Excerpts Taken from the Minutes of the Annual Board of Trustees Meeting

Activity: Annual Board of Trustees Meeting

Participants: Members of the Board of Trustees

Date and Time: July 15, 2026, at 1:00 o'clock in the afternoon

Venue: Tolosa, Leyte

Expectations for the Activity:

To provide direction to the organization, review its accomplishments, strengthen its organizational systems, and approve programs and funding mechanisms for the succeeding year.

General Objective:

To conduct the Annual Board of Trustees Meeting of JCI Tolosa, Inc.

Specific Objectives:

- To review and evaluate the organizational performance and accomplishments of JCI Tolosa, Inc.;
- To identify organizational challenges and corresponding solutions;
- To review the status of the organization's SEC registration application and other compliance requirements;
- To approve programs, projects, activities, and funding mechanisms for the succeeding organizational year; and
- To ensure that the organization's programs and activities are aligned with **JCI RISE: Rebuilding, Investing, Sustaining, and Evolving**.

Agenda

1. Agenda 1: Approval of the Annual Accomplishment Report

The Secretary-General presented the Annual Accomplishment Report of JCI Tolosa, Inc. for the preceding organizational year.

The report highlighted the organization's efforts to establish its organizational foundation and implement community-based activities in line with the objectives of **JCI RISE**. The activities focused on youth leadership, entrepreneurship and livelihood development, women's empowerment, environmental responsibility, health and well-being, and community participation.



The Members of the Board of Trustees noted that the organization's programs, projects, and activities were implemented through the participation of JCI members, volunteers, partner organizations, local government units, schools, community groups, and other stakeholders.

The Board recognized the importance of implementing practical and sustainable projects that respond to the needs of the community while strengthening the organization's capacity to continue serving the people of Tolosa, Leyte.

The Board further noted that the organization's activities were consistent with the three major pillars of **JCI RISE**, namely:

1. Supporting and rebuilding local economies through assistance to small and local businesses;
2. Promoting youth entrepreneurship and livelihood opportunities; and
3. Advancing mental health and community well-being.

After a thorough discussion and after receiving satisfactory responses from the program implementers, the Members of the Board of Trustees unanimously approved the Annual Accomplishment Report.

2. Agenda 2: Approval of the Annual Financial Report

The Treasurer presented the Annual Financial Report of JCI Tolosa, Inc. for the preceding organizational year.

The Members of the Board of Trustees noted that the organization's activities were supported through membership contributions, donations, sponsorships, and in-kind assistance from members, partner organizations, local government units, private individuals, and other stakeholders.

The Board emphasized the importance of maintaining complete and accurate financial records, including receipts, disbursement vouchers, liquidation reports, donation acknowledgments, and other supporting documents.

The Board also agreed to strengthen the organization's financial sustainability through:

- Regular collection of membership dues;
- Fundraising and income-generating activities;
- Solicitation of donations and sponsorships;
- Partnership-building with government agencies, private organizations, business groups, and other civil society organizations;



- Preparation and submission of project proposals for possible grants and external funding; and
- Proper budgeting and financial reporting for every program, project, and activity.

The Board further agreed that all project expenditures must be supported by appropriate documentation and must be consistent with the approved project proposal and budget.

After a thorough discussion, the Members of the Board of Trustees unanimously approved the Annual Financial Report.

3. Agenda 3: Review of Program, Project, and Activity Implementation

The Members of the Board of Trustees reviewed the implementation of the organization's programs, projects, and activities, including the organizational and administrative requirements necessary for the continued operation of JCI Tolosa, Inc.

The following challenges and corresponding solutions were identified:

Challenges	Solutions
1. Pending completion of SEC registration and other organizational compliance requirements	Continue processing the SEC registration application, complete the required documentary submissions, and update the Board regarding the status of the application and other compliance requirements
2. Limited organizational funds for program implementation	Strengthen resource mobilization, seek donations and sponsorships, conduct fundraising activities, and establish partnerships with government agencies, businesses, and other organizations
3. Limited participation of members in organizational activities	Establish a clear activity calendar, assign responsibilities to members and committees, and encourage active participation in planning and implementation
4. Need to strengthen organizational visibility and public information	Prepare and implement a communications and documentation plan through social media, project reports, photographs, press releases, and partner acknowledgments
5. Limited access to technical expertise and training resources	Coordinate with subject-matter experts, government agencies, academic institutions, business organizations, and other potential partners

