AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR A TEMPORARY FARE ADJUSTMENT FOR MOTORIZED TRICYCLES FOR HIRE (MCH) IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF BURAUEN, LEYTE

WHEREAS, the Municipality of Burauen has an existing approved fare matrix for Motorized Tricycles-for-Hire (MCH) under Ordinance No. 23-01, Series of 2023;

WHEREAS, there has been a significant increase in fuel prices due to ongoing geopolitical tensions and conflicts in major oil producing regions, particularly in Middle East, which have disrupted global oil supply and caused volatility in petroleum prices, thereby resulting in substantial increases in fuel prices in the Philippines, which relies heavily on imported petroleum products;

WHEREAS, such persistent increase in fuel prices has gravely and adversely affected the daily income, operational viability, and overall livelihood of Motorized Tricycle-for-Hire (MCH) drivers, to the extent that many are no longer able to recover basic operating cost, resulting in diminished earnings, mounting financial losses, and difficulty in meeting their daily subsistence.

WHEREAS, without corresponding fare adjustment, continued operation under the current fare rates has become economically unsustainable, thereby risking disruption of transportation services within the Municipality;

WHEREAS, MCH drivers and Tricycle Operators and Driver's Associations officers have formally requested the grant of a temporary fare adjustment to mitigate the impact of rising fuel cost;

WHEREAS, a Committee Hearing was conducted to determine the reasonableness of the request and to consider the sentiments of concerned drivers and stakeholders;

WHEREAS, the Sangguniang Bayan recognizes the need to balance the welfare of the riding public and the sustainability of the livelihood of MCH drivers under the present circumstances;

WHEREAS, the fare adjustment is intended to be temporary, reasonable and responsive to the current economic condition;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, as it is hereby ordained by the Sangguniang Bayan of Burauen, Leyte in session assembled, that:

SECTION 1. TITLE

This Ordinance shall be known as the: **"Temporary Fare Adjustment for Motorized Tricycles in Burauen, Leyte."**

Municipal Ordinance No. 26-192, Series of 2026
Enacted: March 23, 2026

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SECTION 2. FARE ADJUSTMENT

In order to mitigate the impact of the rising fuel prices on Motorized Tricycle-for-Hire (MCH) drivers, a temporary fare adjustment, is hereby authorized and shall be applied on top of the existing approved fare matrix, consisting of an additional amount of ₱3.00 for Regular passengers and ₱2.00 for Students, Senior Citizens, and Persons with Disabilities (PWDs)

SECTION 3. TEMPORARY FARE MATRIX

The fare structure established under Ordinance No. 23-01, Series of 2023 is hereby adopted and shall continue to serve as the basis of fares. The temporary fare adjustment authorized under this Ordinance shall be applied on top of the existing approved fare rates.

This Ordinance shall not be construed as a permanent modification or amendment of the existing fare rates under Ordinance No. 23-01, Series of 2023, but only as a temporary fare adjustment measure.

SECTION 4. COVERAGE

This Ordinance shall apply to all motorized tricycles-for-hire legally operating within the Municipality of Bureauen, Leyte.

SECTION 5. TEMPORARY EFFECTIVITY

The Ordinance shall be effective for a period of **thirty (30) days** from its effectivity, unless sooner repealed or extended by the Sangguniang Bayan.


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Upon the expiration of this period, the implementation of the temporary fare adjustment shall automatically cease, and the existing approved fare rates under Ordinance No. 23-01, Series of 2023 shall revert to full force and effect.

SECTION 7. EFFECTIVITY


This Ordinance shall take effect upon approval.



**MINUTES OF THE COMMITTEE HEARING ON TRANSPORTATION,
PUBLIC UTILITIES AND GENERAL SERVICES, SANGUNIANG BAYAN
OF BURAUEN, LEYTE, HELD AT BURAUEN BUS TERMINAL ON
MARCH 18, 2026.**

I. CALL TO ORDER

The Committee Hearing was called to order at exactly 2:05 p.m. by **Hon. Hermenia C. Camasin**, Committee Chairperson on the Committee on Transportation, Public Utilities and General Services who presided over the hearing. The Presiding Officer welcomed the members of the committee, representatives from concerned municipal offices, and the invited officers and members of the TODA organizations.

II. DETERMINATION OF QUOROM

The Committee Chairperson verified the presence of the members of the committee and determined that a quorum was present. With the presence of a quorum, the Committee Chairperson declared that the committee was duly constituted to conduct its business and proceed with the meeting.

III. PURPOSE OF THE MEETING

The hearing was convened on the request of MCH Drivers for a temporary additional fare increase due to the continuous increase in fuel prices.

III. DISCUSSION

The Committee proceeded with the discussion on the request of the MCH drivers for a temporary additional fare increase due to the continuous increase in fuel prices.

The drivers stated that the increase in fuel prices has directly affected their daily income and operations. They expressed that their current earnings are no longer sufficient to cover fuel expenses and other operational costs.

It was also discussed that there are several TODAs operating within the municipality. Despite this number, the drivers stated that passenger volume remains limited, which affects their daily income.

It was also mentioned that due to the limited number of passengers, one TODA has implemented a scheduling system among its drivers, wherein operations are assigned on specific days, particularly on Saturdays and Sundays, in order to manage the number of drivers and address the lack of passengers.

It was also mentioned that due to the limited number of passengers, conflicts sometimes arise among drivers competing for passengers. It was noted that such disputes have, at times, escalated into serious incidents.

