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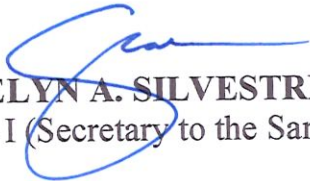

MUNICIPAL ORDINANCE NO. 2026-048

**AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A "FREEDOM PARK
"PURSUANT TO BATAS PAMBANSA BLG. 880 AND
DESIGNATING HEROES SHRINE FOR SUCH PURPOSE,
PRESCRIBING TERMS AND CONDITIONS THEREFOR, AND
IMPOSING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS THEREOF**

AUTHOR: HON. MILDRED C. MODESTO

Be it ordained by the Sangguniang Bayan of the Municipality of Carigara,
Leyte, that:

SECTION 1. TITLE. This Ordinance shall be known as the "ORDINANCE

“AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A ‘FREEDOM PARK’ PURSUANT TO BATAS PAMBANSA BLG. 880 AND DESIGNATING HEROES SHRINE FOR SUCH PURPOSE ...”

ESTABLISHING A ‘FREEDOM PARK’ in the Municipality of Carigara, Leyte.”

SECTION 2. BASIS OF ORDINANCE. This Ordinance is hereby enacted pursuant to Batas Blg. 880, otherwise known as “The Public Assembly Act of 1985” particularly Section 15 in relation to Section 4 thereof.

Section 15 provides:

“Section 15. Freedom parks – Every city and municipality in the country shall establish or designate at least one suitable “freedom park” or mall in their respective jurisdictions which, as far as practicable shall be centrally located within the poblacion where demonstrations and meetings may be held at any time without the need of prior permit”

Section 4. provides:

“Section 4. Permit when required and when not required. No permit shall be required if the public assembly shall be done or made in a freedom park duly established by law or ordinance. Political meetings or rallies held during any election campaign period as provided for by law are not covered by this Act.

SECTION 3. LIBERAL CONSTRUCTION. This Ordinance shall be liberally construed to give full force and effect to the objectives and purposes for which it is enacted.

SECTION 4. DEFINITION OF TERMS. For the purpose of this ordinance, the following terms, phrases, words and their derivations shall have the meaning given herein:

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- (a) **“Public Assembly”** means any rally, demonstrations, march, parade, procession or any other form mass or concerted action held in a public place freedom park for the purpose of presenting a lawful cause; or expressing an opinion to the general public on any particular issue; or protesting or influencing any state of affairs whether political, economic or social, or petitioning the government for redress of grievances.
- (b) **“Freedom Park”** shall refer to the Hero Shrine, located in the Municipality of Carigara, Leyte where person can peaceably assemble that any time without the need of any prior permit issued by the Local Government for the purpose of presenting a lawful cause; or expressing an opinion to the general public on any particular issue; or protesting or influencing any state of affairs weather political, economic or social; or petitioning the government for redress of grievances.
- (c) **“Batas Pambansa Blg. 880”** refers to “The Public Assembly Act of 1985” which was enacted to ensure the free exercise by the people of their right peaceably to assemble and petition the government for redress of grievances among others.
- (d) **“Demonstrators”** refer to the persons participating in a public assembly.
- (e) **“Maximum tolerance”** means the highest degree of restraint that the military, police and other peace keeping the authorities shall observed during a public assembly or in the dispersal of the same.
- (f) **“Law Enforcement Agency/Contingent”** pertains to any group, unit or contingent from the police or military organization or other peace keeping authorities.

SECTION 5. ESTABLISHMENT AND DESIGNATION OF “HEROES SHRINE AS THE “FREEDOM PARK” IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF CARIGARA, LEYTE. The Heroes Shrine, is hereby designated as the “freedom park” as defined in Section 4 (b) hereof. In this plaza, the people can



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freely exercise their constitutional right to peaceably assemble for purposes of holding or conducting a rally, demonstration, march, parade, procession or any other form of mass or concerted action for the purpose of presenting a lawful cause; or expressing an opinion to the general public on any particular issue; or protesting or influencing any state affairs whether political, economic or social; or petitioning the government for redress of grievances; provided, however, that a prior written clearance should be secured from the Municipal Mayor’s Office by the organizers or leaders of a public assembly to be conducted/ held at the “freedom park” for scheduling purposes; and provided, further, that the conduct thereof should not unduly disturb, hinder or disrupt the activities in surrounding the facilities and establishments.

