AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE BAYBAY CITY, LEYTE BANTAY AFRICAN SWINE FEVER (ASF) PROGRAM, PROVIDING MEASURES FOR THE PREVENTION, CONTROL, AND MONITORING OF AFRICAN SWINE FEVER AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Jose L. Bacusmo, Romulo B. Alcala, Carmen L. Cari, Jules Lucas C. Cari, and Ramon Ronald J. Veloso

WHEREAS, Section 16 of the Local Government Code states that every Local Government Unit shall exercise the powers expressly granted, those necessarily implied therefrom, as well as powers necessary, appropriate, or incidental for its efficient and effective governance, and those which are essential to the promotion of the general welfare;

WHEREAS, Section 468 (4)(v); Section 458 (5)(xii); and Section 447 (5)(xii) of the Local Government Code authorizes the Sangguniang Panlungsod to approve measures and adopt quarantine regulations to prevent the introduction and spread of diseases within its territorial jurisdiction;

WHEREAS, the African Swine Fever (ASF), a high-impact trans boundary animal disease (TAD), continues to affect the swine production sector of the Philippines with no known cure to date; resulting in an industry estimate of 36% reduction of national swine inventory impacting both livelihood and agriculture economy;

WHEREAS, the Department of Agriculture (DA) issued Administrative Circular No. 12 (s. 2019) or the "National Zoning and Movement Plan for the Prevention and Control of ASF" provides for the movement protocols through classification of the country into various zones in an effort to manage, contain and control the ASF virus;

WHEREAS, DA Administrative Order No. 6 (s. 2021) states the guidelines on the recovery, rehabilitation and repopulation program for ASF-affected and Non-ASF Affected Areas facilitating the recovery of the swine industry in the country;

WHEREAS, the Department of Agriculture, likewise, issued DA Administrative Order No. 7 (s. 2021) or the "Implementing Guidelines for the Bantay ASF Program" to empower local government officials including those in the barangays on their roles in the disease control programs of the government at the grassroots level for timely detection, management, control and prevention of spread of any diseases, particularly the ASF;

WHEREAS, successful control effort lies on strong collaboration among the Department of Agriculture, its concerned agencies, the Local Government

Units (LGU), and other stakeholders taking ownership of such program, benefiting the growers;

WHEREAS, Section 6 of DA Administrative Order No. 7 (s. 2021) Implementing Guidelines for the "Bantay ASF Program" reiterates the strengthening and institutionalization of LGU Engagement in the implementation of the Bantay ASF Program;

WHEREAS, Proclamation No. 1143 has been issued by the Office of the President, declaring a State of Calamity throughout the Philippines due to the ASF outbreak, for a duration of one (1) year, which may be shortened or extended as deemed necessary. Through this proclamation, all government agencies and LGUs are enjoined to: render full assistance and cooperation with each other; mobilize necessary resources to undertake critical, urgent, and appropriate measures in a timely manner to curtail the further spread of ASF; address the supply deficit in pork products and reduce retail prices; and jumpstart the rehabilitation of the local hog industry.

WHEREAS, to ensure the sustainability of the Bantay ASF Program in the City of Baybay, it is imperative that such program shall be adopted and implemented through the enactment of an ordinance;

NOW THEREFORE, pursuant to the above-cited provisions of the Local Government Code and several issuances of the Department of Agriculture and to prevent and control the spread of ASF, and thereby facilitate the recovery of the hog sector, be it ordained by the 7th Sangguniang Panlungsod of the City of Baybay that:

SECTION 1. TITLE. This Ordinance shall be known as the "BAYBAY CITY, LEYTE BANTAY ASF PROGRAM".

SECTION 2. APPLICABILITY AND LIMITATION. This Ordinance shall apply only when there is a declaration of an ASF infection in the City or any of its Barangay and shall cease when the declaration has been lifted or terminated.