6. Need for sustainable and measurable community projects	Ensure that all projects are aligned with JCI RISE and include clear objectives, target beneficiaries, budgets, implementation schedules, and monitoring mechanisms
7. Need to improve organizational records and project documentation	Maintain updated membership records, minutes of meetings, financial reports, project proposals, accomplishment reports, attendance sheets, photographs, and other supporting documents
8. Difficulty in sustaining projects beyond one activity cycle	Develop continuing programs, establish long-term partnerships, and prepare project proposals for possible grants and external funding
9. Need to strengthen the organization's accreditation and partnership opportunities	Complete the organization's SEC registration and other documentary requirements before applying for accreditation with local government units, national government agencies, and other institutions

The Board agreed that all future programs, projects, and activities should remain consistent with **JCI RISE**, particularly its focus on:

- Supporting small and local businesses;
- Promoting youth entrepreneurship and workforce development; and
- Preserving mental health and well-being.

4. Agenda 4: Program and Funding Mechanism for 2026–2027

The Members of the Board of Trustees reviewed and approved the proposed programs, projects, activities, and funding mechanisms of JCI Tolosa, Inc. for the succeeding organizational year.

The Board agreed that the proposed activities shall be implemented under the organization's continuing commitment to **JCI RISE: Rebuilding, Investing, Sustaining, and Evolving**.

The Board emphasized that the proposed activities should be practical, community-based, and responsive to the needs of Tolosa, Leyte. Each activity shall be supported by an approved project proposal, budget, work plan, attendance sheet, photo documentation, accomplishment report, and financial liquidation report.

5. Agenda 5: Application for CSO Accreditation with the Provincial Government of Leyte and the Municipal Government of Tolosa



The President presented the proposed application of JCI Tolosa, Inc. for accreditation as a civil society organization with the **Provincial Government of Leyte** and the **Municipal Government of Tolosa**.

The President explained that CSO accreditation would provide the organization with an opportunity to participate more formally in local governance, development planning, consultation processes, and other appropriate local special bodies, subject to the applicable laws, rules, regulations, and requirements of the concerned local government units.

The Members of the Board of Trustees noted that, as of the date of the meeting, the organization's SEC registration application was still being processed. The Board therefore agreed that the organization would continue completing the required SEC documentary requirements and would submit the SEC Certificate of Registration and other relevant documents to the concerned local government units once available.

The Board also noted that the organization's SEC registration was subsequently completed on **July 25, 2026**, after the Annual Board of Trustees Meeting.

The Board discussed the documentary requirements that may be required for CSO accreditation, including, as applicable:

- Letter of application;
- Duly accomplished CSO accreditation application form;
- Board resolution authorizing the application;
- SEC Certificate of Registration;
- Articles of Incorporation and By-Laws;
- Updated General Information Sheet, when available;
- List of current officers and members;
- Annual accomplishment report;
- Annual financial report;
- Minutes of the preceding annual meeting;
- Sworn statement of non-partisanship and organizational independence;
- Organizational profile; and
- Other documents required by the Provincial Government of Leyte and the Municipal Government of Tolosa.

The Board agreed that the application should be pursued in coordination with the appropriate offices of the Provincial Government of Leyte and the Municipal Government of Tolosa, including the concerned Sangguniang Panlalawigan, Sangguniang Bayan, secretariats, and other designated offices.



After discussion, the Members of the Board of Trustees unanimously approved the following:

1. The application of JCI Tolosa, Inc. for CSO accreditation with the Provincial Government of Leyte;
2. The application of JCI Tolosa, Inc. for CSO accreditation with the Municipal Government of Tolosa;
3. The preparation, completion, and submission of the required application forms and supporting documents;
4. The preparation of a Board Resolution signifying the organization's intention to apply for CSO accreditation;
5. The designation of the President and Secretary-General, or their duly authorized representatives, to coordinate with the concerned offices and submit the applications; and
6. The updating and submission of the organization's SEC registration documents following the completion of the SEC registration process.

The Board clarified that the approval granted during the meeting was an **approval to apply for CSO accreditation** and did not constitute accreditation itself. Accreditation shall be considered effective only upon approval and issuance of the appropriate resolution, certificate, or other official document by the concerned local government unit.

Adjournment

There being no other matters to discuss, the Annual Board of Trustees Meeting was adjourned.
