ORDINANCE NO. 2026 – 06

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE PROTECTION, CONSERVATION, AND REFORESTATION OF MANGROVE FORESTS IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF TANAUAN, LEYTE, PROVIDING FUNDS THEREFOR AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE SANGGUNIANG BAYAN OF TANAUAN, LEYTE IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED THAT:

WHEREAS, Section 16 of the 1987 Philippine Constitution provides that the State shall protect and advance the right of the people to a balanced and healthful ecology in accord with the rhythm and harmony of nature;

WHEREAS, Section 2 of Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, provides that Local Government Units (LGUs) shall share with the national government the responsibility in the management and maintenance of ecological balance within their territorial jurisdiction;

WHEREAS, Section 447(a)(1)(vi) of R.A. No. 7160 empowers the Sangguniang Bayan to protect the environment and impose appropriate penalties for acts which endanger the environment, such as dynamite fishing and other forms of destructive fishing, illegal logging, and smuggling of logs, smuggled forest products and other products;

WHEREAS, Presidential Decree No. 705, as amended, or the Revised Forestry Code of the Philippines, provides for the protection, development, and rehabilitation of forestlands, including mangrove areas;

WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 9147, or the Wildlife Resources Conservation and Protection Act, aims to conserve and protect wildlife species and their habitats, including mangrove forests that serve as important ecosystems for marine life;

WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 9729, or the Climate Change Act of 2009, recognizes the role of ecosystems, such as mangroves, in climate change adaptation and disaster risk reduction;

WHEREAS, Executive Order No. 533, Series of 2006, adopts the Integrated Coastal Management (ICM) as a national strategy to ensure the sustainable development of the country's coastal and marine environment and resources, of which mangrove areas are critical components;

WHEREAS, mangrove forests serve as vital habitats for marine biodiversity, protect shorelines against storm surges, prevent coastal erosion, and contribute to carbon sequestration and climate change mitigation;

WHEREAS, the Executive-Legislative Agenda (ELA) of the Municipality of Tanauan, Leyte identifies environmental protection and mangrove reforestation as priority projects to promote sustainable development and disaster resiliency within the locality;

WHEREAS, there is an urgent need to institutionalize policies and mechanisms for the protection, conservation, and rehabilitation of mangrove forests within the territorial jurisdiction of Tanauan, Leyte, in order to preserve the ecological balance, protect lives and properties in coastal communities, and secure the livelihood of fisherfolk and other stakeholders;

SECTION 1. TITLE This ordinance shall be known as the **"Mangrove Protection and Reforestation Ordinance of Tanauan, Leyte."**

SECTION 2. DECLARATION OF POLICY It is hereby declared the policy of the Municipality of Tanauan to conserve, protect, rehabilitate, and sustainably manage its mangrove ecosystems for ecological balance, climate resiliency, coastal protection, and food security.

SECTION 3. DEFINITION OF TERMS For purposes of this ordinance, the following terms shall mean:

- a) Mangroves: Coastal trees or shrubs that grow in tidal, saline, or brackish water, providing critical habitat for marine life and protection against coastal erosion and flooding.
- b) Reforestation: Planting of mangrove propagules or seedlings in denuded or degraded mangrove areas.
- c) Protected Mangrove Area: A designated zone within the municipality where mangrove forests are declared protected and any form of destruction or alteration is prohibited.
- d) Coastal Resource Management (CRM): A strategy that promotes sustainable use and conservation of coastal and marine resources.
- e) Illegal Cutting: Unauthorized harvesting, trimming, or destruction of mangrove trees.
- f) LGU: Local Government Unit of Tanauan, Leyte.
- g) DENR: Department of Environment and Natural Resources.
- h) Community Participation: Involvement of residents, barangays, CSOs, fisherfolk, and other stakeholders in mangrove protection efforts.

SECTION 4. SCOPE AND COVERAGE. This ordinance shall cover all coastal barangays in the Municipality of Tanauan where mangrove areas are found or suitable for reforestation and protection.

SECTION 5. DECLARATION OF PROTECTED MANGROVE AREAS/ZONES

A series of handwritten signatures in black and blue ink, likely representing the officials who signed the ordinance. The signatures are located at the bottom of the page, below the text of Section 5.

The Municipality of Tanauan, Leyte hereby declares the existing mangrove areas and coastal mangrove zones located in the following barangays as protected mangrove areas/zones under this Ordinance:

a. Barangay Sta. Cruz

b. Barangay Cabuynan

These areas shall be subject to protection, conservation, rehabilitation, monitoring, and sustainable management pursuant to this Ordinance and existing environmental laws, rules, and regulations.

The Municipal Environment and Natural Resources Office (MENRO), in coordination with the Municipal Agriculture Office (MAO), concerned barangays, DENR, BFAR, and other relevant agencies, shall identify, map, validate, and maintain an inventory of the protected mangrove areas within the municipality.

Additional mangrove areas or coastal protection zones may likewise be declared upon recommendation of the Municipal Mangrove Task Force, MENRO, or other competent agencies.