SECTION 3. OBJECTIVES. The objectives of this Ordinance are as follows:

- a. Strengthen and institutionalize the City Government's engagement for ASF prevention and control;
- b. Establish an effective ASF monitoring, surveillance and reporting system;
- c. Strengthen biosecurity measures at the farm level and border control;
- d. Intensify awareness campaigns and other capacity-building activities;
- e. Assist in the recovery and repopulation of previously affected areas; and
- f. Generate and mobilize resources for an effective implementation of the program.

SECTION 4. Definition of Terms. For the purpose of implementing the provisions of this Ordinance, the following terms shall apply:

- a. African swine fever (ASF) - is a severe viral disease that affects all breeds of domestic and wild swine in the country and has already caused grave production and economic losses in many parts of the country.
- b. Biosecurity Level 1 - refers to the level of farm biosecurity in compliance with the minimum standards set by the Philippine College of Swine Practitioners (PCSP).
- c. *Paalima* - pertains to the system of rearing animals in some areas in the community whereby the care and management of a few animals are delegated to individuals in a community.

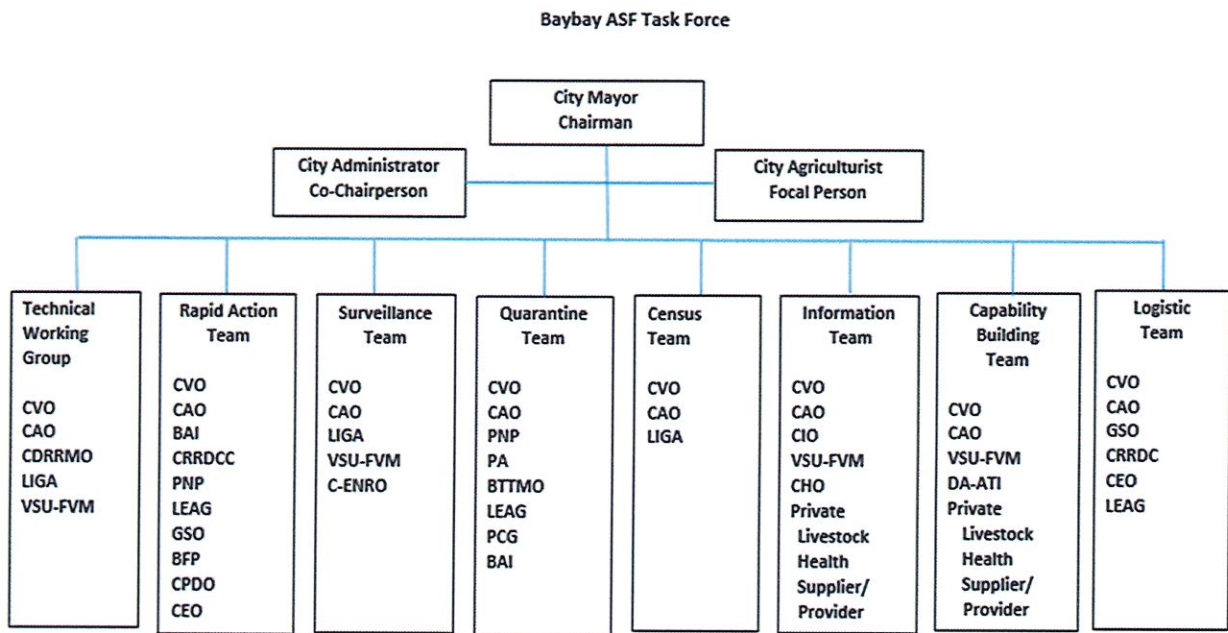

- d. Small-hold Farm – refers to swine farms falling under any of the following:
- With 20 heads of adult swine or fewer and zero head of young;
 - With 40 heads of young swine or fewer; or
 - With 9 heads of adult swine or fewer and 21 head of young swine or fewer. Young swine refers to suckling swine which are a month old or less and adult swine refer to weaned swine.
- e. Commercial Farm - is a farm category for any farm with a swine population that exceeds the definition of a small-hold farm. In high-density areas, commercial farms are further classified into:
- Semi-commercial Farm - refer to swine farms with at least: 10 to 50 heads of sow; or 41 to 500 heads fattener.
 - Full Commercial Farm - refer to swine farms with: 51 heads of sow or more; or 501 heads of fattener or more.
- f. RT-PCR-based test - refers to a highly sensitive laboratory technique which is a frontline test for outbreak investigations and routine diagnostics for determining the presence of ASF virus.