It was also mentioned that there was a previous fare increase implemented during the pandemic period which, according to our Sangguniang Bayan Members, it was not reverted to the original rate.

The drivers then presented their respective proposed fare adjustments based on their routes.

The Vice Mayor stated that in proposing any fare increase, the drivers should base their computation on the existing base fare.

The Committee clarified that the proposed fare adjustments are not automatically approved and will still undergo review and deliberation. It was emphasized that any fare increase must be reasonable and must consider both the welfare of the drivers and the riding public.

The Sangguniang Bayan stated that it will take into consideration the request of the drivers and their proposed adjustments.

It was also noted that the request being presented pertains only to the transport sector, and that there are other sectors which are also affected by the increase in fuel prices.

The Committee emphasized that the conduct of the Committee Hearing is part of the process for the possible creation of an ordinance providing for a temporary and conditional fare increase.

It was also expressed that consultation with other sectors is necessary, considering that while fuel prices increase, wages of the general public have not increased correspondingly.

The Committee clarified that the proposed increase is only an additional amount to the existing fare and does not replace the current approved fare.

It was also emphasized that the proposed increase must be proportionate and reasonable.

On the matter of discounts, it was clarified that senior citizens are entitled to discounts under the law, which applies to all services as part of their privilege.

However, the drivers requested that senior citizens must present valid identification cards to ensure that only qualified individuals may avail of the discount.

The drivers also inquired as to what assistance the Local Government Unit (LGU) can provide to the MCH drivers of Burauen.

It was discussed that financial assistance is provided by the National Government, particularly through the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD), and that such assistance may amount to approximately Five Thousand Pesos (P5,000.00), subject to program guidelines.

It was also raised by the drivers regarding the Gcash assistance previously intended for MCH drivers, wherein some drivers reported that they did not receive such assistance.

The Committee clarified that the Sangguniang Bayan has no direct control or information regarding the said assistance, and that such programs may be regulated or facilitated by the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) or other concerned national agencies.

Discussion also included the matter of TODA accreditation. It was noted that only three (3) TODAs are currently accredited. The Committee emphasized that accreditation is required for official recognition and for eligibility in government assistance. The drivers were encouraged to comply with accreditation requirements.

It was also reported that some drivers are already charging increased fares without approval. The Committee advised that formal complaints must be submitted with proper details such as the name of the driver and plate number.

It was further raised by one of the drivers regarding the uncertainty of fuel price normalization, particularly on whether the temporary fare increase will remain or if additional increases may still be requested should fuel prices continue to rise.

In response, it was clarified that once the ordinance on the temporary fare increase is implemented, it shall remain effective for the duration specified in the ordinance, and the Sangguniang Bayan will not amend or modify the said ordinance during its implementation.

It was also mentioned that the National Government is undertaking measures to address fuel prices, including actions related to the excise tax on fuel, in order to prevent rapid increases in gasoline prices.

The Committee further assured the drivers that there is no need for undue concern, as the Department of Energy (DOE), in coordination with the Local Government Unit (LGU) and the Philippine National Police (PNP), will monitor gasoline stations, particularly those that may take advantage of the current fuel crisis.

It was also clarified that under the ordinance, any increase or decrease in fuel prices does not automatically result in a corresponding adjustment in fare rates.

Lastly, it was stated that the LGU shall properly inform the MCH drivers once the temporary ordinance is lifted or has already expired.

The Committee reiterated that the proposed fare increase will not be implemented immediately and will still undergo further deliberation, including discussion during the Sangguniang Bayan session, and will require the enactment of an ordinance before implementation.

V. OTHER MATTERS

Concerns were raised regarding the presence of single motorcycles or “habal-habal,” including issues on unregistered and unlicensed operators.

The Committee clarified that the monitoring of habal-habal operations is under the Philippine National Police (PNP), while concerns involving unregistered drivers and vehicles fall under the jurisdiction of the Land Transportation Office (LTO).

It was also noted that such operations are currently being tolerated in some areas due to transportation needs, particularly in upland areas.

V. AGREEMENTS

The Committee agreed to receive and review all submitted fare proposals from the different TODAs and elevate the matter to the Sangguniang Bayan for further deliberation and appropriate action.

It was agreed that the proposed temporary additional fare increase shall be subject to the enactment of an ordinance prior to implementation.

The Committee agreed that consultation with other sectors shall be conducted, considering that the request pertains only to the transport sector and that other sectors are also affected by the increase in fuel prices.

It was also agreed that the proposed fare increase shall be treated as an additional amount to the existing fare and shall not replace the current approved fare.

The Committee noted that the proposed increase must be proportionate and reasonable.

It was also agreed that TODA organizations are encouraged to comply with accreditation requirements to ensure proper recognition and eligibility for government assistance.

The Committee further noted that complaints regarding unauthorized fare increases must be properly documented and submitted for appropriate action.

It was also noted that coordination with concerned national agencies may be undertaken regarding matters on assistance programs and monitoring of fuel-related concerns.

The Committee agreed that the matter shall be taken up during the Sangguniang Bayan session for further discussion and possible enactment of the proposed ordinance.

It was also agreed that the Local Government Unit (LGU) shall properly inform the MCH drivers once the temporary ordinance is lifted or has expired.

VI. ADJOURNMENT

There being no further matters to discuss, the Committee Hearing was adjourned at exactly 3:22 PM.
