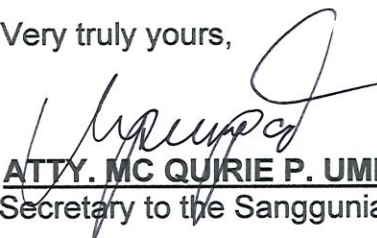

PREFATORY STATEMENT

Section 447 (a) of the Local Government Code of 1991 provides that, the Sangguniang Bayan, as a Legislative Body of the Municipality, shall enact ordinances, approve resolution and appropriate funds, for the general welfare of the municipality and its inhabitants pursuant to Section 16 of this code and in the proper exercise of the corporate powers of the municipality as provided.

Further, in the same law mentioned in the preceding paragraph, it states that, the Sangguniang Bayan is empowered to regulate the use of streets, sidewalks, and public places, including the establishment and regulation of market and vending areas.

The Sangguniang Bayan approved Municipal Ordinance No. 142, S-2021 which established the conduct of "Tabo Day" as a mechanism to simulate local trade and provide livelihood opportunities to vendors and small entrepreneurs.

However, there is a need to adjust the schedule of Tabo Day from Thursday to Wednesday to better accommodate market dynamics, improve traffic management and enhance participation of vendors and consumers. It is likewise necessary to standardize and rationalize the collection of market fees to ensure fairness, equity and increase local revenue generation.

Moreover, in order to ensure efficient implementation, the Municipality finds it more appropriate that the funding requirements be sourced from the Maintenance and Other Operating Expenses (MOOE) of the Office of the Municipal Mayor, instead of the 20% Economic Development Fund.

Be it ordained by the Sangguniang Bayan in regular session duly assembled that:

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE. This ordinance shall be known as the "Amendatory Ordinance to Municipal Ordinance No. 142, Series of 2021."

SECTION 2. Article IV, Section 14 of Municipal Ordinance No. 142, S-2021 is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 14. TABO DAY. – The tabo day shall be **STRICTLY OBSERVED** on every **WEDNESDAY** of each week, commencing at **four o'clock in the morning (4:00 AM)** and ending at **12:00 o'clock in the afternoon (12:00 PM)** of the following day.

Vendors are hereby authorized to commence the setting up of their respective stalls and merchandise on the same day, subject to existing rules and regulations governing the use of designated market spaces.

Tabo activities conducted in all other places within the territorial jurisdiction of the Municipality may be held on any day of the week, **EXCEPT WEDNESDAY**, subject to the approval and regulation of the Local Government and other applicable ordinances, rules and regulations.

SECTION 3. Article VI, Section 18 of Municipal Ordinance No. 142, S-2021 is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 18. TABO FEES. – The municipality shall impose and collect rental fees for the use and occupancy of government-owned space utilized by vendors during the tabo. A fee of Fifty Pesos (Php 50.00) per square meter (sq.m.) shall be charged per vendor, with a minimum rental area of one (1) square meter for each vendor.

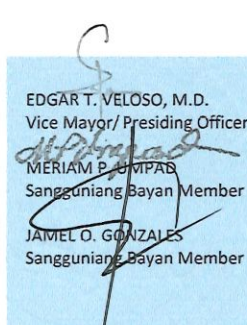
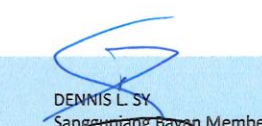
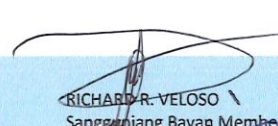
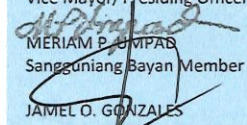
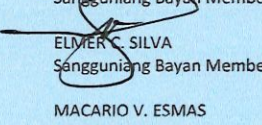
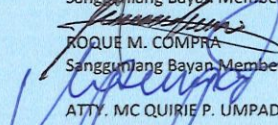
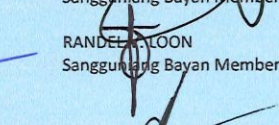
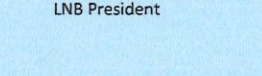
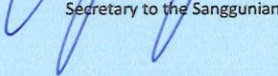
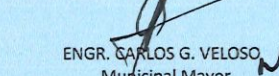
SECTION 4. Article VI, Section 20 of Municipal Ordinance No. 142, S-2021 is hereby amended to read as follows:

"ARTICLE VII. USAGE AND PROVISION OF FUNDS

Section 20. PROVISION OF FUNDS. – The Local Government of Villaba, Leyte shall allocate the amount of **Two Hundred Thousand Pesos (Php 200,000.00)** from the **Maintenance and Other Operating Expenses (MOOE)** of the **Office of the Municipal Mayor** to fund the procurement, installation, and maintenance of garbage receptacles and signages within the perimeter of tabo area."

