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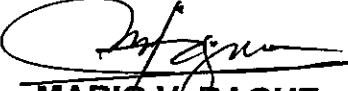

#### PREFATORY STATEMENT

The Local Government Unit of Alangalang recognizes the growing threats posed by climate change, environmental degradation, and disaster risks to the lives, safety, welfare, and future of its constituents, particularly children and other vulnerable sectors. In response to these emerging challenges, there is a need to strengthen local governance through science-based, participatory, and climate-responsive planning mechanisms that ensure sustainable and resilient development.

Pursuant to Republic Act No. 9729 or the "Climate Change Act of 2009," Republic Act No. 10121 or the "Philippine Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Act of 2010," and Republic Act No. 10821 or the "Children's Emergency Relief and Protection Act," this proposed measure seeks to institutionalize and mainstream the Climate Risk Vulnerability Assessment (CRVA) Tool into the formulation, implementation, and updating of all local development plans of the Local Government Unit of Alangalang.

This Ordinance likewise promotes a child-sensitive and inclusive approach to climate change adaptation and disaster risk reduction by integrating the voices, vulnerabilities, capacities, and protection needs of children, youth, and marginalized sectors into local planning, policy development, and investment programming.

Through this measure, the Local Government Unit aims to strengthen climate-informed governance, enhance institutional coordination, establish sustainable implementation mechanisms, and ensure that local plans, programs, and

**WHEREAS**, Section 2 of **Republic Act No. 9729**, otherwise known as the **Climate Change Act of 2009**, declares it a policy of the State to incorporate a gender-sensitive, pro-children, and pro-poor perspective in all climate change and renewable energy efforts, plans, and programs;

**WHEREAS**, **Republic Act No. 10821**, also known as the **Children's Emergency Relief and Protection Act**, mandates the provision of emergency relief and protection for children before, during, and after disasters and other emergency situations;

**WHEREAS**, **Republic Act No. 10121** (Philippine DRRM Act of 2010) directs Local Government Units (LGUs) to mainstream disaster risk reduction and climate change into development processes, policy formulation, and budgeting;

**WHEREAS**, the Local Government Unit of Alangalang commits to the goal that **children in all their diversity are protected from the impact of climate change and natural hazards**;

**WHEREAS**, the adoption of a **Climate Risk Vulnerability Assessment (CRVA) Tool** is necessary to enhance the capacity of local policymakers and planners to analyze climate risks and engage children/CLGs in developing responsive programs;

**WHEREAS**, the Local Government Unit of Alangalang recognizes the urgent need to strengthen climate-resilient and evidence-based governance through the integration of climate risk assessment tools in local development planning and decision-making processes;

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**WHEREAS**, the Climate Risk Vulnerability Assessment (CRVA) Tool serves as a science-based and participatory instrument for identifying climate hazards, vulnerabilities, exposure, adaptive capacities, and sectoral risks affecting communities, particularly vulnerable populations such as children and youth;

**WHEREAS**, the Local Government Unit of Alangalang hereby adopts and institutionalizes the Climate Risk Vulnerability Assessment (CRVA) Tool as an official supplementary instrument for climate-informed planning, policy development, risk analysis, and program implementation across all relevant local development plans and governance mechanisms;

**WHEREAS**, there is a need to mainstream the CRVA Tool into local governance systems to ensure that the Local Climate Change Action Plan (LCCAP), Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Plan (LDRRMP), Comprehensive Development Plan (CDP), Annual Investment Program (AIP), and other local development plans are climate-responsive, child-sensitive, inclusive, and resilient;

**WHEREAS**, the Local Government Unit recognizes the importance of meaningful participation of children, youth, civil society organizations, and community-based stakeholders in the planning and development of climate adaptation and disaster resilience initiatives to ensure that programs and services adequately respond to their specific vulnerabilities and needs;

**WHEREAS**, the Municipal Planning and Development Office (MPDO), together with concerned offices, shall establish appropriate coordination and implementation mechanisms, including the designation of focal persons and local champions, to oversee capacity-building activities, training roll-outs, and the integration of CRVA findings into local planning and investment programming;

**WHEREAS**, the Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (MDRRMO), in coordination with the Municipal Social Welfare and Development Office (MSWDO), Local Council for the Protection of Children (LCPC), and other concerned offices, shall monitor, evaluate, and report climate-informed and child-sensitive programs, projects, and activities to ensure effective implementation of resilience and child protection measures within the municipality;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE SANGGUNIANG BAYAN OF ALANGALANG THAT:**

#### SECTION 1. TITLE

This Ordinance shall be known as the **"Kabataan, Andam ha Kalamidad Ordinance of 2026"**.

