The meeting discussed matters relating to the organization’s participation in government programs, civil society organization (CSO) accreditation, registration, recognition, and possible partnerships with appropriate national and local government agencies.

The members and Board of Directors reviewed the organization’s ongoing and proposed compliance requirements for accreditation and partnership opportunities, including the preparation, submission, updating, and maintenance of organizational documents and supporting records.

The meeting also discussed the importance of maintaining good standing with relevant government agencies and ensuring that the organization’s corporate, financial, programmatic, and administrative records are complete, accurate, and updated.

Particular attention was given to the following matters:

1. **CSO Accreditation and Recognition** – preparation and submission of requirements for applicable CSO accreditation or recognition with government agencies and local government units;
2. **DSWD Accreditation/Registration** – compliance with applicable requirements for social welfare and development activities, including Auxiliary Social Welfare and Development Agency (SWDA) matters, when applicable;
3. **Local Government Partnership** – coordination and possible partnership with the Barangay, Municipal Government, Provincial Government, and other appropriate government offices;
4. **Government Programs and Projects** – identification of appropriate government programs, projects, grants, and community-development initiatives in which the organization may participate;
5. **Documentary Compliance** – updating and maintaining the Articles of Incorporation, By-Laws, General Information Sheet, financial statements, board resolutions, permits, registrations, and other organizational records;
6. **Transparency and Accountability** – ensuring proper documentation of programs, activities, beneficiaries, finances, donations, and utilization of organizational resources;
7. **Partnership Agreements** – preparation of appropriate letters, proposals, memoranda of agreement, or other documents whenever the organization enters into a formal partnership with government agencies or other institutions.

After discussion, the members agreed that all government partnership and accreditation activities was undertaken in accordance with applicable laws, regulations, government guidelines, and the organization’s Articles of Incorporation and By-Laws.

E. Other Matters and Adoption of Resolutions

The Chairperson opened the floor for other matters that were not included in the preceding agenda items. The members and officers were given the opportunity to raise concerns, recommendations, proposals, and other matters relevant to the continued operation and development of the organization.

4. **Membership and Volunteer Participation** – strengthening participation of members, volunteers, ministry workers, and community partners in organizational programs;
5. **Community Outreach and Development** – identification of additional opportunities to serve individuals, families, churches, communities, and other intended beneficiaries;
6. **Compliance and Reporting** – timely submission of required reports, renewals, registrations, certifications, and other government or regulatory requirements;

7. **Future Plans and Projects** – consideration of proposed projects and activities that may further advance the organization’s mission and community impact.

Following the discussions, the Chairperson presented the proposed resolutions for consideration. The members and/or Board of Directors reviewed the matters presented and, after discussion, adopted the necessary resolutions through the appropriate vote or consensus, as recorded in the official minutes.

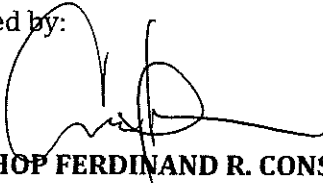