SECTION 6. PROHIBITED ACTS. The following acts are strictly prohibited:

- a. Cutting, uprooting, or destroying mangroves without permit from DENR and LGU
- b. Dumping of solid or hazardous waste in mangrove areas
- c. Backfilling, reclamation, or conversion of mangrove zones for any purpose without proper authority
- d. Constructing structures that impede mangrove growth or access to coastal waterways
- e. Grazing of animals within protected mangrove areas
- f. Unauthorized harvesting of mangrove products (bark, propagules, etc.)

SECTION 7. REFORESTATION AND REHABILITATION. The LGU shall implement a Mangrove Reforestation Program in coordination with:

- a) DENR and Bureau of Fisheries and Aquatic Resources (BFAR)
- b) Local barangays and fisherfolk associations
- c) Civil society and academic institutions

a. Activities shall include:

- 1. Site identification and zoning
- 2. Propagule collection and nursery establishment
- 3. Community training and planting activities
- 4. Maintenance, monitoring, protection and reforestation

SECTION 8. COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT AND EDUCATION. The LGU, through its Municipal Environment and Natural Resources Office (MENRO), shall conduct regular information and education campaigns (IECs) on the importance of mangroves, targeting schools, fisherfolk, youth, and barangays.

SECTION 9. CREATION AND COMPOSITION OF THE MUNICIPAL MANGROVE TASK FORCE

A Municipal Mangrove Task Force is hereby created to oversee the implementation, monitoring, enforcement, protection, conservation, and rehabilitation activities under this Ordinance.

The Task Force shall be composed of the following:

Chairperson: Municipal Mayor or duly authorized representative

Vice-Chairperson: Municipal Environment and Natural Resources Officer (MENRO)

Members:

1. Municipal Agriculture Officer (MAO)
2. Chairperson, Committee on Environment of the Sangguniang Bayan
3. Representative from the Liga ng mga Barangay
4. Barangay Captain/s of affected coastal barangays
5. Representative from BFAR
6. Representative from DENR, if available
7. Representative from accredited Civil Society Organizations (CSOs) or environmental organizations
8. Representative from fisherfolk associations
9. Representative from youth/environmental groups
10. Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Officer (MDRRMO)

The Task Force may invite other government agencies, academic institutions, private organizations, and stakeholders whenever necessary.

SECTION 10. DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE MUNICIPAL MANGROVE TASK FORCE

The Municipal Mangrove Task Force shall have the following duties and responsibilities:

- a. Monitor compliance with this Ordinance and other applicable environmental laws, rules, and regulations;
- b. Coordinate and supervise mangrove protection, conservation, rehabilitation, and reforestation activities within the municipality;
- c. Identify and recommend areas for mangrove rehabilitation, protection, and expansion;
- d. Conduct regular inspection, monitoring, validation, and inventory of mangrove areas;
- e. Assist in the prevention and reporting of illegal cutting, destruction, dumping, reclamation, illegal fishing activities, and other environmentally destructive acts within mangrove zones;
- f. Conduct Information, Education, and Communication (IEC) campaigns and community awareness programs regarding mangrove protection and coastal resource management;
- g. Coordinate with barangays, people's organizations, fisherfolk associations, schools, CSOs, DENR, BFAR, and other agencies for program implementation;
- h. Recommend policies, programs, and measures for the improvement and sustainability of mangrove ecosystems;
- i. Submit regular reports and recommendations to the Office of the Mayor and the Sangguniang Bayan;
- j. Perform such other functions necessary to effectively implement the provisions and objectives of this Ordinance.

SECTION 11. FUNDING. An initial amount shall be allocated under the municipal environment and disaster risk reduction budget for the implementation of this ordinance. Subsequent funding shall be included in the Annual Investment Plan (AIP) or sourced from grants and national agencies.

SECTION 12. PENALTY CLAUSE. Any person, group, or entity found violating this ordinance shall be penalized as follows:

- a. **First Offense:** Fine of ₱1,500 and mandatory seminar of the ordinance
- b. **Second Offense:** Fine of ₱2,000 and imprisonment, at the discretion of the court
- c. **Third & Succeeding Offense:** Fine of ₱2,500, and imprisonment, at the discretion of the court

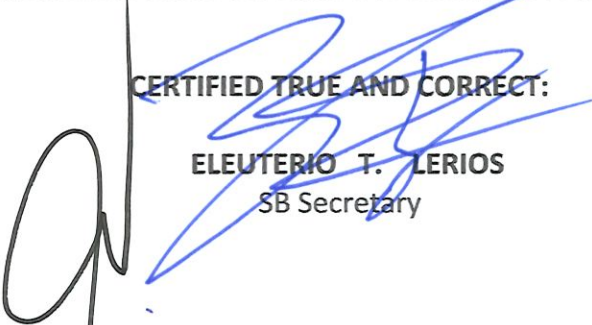
SECTION 13. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE. If any provision of this ordinance is declared invalid or unconstitutional, the remaining provisions shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 14. REPEALING CLAUSE. All ordinances, executive orders, and rules inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

SECTION 15. EFFECTIVITY. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its approval and compliance with posting and publication requirements under the Local Government Code.