#### SECTION 2. DECLARATION OF POLICY

It is the policy of the Local Government Unit Of Alangalang to protect children in all their diversity from the impacts of climate change and natural hazards. In accordance with **R.A. 9729 (Climate Change Act of 2009), R.A.**

10121 (Philippine DRRM Act of 2010), and R.A. 10821 (Children's Emergency Relief and Protection Act), the LGU commits to incorporating a gender-sensitive, pro-children, and pro-poor perspective in all local planning, budgeting, and disaster risk reduction efforts. The development of a child-sensitive CRVA shall facilitate the strategic and systematic mainstreaming of an inclusive risk management approach, highlighting the importance of addressing the multi-faceted and disproportionate impacts faced by children during climate-induced disasters.

### SECTION 3. OBJECTIVES

Institutionalization of the expanded Child-sensitive CRVA tool as an instrument to supplement risk analysis and climate-informed planning within the Local Government Unit of Alangalang.

Institutionalize the Child-Sensitive Climate Risk and Vulnerability Assessment (CRVA) Tool as a supplementary planning and decision-support instrument;

Strengthen the capacity of local government offices and stakeholders in integrating child-sensitive climate and disaster risk analysis into local governance and development planning;

Ensure that the Comprehensive Development Plan (CDP), Comprehensive Land Use Plan (CLUP),

Local Climate Change Action Plan (LCCAP), Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Plan

(LDRRMP), Annual Investment Program (AIP), and other relevant plans are child-responsive, inclusive, and risk-informed;

Alignment with the National Climate Change Action Plan and the Department of Interior and Local Government (DILG) requirements for standardized risk assessment tools.

Creation of non-elected & "Sustainability Champions" within the LGU and DILG to ensure operational continuity during local election transitions and beyond.

Establishment of partnerships with the academes and CSOs to ensure the regular updating of climate projection data and the inclusion of assistive technology for children with disabilities.

### SECTION 4. INSTITUTIONALIZATION OF THE CHILD-SENSITIVE CLIMATE RISK VULNERABILITY ASSESSMENT (CRVA) TOOL

The Child-Sensitive Climate Risk Vulnerability Assessment (CRVA) Tool is hereby adopted and institutionalized as a supplementary reference,

assessment, and decision-support instrument for local planning, policy formulation, budgeting, climate change adaptation, disaster risk reduction and management, and development programming within the Local Government Unit of Alangalang.

All concerned municipal offices, local special bodies, and Barangays shall, where applicable and practicable, integrate the findings, recommendations, and data generated through the CRVA Tool into the formulation, implementation, updating, monitoring, and evaluation of locally mandated plans, programs, projects, and investment priorities, including but not limited to the following:

- a. Comprehensive Development Plan (CDP);
- b. Comprehensive Land Use Plan (CLUP);
- c. Local Climate Change Action Plan (LCCAP);
- d. Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Plan (LDRRMP);
- e. Gender and Development (GAD) Plan and Budget;
- f. Local Youth Development Plan (LYDP);
- g. Local Investment Plan for Health (LIPH);
- h. Disaster Risk Reduction and Management in Health (DRRM-H) Plan; and
- i. Other relevant sectoral, thematic, and development plans of the Local Government Unit.

The implementation and utilization of the CRVA Tool under this Ordinance shall complement existing national and local climate change adaptation and disaster risk reduction frameworks, policies, standards, and assessment mechanisms, and shall not be construed as replacing or superseding mandatory tools, systems, or guidelines prescribed by national government agencies and competent authorities.

Furthermore, all concerned offices are encouraged to ensure that the integration of CRVA findings into local governance processes remains child-sensitive, inclusive, participatory, gender-responsive, and evidence-based.

#### SECTION 5. COVERAGE

This Ordinance shall apply to all departments, offices, and units within the Local Government Unit of Alangalang, as well as the 54 Barangays under its jurisdiction. It further covers all local planning processes, including the formulation and updating of the Local Climate Change Action Plan (LCCAP), Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Plan (DRRMP), and the Comprehensive Emergency Program for Children (CEPC).

#### SECTION 6. DEFINITION OF TERMS

- **Climate Risk Vulnerability Assessment (CRVA):** A systematic tool used to identify the degree to which a system or community is susceptible to, or unable to cope with, adverse effects of climate change.