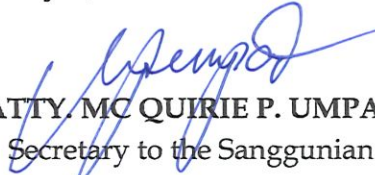
SECTION 5. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE. If for any reason or reasons, any part or provision of this ordinance shall be held unconstitutional or invalid, other parts hereof which are not affected thereby shall continue to be in full force and in effect.

SECTION 6. REPEALING CLAUSE. Any ordinance, rules and regulations and executive issuances found inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

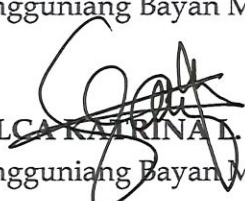

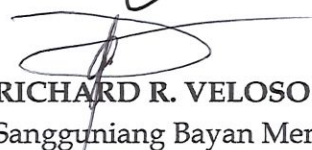

AN ORDINANCE INSTITUTIONALIZING THE "TABO SA VILLABA" IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF VILLABA, PROVINCE OF LEYTE AND PROVIDING FUNDS THEREOF

Introduced by: Sangguniang Bayan Member Kathleen V. Mape

PREPARATORY STATEMENT

WHEREAS, it has been the tradition that market day also known as "TABO" shall be held which, in the case of the Municipality of Villaba, every Thursday of every week. However, there is no existing ordinance that regulates the same TABO that will provide orderly assignment of places in our Public Market for the vendors and prescribing appropriate fees thereof;

WHEREAS, Section 447, (a), (2), (vi) of the Local Government Code states that the Sangguniang Bayan shall "Prescribe reasonable limits and restraints on the use of property within the jurisdiction of the municipality. In conjunction thereto, Section 447 (a) (5) (ii) states that the Sanggunian Bayan shall "(ii) Establish markets, slaughterhouses or animal corrals and authorize the operation thereof, and regulate the construction and operation of private markets, talipapas or similar buildings and structures";

WHEREAS, there is a need to institutionalize the "TABO" in the Municipality of Villaba that will provide an orderly and properly regulated avenue to our local farmers and vendors to sell and disposed of their respective farm produce, goods and livestock in our Public Market. Further, the institutionalization of the same shall likewise spur economic activities being an agro-based Municipality that will generate additional revenues for the Local Government Unit of Villaba, Leyte;

WHEREFORE, on motion by the Sangguniang Bayan Member, Kathleen V. Mape, duly seconded EN MASSE, be it ORDAINED

ARTICLE I. GENERAL POLICY

Section 1. Declaration of Policy. The policy involved in this ordinance is to develop the market day or "tabo" as an instrument of public service for the promotion of the general welfare and the protection of the health of the people, as well as a means to raise revenues for development projects and activities. This will give farmers an avenue to market/sell their farm produce, live animals and other farm goods.

ARTICLE II. TITLE, SCOPE AND APPLICATION

Section 2A. TITLE. This Ordinance shall be known as the "Tabo sa Villaba" in the Province of Leyte.

Section 2B. SCOPE AND APPLICATION. This ordinance shall govern the administration and operation of the tabo market and the collection and accounting of all fees, charges, and including other related impositions under the Revenue Code of this Municipality.

Section 2C. DEFINITION OF TERMS WHEN USED IN THIS ORDINANCE.

- a) Ambulants/Transient or Itinerant - are vendors who sell their merchandise and do not occupy a definite or permanent place or stall in the market who come to sell goods either daily or occasionally by sitting or moving from place to place within the market premises.
- b) Bagsakan – refers to an open area, which served as a service landing area for goods in bulks delivered by farmers/producers for wholesale purposes.
- c) Cereals – refers to rice, corn and other marketable and consumable grains.
- d) Extension area – refers to an area utilized by the stall/space holder for the display of their goods or service to its customer beyond the original area covered by the lease.
- e) Local Market Authorities – refer to the Municipal Mayor, his duly appointed Market Administrator/Supervisor, the Municipal Treasurer, or any other municipal officer-in-charge with the management of the day-to-day operations of the public market and/or specific aspects of such operations.
- f) Market premises – refer to any space in the market compound including the bare ground not converted by market buildings.

