Administrative Complaint of Lowell C. Marmita against Edwin B. Jomadiao

I. ANTECEDENTS

This administrative case arose from a Complaint filed by **Lowell C. Marmita** against **Edwin B. Jomadiao**, then a Member of the Sangguniang Bayan of Alangalang, Leyte and Chairman of its Committee on Games and Amusements, for **Oppression and Abuse of Authority** under Section 60 of the Local Government Code.

The Complaint arose from Respondent's issuance and personal service of a **Cease-and-Desist Order dated 26 March 2017**, directing the organizers of a scheduled special derby at the Alangalang Sports Complex and Gallera to cease and desist from conducting and promoting the same.

The Complaint was initially filed before the Office of the Ombudsman for the Visayas and was thereafter endorsed to the Sangguniang Panlalawigan of Leyte for appropriate administrative proceedings.

II. FACTUAL AND PROCEDURAL BACKGROUND

Based on the records:

- Respondent admitted issuing and personally serving the questioned Cease-and-Desist Order in his capacity as SB Member and Chairman of the Committee on Games and Amusements.
- During the pendency of the administrative proceedings, Respondent was preventively suspended for sixty (60) days pursuant to **SP Resolution No. 2021-177** and the corresponding Order of the Provincial Governor. The preventive suspension expired on **5 July 2021**.
- Respondent separately challenged the preventive suspension before the Regional Trial Court and the Office of the President. One judicial challenge was dismissed for forum shopping, while his Petition for Review before the Office of the President was subsequently withdrawn after the preventive suspension had been fully served.
- On **23 May 2022**, the Blue Ribbon Committee issued an Order directing the parties to submit their respective Memoranda within fifteen (15) days from receipt.
- Respondent thereafter filed a **Motion to Dismiss dated 14 May 2026**, principally invoking violation of his constitutional right to the speedy disposition of cases and, alternatively, mootness by reason of his separation from public office.

III. ISSUES FOR DETERMINATION

- Whether Respondent's Motion to Dismiss should be granted on the ground of violation of his constitutional right to the speedy disposition of cases;
- Whether the dismissal affects the validity of the preventive suspension previously imposed and fully served by Respondent; and
- What disposition should be made of the administrative complaint.

IV. DISCUSSION

A. Motion to Dismiss

The Committee finds the Motion to Dismiss **meritorious**.

While a substantial portion of the earlier proceedings involved Respondent's own collateral judicial and administrative challenges and cannot fairly be attributed to the disciplining authority, the records presently available do not contain competent documentary proof from which service of the **23 May 2022 Order** upon the parties may now be verified.

The absence of such documentation does **not** constitute a finding that service was never effected, nor does it establish negligence, bad faith, misconduct, or administrative lapse on the part of the Blue Ribbon Committee, the Secretariat, the Sangguniang Panlalawigan, or any public officer. The Committee's determination is confined solely to the state of the records presently available for adjudication.

Nevertheless, in the absence of affirmative proof of receipt, Respondent's failure to submit the required Memorandum cannot be attributed to his fault or neglect. Considering the totality of the circumstances and the constitutional guarantee of speedy disposition of cases, the Committee finds sufficient basis to grant the Motion to Dismiss.

B. Preventive Suspension

173 The dismissal of the administrative complaint does **not invalidate or otherwise affect the preventive suspension previously imposed**
174 **upon Respondent.**

175 Preventive suspension is an interlocutory measure and not a penalty or adjudication of guilt. Its propriety is determined by the
176 circumstances existing at the time of its imposition. Respondent separately challenged the preventive suspension and subsequently
177 acknowledged that the sixty-day period had already been fully served.

178 Accordingly, the dismissal of the underlying administrative complaint should not be construed as a declaration that **SP Resolution No.**
179 **2021-177** or the corresponding Order of Preventive Suspension was illegally issued, implemented, or otherwise void.

180 C. Evidence on the Underlying Complaint

181 For completeness of the record, the evidence substantially establishes that Respondent personally issued and served the questioned Cease-
182 and-Desist Order in his official capacity, while no specific ordinance, executive issuance, written delegation, or other legal authority was
183 demonstrated authorizing him, acting individually as an SB Member or Committee Chairman, to issue and personally enforce such
184 directive.

