WHEREAS, Section 16, Article II of the 1987 Constitution provides that the State shall protect and promote the right of the people to a balance and healthful ecology in accordance with the rhythm and harmony of nature;

WHEREAS, Republic Act 9147 also known as the Wildlife Resources Conversation and Protection Act, Section 2 (a) states, "It shall be the policy of the state to conserve the country's wildlife resources and their habitats areas for sustainability;

WHEREAS, Section 35 of the same law provides that Local Government Unit shall initiate conversation measures in their areas;

WHEREAS, based on the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) records, the Philippines is the sole host to 1,137 animal species and 14,000 species of plants, the country is also one of the top biodiversity hotspots with 592 endemic species of amphibians, birds and mammals considered threatened or endangered.

NOW THEREFORE, foregoing premises considered the 16th Sangguniang Bayan of Inopacan, Leyte, in session assembled; be it

MUNICIPAL ORDINANCE NO. 26 - 07
(Series of 2026)

**AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE MUNICIPAL WILDLIFE ANTI TRAFFICKING
AND PROTECTION PROGRAM**

BE IT ORDAINED by the Sangguniang Bayan of Inopacan, Leyte that:

Section 1. Short Title. This ordinance shall be known as the "Inopacan Wildlife Anti-Trafficking and Protection Program."

Section 2. Declaration of Policy. It shall be the policy of the Municipality of Inopacan to preserve and protect wildlife resources and their habitats consistent with national law. In the pursuit of this policy, this ordinance shall have the following objectives:

- a) To conserve and protect wildlife species and their habitats to promote ecological balance and enhance biological diversity;
- b) To regulate the collection and trade of wildlife;
- c) To pursue, regarding national interest, the Philippine commitment to international conventions, protection of wildlife and their habitats; and
- d) To initiate support scientific studies on the conservation of biological diversity.

Section 3. Scope. This ordinance shall be enforceable for all wildlife species found within the municipality of Inopacan, Province of Leyte.

Section 4. Definition of Terms. For the purpose of this ordinance, the following terms shall mean and be construed as:

- a. By product or derivatives – means any part taken or substance extracted from wildlife, in raw or in processed form. This includes stuffed animals and herbarium specimens.
- b. Collection or collecting – refers to the act of gathering and harvesting wildlife or their by-products and derivatives.
- c. Conservation - means preservation and sustainable utilization of wildlife, and/or maintenance, restoration and/or enhancement of habitat.
- d. Critically endangered species – refers to a species or subspecies that is facing extremely high risk of extinction in the wild in the immediate future;
- e. Endangered species – refers to species or subspecies that is not critically endangered but whose survival in the wild is unlikely if the causal factors continue operating;
- f. Wildlife - means wild forms and varieties of flora and fauna, in all developmental stages, including those which are in captivity or are being bred or propagated.
- g. Wildlife Collectors permit - means a permit to take or collect certain species and quantities of wildlife from the wild for commercial purposes.

- h. Habitat – shall mean a place or environment where species naturally occurring and established its population.

Section 5. Local Transport of Wildlife, By-Products and Derivative - Transport of wildlife shall require the appropriate permits and documents issued by the DENR pursuant to R.A. 9147.

Provided further that if the ownership of the said conveyances belongs to the third person who has no participation in or knowledge of the illegal acts, the same may be released to said owner after presentation of proper documents.

Section 6. Prohibited Acts. Unless otherwise allowed in accordance with RA 9147, it shall be unlawful for any person to willfully and knowingly exploit wildlife resources and their habitats, undertake the followingly acts:

1. Killing and destroying wildlife species except in the followingly instances:
 - a) When wildlife is afflicted with an incurable disease.
 - b) When it is deemed necessary to put an end to the misery suffered by the wildlife;
 - c) When it is done to prevent an imminent danger to the life or limb of a human being; and
 - d) When the wildlife killed or destroyed after it has been used in an authorized research or experiments.
2. Trading of wildlife
3. Gathering or destroying of active nest, nest trees, host plants and the like
4. Transporting wildlife
5. Collecting, hunting, or possessing wildlife, their byproducts and derivatives

Section 7. Wildlife Traffic Monitoring Unit

There must be a Wildlife Traffic Monitoring Unit assigned in the Municipal Environment and Natural Resources Office (MENRO) who must have proper training in identifying wildlife. Such unit must also disseminate information on what acts prohibited and banned species in every barangay.

