

1008 • **Finding:** Failure to ensure release of compensation
1009 • **Penalty: Five (5) months suspension**

1010 **5. Marites O. Aurillo (Barangay Health Worker)**

- 1011 • **Allegations:** Delay and withholding of honoraria
1012 • **Finding:** Failure to act on release of benefits

- 1013 • **Penalty: Five (5) months suspension**

1015 **DECISION OF SB DAGAMI**

1016 In its Decision dated 28 August 2025, the Sangguniang Bayan of Dagami:

- 1017 • Found respondent GUILTY of Grave Misconduct and Neglect of Duty
1018 • Imposed an aggregate penalty of twenty-six (26) months suspension, subject to legal
1019 limitations

1055 **B. FINDING OF THE COMMITTEE**

1056 The records clearly establish that:

- 1057 • A Decision was already rendered (28 August 2025)
1058 • A penalty of suspension (26 months) was imposed
1059 • The case is now on appeal before the Sangguniang Panlalawigan

1060

1061 **C. LEGAL DISTINCTION**

1063 Jurisprudential law¹ establishes a clear-cut distinction between suspension as preventive
1064 measure and suspension as penalty. The distinction, by considering the purpose aspect of the
1065 suspensions, is readily cognizable as they have different ends sought to be achieved.
1066

1067 Preventive suspension is merely a preventive measure, a preliminary step in an administrative
1068 investigation. The purpose of the suspension order is to prevent the accused from using his
1069 position and the powers and prerogatives of his office to influence potential witnesses or
1070 tamper with records which may be vital in the prosecution of the case against him.² If after
1071 such investigation, the charge is established and the person investigated is found guilty of acts
1072 warranting his suspension or removal, then he is suspended, removed or dismissed. This is
1073 the penalty.³

1074 In any case, the concept of preventive suspension pending appeal does not apply herein, as
1075 the records do not show that such a separate order was issued; rather, the suspension being
1076 served arises from the decision on the merits.

1077 **D. COMMITTEE DETERMINATION**

1078 The suspension in this case is:

- 1079 • NOT preventive suspension
- 1080 • BUT a disciplinary penalty imposed after adjudication

1081 The allegation of "prolonged preventive suspension" is not supported by the records and
1082 applicable law.
1083

1084 **VI. ON THE ALLEGED DELAY**

1085 The Committee finds:

- 1086 • The SP acted continuously and diligently
- 1087 • Any delay was due to:
 - 1088 ○ Non-transmittal of complete records
 - 1089 ○ Need to complete the evidentiary rollo

1090 The records show that the Sangguniang Panlalawigan continuously acted on the appeal. Any
1091 lapse in the progression of the case was primarily due to the non-transmittal of complete
1092 records by the originating Sangguniang Bayan, which is a prerequisite for full appellate review.
1093 The SP's Revised Internal Rules of Procedure provides:

1094 **Section 44. Order of Transmittal of Records.** If the records of the case are not received by the
1095 Sangguniang Panlalawigan within 30 calendar days after the notice of appeal shall have been filed, the
1096 appellee may, upon notice to the appellant, move the Sangguniang Panlalawigan to grant an order
1097 directing the Municipal Secretary forthwith to transmit such records or to declare the same abandoned
1098 for failure to prosecute. However, within such 30-day period, the appellant may submit to the Sangguniang
1099 Panlalawigan a certified copy of each of the pleadings, motions or papers filed with or submitted to the
1100 Sangguniang Bayan in connection with the appealed administrative case in lieu of the records of the
1101 case. In either case, the appellant shall cause the reproduction of the records or the certified copies
1102 thereof in such number of copies as there are appellees plus fifteen (15) copies and electronic or soft
1103 copy for the Sangguniang Panlalawigan.

1104 **Legal Justification**

1105 The Committee finds that the procedural handling of the appeal is consistent with Section 44
1106 of the applicable rules governing appeals from decisions of the Sangguniang Bayan. Under
1107 said provision, upon the filing of a Notice of Appeal, it is the ministerial duty of the Municipal
1108 Secretary to transmit the complete records of the case to the Sangguniang Panlalawigan within
1109 thirty (30) calendar days. However, the same rule explicitly provides safeguards in instances
1110 of non-transmittal, allowing the appellant to submit certified true copies of the pleadings,

1111 motions, and relevant documents in lieu of the original records, thereby ensuring that the
1112 appeal is not defeated by procedural delays beyond the control of the parties.

1113 While the non-transmittal of complete records formed part of the circumstances affecting the
1114 progression of the appeal, the governing rules provide remedies, including the filing of a motion
1115 for transmittal or submission of certified copies in lieu thereof. Notwithstanding these
1116 circumstances, the appellate process ultimately proceeded upon completion of the official
1117 records.

1118 VII. ON JURISDICTION

1119 The Committee affirms:

- 1120 • The case is under appellate jurisdiction of the SP
- 1121 • Proceedings are active and ongoing
- 1122 • The issue raised before DILG is mischaracterized

1123 VIII. ATTACHMENTS

1124 Relevant documents forming part of the official records are attached for compliance.
1125

1126 IX. COMMITTEE EVALUATION

1127 The Committee concludes:

1128 The case involves substantiated complaints adjudicated by SB Dagami.

1129 The SP has acted with due diligence and procedural compliance.

1130 The allegation before DILG is based on a mischaracterization of the suspension.

1131 The matter is properly within SP's appellate jurisdiction.
1132

1133 X. RECOMMENDATION

1134 **WHEREFORE, premises considered**, the Committee respectfully recommends that the
1135 Sangguniang Panlalawigan:

- 1136
- 1137 1. NOTE AND ADOPT this Committee Report and Annex "A" with all its attachments;
- 1138 2. APPROVE and AUTHORIZE THE TRANSMITTAL OF THE OFFICIAL REPLY TO DILG
1139 including:
 - 1140 • Timeline
 - 1141 • Supporting annexes
- 1142 3. DIRECT CONTINUATION OF PROCEEDINGS for the expeditious resolution of the
1143 appeal.
1144

1145 XI. CONCLUSION

1146 The Committee finds that:

- 1147 • The SP acted lawfully, diligently, and continuously.
- 1148 • The suspension is a penalty, not preventive.
- 1149 • The issue raised before DILG appears to stem from a mischaracterization of the
1150 nature of the suspension.
- 1151 • The case is properly under appellate review.
1152

1153 The proceedings undertaken reflect adherence to due process and cannot be construed as
1154 inaction, but rather as the necessary compliance with procedural requirements for proper
1155 appellate review.