- g) Public Market – refers to any space, building or structure of any kind owned and/or operated by the Municipality of Villaba, constructed for the purpose of providing space and/or stalls where goods of any kind and services may be sold or offered.
- h) Peddler – refers to a person who, either for himself or on commission, travels from one place to another and sells his goods or offer to sell and delivers the same.
- i) Rental fee – means a charge fixed by law or agency in the form of money or otherwise for the enjoyment or use of a thing.
- j) Striker – a seller that only sells merchandise/produce on the ground.
- k) Support Facilities – refer to service areas provided, to support operations of the market including the Bagsakan, waste collection station, poultry dressing area, ice and cold storage rooms, toilets, parking area, slaughterhouse, and trading posts.
- l) Tabo stalls – refer to any specified and assigned area or booth in the tabo area where merchandises are sold or offered.
- m) Vendor – refers to person who sells goods, commodities or foodstuff.

ARTICLE III BASIC POLICIES, REGULATIONS, AND SANITATION

Section 3. SITE – The site/location of the tabo area shall be determined by the Municipal Planning and Development Officer. It shall not be far from the public market; traffic congestion shall be considered and shall have ample parking space within the vicinity of the area.

Section 4. CLEANLINESS AND SANITATION. – Markets and their premises must at all times be kept clean and in sanitary condition to safeguard the health and safety of the buying public as well as the stall owners, vendors and market personnel. Facilities for the sanitation and maintenance, such as for cleaning and garbage or trash container shall be provided.

Section 5. SANITATION UNIT. – Adequate personnel shall be provided to ensure efficient operation in the maintenance of cleanliness and sanitation within the premises of the tabo area.

Individual stall owners/vendors shall keep and maintain their stalls/area clean and in sanitary condition at all times and shall likewise be responsible for the cleanliness of the passageways, alleys, canals or spaces immediately in front or behind or by the side of their respective stalls/area. In cooperation with the local market authorities and personnel, market vendors and stall owners shall be responsible for the general cleanliness and sanitation of the tabo-an and its premises.

Section 6. SIGNS AND SIGNAGES. - Signs and signages shall be placed at conspicuous places that say: NO LITTERING or KEEP OUR PREMISES CLEAN and USE OUR GARBAGE CANS. This is to remind and warn vendors and buyers that violation thereof is punishable by law.

Section 7. GARBAGE RECEPTACLES/GARBAGE BINS. – Adequate number of garbage receptacle and garbage bins shall be placed at strategic places for the garbage and rubbish of the buyers, ambulant vendors and market personnel, likewise all stall owners and vendors shall be required to have individual garbage cans. Garbage receptacle or garbage bins must be covered and fly-and-rat proof to keep from becoming the breeding place of flies, rats, mosquitoes and other insects and be looted by cats and dogs.

Section 8. DISPOSAL OF GARBAGE. – It shall be the responsibility of the individual stall owner and vendors to dispose of their garbage at the end of the day by placing them in the receptacle referred to in Section 7 thereof. However, the disposal of the garbage of the buying public, ambulant vendors and the market personnel shall be the responsibility of the local market authorities. The dumping area of disposed garbage shall be located at a convenient place wherein garbage collectors/trucks shall have access to collect them. Solid waste from each stallholder shall be transferred to the central dumping area to facilitate efficient solid waste management.

Section 9. TIME FOR COLLECTION AND DISPOSAL OF GARBAGE. – All garbage and rubbish of the tabo must be collected and disposed of at an appropriate schedule to be determined by the local market authorities.

Section 10. MEAT AND MEAT PRODUCTS. - All meat and meat products shall be inspected pursuant to existing laws.

Section 11. SALE OF MARINE PRODUCTS. – Only fresh, live and wholesale fish and marine products or dried, salted, smoked or fermented fish and marine products, which are safe for consumption shall be sold. Fish and other marine products caught in unsafe zones as well as contaminated areas determined by the Department of Health (DOH) in coordination with the Bureau of Fisheries and Aquatic Resources (BFAR) and the Food and Drug Administration (FDA), shall be condemned and shall not be allowed for sale.

Section 12. PROTECTION FROM CONTAMINATION AND PRESERVATION OF FOOD. – All foods which required no further cooking shall be wrapped, covered or enclosed in containers to preserve their freshness and prevent contamination.

Section 13. APPLICABILITY OF CODE ON SANITATION. – All provisions of the Code on Sanitation shall, whenever applicable, be observed by and enforced upon public markets and all establishments therein and their respective personnel.

ARTICLE IV. DAY OF THE TABO

Section 14. TABO DAY. – The tabo day shall **ONLY** be on every **THURSDAY** of every week which starts at **four o'clock (4:00 AM)** in the morning and shall closed at **five o'clock (5:00 PM)** in the afternoon of the same day.