The Wildlife Traffic Monitoring Unit shall regularly monitor pet shops, commercial establishments, institutional facilities, and residential area within the Municipality of Inopacan to ensure that no wildlife species (Flora and Fauna) are illegally traded

Section 8. Composition of the Local Wildlife Enforcement Committee

Chairman: Municipal Mayor

Vice-Chairman : Chairman on the Committee on Environment and Ecology

Members : Municipal Environment and Natural Resources Office (MENRO)
 Philippine National Police (PNP)
 Municipal Agriculture's Office (MAO)
 DENR Representative
 CSO Representative

Section 9. Deputation of Wildlife Enforcement Officers

- a. The Wildlife Enforcement Officers shall have full authority to confiscate illegally traded wildlife species as well as apprehend violators subject to existing laws, rules, and regulations.
- b. All confiscated wildlife shall be properly turned over to the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) In accordance with the guidelines set forth RA 9147.
- c. The Local Wildlife Enforcement Committee shall formulate guidelines and Implementing Rules and Regulation (IRR) for the smooth implementation of the ordinance.

Section 10. Penalty Clause. Any person committing any act mentioned in Section 6 herein shall be punished by the following:

First Offense	: A Fine of one Thousand Pesos (P1,000.00)
Second offense	: A Fine of One Thousand & Five Hundred Pesos (P1,500.00)
Third Offense	: A Fine of Two Thousand & Five Hundred Pesos (P2,500.00) or an imprisonment of not more than six (6) months, or both, at the discretion of the court

Section 11. Funding Requirements. Funds to pay shall be chargeable to the Local Government Appropriation for Fiscal Year 2026 under Municipal Environment and Natural Resources Office. Such fund shall cover all necessary requirements related to Wildlife Anti-Trafficking and Protection Program to carry out its implementation.

Section 12. Repealing Clause. – The provisions of previous local Ordinance, Resolutions, Memoranda, Circulars and other issuance inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

Section 13. Separability Clause. –Should any portion of this Ordinance be declared ultra vires or unconstitutional by competent authority, the remainder not so affected shall continue to be in full force and effect.

SECTION 14. EFFECTIVITY CLAUSE. The Ordinance shall take effect after posting for three (3) consecutive weeks in conspicuous places.

MINUTES OF THE PUBLIC HEARING ON THE PROPOSED MUNICIPAL ORDINANCES OF THE 16TH SANGGUNIANG BAYAN OF INOPACAN, LEYTE HELD ON JUNE 04 AT THE BARANGAY HALL, POBLACION, INOPACAN, LEYTE

4 The proposed ordinances submitted for public hearing are the

16 Since the public hearing was scheduled in conjunction with the ABC Meeting,
17 it commenced at 9:35 o'clock in the morning upon the endorsement of the
18 proceedings by the ABC President, Honorable Panfila I. Alonzo.

19
20 The Master of Ceremonies, Mr. Montajes, expressed his gratitude to the ABC
21 President and the Punong Barangays in attendance for permitting the use of their
22 meeting as a venue for the conduct of the public hearing. Thereafter, Honorable
23 Villas was recognized to give the introductory message and present the rationale
24 and purpose of the public hearing. Honorable Villas explained that the public hearing
25 was intentionally conducted in conjunction with the ABC Meeting, considering that
26 the proposed ordinances require the cooperation and coordination of the Punong
27 Barangays for their effective implementation. She further emphasized that not all
28 proposed ordinances necessitate a public hearing, as such requirement generally
29 applies only to measures that impose penalties. With that, Honorable Villas
30 proceeded to the discussion of the proposed ordinances, starting with the ordinance
31 she authored entitled:

33 "AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING/INSTITUTIONALIZING THE 'TUBURAN SA
34 KASAYSAYAN' AS THE OFFICIAL MUNICIPAL HYMN OF THE MUNICIPALITY
35 OF INOPACAN, PROVINCE OF LEYTE, PROVIDING GUIDELINES FOR ITS
36 OFFICIAL USE AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES"

37
38 *Author: Honorable Lourdes B. Villas*

39 The author, Honorable Villas, provided a background of the Inopacan Hymn.
40 That in 2019, the Local Government Unit of Inopacan, under the leadership of
41 Honorable Mayor Mirambel, conducted a contest for the composition of an official
42 municipal hymn. The composition submitted by the Department of Education,
43 particularly by Mr. Jaime Dianon and Ms. Brenda Lapasanda, and succinctly titled
44 "Inopacan Hymn," was declared the winner of said contest.

45 The hymn was officially launched and introduced to the public during the
46 Inopacan Founding Anniversary in 2021. However, in the absence of an ordinance
47 institutionalizing the Inopacan Hymn as the official municipal hymn, it has not been
48 utilized in any formal government events since its introduction.

49 Thereafter, Honorable Villas proceeded to read the provisions of the
50 proposed ordinance before the participants and provided a concise explanation of
51 each section thereof. She likewise clarified that all recommendations raised during
52 the public hearing shall be duly noted and submitted for the consideration of the
53 August Body, and, when found meritorious, shall be incorporated into the proposed
54 measure.

55 After the entire ordinance had been presented, Honorable Villas enjoined the
56 participants to listen to the musically enhanced version of the Inopacan Hymn.

57 Afterward, the floor was given to the Inopacan District Supervisor, Mrs.
58 Violeta B. Boldios, to provide additional inputs on the Inopacan Hymn. Mrs. Boldios
59 recalled that she was serving as District Supervisor of this municipality when the
60 Inopacan Hymn was launched, prior to her reassignment. She recounted the
61 preparations undertaken and the expenses incurred by the Department of Education
62 in producing a hymn befitting the Municipality of Inopacan.

63 Mrs. Boldios likewise discussed the various stages in the enactment of an
64 ordinance relative to the institutionalization of a municipal hymn. Her discussion also
65 touched on intellectual property rights, emphasizing the Local Government Unit's
66 responsibility to secure the rights to the hymn in order to prevent potential legal
67 disputes or litigation in the future.

68 To this end, Mrs. Boldios explained that the composer and lyricists must
69 execute a Deed of Assignment, a formal legal instrument transferring all intellectual
70 property rights and copyright ownership of the hymn to the Municipal Government of
71 Inopacan. She further stated that, upon execution of the Deed of Assignment, the
72 LGU shall proceed with the registration of the musical composition, arrangement,
73 and lyrics with the appropriate government agency, such as the National Library of
74 the Philippines or the Intellectual Property Office of the Philippines (IPOPHL), under
75 the name of the Municipality of Inopacan, Leyte.

76 Mrs. Boldios likewise emphasized that, in order to prevent community groups
77 from performing versions of the hymn that differ from the officially adopted rendition,
78 the Municipality should produce an official recording thereof and distribute copies to
79 the community. She added that, in order to transition the hymn from a legal
80 instrument into a living part of civic life, the Municipality must ensure its regular use
81 during official functions, in schools, and in community activities.

82 As regards the launching of the official hymn, Mrs. Boldios suggested that the
83 same be undertaken during a significant milestone event of the Municipality.

84 After Mrs. Boldios had concluded her discussion, the floor was given to
85 Honorable Villas. Honorable Villas informed Mrs. Boldios that certain modifications
86 had been made to the musical arrangement of the hymn, particularly with respect to
87 its tempo, which had been adjusted to a faster pace. Thereafter, the floor has been
88 opened for suggestions and/or clarifications from the participants.
89

90 The Punong Barangay of Maljo, Honorable Fernando B. Rulete, Jr., asked if
91 incentives were given to the composers of the hymn. Honorable Villas responded
92 that the composers were given their due incentives.