SECTION 6. NON-INTERFERENCE BY LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES/ CONTINGENTS. Law Enforcement Agencies shall not interfere with the holding of a public assembly in the “freedom park”. However, to adequately ensure public safety, a law enforcement contingent under the command of a responsible police or military officer may be detailed and stationed in a place at least one hundred (100) meters away from the said park where a public assembly is taking place/ being held conducted ready to maintain peace and order at all times. Any such officer found guilty of violating this section shall be punished in accordance with Section 9 (a) hereof.

SECTION 7. DUTIES OF LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES- It shall be imperative for law enforcement agencies shall not interfere with the holding of a public assembly in the “freedom park” to perform their duties always mindful that their responsibility to provide proper protection to those exercising their right to peaceably assemble and to freedom of expression is primordial. Toward this end, law enforcement agencies shall observe the following rules:

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**“AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A ‘FREEDOM PARK’ PURSUANT

SHRINE FOR SUCH PURPOSE ...”**

- (a) Members of the law enforcement contingent who deal with the demonstrators shall be in complete uniform with their name plates and units to which they belong displayed prominently on the front part of their uniform and must observed the policy of “maximum tolerance” as herein defined;
- (b) The members of the law enforcement contingent shall not carry any kind of firearms but may be equipped with baton or riot sticks, shields, crash helmets with visors, gas, masks, boots or ankle high shoes with shin guards;
- (c) Tears gas, smokes grenades, waters cannons, or any similar anti-riot device shall not be used unless the public assembly in the “freedom park” is attended by actual violence or clear and present serious threats of violence, or deliberate destructions of property, or causes actual physical damage or injury to persons or property, whether private or public.

Any law enforcement personnel found guilty of failure to protect the public assembly with his assistance is sought by its leaders or organizers, or to comply with the rules in above mentioned subparagraphs (a), (b), or (c) shall be punished in accordance with section 9 (b) hereof.

SECTION 8. DUTIES OF THE DEMONSTRATORS/ORGANIZERS-

The organizers, leaders, and participants of any public assembly, demonstration, rally, meeting, or similar activity conducted within the designated Freedom Park shall:

- a. The organizers and participants of the assembly shall conduct themselves in a peaceful and orderly manner and comply with all applicable laws, regulations, and permit conditions.
- b. The organizers shall take reasonable measures to ensure the safety of



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participants and prevent damage to public or private property.

- c. Upon the conclusion of the assembly, the organizers shall be responsible for cleaning and restoring the assembly area and its immediate surroundings to their original condition, including the removal and proper disposal of all litter, banners, placards, materials, and other waste generated during the event.
- d. The organizers shall coordinate with the appropriate local government offices or authorities, when necessary, to ensure proper waste collection and area restoration after the assembly.
- e. Failure to comply with the obligations under this Section may subject the organizers to applicable penalties, liabilities, or sanctions as provided by law or local ordinance.

SECTION 9. PROHIBITED ACTS. The following shall constitute violations of this Ordinance:

- (a) Obstructing, impeding, disrupting or otherwise denying the exercise of the right to peaceful assembly;
- (b) The unnecessary firing of firearms by a member of any law enforcement agency or any person to disperse the public assembly.
- (c) Acts in violation of section 6 and 7 hereof.
- (d) Acts described hereunder if committed within one hundred (100) meters from the “freedom park” the area of the activity of the public assembly, or on occasion thereof, particularly:

1. The carrying of a deadly or offensive weapon or device such as firearm, pillbox bomb, and the like;
2. The carrying of a bladed weapon and the like;
3. The malicious burning of any objects;
4. The carrying of firearms by members of the law enforcement unit;



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5. The interfering with or disturbing intentionally of the holding of a public assembly by the use of a motor vehicle, its horns, loud sound systems or other similar means.