185 Had the case been timely resolved on the merits, the evidence would have been sufficient to support a finding that Respondent exceeded
186 the authority vested in his office. However, because dismissal is warranted on constitutional grounds, **no formal adjudication of**
187 **administrative liability or penalty should now be imposed.**

188 V. FINDINGS

189 Upon review of the records, the Committee finds that:

- 190 1. Respondent's Motion to Dismiss should be **GRANTED** on the ground of denial of his constitutional right to the speedy
191 disposition of cases;
192 2. Such dismissal does not constitute a finding of negligence, bad faith, misconduct, or administrative lapse on the part of the
193 **Sangguniang Panlalawigan, Blue Ribbon Committee, Secretariat, or any public officer or employee;**
194 3. The dismissal does not invalidate or set aside **SP Resolution No. 2021-177** or the preventive suspension previously imposed
195 and fully served by Respondent; and
196 4. While the evidence would have supported a finding that Respondent exceeded the authority vested in his office had the case
197 been timely decided on the merits, dismissal on constitutional grounds precludes a formal adjudication of administrative liability.

198 VI. RECOMMENDATION

199 **WHEREFORE**, premises considered, the Blue Ribbon Committee respectfully recommends that the Honorable Sangguniang
200 Panlalawigan:

- 201 1. **GRANT** Respondent Edwin B. Jomadio's Motion to Dismiss dated 14 May 2026;
202 2. **DISMISS** Administrative Case No. IC-OV-18-0096 on the ground of denial of Respondent's constitutional right to the speedy
203 disposition of cases;
204 3. **DECLARE** that the dismissal shall not invalidate, reverse, or set aside SP Resolution No. 2021-177 or the corresponding
205 preventive suspension previously imposed and implemented against Respondent; and
206 4. **APPROVE AND ADOPT** the accompanying Decision consistent with this Committee Report.

216 HON. MILDRED JOY P. QUE: 2ND DISTRICT BOARD MEMBER

217 This is regarding the case of Edwin B. Jomadiao filed by complainant Lowell C. Marmita
218 which was referred to the Blue Ribbon Committee. This is about a case for Oppression and
219 Grave Abuse of Authority under Section 60 of the Local Government Code.

220 Complaint arose because respondent, Edwin Jomadiao, issued and personally served
221 a cease-and-desist order dated March 26, 2017. Please show the cease-and-desist order
222 which was issued, by then Councilor, Edwin Jomadiao who is actually the Chairman of the
223 Committee on Games and Amusements.

224 *CEASE AND DESIST ORDER SHOWN IN THE PRESENTATION*

225 This is the cease-and-desist order which he issued and personally signed. You see at
226 the bottom, it is signed and nakalagay dyan na that the gallera and their derby should cease
227 and desist from conducting their derby. So respondent, during the pendency of the
228 administrative proceedings before the Sangguniang Panlalawigan, was preventively
229 suspended for 60 days pursuant to SP Resolution 2021-77, and there was also an order from
230 the Provincial Governor. The preventive suspension expired on July 5, 2021.

231 Respondent separately challenged the preventive suspension before the Regional Trial
232 Court as well as with the Office of the President. All of these cases against Former Governor
233 Dominic Petilla, the former SP members then were all dismissed while the case at the Office
234 of the President, he personally withdrew it. So, on May 23, 2022, the Blue Ribbon Committee
235 issued its last order directing the parties to submit their respective memoranda within fifteen
236 days from receipt. Unfortunately, after due diligence, we could not find if this order was
237 received by both complainant and respondent, so, since May 23, 2022 until today, wala na
238 kaming nakita sa records if gumalaw pa yung case. Respondent then filed a motion to dismiss
239 last May 14, 2026 invoking violation of his Constitutional Right to the Speedy Disposition of
240 Cases and, alternatively, he said that moot na daw itong kasong to because he's already
241 separated from public service. So, what were the issues that needs to be determined? Whether
242 respondents motion to dismiss should be grounded based on violation of his Constitutional
243 Right to Speedy Disposition of Cases, whether the dismissal affects the validity of the

244 preventive suspension which was previously imposed and fully served and what this position
245 should be made under administrative complaint?

246 So, for discussion, first on the motion to dismiss the Committee then finds that the
247 motion to dismiss is meritorious. Why? Because based on the May 23, 2022 order, wala nang
248 nangyari sa case so for 2002, 2023, 2024, 2025 and 2026 which is close to four years, so,
249 talagang mag tri-trigger na yung kanyang Constitutional Right to Speedy Disposition. Hence,
250 we would need to grant the motion for dismissal of the case.