However, vendors may start to set-up their respective merchandise on **Wednesday** starting at **three o'clock (3:00PM)** in the afternoon.

ARTICLE V. – SERVICE AREA / FACILITIES

Section 15. SECURITY UNIT. - The municipality shall provide adequate security for the protection of consumers and traders within the vicinity of the market area.

Section 16. **PARKING SPACES.** – Ample space shall be provided within the vicinity of the public market. The Municipal Government shall charge a parking fee of **Ten Pesos (Php10.00) for the first (1st) four hours (4 hours) and an additional Five Pesos (Php5.00) on the succeeding hours.**

Section 17. **WEIGHING SCALES.** – The municipality shall provide weighing scales for the use of the consumers to safe guard them against short weighing of commodities like rice, fish, meat, vegetables, etc. It shall be located at a strategic point in the public market/tabo area.

ARTICLE VI. COLLECTION OF FEES

Section 18. **TABO FEES.** – The municipality shall collect fees for rentals of the spaces occupied by the vendors of the tabo for the use of any part of a government-owned public market or the tabo premises. Fees to be collected per tabo vendor shall be at a “per square meter” basis per day at **Twenty Pesos (PHP20.00) per square meter for a minimum of one (1) square meter.**

Section 19. **PAYMENT OF FEES.** – Payment of rental for stalls in the tabo shall be paid thru the office of the Municipal Treasurer’s designated collector who, in return, will issue cash tickets to the vendors and remit collections to the municipal treasurer for proper reporting.

ARTICLE VI. USAGE AND PROVISIONS OF FUNDS

Section 20. **PROVISION OF FUNDS.** – The Local Government of Villaba, Leyte shall provide **Two Hundred Thousand Pesos (PHP200,000.00) from the Twenty percent (20%) Economic Development Fund (EDF)** for the garbage receptacle and signages needed in the perimeter of the tabo.

Section 21. **FUNDS COLLECTED.** Funds derive/collected from the tabo shall all accrue to the municipality’s general fund.

ARTICLE VIII. FINAL PROVISIONS

Section 21. **SEPARABILITY CLAUSE.** If for any reason or reasons, any part or provision/s of this ordinance shall be found invalid or not in accordance to the constitution, other parts found not affected shall be in full force and effect.

Section 22. **REPEALING CLAUSE.** Ordinances that are in conflict or inconsistent with the provision of this ordinance are hereby modified or repealed accordingly.

Section 23. **EFFECTIVITY.** This ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days upon approval and compliance with posting requirements under Republic Act No. 7160, as amended and shall also be posted in conspicuous places.

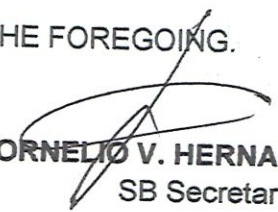

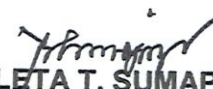

She mentioned that the updated Tabo Fees – Fifty pesos (Php 50.00) per square meter (sq.m.) shall be charged per vendor, with minimum rental area of one (1) square meter for each vendor.

She also mentioned that the Local Government Unit of Villaba, Leyte shall allocate the amount of Two Hundred Thousand Pesos (Php 200,000.00) from the maintenance and other Operating Expenses (MOOE) of the Office of the Municipal Mayor to fund the procurement,

installation, and maintenance of garbage receptacles and signages within the perimeter of tabo area.

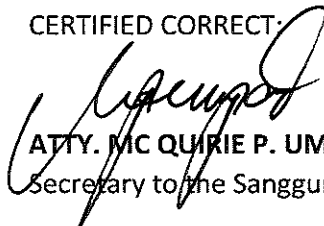
One of the vendors asked whether they are permitted to sell to regular customers who wish to buy products even if it is not the scheduled tabo day.

The author responded negatively, stating that it is the intent of the ordinance to regulate the hours and the dates of the tabo operations.

APRIL 29, 2026

FINDINGS:

- There is observed confusion among sellers regarding when official tabo activities are allowed.
- There is possibility of congestion and informal vending occurring outside designated times and areas.
- There is a need to review and adjust the current schedule, taking into consideration the availability of suppliers, as well as the actual trading patterns of vendors.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- It is recommended that the LGU shall review and adjust the current Tabo schedule to address the observed confusion among sellers and prevent congestion and informal vending outside designated times and areas. The revised schedule should be based on the actual trading patterns of vendors, availability of suppliers, and overall market conditions to ensure it is practical and beneficial for all stakeholders. Furthermore, proper dissemination of information and strict enforcement of the agreed schedule and designated vending areas should be implemented to promote order, efficiency, and compliance in the Tabo system.