SECTION 10. PENALTIES. Any person found guilty and convicted of any of the prohibited acts defined in the immediately preceding Section shall be punished, as follows:

- (a) Violation of subparagraph (a) shall be punished by imprisonment of fifteen (15) to thirty (30) days at the Court’s discretion and a fine of one thousand five hundred (1,500.00) pesos;
- (b) Violations of subparagraphs (b), (c), and item 4, subparagraph (d) shall be punished by imprisonment of fifteen (15) to thirty (30) days at the Court’s discretion and a fine of two thousand (2,000.00) pesos;
- (c) Violations of item 2, item 3, or item 5 of subparagraph (d) shall be punished by imprisonment of fifteen (15) to thirty (30) days at the Court’s; discretion and a fine of two thousand five hundred (2,500.00) pesos.
- (d) Violation of item 1, subparagraph (d) shall be punished by imprisonment of fifteen (15) to thirty (30) days at the Court’s discretion and a prejudice to prosecution under Presidential Decree No. 1866;
- (e) Violation of the provisions of Section 6 or 7 hereof shall be punished in accordance with subparagraph (a) and subparagraph (b) hereof, respectively.

SECTION 11. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE. Any provision or portion of this ordinance found to be violative of the Constitution or invalid shall not impair the other provisions or parts thereof which shall continue to be in force and in effect.

If any provision of this Ordinance, or its application to any person, legal entity or circumstance, is held invalid, the reminder of the ordinance, or the application of the provision to other persons, legal entities or circumstance shall not be affected.

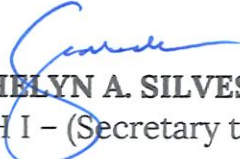
SECTION 12. REPEALING CLAUSE. Ordinances, rules and regulations or parts thereof, which are inconsistent or in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance, are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

SECTION 13. EFFECTIVITY. This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its approval and publication in local newspaper of general circulation.

1 MINUTES OF THE PUBLIC HEARING ON THE PROPOSED MUNICIPAL
2 ORDINANCE NO. 2026-048 entitled "AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING

7 HELD LAST JUNE 23, 2026, AT 3:00 PM AT LIGA HALL

9 **I. PRAYER & SINGING OF THE PHILIPPINE NATIONAL ANTHEM**

10 The committee formally commenced the public hearing with the
11 Opening Prayer followed by the singing of the Philippine National
12 Anthem.

13 **II. CALL TO ORDER**

14 The chairman of the Committee Hon. Fernando N. Moriel calls the meeting
15 to order.

16 **III. ROLL CALL**

17 The Secretariat Ms. Charie Ann Dacara disclosed that present thereat are
18 the Hon. Fernando N. Moriel (Chairman); Hon. Mildred C. Modesto; and Hon.
19 Joenlee C. Larraga. Absent thereat was Hon. Carlo Angelo B. Go and Hon. Arvin
20 N. Urmeneta.
21

22 Also present thereto are: Mr. Alejo N. Urmeneta, MDRRMO; PCPT Ma.
23 Alma Corpus-PNP OIC Chief; 49 Punong Barangays & Brgy. Secretaries;
24 representatives of educational institutions; CSO representatives; SB staff; and
25 other stakeholders.
26

27 **IV. OPENING STATEMENT:**

28 The Presiding Officer, Hon. Fernando N. Moriel, Chairman of the
29 Committee on Rules, welcomed everyone and explained that the purpose of the
30 hearing was to gather public comments, recommendations, and insights regarding
31 the Proposed Municipal Ordinance No. 2026-048 entitled, "An Ordinance
32 Establishing a 'Freedom Park' Pursuant to Batas Pambansa Blg. 880 and
33 Designating the Heroes Shrine for Such Purpose, Prescribing the Terms and
34 Conditions Therefor, and Imposing Penalties for Violations Thereof."
35

36 He emphasized that the public hearing serves as a venue for transparency,
37 participatory governance, and meaningful dialogue, encouraging all stakeholders

1 to freely express their opinions, concerns, and suggestions. He further stated that
2 the comments and recommendations gathered during the hearing would be
3 carefully considered by the Committee in evaluating and refining the proposed
4 ordinance before its endorsement for appropriate legislative action.