251 Second, yung preventive suspension nya, we cannot invalidate it and it will not also
252 affect kung ano ang naging decision natin sa motion to dismiss because preventive suspension
253 is an Interlocutory Order and it is not a penalty or adjudication of guilt. Precisely, preventing
254 suspension siya para kung ano mang hearing, hindi sya maka exert ng influence.

255 And of course, I also discussed that for completeness of record, yung underlying
256 complaint, nakitaan Talaga nating sya ng grave abuse of authority although walang oppression
257 kasi wala naman tayong nakita may bayaran, may suholan. Ang naging mitya lang ng kanyang
258 case was actually the issuance of a cease-and-desist order na walang basis. Wala syang
259 naipresent sa lahat ng sinubmit nya satin na reply and answer. Wala talaga siyang naipakita
260 na basis ng kanyang pagpirma ng cease-and-desist order.

261 Therefore, the Blue Ribbon Committee recommends that we grant Respondent
262 Jomadio's motion to dismiss, that we dismiss the Administrative Case on the ground of Denial
263 of Respondents Constitutional Right to Speedy Disposition of Cases, that we declare that the
264 dismissal shall not invalidate, reverse or set aside the SP Resolution corresponding to
265 preventive suspension previously imposed and that we approve and adopt this decision which
266 was drafted.

267 So, this is the decision. First, we summarized what this case was all about. Then
268 second, we discussed the antecedents. Ikwinento natin kung ano ang case na to which arose
269 from a from derby sa Alangalang Sports Complex and akung anong nangyari. We cited kung
270 ano pa ang bababa sa antecedents, we cited the cease-and-desist order na pinirpmahan nya
271 and then binigay din natin yung procedural history ng case. The complaint was dated January
272 2018 pa. Ang unang finile nya ay dun sa Ombudsman but this was referred to the

273 Sangguninang Panlalwigan. So, anong nangyari sa atin, ano yung sinasabi sa records. Then
274 diniscuss din nating yung kanyang motion to dismiss diniscuss din nating yung motion to
275 dismiss na partly meritorious. Heavy yung discussions sa motion to dismiss. Itong decision na
276 to, it also said na sa second paragraph before the end of page four, "correspondingly the period
277 following the issuance of the order on the basis of the present record." And second, diniscuss
278 din datin yung kanyang dismissal of the administrative complaint na hindi siya makaka affect
279 sa preventive suspension previously imposed and then yung mootness ng case, hindi ko na
280 pinass upon kasi tapos na. Tapos, diniscuss ko yung findings from the record na kung irereview
281 nating yung kaso, talagang nasusuport yung factual findings na may kasalanan sya. On the
282 evidence presented wala kasing legal authority na naipakita, pero, sa dispositive portion we
283 granted motion to dismiss, sa admin case it nadismiss and then sinabi natin na "that the
284 foregoing findings and observations are made solely to explain the evidence contained in the
285 record and the reasons for the disposition. They shall not constitute a formal adjudication of
286 administrative liability nor shall they serve as a basis for the imposition of any administrative
287 penalty." So, so ordered.

288 HON. LEONARDO M. JAVIER JR: PRESIDING OFFICER/VICE GOVERNOR

289 Ano ba si Mr. Jomadio that time? Was he a councilor?

290 HON. MILDRED JOY P. QUE: 2ND DISTRICT BOARD MEMBER

291 He was a councilor po, Mr. Chair, and the Chairman of Committee on Games and
292 Amusement.

293 HON. LEONARDO M. JAVIER JR: PRESIDING OFFICER/VICE GOVERNOR

294 Db a even if you are a councilor or chairman of such committee, the power to issue
295 cease-and-desist order falls only to the mayor?

296 HON. MILDRED JOY P. QUE: 2ND DISTRICT BOARD MEMBER

297 Yes, Mr. Chair.

298 HON. LEONARDO M. JAVIER JR: PRESIDING OFFICER/VICE GOVERNOR

299 So, who authorized him to issue?

300 HON. MILDRED JOY P. QUE: 2ND DISTRICT BOARD MEMBER

301 Nobody authorized him, Mr. Chair. That's why there is an abuse of authority.

302 HON. LEONARDO M. JAVIER JR: PRESIDING OFFICER/VICE GOVERNOR

303 So, akala nya, siya yung mayor that time?

304 HON. MILDRED JOY P. QUE: 2ND DISTRICT BOARD MEMBER

305 Yes, Mr. Chair.

306 HON. LEONARDO M. JAVIER JR: PRESIDING OFFICER/VICE GOVERNOR

307 Pero dahil tumagal na rin ito ng husto, pwede na nating idismiss?

308 HON. MILDRED JOY P. QUE: 2ND DISTRICT BOARD MEMBER

309 Yes po, idismiss nating nalang kasi iniinvoke nya yung kanyang Constitutional Right to

310 Speedy Disposition of cases. Umabot na kasi ng apat na taon.

386 might be some conflict of interest or whatever. Please put it on record. Thank you.