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- **Child-Sensitive/Child-Centered:** An approach that prioritizes the specific rights, vulnerabilities, and voices of children in the design and implementation of policies.
- **Inclusivity:** The practice of ensuring that all individuals, particularly those from marginalized groups such as children with disabilities and those in remote areas, have equal access to protection and participation.
- **Sustainability Champions:** Designated non-elected officials and technical staff within the LGU and DILG tasked with maintaining project continuity across political transitions.
- **Child-Led Groups (CLGs):** Children's organizations or organized clusters of community members, including children and youth groups, that lead or participate in local resilience efforts.

#### SECTION 7. PROGRAM IMPLEMENTATION

- Establishment of a Technical Working Group (TWG) led by the Local Chief Executive with the Municipal DRRM Office (MDRRMO), the Local Social Welfare and Development Office (MSWDO) and Municipal Planning and Development Office (MPDO) to oversee the rollout of the CRVA tool.
- Formalization of a partnership with the DILG or its representative within the locality for the usage of the expanded child-sensitive CRVA to ensure its inclusion in national guidelines.
- Engagement with local CSOs and other Local Special Bodies as may be determined by an Implementing Rules and Regulations of the Local Chief Executive, to integrate assistive technology and inclusive methodologies for children with disabilities into the risk assessment process.
- Creation of a transition strategy that empowers permanent department focal persons to act as anchors to prevent disruption in implementation.

#### SECTION 8. PROGRAM COMPONENTS

- **Evidence Generation:** Conducting situational analysis reports and using the CRVA tool to address knowledge gaps regarding climate impacts on children within the local context.
- **Capacity Building:** Provision of specialized training modules for the LGU and the MLGOO covering the CRVA tool, child safeguarding, child rights governance, and child protection services.
- **Participatory Risk Assessment:** Systematic mobilization of children and CLGs to participate directly in risk assessment workshops and the development of local plans.

- **Guidance Documentation:** Development of a reference manual for local planners that synthesizes pilot results and highlights policy gaps in current programs.
- **Inclusive Communication:** Co-designing and distributing child-friendly playbooks and interactive materials to ensure climate information is accessible to all children, regardless of ability.

#### SECTION 9. CAPACITY BUILDING OF CONCERNED STAKEHOLDERS

- Provision of technical training for LGU officials, department heads and key employees on the operationalization of the expanded Child-sensitive CRVA tool.
- Integration of specialized training modules covering child safeguarding, child rights governance, and child protection policies into the regular human resource development plan.
- Implementation of co-designing workshops involving children and child-led groups (CLGs) to enhance their capacity for meaningful participation in risk assessment and planning.
- Distribution of guidance documents and reference materials to ensure future LGU officials have access to established risk assessment methodologies.

#### SECTION 10. MANDATORY BARANGAY SUPPORT AND UTILIZATION OF THE ONE PERCENT (1%) LCPC FUND AND THE ANNUAL LDRRM FUND

All Barangays within the Municipality of Alangalang shall support the implementation of this Ordinance and shall allocate a portion of their One Percent (1%) Barangay Council for the Protection of Children (BCPC) and the seventy percent (70%) of the Five Percent (5%) Barangay Disaster Risk Reduction Management Fund, as provided in their BCPC and CBDRRM Plans, respectively, for the production, reproduction, dissemination, and utilization of child-friendly climate resilience playbooks, information, education, and communication (IEC) materials, and other child-centered advocacy tools developed pursuant to this Ordinance, subject to existing budgeting, accounting, and auditing laws, rules, and regulations.

The Barangay Council for the Protection of Children (BCPC) shall ensure that these materials are integrated into barangay-based child protection, disaster preparedness, climate change adaptation, and youth participation programs to strengthen community resilience among children and youth.

##### SECTION 10.1. OVERSIGHT AND IMPLEMENTATION MONITORING

The Municipal Planning and Development Coordinator (MPDC), Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (MDRRMO), and Municipal Social Welfare and Development Office (MSWDO) shall jointly provide technical oversight, monitoring, and policy guidance to ensure the effective implementation of this Section by all Barangays.

The concerned offices shall assist the Barangays in the integration of child-sensitive climate resilience initiatives into their respective LCPC Plans, monitor the utilization of the allocated LCPC Funds for purposes authorized under this Ordinance, and provide appropriate technical assistance in the development, distribution, and utilization of climate resilience playbooks and related advocacy materials.