SECTION 5. CREATION OF THE BAYBAB ASF TASK FORCE. The Baybay ASF Task Force is hereby created and shall be constituted as follows;

The City Mayor, as chairperson, may appoint additional members or may remove members of the Task Force as he may deem fit.

SECTION 6. FUNCTIONS OF THE BAYBAY ASF TASK FORCE. The Baybay ASF Task Force shall be the primary unit in the LGU tasks to oversee the implementation of the Baybay City, Leyte Bantay ASF Program whose functions include, but not limited, to the following

- a. Formulate plans, programs and policies for the ASF prevention and control measures in the City;
- b. Initiate and coordinate all ASF-related activities including quick response, disease investigation, surveillance, animal movement control, information and education, and logistical support;
- c. Conduct capacity building activities;
- d. Disseminate information, guidelines and memoranda to all stakeholders;
- e. Regularly submit reports to the City Mayor on the status of its activities;
- f. Perform such other functions as the Task Force may be necessary for the full and proper implementation of the ASF prevention and control protocols within the City.

SECTION 7. POWERS OF THE BAYBAY ASF TASK FORCE. The Task Force, in the performance of its functions, shall exercise the powers provided hereunder;

- a. Regulate the movement of live swine, pork, pork products, by-products and other products with pork ingredients in line with the national and local issuances and guidelines;
- b. Conduct site visit with power to enter and inspect swine farms and other related livestock establishments, conduct disease investigation, surveillance, monitoring and collection of laboratory specimens and samples, and impose preventive and control measures therein, subject to biosafety and biosecurity entry requirements of concerned farms and establishments;
- c. To seize and confiscate animals, animal carcasses, products, and by-products, feeds, feed ingredients, feed supplements and feed additives, veterinary biologics, drugs, products and devices, and such other materials or substances that are undocumented, or of unknown source and conditions, and are showing signs of ASF, or reasonably suspected to be infected with or carriers of ASF, contaminated with ASF or posing an imminent danger, threat and injury to the overall animal health situation in the City. A seizure and confiscation receipt shall be issued to the grower concerned indicating the name of the grower/farm; the address; the number of swine and their respective age groups; the circumstances of the swine(s) confiscated; and the legal basis of the seizure and confiscation.
- d. Perform condemnation and eradication measures on animals that are affected with the disease or reasonably suspected to be infected with ASF, and are deemed a great risk to the swine population.

SECTION 8. TECHNICAL SUPPORT TEAMS. The Task Force, upon its creation, may create support teams to effectively carry out its mandate. The support teams shall include the following;

- a. A Technical Working Group (TWG) which shall serve as the technical advisory body of the Task Force for the efficient implementation of the Bantay ASF Program.
- b. A Rapid Action Team (RAT) which shall carry out the immediate diagnosis of suspect premises and the initiation and implementation of the stamping out procedures.
- c. A Surveillance Team (ST) which shall conduct regular surveillance and profiling of swine diseases in the identified priority areas.
- d. A Quarantine Team (QT) which shall conduct periodic identification and consolidation of data on swine population, location, etc.
- e. A Census Team (CT) which shall conduct periodic identification and consolidation of data on swine population, location, etc.
- f. An Information Team (ICT) which shall ensure adequate awareness of the general public matters and updates on ASF.
- g. A Capability Building Team (CBT) which shall conduct trainings and other similar activities to ensure that the stakeholders, ASF Task Force members including the BBOs, are given ample knowledge on the roles and responsibilities they need to undertake.
- h. A Logistic Team (LT) which shall provide labor resources, equipment and transportation required for the prevention, containment and response operation of the ASF Task Force.