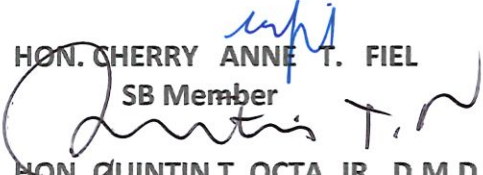

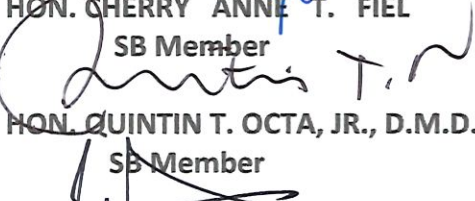

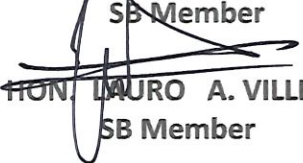

MINUTES OF THE PUBLIC HEARING

21 November 2025 - FRIDAY- 9:00 A.M.
Amphitheater, Tanauan Public Plaza, Tanauan, Leyte

A. PRELIMINARIES

In attendance were the sponsors of the proposed ordinances Hon. Engr. Mae Jane Angelie M. Morabe-Borais and Hon. Mark Efren E. Merilo. Also present were the SK Federation President- Hon. Kyle C. Mesias, the Licensing Officer, representatives from the Tanauan PNP, the Barangay Chairpersons, representatives from the different fisherfolk associations, representatives from the Motorcab and Pedicab Drivers Aassociations.

B. AGENDA

C. PRESENTATION OF THE PROPOSED ORDINANCE

Hon. Morabe presented the provisions of her proposed ordinances, emphasizing the rationale and legal basis of the said proposed measures for the protection of mangrove forest and the establishment of anti-drunk driving in the municipality.

On the otherhand, Hon. Merilo presented the proposed amendments and consolidations of the existing ordinances on traffic management in the municipality, incorporating the provisions relating to the operation of e-trikes. Hon. Morabe also emphasized the prohibited acts and the penalties under the proposed Comprehensive Traffic Code.

D. OPEN FORUM

The Chairperson of Brgy. Guingauan- Hon. Leonil Badana, asked the author if a provision on the revocation of business permits of the pedicab and e-trike drivers who are involved in drunk-driving incidents can also be included just like the motor vehicle drivers, to which the main author has answered that she will consider the same as it was also the suggestion of the Municipal Traffic Management to include the pedicab and e-trikes in the ordinance and not only the motor vehicles.

While some concerns not related to the proposed ordinance were also raised, the same were duly noted by the author such as the concern of the Chairman of Brgy. Guindag-an – Hon. Floro Juanitez on the protection of the mountain side in their barangay and whether the same was included in the new CLUP of the LGU; the concern of the TUPAD beneficiaries on the requirement of medical certificates; and the concern of the chairman of Brgy. Limbuan Daku – Hon. Joel Logronio, on the construction of the farm to market road in their barangay affecting numerous farmers and yet the said farmers were not consulted prior to the implementation of the said projects.

As to the proposed Traffic Code, the Chairman of Brgy. Canbalisara – Hon. Molon, inquired if the fare rates from the Tanauan Public Market to Brgy. Cabungaan can be in two categories such as the other barangays with “puro” and “ilawod” contending that the distance from the barangay proper to the end or boundary of Brgy. Cabungaan is likened to the distance to Brgy. Picas, in which the fare is Php40.00, and suggested that the fare rates to Brgy. Cabungaan proper be Php30.00 and beyond the barangay proper to the end boundary of the said Barangay should be Php40.00. The Licensing Officer explained that the fare rates were only adopted based on the increase after the Covid-19 pandemic and if the said rates will be incorporated, the commuting public in the said barangay will still be consulted if they are amenable to the said increase.

Mr. Demegillo of Brgy. Bislig suggested that there should be bicycle lane in the municipality to which Hon. Morabe answered that there is already an existing ordinance passed by Hon. Borja however there is difficulty in the implementation of the said ordinance particularly on the road widening due to existing concrete structures encroaching the road setbacks.

A concern on high fare rates of being charged by pedicab or e-trike drivers going to Brgy. Sta. Cruz was also raised, as well as some pedicab/e-trike drivers plying from Tanauan Proper to the different barangays such as Brgy. Kiling. The said concern was addressed by advising the concerned persons to report the said incidents for being violative of the existing ordinances as indicated in the fare matrix and for out-of-line.

E. ADJOURNMENT

There having no more matters to be discussed, the public hearing was adjourned at 12:10 in the afternoon.

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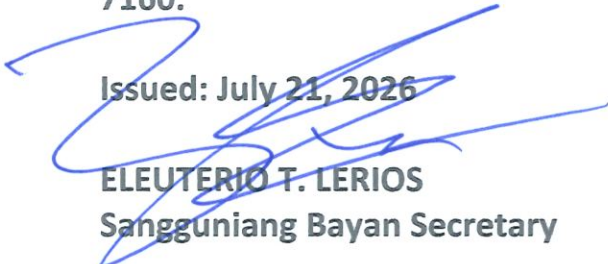