93 Honorable Villas likewise reiterated that, pursuant to Section 10 of the
94 proposed ordinance, any revision to the hymn may only be considered or adopted
95 after the lapse of five (5) years from the enactment of the ordinance. Mayor
96 Mirambel pointed out that the hymn captures the essence of the Municipality of
97 Inopacan and that constant revisions thereto are not encouraged, as stability and
98 consistency are essential to its recognition as the Municipality's official hymn.
99 Honorable Mirambel clarified that while the public hearing is still ongoing, the
100 participants are urged to raise their suggestions or proposed changes to the hymn.
101 The Mayor further suggested that the official music video of the hymn be updated to
102 incorporate recent photographs depicting the Municipality of Inopacan, particularly
103 its tourist attractions, cultural landmarks, and the distinct local delicacies of each
104 barangay.

105
106 Since the participants raised no further questions, the floor was given to
107 Honorable Teotimo G. Lapasa to discuss his proposed ordinance, to wit:

115 Honorable Lapasa read the entirety of the proposed measure before the
116 participants, after which the floor was opened for questions, comments, and
117 recommendations relative thereto.

118 The Punong Barangay of Guinsangaan, Honorable Bayani R. Piamonte,
119 inquired whether the proposed ordinance would formally prohibit the hunting of wild
120 boars. In response, Honorable Lapasa clarified that the hunting of wild boars is
121 prohibited under the measure.

122 The Honorable Mayor then directed a question to the Municipal Environment
123 and Natural Resources Officer, Mr. Alfredo D. Galo, Jr., as to whether the proposed
124 ordinance likewise prohibits the capture of wild birds, such as *tukmo*, *kusi*, and
125 similar species.

126 In response, Mr. Galo explained that the term “wildlife” encompasses all wild
127 forms of flora and fauna, including wild plants and animals. Consequently, the
128 capture of wild birds is likewise prohibited under the proposed measure.

129 Mr. Galo, however, clarified that individuals who are already keeping wild
130 animals in captivity prior to the enactment of the ordinance may be exempted from
131 its application, provided that they do not acquire additional wild animals and that all
132 animals in their possession are duly registered with the Department of Environment
133 and Natural Resources (DENR). He further explained that such exemption shall not
134 apply to species classified by the International Union for Conservation of Nature
135 (IUCN) as vulnerable, endangered, or otherwise threatened with extinction. He also
136 clarified the distinction between an active capture and accidental capture, with the
137 former being penalized under the proposed ordinance.

138 Mr. Galo emphasized that the primary objective of the proposed ordinance is
139 to prevent the trafficking of wild plants and animals within the Municipality. He further
140 explained that, should such acts be committed in the future, the Municipality would
141 already have a legal basis for the imposition of the corresponding penalties.

The Punong Barangay of Guadalupe, Honorable Aura P. Chiong, cited a situation involving a resident who had taken an owl chick into his custody. According to her, the owl eventually matured in captivity and has since been kept as a household pet. She then sought clarification as to the legality of such circumstance under the proposed ordinance.

In response, Mr. Galo explained that the keeping of wild animals in captivity is generally prohibited under the proposed measure. He stated that, in such instances, the individual concerned is required to surrender the animal to the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR). However, he clarified that if the individual wishes to domesticate the animal, he may be permitted to do so, provided that the animal is duly registered with the DENR and is not otherwise prohibited under existing laws and regulations.

The Mayor inquired as to the legality of honey harvesting, considering that the process may involve the disturbance or destruction of bee hives. In response, Mr. Galo explained that due consideration is given to certain circumstances, particularly to practices that have long been adopted by communities as a source of livelihood. He further clarified that appropriate exemptions from the application of the proposed measure may be extended where warranted, subject to existing environmental laws, rules, and regulations.

Since there were no other questions raised, Mr. Montajes, on behalf of the 16th Sangguniang Bayan, once again expressed his gratitude to the ABC President and the Punong Barangays for the opportunity to present the proposed municipal ordinances.

There being no further matters to be taken up, the public hearing was adjourned at 11:51 o'clock in the morning.