SECTION 9. BARANGAY BIOSECURITY OFFICER (BBO). The Task Force shall engage the services of a Provincial LGU duly deputized Barangay Biosecurity Officer (BBO) who is tasked to conduct regular disease monitoring and biosecurity evaluation of commercial, semi-commercial, *Paalima*, and small-hold farms in the City. In the absence of a Provincial LGU duly deputized BBO in the City, the City Government, upon recommendation of the Task Force, may hire individuals to serve as BBO in the City. However, these individuals shall undergo deputization training with the Provincial LGU before they will be authorized to function as such.

SECTION 10. RAPID ACTION WHEN SUSPECT ASF INFECTION IS REPORTED. When there is a report of a suspected case of ASF in any barangay of City, the Rapid Action Team of the Task Force, in coordination with the concerned government agencies, shall immediately respond to the report and conduct the following actions, among others;

- a. Conduct a thorough disease investigation and sample collection.
- b. Collect blood/organ samples for disease investigation which shall come from 30 randomly selected animals preferably exhibiting clinical signs consistent with those of ASF, if the population is greater than 30. If the population is less than 30, samples shall be collected from all swine in the farm.
- c. Conduct a disease investigation in accordance with the protocol set in Annex 2 of the DA AO 7 (s. 2021).

The Rapid Action Team shall facilitate and ensure safe burial of infected swine and contaminated feeds. Carcass and contaminated feeds should be buried at least 2.5 meter deep below the ground. Area where swine died should be washed down with a mixture of 1 part bleach to 5 parts water, or as may be prescribed by the City Veterinarian.

SECTION 11. QUARANTINE. A quarantine or strict movement restrictions on live swine, pork products, and related materials shall immediately be imposed right after a positive report of suspected AFS infection is recorded to prevent the spread of ASF virus. Actions to be undertaken by the Task Force in implementing a quarantine shall include, but not limited to, the following:

- a. Declaration of areas within a 1 km. radius of the ASF infected premise(s), as under quarantine following detection of an ASF suspect case, and restricting movement of live swine from the infected farm(s).
- b. Movement of live swine within a 500-meter radius from where the ASF infection was detected shall be strictly prohibited.
- c. Movement of swine outside the 500-meter up to 1- kilometer radius from where the ASF infection was detected may be permitted within the City, provided that the same are proven to be healthy based on negative RT-PCR ASF test result. Live swine from areas outside the 1-kilometer radius but still within the red infected zone may be transported for slaughter across all zones, subject to compliance with the requirements set forth in DA AO 7(s. 2021).
- d. The movement of live swine from other zones may be permitted across all zones, upon compliance with the documentary requirements set forth by DA-BAI/ DA Administrative Circular No. 12 (s. 2019).
- e. Movement of swine within the City shall comply with the documentary requirements set forth in this Ordinance or as may be provided by the Task Force;
- f. The swine must be transported directly from the origin to the specified destination.
- g. Loading and unloading of swine during transit is strictly prohibited.
- h. All swine must be slaughtered within 24 hours of arrival at the slaughterhouse.
- i. The trader/shipper shall implement strict precautionary measures to ensure that all vehicles and conveyances used for hauling are subjected to appropriate biosecurity protocols both before and after each shipment. This is to prevent any risk of contamination that could endanger farms and healthy animals. The shipper is responsible for complying with the requirements of the transport as well as the destination.

SECTION 12. SURVEILLANCE. The Task Force shall mobilize its Surveillance Team to monitor, detect, control and prevent the spread of highly contagious ASF virus. Actions to be undertaken by the Surveillance Team includes, but not limited to, the following;

- a. Coordination with BAI for deployment and periodic testing thereafter of sentinel animals;
- b. *Paalima*/Semi-commercial/Commercial farms Testing every 6 months;
- c. Slaughterhouse testing by conducting initial test during exit from quarantine protocol or initial phase of repopulation program and every 6 months thereafter.
- d. Meat Market Testing by conducting initial test during exit from quarantine protocol or initial phase of repopulation program and every 6 months thereafter.
- e. Implementation of the detailed protocol on surveillance within a one (1) km quarantine area from the ASF-infected premise as stipulated in Annex 3 of DA AONo. 7 (s.2021).