#### SECTION 11. IMPLEMENTING MECHANISM; MANDATORY MEMBERS

The Local Government Unit of Alangalang shall establish a Child-Sensitive Climate Action Technical Working Group (TWG), composed of the following mandatory members:

- Local Chief Executive (Chairperson)
- Sangguniang Bayan Member Committee Chairperson on DRR (Vice Chairperson)
- Municipal DRRM Officer
- Sangguniang Bayan Member Committee Chairperson on Social Welfare
- Liga ng mga Barangay President
- Pambayang Pederasyon ng mga Sangguniang Kabataan
- Municipal Planning and Development Coordinator
- Municipal Social Welfare and Development Officer
- Municipal Budget Officer
- Municipal Local Government Operations Officer
- Municipal Youth Development Officer
- Representative from the Local Council for the Protection of Children (LCPC)
- Representatives from Child-Led Groups (CLGs) and local CSOs
- Technical partners from the academe
- Persons with Disabilities Affairs Officer

#### SECTION 12. FUNCTIONS, ROLES, AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE TECHNICAL WORKING GROUP (TWG)

The Child-Sensitive Climate Action Technical Working Group (TWG) shall serve as the primary coordinating, advisory, and implementation-support body for the effective operationalization and mainstreaming of the Child-Sensitive Climate Risk Vulnerability Assessment (CRVA) Tool within the Local Government Unit of Alangalang.

The TWG shall have the following functions, roles, and responsibilities:

- Provide overall policy direction, supervision, and executive support for the implementation of this Ordinance;
- Approve policies, action plans, and recommendations of the TWG;
- Mobilize resources and ensure institutional support for the sustainability of the CRVA mainstreaming initiatives.

**b. Sangguniang Bayan Committee Chairperson on Disaster Risk Reduction (Vice Chairperson)**

- Assist in the formulation of legislative measures supportive of climate resilience and child-sensitive governance;
- Coordinate with the Sanggunian on policy recommendations and appropriation requirements related to this Ordinance.

**c. Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Officer (MDRRMO)**

- Lead the technical implementation of the CRVA process, hazard assessment, and disaster risk analysis;
- Ensure integration of CRVA findings into the Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Plan (LDRRMP) and related resilience programs;
- Maintain and update climate and disaster risk data relevant to the municipality.

**d. Sangguniang Bayan Committee Chairperson on Social Welfare**

- Ensure that child protection, social welfare, and inclusive resilience measures are integrated into local climate adaptation and disaster preparedness initiatives;
- Recommend policies supportive of vulnerable sectors affected by climate risks.

**e. Liga ng mga Barangay President**

- Facilitate coordination and implementation of this Ordinance at the barangay level;
- Encourage Barangays to integrate CRVA findings into Barangay Development Plans, BCPC Plans, and Barangay DRRM Plans.

- Assist in mobilizing youth participation in CRVA activities, awareness campaigns, and community consultations.

**G. Municipal Planning and Development Coordinator (MPDC)**

- Serve as the lead coordinating office for the mainstreaming of CRVA findings into local development plans, policies, and investment programs;
- Facilitate planning integration, monitoring, documentation, and technical coordination among concerned offices.

**h. Municipal Social Welfare and Development Officer (MSWDO)**

- Ensure that child-sensitive and protection-centered interventions are incorporated into climate and disaster programs;
- Monitor vulnerable children and families affected by climate-related hazards and emergencies.

**i. Municipal Budget Officer**

- Assist in identifying and aligning appropriate funding sources for programs and activities under this Ordinance;
- Ensure budgetary support and compliance with applicable budgeting and auditing rules and regulations.

**j. Municipal Local Government Operations Officer (MLGOO)**

- Provide technical assistance and policy guidance consistent with DILG standards and issuances;
- Support monitoring, evaluation, and compliance mechanisms related to the implementation of this Ordinance.

**k. Municipal Youth Development Officer (MYDO/LYDO)**

- Facilitate youth engagement, consultation activities, and child-sensitive climate advocacy programs;
- Coordinate with youth-serving organizations and child-led groups in resilience-building activities.

**l. Representative from the Local Council for the Protection of Children (LCPC)**

- Ensure alignment of CRVA-related initiatives with child protection policies and programs;
- Promote child-centered planning and monitoring mechanisms within the LGU.

**m. Representatives from Child-Led Groups (CLGs) and Local Civil Society Organizations (CSOs)**

- Provide community-based insights, recommendations, and sectoral perspectives during planning and implementation processes;

- Participate in consultations, monitoring activities, and advocacy initiatives related to child-sensitive climate resilience.

**Technical Partners from the Academe**

- Provide technical expertise, research support, climate projections, and evidence-based recommendations;
- Assist in data analysis, capacity-building activities, and enhancement of CRVA methodologies and tools.