5
6 He assured the participants that all comments, observations, and
7 recommendations presented during the hearing would be duly recorded and
8 carefully evaluated by the Committee on Rules. He concluded his opening
9 remarks by thanking everyone for their attendance and valuable participation,
10 expressing hope that the discussions would contribute to the enactment of a well-
11 balanced ordinance that serves the best interests of the municipality and its
12 constituents.

13 14 **V. PRESENTATION OF THE PROPOSED ORDINANCE:**

15
16 The author of the Ordinance titled “**AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING**
17 **A “FREEDOM PARK” PRUSUANT TO BATAS PAMBANSA BLG. 880**
18 **AND DESIGNATING HEROES SHRINE FOR SUCH PURPOSES,**
19 **PRESCRIBING THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS THEREFOR, AND**
20 **IMPOSING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS THEREOF”** Hon. Mildred C.
21 Modesto, presented the key provision of the proposed ordinance, discussed each
22 provision, the salient features in its entirety, emphasizing that the said ordinance
23 seeks to comply with the provisions of Batas Pambansa Blg. 880, otherwise
24 known as the *Public Assembly Act of 1985*, by establishing and designating the
25 Heroes Shrine as the municipality's official Freedom Park. The ordinance aims to
26 provide a designated venue where individuals and organizations may peacefully
27 exercise their constitutional rights to freedom of speech, expression, and peaceful
28 assembly, subject to reasonable regulations necessary to maintain public order,
29 safety, and convenience.

30 Furthermore, the ordinance prescribes the guidelines, terms, and conditions
31 governing the use of the Freedom Park to ensure that public assemblies are
32 conducted in an orderly, peaceful, and lawful manner. It also provides
33 corresponding penalties for violations of its provisions to promote compliance
34 and safeguard the rights and welfare of the public.

35 36 **V. OPEN FORUM/PUBLIC COMMENTS:**

37
38 The public and other stakeholders were invited to express their views,
39 comments, and suggestions regarding the proposed ordinance.

40 The floor was formally opened for comments, suggestions,
41 recommendations, or manifestations from stakeholders, barangay officials,
42 representatives of concerned offices, civil society organizations, and other

1 attendees. The Presiding Officer encouraged everyone present to freely share
2 their opinions, raise any concerns, or propose amendments that could further
3 improve the proposed measure.

4 After ample opportunity was given for discussion and participation, no
5 stakeholder expressed opposition to the proposed ordinance. Likewise, no
6 suggestions, comments, recommendations, or proposed amendments were
7 presented by any of the attendees. No written position papers, memoranda, or
8 other documentary submissions were received during the hearing.

9 The author of the ordinance Hon. Mildred C. Modesto inquired once more
10 if there were any additional comments or matters to be raised. As no one signified
11 their intention to speak, the body noted for the record the absence of objections,
12 comments, recommendations, and documentary submissions from those present.

13 14 **V. RESPONSE FROM THE AUTHOR AND THE MEMBERS OF THE** 15 **COMMITTEE**

16 While the author of the ordinance acknowledges and respectfully states
17 that, after thorough review and deliberation of the proposed ordinance, there are
18 no suggested amendments, revisions, or requests for clarification from the
19 attendees and stakeholders.

20 The proposed ordinance has been carefully examined and is found to be
21 complete, clear, and aligned with its intended objectives. As such, the Author and
22 the Committee fully support its approval in its current form.

23 The Committee acknowledged the support and cooperation of all
24 participants and considered the lack of opposition as an indication that there were
25 no substantial issues raised by the stakeholders concerning the proposed
26 ordinance. It was likewise placed on record that the conduct of the public hearing
27 satisfied the requirement of public consultation, and that the proceedings and
28 attendance would form part of the Committee's report and be considered in its
29 evaluation and recommendation on the proposed measure.

30 31 **VI. CLOSING REMARKS**

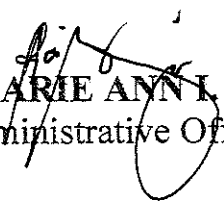
32 The Presiding Officer Hon. Fernando N. Moriel thanked the attendees for

2 Sangguniang Bayan for appropriate legislative action.

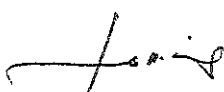