SECTION 13. CENSUS AND GIS MAPPING OF HOG POPULATION, LOCATION AND INCIDENCE OF ASF. A swine inventory, including the grower's name and coordinates, shall be conducted per barangay, collated and submitted to the City Mayor every six months or as may be necessary. All Barangay Officials shall provide assistance and coordinate the gathering of this data and submit the same to the City Agriculture's Office.

The City Government shall appoint or designate at least two (2) personnel to geotag the pens and households with tethered swine. GIS maps of the ASF-affected areas will be generated by CPDO based on the submitted reports of the appointed/designated personnel for geotagging swine pens and household with tethered swine.

SECTION 14. INFORMING THE PUBLIC. There shall be an awareness campaign to ensure that biosecurity protocols are duly observed by the growers, including discouraging the use of leftover and scraps as feed for hogs and addressing risk factors for ASF outbreaks and spread tailored to the local setting. This shall include bringing growers to register in the Growers Registry developed for livestock growers.

Awareness campaign shall also include informing the general public of indemnity that DA will pay to their stocks in case these are included in the depopulation and free insurance of hogs by the Philippine Crop Insurance Corporation (PCIC) when the City is declared as out of the "Red Zone" for ASF.

SECTION 15. CAPABILITY BUILDING AND AWARENESS. The Capacity Building Team shall, from time to time, conduct seminars and fora to capacitate the members of the Task Force and other key personnel on their roles, responsibilities, expected outputs and needed skills related to ASF prevention and control.

SECTION 16. DECLARATION OF ASF FREE STATUS. In the event that the ASF infection or any threat thereto has been neutralized or determined by the Task Force to be non-existent or already contained, the Task Force shall submit its recommendation to the City Mayor for the declaration of an ASF free status. The City Mayor shall issue an Executive Order declaring a certain Barangay or the City ASF free.

SECTION 17. REPOPULATION. Whenever an ASF free status has been declared, the Task Force, in coordination with BAI, shall deploy and conduct the test of sentinel animals, and thereafter, repopulation may commence.

SECTION 18 SLAUGHTERING. No swine within the City shall be slaughtered outside of the slaughterhouse without informing the CVO or the Slaughterhouse. The VCO shall dispatch meat inspector to sites where and when slaughtering is done other than in the slaughter house.

SECTION 19. ISSUANCE AND INSPECTION OF HOG TRANSPORT PASS AND SOURCE CERTIFICATION. Hog traders and other logistical support providers, with their respective transport vehicles and vessels, doing swine and pork-related businesses in the City shall be required to secure all the necessary certifications and clearances from DA-BAI. All traders sourcing swine or pork in barangays of the City shall be required to secure certification from the Barangay that the stock or carcass came from the barangay for monitoring and maintaining a disease-free areas

The City Agriculture's Office (CAO) shall regularly submit the list of traders operating in the City to the DA-RFO and the DA-BAI for the issuance of swine transport pass in accordance with Annex 6 of DA AO No. 7 Series of 2021. The CAO shall see to it that no hog traders and livestock transport carriers will be allowed to transact business within the City without the Hog Transport Pass (HTP) which shall be a requirement before issuance of Veterinary Health Certificate (VHC). For better traceability and protection from tampering, digital coding will be incorporated in certifications, permits and licenses that the City will issue.

All livestock transport carriers shall be required to comply with the biosecurity measures such as cleaning and disinfection as may be imposed by the Task Force, the CVO and/or DA-BAI. Any violation of this guideline by the hog traders and other logistical support providers shall immediately render his/her HTP revoked.

SECTION 20. VIOLATIONS/PROHIBITED ACTS. The following acts are prohibited.