388 Even if you are inhibiting yourself, may we know what you have in your mind about this?

390 Yes, Mr. Chair. This Quick Gas monitoring system, it is an information system where in

391 all the gasoline stations' price here in the Province of Leyte will be posted in an internet or

392 social media platform. There are times, Mr. Chair, that the price of my gasoline is most probably

393 the lowest in the Region. It might be on my advantage, if there is that my price will be viewed

394 by all the motorists that my price is lower or cheaper or competitive with other gas stations. So,
395 that's only my insight of this information.

397 So, if your price is lowest, you are scared that everybody will go to your station?

398 HON. WILSON S. UY: 1ST DISTRICT BOARD MEMBER

400 alam yung mga isip ng mga tao na we are taking advantage of the platform but as I have said,
401 this platform is good, it is helpful to our general consumer.

403 On my part, Mr. Chair, since I also have a gas station, I would like to manifest on record
404 pursuant to Article 89 of the Local Government Code which mandates that we should declare

406 if, at any point, there will be a conflict of interest, I will withdraw the authorship of this ordinance
407 but at this point, there's no conflict yet because it is only a price monitoring.

409 So, in that case, everybody who has a gas station. I have a gas station also but I don't
410 really know anything about it.

412 Mr. Floor and Mr. Chair, drafting this ordinance and reviewing it from a legal stand point,
413 I don't see any conflict of interest because these are all general views that the public can
414 actually view. This is just an information drive pertaining to digital governance which is being
415 spearheaded by Governor Jericho Icot Petilla and I don't see any conflict-of-interest provision.
416 Therefore, I still encourage Honorable Uy and Honorable Loreto to join in the discussion but
417 maybe in voting you can just inhibit because you have the experience on how to implement
418 the said QGAS monitoring system. The SP needs your wisdom through the experiences that
419 you have.

844 This representation would like to seek the floor to deliver a short privilege speech.

845 Mr. Chair, my privilege speech pertains to LLCC, if we are aware what is LLCC which
846 is Line Lost and Congestion Cost, are charges being passed through by NGCP to our electric
847 cooperatives. And itong LLCC charges represents the cost of transmitting power over long
848 distances in the market price difference created by grid bottlenecks and transmissions system
849 constraints. Sa lahat ng mga regions, ang natatamaan ng LLCC ay Region 8 and Region 6.
850 This LLCC being charged to us, in the month of July, umabot ito ng more more or less P5.00
851 per Kilowatt-hour yung kuryente natin. This is not a system loss of our cooperative. Iba pa yung
852 system loss ni LEYECO. Ito transmission loss lang ito na umaabot sa P5.00. Dito sa atin, as
853 far as Samar, yung Kuryente nila doon umaabot ng P24.00 per Kilowatt, sobrang mahal. Itong
854 LLCC is being discussed in the hearing of the House of Congress. Since, we here in Region 8
855 is affected with this LLCC, that's why this representation would like to pass a Resolution to the
856 Regional Development Council to look into the possibility if meron ba tayong reimbursement
857 na makukuha because any excess collection resulting to market congestion and line loss, sabi
858 nila shall be returned to consumers through the Net Settlement Surplus Allocation. So, this is
859 being regulated by the Department of Energy, ERC and other agencies in the government.

860 So, Mr, Chair, considering that consumers here are being penalized with their system
861 wide generation constraints, the Generation Line Losses and Grid Congestion which we have
862 no operational control. That's why, Mr. Chair, there is a reason for us to pass a resolution to
863 the RDC to formally look into with the help of ERC, DOE and the Independent Electricity Market
864 Operators of the Philippines to review, revised, and accelerate the Net Settlement Surplus
865 allocation mechanism and revenue computation for Line Lost and Congestion Cost burdening
866 Eastern Visayas, our electric consumers particularly in Leyte. I so move.