**o. Persons with Disabilities Affairs Officer (PDAO)**

- Ensure that the implementation of the Child-Sensitive Climate Risk Vulnerability Assessment (CRVA) Tool integrates disability-inclusive and accessibility-sensitive approaches in all climate change adaptation and disaster risk reduction initiatives;
- Advocate for the inclusion, protection, participation, and welfare of children and persons with disabilities in local climate resilience planning and emergency preparedness programs;
- Assist in identifying the specific vulnerabilities, needs, and adaptive capacities of persons with disabilities affected by climate-related hazards and disasters;
- Coordinate with concerned offices, organizations of persons with disabilities (OPDs), civil society organizations, and stakeholders in the development of inclusive policies, programs, information materials, and assistive interventions related to this Ordinance;
- Support the promotion of accessible communication strategies, child-friendly materials, and inclusive participation mechanisms during consultations, trainings, workshops, and community-based activities.

The TWG may create sub-committees, technical clusters, or advisory groups as may be necessary for the effective implementation of this Ordinance

**SECTION 13. MONITORING, REVIEW, AND ASSESSMENT**

- The Municipal Social Welfare Development Office with the Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction Office shall establish a monitoring framework to track the number of child-responsive recommendations successfully integrated into local policies.
- A semi-annual review of the Action Plan shall be conducted to assess the progress of CRVA mainstreaming across different LGU sectors.
- The Child-Sensitive CRVA tool and its corresponding data shall be regularly reviewed and updated in coordination with concerned Civil Society Organizations (CSOs) and/or relevant national government agencies identified in the Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR) of this Ordinance, to ensure that the assessment remains responsive to emerging climate projections, hazards, and child-related vulnerabilities.
- An annual report on the status of child-sensitive climate initiatives shall be submitted to the Local Council to ensure transparency and accountability.

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#### SECTION 14. APPROPRIATIONS

- The LGU shall allocate the necessary funding for the implementation of this Ordinance, which may be sourced from the Annual LDRRM Fund.
- Ongoing costs for capacity building, co-designing workshops, and the maintenance of the CRVA tool shall be integrated into the Annual Investment Program (AIP).
- The LGU is authorized to enter into funding agreements or receive grants from national agencies and international partners (e.g., Save the Children) to support the scalability and sustainability of the project.

#### SECTION 15. IMPLEMENTING RULES AND REGULATIONS (IRR)

Within sixty (60) days from the effectivity of this Ordinance, the Local Chief Executive, upon recommendation of the Child-Sensitive Climate Action Technical Working Group (TWG), shall promulgate the necessary

Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR) to ensure the effective implementation of the CRVA mainstreaming process. The IRR shall include specific technical protocols for tool utilization, data privacy measures for children, and the schedule for the succeeding roll-out activities.

#### SECTION 16. DATA PRIVACY, CONFIDENTIALITY, AND PROTECTION OF CHILDREN'S INFORMATION

All data, records, information, and assessment results gathered, processed, stored, and utilized pursuant to the implementation of this Ordinance, particularly those involving children and other vulnerable sectors, shall be handled in accordance with Republic Act No. 10173, otherwise known as the "Data Privacy Act of 2012," and other existing laws, rules, and regulations on confidentiality, privacy, and data protection.

The Local Government Unit of Alangalang, through the concerned offices and members of the Child-Sensitive Climate Action Technical Working Group (TWG), shall ensure that all personal information, sensitive personal information, and child-related data obtained during the conduct of Climate Risk Vulnerability Assessments (CRVA), consultations, profiling, surveys, workshops, monitoring, and reporting activities are collected, processed, accessed, shared, and retained only for legitimate, lawful, and authorized purposes related to the implementation of this Ordinance.

Appropriate safeguards and security measures shall be adopted to protect the confidentiality, integrity, and security of all data and information gathered, including but not limited to the following:

- a. Restricting unauthorized access to personal and sensitive information;
- b. Ensuring informed participation and proper consent procedures, especially in activities involving children;

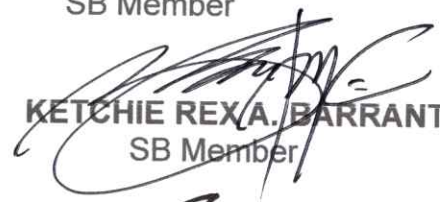
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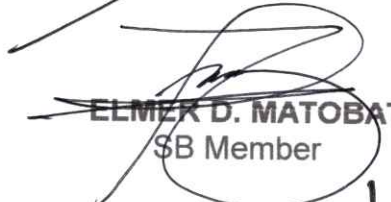