- a. Tampering and falsification of documents such as, but not limited to:
 - Veterinary Health Certificate
 - Certificate Free Status on ASF
 - Laboratory Test Results for ASF
 - Weekly Negative Disease Monitoring Report
 - Biosecurity Evaluation Form
 - Concealment of information
- b. Removal of diseased animals from quarantine area
- c. Slaughtering swine without informing the VCO or the slaughterhouse
- d. Movement of animals without necessary permits/ documents Non-Reporting or Delay in reporting of ASF cases or threat of ASF cases
- e. Interference or Disobedience to persons in authority
- f. Refusal to farm inspection and conduct of surveillance without legal justification
- g. Sharing of private information without proper authority

SECTION 21. PENALTY CLAUSE. Any violation of this Ordinance or any of the prohibited acts mentioned in the immediately preceding Section shall be penalized as follows;

- 1st Offense – P 500.00
- 2nd Offense – P 1,000.00
- 3rd Offense – P 2,500.00
- 4th Offense – P 4,000.00
- 5th and subsequent offenses – P 5,000.00

Seizures and confiscations of animals and their derivates as provided under Section 11 hereof shall be made in accordance with existing laws and regulations.

SECTION 22. FUNDS AND RESOURCES. Budgetary requirements for the control and prevention of ASF shall be included in the annual budget of the City.

SECTION 23. IMPLEMENTING RULES AND REGULATIONS. The City Agriculture’s Office (CAO) shall promulgate the implementing rules and regulations of this Ordinance.

SECTION 24. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE. If any part or provision of this Ordinance shall be declared unconstitutional or invalid, the other provisions hereof which are not affected thereby shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 25. REPEALING CLAUSE. All executive orders, memorandum orders, memorandum circulars, administrative orders, ordinances or parts thereof which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby deemed repealed or modified accordingly.

SECTION 26. EFFECTIVITY CLAUSE. - This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its publication or after due compliance with all the requirements of RA 7180. This Ordinance shall take effect after due compliance with all the requirements provided under RA 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991.

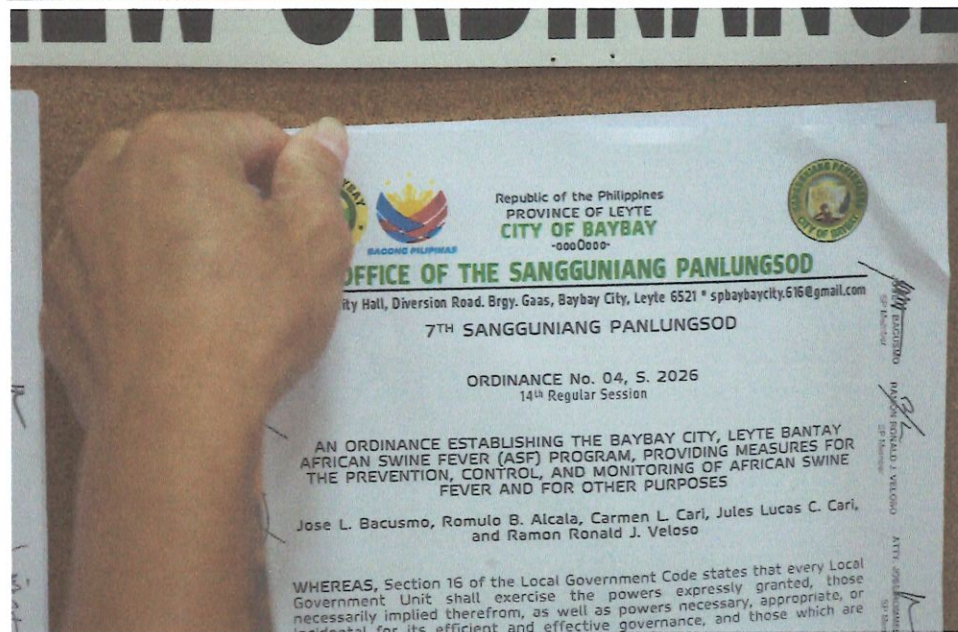
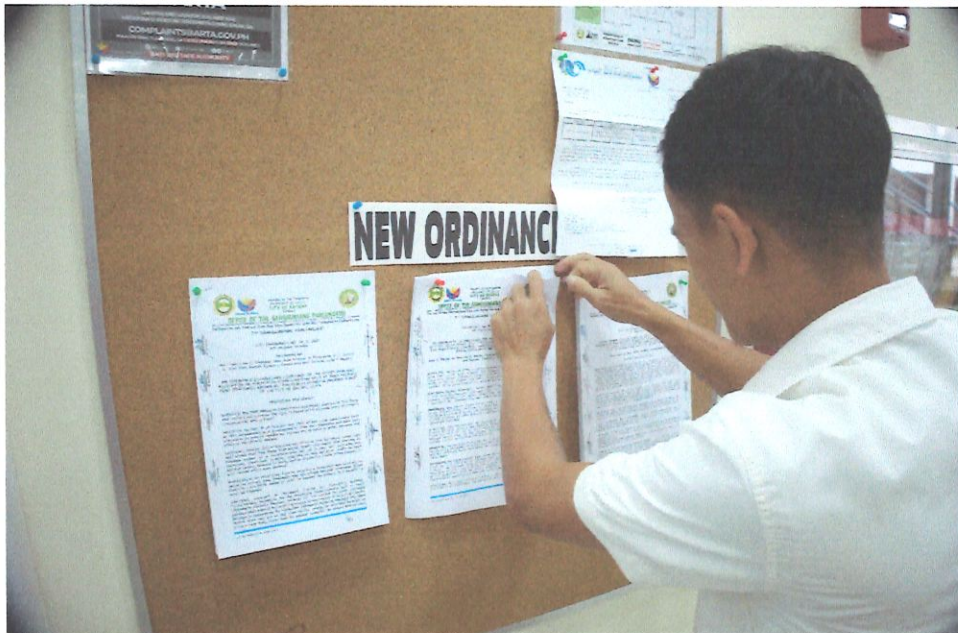

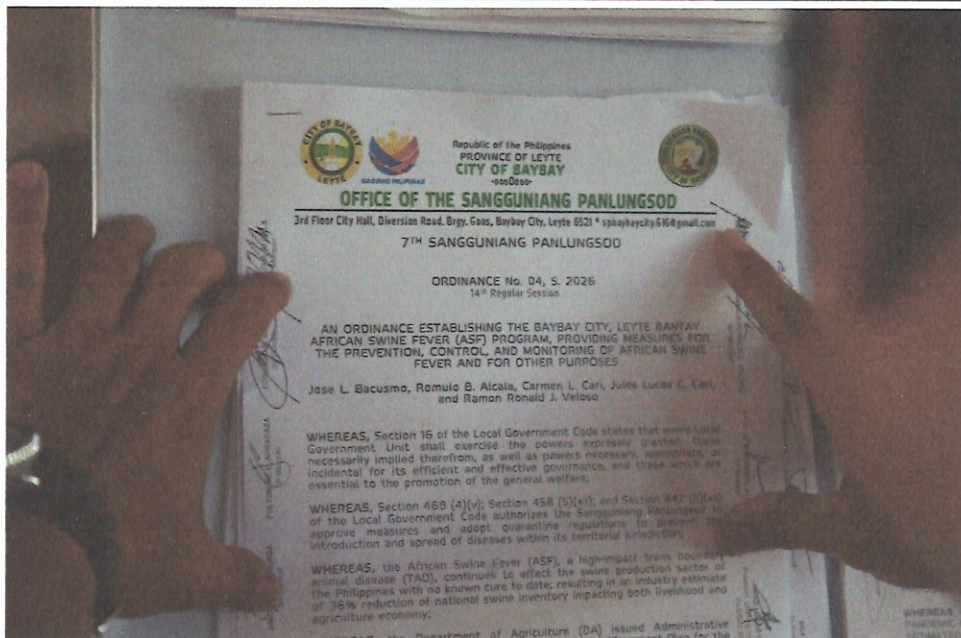
